The Bruce Family Of Kitley Township -Leed County, Ontario

Robert Bruce with his wife Mary Kennedy and their four children, Elizabeth, Mary, Robert and Anne came from London Derry Ireland to Canada probably in 1823. Robert's brother Ed came with them but he soon went on further west and they lost contact with him. According to family legend James Edgar and his wife Mary McMaster came over on the same boat. The younger Robert Bruce later on married Mary Edgar, James Edgar's oldest child, and they were my paternal grandparents.

I am attempting here to trace and list the descendants of Robert and Mary Bruce, the original immigrants up to the present; following both the male and female lines. There will, of course, be some omissions and some errors. The dates taken from the old census rolls, the headstones and the old family Bibles, do not always agree. I have used what seems to me the most probable dates of birth and death.

I want to say here that I was first prompted to do this when some time after I retired in 1969 I was at my son's place at Sutton, Ontario and my granddaughter, Donna Bruce, asked me to tell her what I knew about our ancestors. She had a tape recorder and we talked for an hour or more and then found that the recorder was not working. I then promised her that I would write down what I had told her. However, since then I have looked at the old census records at the Public Archives, visited many cemeteries and examined other records and so I have much more information than I had at that time.

With regard to the place in Ireland that they came from we only have the family legend which I believe is correct and, it does seem to have been accepted by all branches of the family that they did come from London Derry. I have searched the ships emigrant passenger lists at the Public Archives and in "The Hand Book of

Irish Geneology" and have not found anything. It seems the Government did not keep a record of people leaving Ireland but the ship owners did keep a record of people boarding their ships to come to America. From 1860 on the most of these lists have been kept but for earlier dates many have been lost or destroyed especially between 1803 and 1833.

It was thought by some of the family that the first of this Bruce family might have arrived in Canada in 1818 or 1819. I am convinced that this is not correct. First there is the short biographical sketch in the "History of Leeds and Grenville" by Thad. W.H. Leavitt and published in 1879. It says that the James Edgar family came out in 1821 so if the Bruces and Edgars came over on the same boat this would establish the date the Bruces arrived. However, I have a copy of the obituary of Mrs. Robert Bruce (Mary Edgar) who died in 1902 and there it states that the deceased came to Canada from Ireland in 1823 and lived in Augusta Township in Grenville County until 1830 when the family moved into Kitley Township in Leeds County. Again Mrs. Jacob Weatherhead (Anne Bruce) according to early census records was born in 1821 Robert Bruce and her obituary states that she was two years old when she came 1788 - 1856 from Ireland to Canada. Also I remember one of my aunts who was born in 1844 telling me that she understood that her father was Mary Kennedy 1781 - 1878 ten years old when he came out from Ireland and he was born in 1813. It seems to me that 1823 is probably the correct date of the arrival of both the Edgars and Bruces. I believe they came over in the same boat. We do know that the Bruce family did live for a time in Augusta. Elizabeth, the oldest of the family, married and lived there the rest of her life. We do not know whether the Edgars did live in Augusta or not but we find that in December, 1829 James Edgar and Robert Bruce each bought fifty acre of land from William Dowsley, parts of lot 17 in the 6th concession of Kitley. This shows that they probably did move into Kitley in 1830. Edgar bought the N. 1/2 of S. 1/2 of the lot and Bruce bought the S. 1/4 of the lot. In 1845 Bruce sold James Edgar the S. 1/4 of lot 17 and in the same year Edgar bought the whole 200



acres of lot 18. On January 31, 1837 Robert Bruce bought part of lot 18 in the 7th concession from E. Hubbel. Quite a part of this 100 acre lot is in Irish Lake. He lived here until he died in 1856. He is said to have gone to Brockville to sell some firkins of butter in November and got caught in a very heavy cold rain. He died about a week later.

We also find that Robert Bruce, the son who, was my grandfather, on March 4, 1838 bought from James Gilpin and wife and Martin Gilpin 100 acres, the N. 1/2 of lot 17 in the 6th concession. He was married to Mary Edgar in April of the same year. My grandmother often told her children that she stood all day in the door of their first log house and listened to the sound of the cannons firing at the Battle of the Windmill at Prescott while her husband was away with the local militia to the battle. The battle of the Windmill was fought in November, 1838. The Americans crossed the St. Lawrence on the 11th November. My grandparents continued to live on this farm part of lot 17 in the 6th concession of Kitley until they died. She died in 1902 and he died in 1903. Their very substantial old home was destroyed by fire in the 1930's. I remember the carriage house and loft contained many old relics of pioneer days such as hand cards and spinning wheels for both flax and wool and also the looms for weaving. There was also the old cradle attached to a scythe for harvesting grain, the yoke for oxen, the candle making moulds and an old lantern designed to use a candle. All of these together with some old carriages and other things were destroyed in the fire.

