I have here tried to present a record, although it may be somewhat incomplete of the Bowman and Metcalfe families of Augusta Township in Grenville County, Ontario. Bowman (Urilla Metcalfe) and so I wish to present this work for what it is worth to my children, grandchildren and all other relatives in the Bowman and Metcalfe families.

The Bowman Family of Augusta Township

Bowman is still a common surname in England and it is an occupational name referring to Englishmen who with their long bows were the most famous archers in Europe.

James Bowman and his wife Bridget and their children came to Augusta Township about 1845 from England. They probably came from Yorkshire but we do not know for sure. We find them in the nominal census of 1851. The census of 1851 is on micro-film at the Public Archives in Ottawa and the Bowman family is listed as follows:

We also find them in the 1861 census with Andrew 9 years old and Anne 5 years old making 9 children in all. The first 5 children were born in England and the rest were born in Canada. John being born in England in 1844 and Henry in Canada in 1846, establishes their arrival in Canada between 1844 and 1846. In the agricultural census of 1861 in which only the head of the family is given they were located on part of lot 16 on the second concession of Augusta. They had 60 acres of land, 45 acres under cultivation and a 15 acre wood lot. It lists the

number of horses, cattle and other livestock. The farm implement and the quantity and estimated value of the crops produced the previous year.


James Bowman and his wife Bridget and two of their sons are buried in Maynard Cemetery on the third concession of Augusta. The headstone inscriptions at Maynard Cemetery are as follows:

Bridget Bowman's maiden name is not given on the cemetery memorial or in the census records.

We will now list this family and their descendants generation by generation calling James Bowman and his wife Bridget the first immigrants to Canada generation 1 and we will use the folling abbreviations:



It should be noted here that the date of birth used here for Eliza, Deborah, John, Phoebe, Andrew and Anne are from the 1851 and 1861 census and could vary a year depending on whether their next birthday was in the same year the census was taken or before that same time in the next year. Also while it does not apply to the Bowmans I have found in other families a difference of 2 to 5 years between census dates and dates on their headstones.

Gen. 2- The four girls of this Bowman family were Eliza, Deborah, Phoebe and Anne.

We know nothing about these girls except that they were listed in the 1851 and 1861 census as noted above. We do not know if they married and had children or what became of them. There is only one thing; my mother who was the oldest of her family and about 20 years of age when her father died in 1888 worked for a short time in Almonte and I believe had some contact with one of her father's sisters who lived somewhere near Almonte. We don't know which one.

In regard to John Bowman, he went to the U.S. and was in the American Civil War. I can clearly recall my mother telling us about her uncle John Bowman visiting them when she was a small girl and how frightened she was as he told her father about the war and the bloody battles in which he had engaged. His age would lend credence to this story. He would be about 17 years old when the American Civil War broke out early in 1861 and about 21 years old when it was over in 1865. Many young Canadians were recruited at this time and were paid quite a bounty for joining the Northern Armies. As I remember he made this visit from Chicago and presumably he returned there. We have no further information regarding him although it is possible some information might be had by a search of the American military records of that period.

Also Andrew Bowman as far as we know lived in and around North Augusta most of his life but we have very little solid information about him. However it is thought that he may have been married twice and had two sons. He is still rather vaguely remembered by a few people still living in North Augusta and I remember seeing him myself when I was a small boy. Thelma Botham remembers him and thinks he may be buried in the Sand Hill Cemetery where many of the Bowmans are buried, at North Augusta. I have looked there and also at the records and old maps of this cemetery and have not found anything. However, the old map of the cemetery and the older records are not very ledgible.

We are here mostly interested in James Bowman, son of the original immigrant and, his wife Urilla Metcalfe and so, we list this family as follows:

Some information about Wilfred Bruce and his family.

Wilfred managed his father's farm for a time and then was part owner of the factory and cheesemaker at Newbliss. He came to Ottawa September 7, 1929. He was later General Manager of the Capital Consumers Co-operative Dairy and remained in this position until this business was sold to the Borden Company. He attended Dairy School in Kingston in 1926 and graduated at the head of the 1926 class. He was for two years President of the Ottawa Milk Distributors Association and a member of the executive of the Ontario Milk Distributors Association.

Dwight attended Dairy School at Kemptville and graduated at the head of his class. He was for some time secretary treasurer of the Seal Test Dairy organization in Canada and is now President and General Manager of Glenville Dairies at Newmarket, Ontario.

Garnet has a Bachelor of Arts degree from Carleton University and is a senior Computer Systems Designer in the Federal Post Office.

Lois is office supervisor with Scott and Aylen, Patent and Trademarks Agents in Ottawa.

Some information about Robert Mansel Bruce and his family.

Robert graduated from a two year course at Kemptville Agricultural School with honours and a medal from the Honourable Howard Ferguson, Premier of Ontario. He soon took over the home farm which he continued to operate as a dairy farm but for some years specialized in market gardening. They were still living on the farm although their farming operations were very much curtailed until Robert died May 28th, 1974.

Russell graduated from Athens High School in June, 1943 and was granted a Province of Ontario University Scholarship. September 1, 1943 he enrolled in the Ontario Agricultural College majoring in field husbandry and soils. He graduated in May 1947 and joined the staff of the Department of Soils, Ontario Agricultural College, as a Soil Specialist. In July, 1949 he went to Cornell University at Ithaca N.Y. and graduated from there with a Master of Science degree in January, 1951. He then returned to the Ontario Agricultural College but left in February, 1953 and went to the University of Illinois at Urbana where he was awarded his Doctor of Philosophy in February, 1956. He then accepted a position at Mississippi State University doing teaching and research. He was later promoted to Associate Professor and Associate Agronimist. In 1965 he was also visiting Professor of Soil Science at Auburn University in Alabama. In 1966 he became Supervisory Soil Scientist and

Research Investigations Leader in Soil Physics for the Southern United States and Puerto Rico. He is living in Athens, Georgia, Alvin Bruce is a chartered accountant in Toronto. He

Beryl finished High School at Smiths Falls and graduated as a Registered Nurse from Kingston General Hospital. Douglas Booth, her husband, is a high school teacher at Richmond Hill.

Frances Walker was a daughter of Nathan Walker and her mother was a Bellamy, a descendant of Samuel Bellamy and his wife, Anna Blanchard. Samuel came up from Vermont in 1819 and bought 400 acres of land in Augusta Township where the village of North Augusta is situated from a man by the name of Dunham. There was only one other house in North Augusta at that time. He built a grist mill and a cloth dressing works at North Augusta and had them in operation in 1824. Three other brothers came to Canada with Samuel and they built mills at different places in Leeds and Grenville Counties. There is a geneology of the Bellamy family that claims some of them were involved in an uprising against William Duke of Normandy in 1047. Some of them later joined

the Huguenot movement and emigrated to America to avoid persecution.

Robert Bowman lived on the old Bowman homestead for many years and then bought a house and a piece of land in North Augusta. He drove a rural mail route for a great many years. Ward and Rheta Baker are still living in this house.







ROBERT METCALFE OF AUGUSTA TOWNSHIP AND SOME OF HIS DESCENDANTS


Robert Metcalfe and his wife Elizabeth Craddock were one of my Gr.Gr. Grandparents. They were the grandparents of my maternal grandmother Mrs. James Bowman (Urilla Metcalfe) of North Augusta Ontario. Robert and Elizabeth Metcalfe of course would be Gr. Gr. Grandparents to all Mrs. James Bowmans grandchildren.

Robert Metcalfe's obituary may be seen at the United Church Archives at Victoria University Queen's Park Crescent East, Toronto, Ontario. His obituary was signed by R. Harden dated March 9th, 1844 and appeard in the May 1st, 1844 issue of The Christian Guardian. It says "Robert Metcalfe, the subject of these remarks was born 1788, in a small village called Ilton, in the Parish of Masham, North Riding of Yorkshire England and from a small child he was the subject of religious impressions. He joined the Methodist Church when he was twenty-eight years old and two years later he was appointed class leader and was then licensed to preach". He apparently spent the most of the remainder of his life in the Church as a lay preacher, although he was out of the church for a time before his death. He was to be received back into his place in the church the very day he was carried to his grave. His illness was short. He became ill on Monday, medical aid was called and it says all was done that could be done, but he passed away on Friday evening February 2nd, 1844. He was buried the following Sunday, the Reverand Nankevill conducting the funeral service. His obituary says his funeral was attended by an almost incredible number of friends and acquaintances.

Burial was in Carpenters Cemetery which is located on Lot 35, Concession 5 of Augusta Township. This little cemetery has probably not been used much in recent years, but it has been well renovated and is in good condition. I believe the renovation

here was largely due to the efforts of Mr. Howard Warner of Ottawa.

The inscription on Robert Metcalfe's gravestone is still legible and reads "The Reverand Robert Metcalfe - died 1844 at 56 years of age". The word Reverand should not have been in the inscription because he was not an ordained minister but yet it may show the esteem and respect in which he was held by his family and those to whom he had ministered. His wife was Elizabeth Craddock and they were married April 15th, 1808. Her gravestone inscription shows that she died in October 1872 at 84 years of age. There is a foot-stone on the lot with the initials J.H.M. died February 22nd, 1866 age 42 years.