I shall now proceed to list the descendants of Robert Bruce and his wife Mary Kennedy generation by generation considering them as generation (1) and their children as generation (2) and so on. As we stated earlier Robert and his wife Mary Kennedy had four children and we will list them and their descendants starting with Elizabeth the oldest. I think we should say here that in the 1851 census we find Robert Gen. 1 and Mary and Pamilla Bruce. Pamilla was thirteen years old in 1851 and we are not sure but, she may have been a child of natural birth and a granddaughter of

Robert and Mary. We will deal with her and her family later,
So we will proceed using a few abbreviations as follows:

Gen. 2- Mary Bruce was the second oldest child of Robert Bruce and his wife Mary Kennedy and this was one of the second generation of this Bruce family to live in Canada.

Hezekiah was a son of William Brown and his wife Betsy Allan who was a daughter of Jonah Allan. They had eight sons and two daughters. William Brown was born in New Brunswick in 1775 and came up into Elizabethtown in Leeds County with his family in 1808. In 1809 they settled on lot 22 in the 6th concession of Kitley. This lot is right at the cross roads in the Village of Toledo and would run north from there. This would be before the old Perth road from Brockville to Perth was opened up. Thad. W.H. Leavitt in his History of Leeds and Grenville published in 1879 states that William Brown attended one of Gourlay's meetings held in William Tallman's school house on June 22nd, 1818. Gourlay who like William Lyon McKenzie was working for a reform of government and the abolition of Clergy Reserves in Upper Canada held meetings all through the Johnstown District at that time. William Brown was appointed a member of a committee at that meeting. William and his family later settled in the 9th concession a short distance west of the Village of Frankville. He died in 1831 at 56 years of age.

We have a note taken from the Farmersville (Athens Reporter dated May 24, 1884 as follows:

"We regret to learn of the death today of an old resident of Kitley, Hezekiah Brown in his 78th year. The funeral will be held at Frankville on Monday May 26th at 2 o'clock".

It is quite apparent that William W. in the 1851-1852 census is listed as Wellington in 1861 and Cynthia M. in 1851-1852 census was the one the family later referred to as Minerva. There is some difference of age between the two census. This is not unusual.

ROBERT BRUCE

Gen. 2-

Robert the third child and only son of the original immigrants Robert Bruce and Mary Kennedy, married Mary Edgar the oldest child of James Edgar and his wife Mary McMaster on the 9th of April, 1838.

This must have been quite an eventful year for this young couple. He bought the farm March the 4th. They were married April 9th and apparently moved into a log house. He was called up in November with the local militia to go to the battle of the Windmill at Prescott. According to family legend the battle was over when the Kitley brigade got there. In February their first child was born. At the time of their marriage he would be twenty-five and she was in her twentieth year. The farm they bought was next to the James Edgar property located on the old Victoria road, now highway 29 and about 10 miles from Smiths Falls. Douglas Bruce, a great grandson, now owns and occupies a new house built on the foundations of the old frame homestead.

It is rather hard to see how my grandparents managed to raise a very large family, build a good house, two barns and other buildings and die at 90 years of age with a few dollars in the bank. There was eighteen births in the family. One child died at 5 years of age and five others in infancy. The children who died in early childhood are buried on the Edgar place now owned by Daniel Fowler and the graves are only marked by field-stones and, of course, there are no inscriptions.

It is said that the first work Robert did away from home was at the construction of the Rideau Canal through Smiths Falls. He would be in his teens at that time.

We will list this family and their descendants generation by generation considering Robert and Mary Kennedy the first immigrants to Canada as gen. 1.