Nearby there is a stone with the inscription "In memory of Mary Metcalfe Kirby late of Yorkshire England, died January 30th, 1890 age 82 years". This is undoubtedly the oldest child of Robert and Elizabeth Metcalfe. In another lot here, there is the graves of Daniel Falkner who died Feb. 19th, 1882 age 73 and Miles Falkner son of Daniel who died July 2nd, 1873 age 23 years.

Robert Metcalfe's son Robert was married to Nancy Falkner so Daniel Falkner and his son may be the father and brother of Mrs. Robert Metcalfe. I remember my mother speaking of her relationship to both the Kirby and Falkner families and the good times she had enjoyed with them.

It is interesting to note that we find this Kirby family listed in the 1861 census as follows:

Robert Metcalfe's will may be found at the Registry Office in Prescott and is dated Feb. 1st, 1844 the day before he died. The land transfer to Robert Metcalfe of Lot 37 in the 7th Concession and of parts of lots 30 and 31 in the 6th concession of Augusta may also be seen there. These properties are mentioned in his will in which after making provision for his wife Elizabeth he proceeds to make bequests to each of his eight children. Their names in the order appearance in the will is evidently not according to their dates of birth. In the will they are as follows: Abraham, Anthony, Robert, Mary, Elizabeth, Ann, Martha and William. The will bequeaths three pieces of land, sums of money, some of it to be paid in live shock and, to his beloved daughter Mary, a clock which was in his possession His executors were Herman Landon, John Barnard and his wife Elizabeth executrix. The will refers to him as Robert the elder and to the son as Robert the younger.

In this record of the Metcalfe family we are primarily interested in the descendants of Robert the younger although a few notes on some of the others may be in order. We have already reported on Mary, who was probably the oldest and, her husband William Kirby and their family.

We find William and his family in both the 1851 and 1861 census as follows:

The Elizabeth mentioned here in 1861 would probably be his mother. She may have been keeping house for him. In looking through some Augusta township papers at the Public Archives, we see that Martha Metcalfe married Richard Stockdale, March 30, 1848 and that Anthony Metcalfe married Catherine Haley, June 22, 1848. I have a letter written by the late Mrs. Dwight Bennett (Flossie Metcalfe) dated May 7, 1971 in which she says that Anthony was also a preacher and William a stone mason and Elizabeth (Betsy) was Mrs. Brownbridge. She also mentions Mrs. Kirby. We have no detailed information of either Abraham or Ann except that they were mentioned in their father's will. These people would be great uncles and aunts of Mrs. Bennett.

Before we continue with Robert the younger's family, we will take a look at the probable time that these Metcalfe's came to Canada.

Referring again to the obituary it says that he married Miss Elizabeth Craddock April 15th, 1808, and emigrated to Canada shortly afterwards. This does not seem to be correct. At least three of his children were born in England and the late Mrs. Bennett of Campbellford says in her letter that she understood her grandfather Robert (the younger) came out to Canada from Yorkshire, England with several brothers and sisters. Again William's oldest child Ann who was born in 1830 was not born in Canada.

Furthermore I have a letter from Mrs. J.C. Heard, Islington, Ontario who has a distant Metcalfe ancestor and says that she has done considerable research on her mother's paternal ancestry.

She says the Metcalfes' of Wensleydale, Yorkshire were numerous, and like many of our ancestors there were "good'uns and bad'uns". She says there is referances in several books she has. She also quotes from a letter written by the Reverand Mr. Blakey who was the first Rector of Augusta to his brother-in-law Thomas Lawson and dated July 14th, 1834. Mr. Blakey says Robert Metcalfe and his family arrived here well, after, a nine weeks passage. He wishes me to request you to let him have the money a little longer than the time specified if you can spare it as he has bought a farm about fourteen miles from my residence but, I think five years is time enough to repay the amount, but you can please yourself. I got the signature to the note you requested me to get. Mr. Blakey apologizes for taking so long to write. His residence was Pine Grove Rectory, which still stands a short distance east of the Blue Church on Highway Number 2.

Mr. Blakey does not say whether the farm Metcalfe bought was east, west or north, so we cannot be sure whether this is the Robert Metcalfe family we have been talking about or not but it seems very probable that it is. The deed to the land on Lot 37 in the seventh concession was in Robert Metcalfe's name early in 1836.

Returning to Robert Metcalfe the younger and his family we find them listed in the 1861 census as follows:

Also in the Agricultural Census of 1861, Robert the younger has 100 acres on concession 7 in Augusta and in 1860 produced 300 bushels of potatoes, and 300 bushels of oats. He had 6 milch cows other live stock and farming equipment which he valued at \$4,000.00. Robert was born in 1816 and his wife Nancy in 1815. She was raised at Heron's Corners not far from Metcalfe Corners, where the Metcalfe family were settled. He died in 1897. We do not have Nancy's date of death.

Wellington Metcalfe the oldest of Robert the younger's children, married Mary Wilson and they had three children - Robert William, Blanche and Flossie Pearl.

Robert William married Pearl Bryant. There was no family and they are both dead.

Blanche married Vivian Simmons and they had no family. Vivian is dead and Blanche has for sometime been living in the Warkworth Nursing Home at Campbellford, Ontario.

Flossie Pearl married Dwight Bennett. They ran a furniture business and a funeral home at Campbellford, Ontario. Flossie died in May 1973 and Dwight about four years earlier. They had four children -

Donald Dwight who now runs an expanded furniture business at Campbellford.

James who died of lung cancer at 33 years of age. Robert Byron who is with Canadian Tire in Sudbury and Paul who is in Kapuskasing.

Robert Byron Bennett has three children: Susan Bennett Cathy Bennett Janet Bennett Paul Bennett has two children: Patricia Bennett Peter Bennett

Permilla Metcalfe the second of Robert the younger's children married young and went at once to Chicago to live. The rest of the family had very little contact with her over the years but, I do remember that this woman and her son John Dyson visited at our place when I was quite young. If I remember correctly there was another son and they ran a China Shop in Chicago. Mrs. Flossie Bennett in her letter of 1971, says that she thinks Permilla also had two daughters and may have been married twice.

As for Urilla the third child of Robert the younger, she and her descendants have been dealt with in the Bowman section of this book.

Almiron the fourth child of Robert the younger, born Oct. 27th, 1849 and died January 19th, 1929 in Smiths Falls. He was married to Harriet Niblock September 23rd, 1885. She died with typhoid fever and was buried August 23rd, 1916 at age 53 years.

Almiron was usually called Bob, even from early childhood. In the Anglican Archives his occupation is given as a carpenter while in the report of his death from The Registrar Generals Office he is called a painter.

Almiron, his wife and two of his children Violet and Ruth are buried in the Anglican Cemetery in Smiths Falls but there are no gravestones on the lot. They had four children -

Violet died June 1905, of a heart condition. She was 18 years old. Emma Ruth was born September 21st, 1890 and was baptised November 14th, the same year. She was married to Cyrus Service and she died in diabetic coma and was buried January 27th, 1935.

Hazel Metcalfe was born March 30th, 1893 and was baptised July 28, 1893. She married John E. Belling, February 28th, 1915. They live in Ancaster, Ontario and have three children -

Wallace Metcalfe was born in Smiths Falls on Feb. 6th, 1898 and died in Hamilton Dec. 1968. He was married to Willa Waggoner and they had one son Alexander Metcalfe who was born Oct. 22nd, 1924. He is married to Margaret Taylor born September 28th, 1925. They live at the corner of Mississauga Road and Steeles Avenue, R.R. 3, Streetsville, Ontario where Alexander has a ceramics business. Alexander I believe is the only adult male descendant of Robert Metcalfe the younger. However he and Margaret have five sons.

Alpheus Metcalfe the fifth child of Robert Metcalfe the younger was born September 1851, and he died May 23rd, 1929. He was married to Minnie Derbyshire a sister of Eugene Derbyshire of Kingston, who in turn was married to Lavina Weatherhead a sister of Thomas Weatherhead who was a long time resident of North Augusta and a Bruce family descendant. Alpheus and Minnie Metcalfe are buried in the Cemetery at the old Gosford Church but there is no marker at their graves.

Wellington and his wife are buried here and also their son Robert William. There is a headstone. We do not know where Robert the younger Metcalfe and his wife are buried. They are probably buried either at Carpenters or Gosford but, we did not see a headstone in either place.

I should note that Mrs. Flossie Bennett spelled her Uncle's name Almiron. It is spelled Almeron in his death certificate from the Registrars Office. Also there is quite a difference in the ages of both. Almiron and Alpheus as given by the Registrars Office death certificate and the age as given in the 1861 census. I have used the census figures as they seem to me the most logical but it does make both of them older at the time of their death. Mrs. Blanch Simmons is ninety years of age but still has a good memory. She says that her grandparents, Robert Metcalfe the younger and his wife Nancy Falkner, Mary Metcalfe and her husband William Kirby and Elizabeth (Betsy) Metcalfe and her husband ? Brownbridge are all buried at Gosford but there are, apparently, no headstones there for them. Gosford is just a few miles west of North Augusta village.