The census records for 1851 and 1861 have been searched and where possible the dates have been checked with the gravestone inscriptions. Most of the dates check within a year except for Adelia and Lucinda. In the census they are two or three years older. The 1851 and 1861 census dates agree and I have used them,

James Bruce

M. Lucy A. Patterson b. 1841 or 1842 d. Feb. 11, 1911

James and three of his younger brothers learned a trade. They were wheel wrights and wagon and carriage makers and blacksmiths. James and his wife Lucy must have gone to the U.S.A. where horses were in great demand during the war.

James and his wife settled in the town of Lowville in Lewis County, New York State, and they lived there until they died. In the 1865 U.S.A. census we find in the industries listed "Ireland & Bruce Blacksmiths". Again in Beer's Atlas of Lewis County, N.Y. 1875 under Manufacturers - "Bruce, J.E. Manufacturer and dealer in Carriages, Wagons, Sleighs, Cutters, etc. Horse Shoeing and Repairing done on short notice". James is said to have become quite well-to-do and besides his property and business in Lowville he owned a block of property in Rome, N.Y. However, his Rome property was destroyed by fire and the insurance failed. This dealt him a serious financial loss. When factory-made carriages came on the market he was engaged mostly as a salesman.

Albentha, a daughter, was two months old in the 1865 census. We do not know when she died but probably in early childhood.

At the time of his death he was listed as a carriage salesman. He was ill for quite

a long time before he died. He was married but had no family. His wife's name was Katherine and she was 33 years old in the 1905 census. Katherine later married Manning Fitch. They are all buried in the Rural Cemetery in Lowville, N.Y. James Bruce also had a daughter named Effie, who married Joe Bowman. They lived in New York City and I believe were separated in later years.

- Gen. 5- They had a daughter, Marthina, who visited her relatives in Canada when she was about 16 or 17 years old. We have no further information.
- Elizabeth Bruce Nothing much is known about Gen. 3this child except that my father and my two aunts told me when I was quite young that she had died when she was five years old. My aunts, Alvira and Abigail, told me that she was the oldest or the oldest girl of the family. My father thought that she was born later. However, sometime after my brother Robert Mansel Bruce died his son found an old paper that was apparently written by Sarah Bruce, (Mrs. Eli Jones of Lowville, N.Y.) and must have been written around 1870. It gives the dates of birth of all the family. Elizabeth according to this was born May 20 - 1845 and died July 19 - 1848. There is no evidence that she is buried at Toledo and is likely buried on the old Edgar place.

Ira Edwin Booth was a medical doctor and we have the following from the American Medical Association in Chicago. He was born in Canada in 1863 - graduated from Medical College, New York University, May 1887 and was granted a license to practice medicine in 1887. He had his office at 437 W. 124th Street, New York City, from 1887 until 1936 when he went to Buffalo (Erie City) with his office at 311 Main Street. 1942 was the last year he held a license to practice. He would be 79 years old at that time.

Dr. Booth married Jessie Gardiner, a daughter of L.M. Gardiner of Gouveneur September 1, 1892. Jessie died and the Doctor married twice after that. He had one son Edwin who visited in Canada with his father when he was a boy of 10-12 years of age. We have no information about the boy Edwin.

Gen. 4-

Ettie Booth was not married when she died at 24 years of diptheria in New York City. She was brought to Lowville for burial. We have some other notes on the Booth family supplied by Mrs. Homer Perkins of Watertown, N.Y.

A copy of Mrs. Booth's obituary which states that she took suddenly very ill about noon on July 4th, 1898 and died within a few hours. She was living alone in Rodman and none of her relatives reached her before she died. Her son, Dr. Booth, it says was rusticating in the wilderness of Canada fifty miles from any mail or telegraph and did not learn of his mother's death until a week later. She was buried in the Rural Cemetery in Lowville.

Alvira never married and lived at home in the old homestead all her life. She and her sister Abigail looked after their parents during their declining years and then they stayed on at the old home the rest of their lives. These old aunts were very kind to me and I spent many of my childhood hours at their place. Alvira was a great reader and liked to read aloud. She had read to me most of the children's books from the old school library before I was able to read well myself. I remember so well sitting on the floor by the hour beside her as she read many of the books of the Old Testament. I became quite familiar with the stories and characters of the Bible at a fairly early age. She also liked to tell about the early days as she remembered them. How as a little girl she would sit at the window and watch the deer crossing the road at the top of the hill. She remembered when they washed the sheeps' wool in the creek, dried it, carded and spun it and wove it into cloth and carpets. They had some very nice wool carpets on their floors that were homemade. How they used to cut the flax and put it in the creek to ret before carding, spinning and weaving it. Although she said before she was very old the Dayton family started a carding mill about a mile west of toledo. She told about the commotion when one night a bear broke into the calf pen and killed one of the calves. She told about her father driving the cows home after dark when they had strayed away over on the Patterson place and a wildcat followed him jumping from tree to tree. She said she remembered her father carrying a bushel of wheat on his back and walking to the nearest town several miles away and then returning with the flour. She was, of course, twelve years old when her grandfather died and her grandmother died two years later so she remembered some of the things they told about the old country and the trip coming over.