Mr. and Mrs. Wellington Metcalfe, their son Robert William and his wife Pearl Bryant and Blanch Metcalfe's husband Vivian Simmons are all buried in the Gosford cemetery. The names of these people are all recorded on a good headstone on the Metcalfe plot.

It is very possible that some more information might be aquired with more time and effort but, having been more than a little naive in promising one of my grandchildren to write down what I knew of or could find out about her ancestors and, at the moment failing to realize what I was getting into with six families to research, I must not spend too much time on any one branch of the relationship. I hope that what has been presented here may be of some interest to at least some of the younger generation.

An Appendix to the book - The Bowman and Metcalfe Families of Augusta Township, Grenville County, Ontario - 1834 - 1974

This little book was printed in April 1975 but since then we have received some very interesting information.

During 1976 we have learned a lot about John Bowman and his family. He was the fifth child and third son of the original immigrants, James Bowman and his wife Bridget (Eliza) Corbett, who came from England and settled in Augusta Township about 1843. Then before that some old notes were found at North Augusta in December 1975. This material was given verbally by my mother many years ago and was written down by Thelma Botham.

We knew these notes had been made and a thorough search was made to find them but without success until Thelma found them in December 1975 under the paper lining of a seldon used bureau drawer. The old notes do change or in some cases contradict some of the conclusions reached when the book was being written.

However, we will deal first with John Bowman. It was known by family legend that he had gone to the United States and had been in the civil war. He is shown in the charts on pages 1 and 3 and is mentioned on page 4 of the book, but the family had no contact with him or his family over the years. A researcher had been contacted in Washington D.C. but about all she found was that there were 26 John Bowmans in the New York regiments of the Union Army during the civil war. However, another try was made early in 1976 using another research person. She did find the right John Bowman and when and where he enlisted but, she could not find when he was discharged from the army or where he may have gone after he Was discharged. As a result of him being a war pensioner his records were in the War Veterans Administration files, which were not available to the general public or even regular professional researchers. Finally through the help of Special Master Sergeant Edward Parrish an Attaché at the American Embassy here in Ottawa, we got all the proper forms to give proof of relationship etc. and soon we received about 40 pages of photocopy giving a very complete record of him from when he enlisted until his death in 1931 and even until the death of his wife in 1935.

Most of the following has been taken from the files of the War Veterans Administration. In all his army records he gives his birth place as Prescott, Ontario Canada and his date of birth as June 22nd 1845 although as we have shown in the book, he is shown in the 1851 census as born in England and seven years old his next birthday. Also he gives his mother's name as Eliza although on her headstone and in the early census rolls it is Bridget. The army describes him as having blue eyes, brown or dark hair, fair complexion and five feet 8 inches in height. His occupation labourer.

His son Walton describes his father as being a very jovial barrel-chested man who wore a size 18 collar and he was about 5 foot 8 or 9 inches in height. He was a man who loved to tell stories of his army experiences some of them that would not be appropriate in a Sunday School class. He used to tell of one time when his unit was on a march and, they were told to live off the land. He came to a house and the woman there said she would give him a good meal but in return he was to leave her one and only turkey alone. He ate the meal and then went out and shot her turkey and took it away under his arm. The woman said she thought he was the meanest man in the whole - - army. But he said he had to make provision for his next meal.

His army record shows that he enlisted at Rochester. New York on October 4, 1864 into the 12th regiment New York Infrantry at Elmiria N.Y. He enlisted for 3 years and received a \$400.00 bonus. Many young Canadians were given a bonus for enlisting in the Union Army. He seems to have been very soon transferred to the 8th Cavalry Regiment of New York; at least it was in this unit that he was during most of his time in service and all his records are in the files of this unit. It seems he was involved in at least one little episode. On October 22nd he was reported away without leave from his regiment at Petersburg Virginia and on October 24th he was picked up in Washington in civilian clothes and without a pass. The record shows that a man by the name of George Corbett was with him and was also arrested. It may be worth noting that John had a first cousin George Corbett who was raised on a farm in Augusta Township about three miles from where John Bowman was raised. They were about the same age. I wonder if the name is just a coincidence or could this have been his cousin? Fortunately nothing much seems to have happened except that they were returned to their regiments. His period of training must have been short because he is mentioned in despatches from the field in each of the months of January, February and March and April 30th he was transferred to the company of unassigned recruits. The war was over. On May 29th he was admitted to the hospital with typhoid fever and he appears again on the muster roll of his unit on June 27th. He received his honourable discharge from the army on July 11th, 1865