Alvira was the sort of person who was always ready to help when sickness or trouble occurred either among the relatives or neighbours.

Unfortunately she had to endure a long period of physical and mental decline before her death.

Another very clear recollection I have is that Alvira was an inveterate berry picker. In the summertime in berry season and when I was about 10 years old she called and picked me up morning after morning to go berry picking with her. As I recall it now her enthusiasm for the job was much greater than mine. Time for coming home wasn't of great importance but coming home with all the pails full of berries was a must.



Eli Jones ran a boot and shoe store in Lowville for 30 years and just a few weeks before his death he sold his interest to his partner George L. Goutremont. From his obituary we learn that he was only sick a day or so and died of a kidney ailment. Interment was in the Rural Cemetery. My Aunt Sarah visited in Canada every summer for several years after her husband's death. She died after quite a long illness at the home of Mrs. George Coad, her sister in Smiths Falls. She is buried in Rural Cemetery in Lowville.

Robert Bruce according to his obituary went to Lowville in 1865. He was a blacksmith and carriage maker and he ran a shop in Lowville until a few years before his last illness. He died of a malignancy in his throat and was sick quite a long time. He and three of his brothers all learned their trade in the old stone shop on the hill in Toledo. This building was first built for a school and was the first schoolhouse in Toledo but was used as a shop by some of the Bruce family for many years in fact until a few years before John Bruce died in 1927. The building is now used as a storage and warehouse by Struther's Furniture and Appliances Ltd. I have some quite fond memories of my Uncle Rob and Aunt Lottie. I went with my father and mother when they visited them in Lowville when I was quite young and I remember they visited us in Canada in later years. He was a rather short but very powerfully built man and he loved to hunt in his spare time. I remember on two occasions he took me with him hunting partridge in the nearby bush. Aunt Lottie was a very kind and motherly sort of woman. (See Appendix 2).

Fred Bruce learned the blacksmith trade in his father's shop and worked at it until he retired when he was well over seventy years of age. He was said at one time to be the best horse-shoer in Lewis County. In 1973 he was living at a nursing home in Martinsburg at 97 years of age. He never married.



Clifford Bruce was a cigar maker by trade. I remember watching him cut the tobacco leaves and roll them into cigars.

I was amazed at how fast he could make a fine high-priced cigar.

He never married and he lived with his mother until she died and then Fred and he lived together.

Abigail Bruce never married and stayed with her parents at the old homestead and after their death she and Alvira lived there until they died. Abigail loved flowers and I so well remember their front yard where the flags (a type of Iris) would be in bloom as soon as the snow was gone, then the lilacs and different kinds of roses, the tiger and orange lilies and peonies as well as beds of annual flowers.

Henry Bruce lived and worked at his trade in Toledo until about 1900 when he moved to Smiths Falls. They were on what is now Chambers Street for some years and then they lived on Elmsley Street until they died. They are buried at Toledo.

In Smiths Falls he worked for a great many years at the Smiths Falls Malleable Iron Works. I remember watching him as he weighed in the different kinds of iron as they were wheeled in and dumped into the furnace to make a batch of malleable iron.

His son Dr. E.L. Bruce had a very distinguished career as a geologist, mining engineer and teacher. He was born and attended public school in the village of Toledo in Leeds County, Ontario. He attended high school in Athens and later in Smiths Falls. He had completed his high school and model school training before he was old enough to teach. He taught school at both Newleliss and Addison, Ontario and then entered Queen's University in 1905. He graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Science in 1909 and then later completed his requirements for the degree of Bachelor of Arts in geology. As an undergraduate he led his classes in geology and minerology, played on the University's first football team and became president of his Alma Mater Society.