After leaving the army he is reported living at Mannsville, Jefferson County New York State and on September 6, 1867 at the nearby village of Pierrepont Manor he was married to Emily Sophia Bremer a daughter of Nute Bremer. Next we find him farming in Lee County Illinois where his son Fred Byron Bowman was born on June 11, 1870. After that they farmed for a time near St. Joseph Missouri and later on again they moved to Humeston Iowa. Emily died there on June 25th, 1897 and is buried in the Humeston Cemetery. Before this John had applied for and eventually received a pension in about 1890 and it is because he was receiving a pension that we have so much detail about him in the Veterans Administration files.

John remarried on November 20, 1901 to Emma Levina Henry of Derby Iowa, the daughter of Emmanuel Henry and his wife Barbara Dale. They were married by the Rev. A.M. Molesworth, a Methodist Episcopal Minister. They lived for a time at Humeston and it was there that his two younger sons were born. In 1910 they moved onto a 320 acre farm east of Promise City Iowa where he engaged in mixed farming until 1915 when he retired and moved back to Humeston where he died February 11, 1931 and Emma who was born August 9, 1868 died March 24, 1935. They are both buried in Humeston Cemetery with his first wife and his daughter Allie. Emma received a pension as long as she lived.

We will now list John Bowman and his descendants from both his marriages as far as we have information, using the same abbreviations and the same format as we used in the book. The record of John's family and descendants has been obtained from correspondence with his son Henry Walton Bowman of Cedar Falls Iowa. Contact was made with Walton Bowman through an add placed in the Cedar Rapids Gazette. A copy of his first letter to me is at the end of this appendix.

This is the record of John William Bowman and his descendants as far as we have information at this time. We shall now turn to some of the information contained in the old notes - They say that the James Bowman Family - gen. 1 - came to Canada from Norfolk County in England when James their second oldest child and oldest son, was five years old. They came directly to Prescott in Augusta Township Ont. We had thought that they might have come from Yorkshire (see page 1 in the Book) and if the notes are right it brings them to Canada a couple of years earlier than we had thought. In all his army records John says he was born in Canada, June 22, 1845. We find on a closer look that some of the 1851 census was not finished until some time in 1852. This could make a difference. I may say that the graves and headstones of James, Bridget and their two sons George and Henry, are in the south east corner of Maynard Cemetery and the inscriptions can still be read. Some of the children were quite young when the mother died in 1861. The notes say that Henry died with tuberculosis and it may be that George and the mother did too. In the 1851 census Bridget is listed as a Baptist but James' religious affiliation is not shown. John left his oldest sister Eliza as his next of kin during the war. On page 3 of the book we said that we knew nothing about the four girls except that they were mentioned in the early census; but the old notes tell us that Eliza, the oldest of the family, went to Chicago and married a man who ran a laundry. Deborah and Anne also went to Chicago sometime later.


Phoebe married a man by the name of John Holliday, a shoemaker and they lived in or near Almonte, Ontario. I have searched and only find that in 1875 John Holliday a shoemaker was living at the Almonte Hotel. This was probably before his marriage. After James Bowman, my grandfather, died in 1888 my mother evidently had some contact with them for a short time, as she worked in the woollen mills in Almonte before coming back to North Augusta and learning the tailor trade. I well remember that she could quite quickly turn out a full suit of clothes for us when we were growing boys; much better than the clothes from the T. Eaton catalogue. I have not found any descendents of Phoebe or her place of burial although she is probably buried in Auld Kirk Cemetery in Almonte without a

marker. (See addendum, page).

This is not in the old notes, but as a result of a letter I have from the late Flossie (Metcalfe) Bennett, which says that Permilla Metcalfe my grandmother Bowman's sister (a couple of years older) was married quite young to a man by the name of Sheridan and went with him immediately (against her family's wishes) to Chicago, I wonder if she may have had some influence on the Bowman girls in their decision to go to Chicago. They would certainly be well known to each other.

While searching for material for the book, we found in an old box in the garret at my late brother Robert's place, my childhood home, an old picture on which was written Mrs. Dyson, sister of Mrs. James Bowman. This would have to be Permilla Metcalfe my grandmother Bowman's only sister but, the old notes show that it was Deborah Bowman who married the man named Dyson in Prescott. She lived in Prescott and had two children. Dyson, it seems, had a drinking problem and she left him and took her two children with her and went to her sister Eliza who was already in Chicago. She later married again to a man who ran a store in Chicago selling dishes, crockery and chinaware. Walton Bowman says this man came to visit them when they lived on their farm east of Promise City, Iowa sometime between 1910 and 1915.

Deborah by this time had died. He is not sure of the man's name, but thinks it was Van Linnett of Van Linnupp. I have checked about this name in the Public Archives Library, the Public Library here in Ottawa and also at the Chicago Historical Society at North and Clark Street, Chicago 60614. I did refer to Permilla on page 32 of the book but owing to the mistake in the picture, the picture on the lower left hand corner of the picture page facing the printed page 26 was designated Permilla Metcalfe, but it actually was the picture of Deborah Bowman, a sister of my grandfather Bowman. Stickers have been put in most of the books making the correction.

The above information has caused an error in the pages 23 and 24. It would seem from the letter we have from the late Mrs. Bennett that Permilla was only married twice. First to a man named Sheridan and later to a man named Johnston. It is thought she had two daughters, but information about her is not at all clear. In the book on page 1 we said we thought the Bowmans came from England probably from Yorkshire. The old notes say they came from Norfolk County in England and this is probably correct. They say that they did come directly to Prescott. The 1851 nominal census do not give the lot and concession numbers but the 1861 agricultural census does and they were on lot 16 of the 2nd concession of Augusta Township.

The old notes say that Anne went to Chicago and married a Man of the Morman faith. However, Walton Bowman says they had a letter from Anne's son in 1929. She wanted to know her correct age. She had married a Jew and had embraced the Jewish faith changing her name from Anne to Sara. Her son's name was Abram.

The notes say that my grandmother Bowman was married at 18 years of age and my grandfather was nine years older. They lived first in a house near Gosford Church and then on the Kid farm. This was the south half of lot 37 in the eighth concession of Augusta. Robert their third child was born there in 1872. They then moved to the old place and lived in the old house shown in the book. The house, horse barn and the vegetable garden were on lot C about an acre of land in the ninth concession of Augusta. The hay barn, cow barn and work land was across the road in Elizabethtown. This lot C, in 1861 was occupied by a William Barker. The north end of lot 37 in the eighth concession of Augusta had three names on it, Sam Haley, P. Baldwin and N. Timblick. In my earliest recollection it all belonged to the Haley family. The notes say my grandmother Bowman was born below Kenptville. We see that Robert Metcalfe the elder in his will made in 1844 left his son Robert the younger, my grandmother Bowman's father, parts of lots 30 and 31 in the 6th concession as well as lot 37 in the 7th concession of Augusta. It does seem a little strange that even if they may have been living on lots 30 or 31 in the sixth concession when my grandmother was born in 1848 that they would describe this as being below Kemptville. They would be much nearer either Prescott or Brockville.

There is one or two other items we may mention here although they are not in the old notes. The late Mrs. Bennett speaks in her letter of her grandfather's sister Betsy Brownbridge. Robert the elder mentions his daughter Elizabeth in his will but no one seems to know much about them but in the 1861 census we find as follows -

William Brownbridge - age next birthday 53 years

Eliza Brownbridge - age next birthday 43 years. Albert Brownbridge - age next birthday 18 years.

On the atlas maps of 1861 we find them on lot 1 concession 8 in Elizabethtown. They are likely buried in Gosford Cemetery.

We also find the Corbetts in the 1871 census - in fact two families of them.

George Corbett - age next birthday 53 years, born in England. Mary Corbett - age next birthday 50 years, born in England Jane Corbett - age next birthday 19 years, born in Canada. John Corbett - age next birthday 14 years, born in Canada. Martha Corbett - age next birthday 12 years, born in Canada.

This George Corbett was no doubt the brother of Mrs. James Bowman the original immigrant from England. He was 7 years younger. Although they are described as living at Stones Corners we find them in the 1888 County Directory on lot 37 in the 4th concession of Augusta. Their address was Algonquin.

The second George Corbett family in the 1871 census are -George Corbett - age next birthday 29 years, born in England. Martha Corbett - age next birthday 26 years. John Corbett - age next birthday 6 years. William Corbett - age next birthday 3 years.

This George Corbett was likely a son of the older man. Howard Warner in his book "South Augusta and its Environs" mentions a John Corbett at Stones Corners in the early 1900's.

BOWMAN & METCALFE FAMILIES (1834 - 1974)

Further research was done on the Bowman and Metcalfe families in the Autumn of 1977 and the early part of 1978. Some rather interesting information was found. Most of this work was done by Claire Wells of Salt Lake City. Information was obtained from records and computer files of the Genealogical Division of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. These records are copies of parish records in Masham, Yorkshire, and Ashmanhaugh and Tunstead in Norfolk, England. Additional information came from the census of 1841 and 1851, at Ashmanhaugh, and the Consistory Court records at Norwich, Norfolk County, England. The Metcalfes

We have confirmed their location in the north Riding of Yorkshire, England, and in the parish of Masham. Robert, who was designated as Robert the elder in the Bowman and Metcalfe book, was born in the small hamlet of Ilton near the city of Masham, in I788, and was christened at Masham on May 4th of that year. The Metcalfes were Methodists. Robert was married at Masham to Elizabeth Graddock on April I5th, I808. Robert was the son of John Metcalfe and his wife Mary Farrar. Elizabeth Graddock was the daughter of Anthony Graddock and his wife Hannah Sunter. Elizabeth was christened on September 22nd, I788.

We also have the dates of christening of their nine children, one more than is shown in the Bowman and Metcalfe book.

The Bowmans

The Bowmans lived at Ashmanhaugh in Norfolk County, England. The British High Commissioner's office in Ottawa, advises us that Ashmanhaugh is pronounced ASH-MAN-HOW. It is a small hamlet of between IOO and 200 people. Ashmanhaugh is 9 miles northeast of Norwich City, the capital of Norfolk County and is about 3 miles from Wroxham.

James Bowman, who came from England and settled in Augusta township in 1843, was the son of John Bowman and his wife Sarah Thirtle, and was the grandson of Nicholas Bowman and his wife Esther. In a will Nicholas made dated Feb I5, I770, he mentions his wife Esther, his sister Susannah Baldwin, his brother Michael Bowman, his sister Catherine Frost, his son John, and his daughter Sarah, who was the wife of John Baines. He willed some lands in Brizeley, Norfolk, to his son John and his daughter Sarah. His executor was his son-in-law, William Gurling, and the will was probated July 3rd, I77I. From the computer file we find that John Bowman and Sarah Thirtle were married at Ashmanhaugh, Norfolk, England, on the 5th of April, I790. We also have a listing of their eight children with their dates of birth and dates of christening.

The age of James does not correspond with that given above, but Claire Wells tells me that the ages given in English censuses are only approximate. There are a number of Bowmans listed in the census, but we do not know if they were related or not. They seem to have all been farmers or farm labourers.

Bridget Corbett, the wife of James Bowman, was the daughter of John Corbett and his wife Phoebe, of the parish of Ashmanhaugh. James and Bridget were married at Tunstead, on March 29, 1836. Tunstead is another small hamlet about a mile or so from Ashmanhaugh. In the Bowman Metcalfe book, we show that Eliza was born in 1836. This is a Canadian Census date, but according to the I84I Ashmanhaugh census she was four years of age, which means she was born in 1837. However, ages given in the census are only approximate, either in Canada or in England.

The Corbetts were Baptists and the information here was originally taken from the Baptist records at Tunstead.

Bridget was born Oct I2, I8I2. She had a sister, Elizabeth, born June II, I8I5, and a brother George born May I4, I8I7. The witnesses at the wedding of James and Bridget were Thomas Sharpe, Eliza Corbett, and Henry Smith.

We found from the Baptist records a Mary Corbett, christened June 25, 1774. She may have been a sister of John Corbett. Also, we found a Sarah Corbett, buried June 29, 1775. We can not be sure but she may have been John Corbett's mother.

This search could be carried much further, but I have discontinued it at least for now. I have a copy of Deborah Bowman's birth certificate from England and George Corbett's obituary which I received from Mrs. Patricia Mackey here in Ottawa, who was

raised in the Prescott area. This George Corbett would be a son of George Corbett, the brother of Mrs. James Bowman. Here is George Corbett's obituary (I9II):

GEORGE CORBETT - After a brief illness, George Corbett, of Algonquin, died Monday in the General Hospital, aged 70 years. The deceased was born in Norfolk, England but when a child came to this country with his parents and had lived continuously since in the Township of Augusta where he was known as a progressive, honorable farmer. Besides his wife who was Miss Martha Attridge, one son, John W. of Kingston survives. He also leaves three sisters and one brother, Miss Phoebe Warner, Toronto; Mrs. Wm. Knapp, North Bay; Mrs. Henry Goldsmith, Prescott, and John Corbett, of South Augusta. The deceased was a lifelong member of the Algonquin Methodist church. The funeral was held at two o'clock yesterday afternoon from his residence to the Algonquin Methodist church, thence to the cemetery close by. - Times.

The only surviving son, John W. Corbett, formerly of this town, has the sympathy of a large number of Prescott friends.