He went to Columbia University and took his degree of Master of Arts in 1912 and then his Doctor of Philosophy in 1915. In 1916 he attended the University of Wisconsin for special training in Precambrian geology.

Beginning in 1912 he did geological surveys for both the Dominion and Ontario governments as well as continuing his academic studies. He was a permanent member of the Geological Survey of Canada and in 1919 he joined the staff of Queen's University as Professor of Minerology. In 1927 he became the first Miller Memorial Research Professor at Queen's and in 1944 on the retirement of Dr. Baker he became the Head of the Department of Geology which position he held at his death.

During most of his teaching career he engaged during the summer months in geological surveys for mining companies and different Governments and this extensive field experience was one of the reasons for his great success as a teacher and supplied him with much material for his many publications. His

book "Mineral deposits of the Canadian Shield" published in 1933 was the most authoritative source of information on the Precambrian geology of Canada. It was revised and brought up to date just before his death.

He became a well-known figure at meetings of geologists in both America and Europe. He attended the Fourteenth International Geological Congress in Spain in 1926, the Seventeenth Congress in Russia in 1937 and in 1948 the Eightteenth Congress in Great Britain.

He was a member of the Royal Society of Canada, a Fellow of the Geological Society of Finland and of the Geological Society of America and President in 1943.

Louis Douglas Bruce is a graduate of Queen's
University. He lives and works in Brampton, Ontario.

Geoffrey Bruce had his B.A. from Queen's in 1947 and his M.A. from Columbia in 1948. In 1948-1949 he studied at the New School for Social Research at Columbia University. He joined External Affairs in Ottawa in 1952. He was posted to the Canadian Embassy at Tel Aviv 1955-1957 and at Ottawa 1957-1960. He was posted to the High Commission, Colombo, Ceylon, 1960-1963 and the Canadian Embassy at Vienna, Austria, 1963-1967. Alternate Governor for Canada on the Board of Govenors of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Vienna. He was in Ottawa 1967-1972 and in 1973 was made a Permanent member of the Canadian Mission to the United Nations.

PAMELA BRUCE

In our introduction we mentioned Pamela Bruce. The 1851 census shows Robert and Mary Bruce, and also Pamela age 13 years. She was evidentally a grandchild and may have been a child of natural birth. Be that as it may, she had a number of descendants who were very fine people, and we shall list her as generation 3 and continue from there.

From the Penguin Dictionary of Names we have the following: The name Bruce is from a place name in Normandy - I Briouze, a muddy place, II Brus meaning a Heath - It is the family name of the Earls of Elgin and three other peers.

From the Dell book of Names we have - Bruce (French) - from the brushwood thicket.

From Black's, The Surnames of Scotland, we have the following: This surname so celebrated in the history of Scotland is of territorial origin from the Chateau d'Adam at Brix, between Cherbourg and Valognes, Normandy. The ruins of the extensive fortress built in the eleventh century by Adam de Brus and called after him Chateau d'Adam yet remain. The first Robert de Bruce in Britain was probably the leader of the Brus contingent in the army of William the Conqueror in 1066. This knight brought with him two sons and it was a direct descendant of his who became Robert Bruce king of Scotland on March 27, 1306. He was given a large tract of land in Yorkshire known as the lands of Skelton. He died about 1094. It seems that another branch of the family acquired a share of the Orkney earldon before 1066 and there is also a Swedish branch of the family ennobled in 1668 and probably descended from Robert Bruce of Lynmylne.

Robert Bruce son of the knight who came over with William the Conqueror's army was given the Lordship of Annandale in Scotland by David I king of Scotland and Robert the king acquired the Earldom of Carrick through his mother.

There is another source that says that the Bruces were of Northern Origin and that Sigurd the Vicking son-in-law of Malcom II had four sons, one of whom was named Brusi. It is claimed that he was the progenitor of the Family of Bruce. Be that as it may the name is widely spread throughout the English speaking world and they seem to have arrived in Ulster in Ireland in the early seventeen hundreds although they probably were in Southern Ireland around Cork at an earlier date.

There is one thing that anybody who bears this surname may be sure of, they are not a descendant of Robert the king or of any of his four brothers, because there were no male descendants.

The present head of the Bruce clan is now The Earl of Elgin, descendant from Bruce of Clackmannan who sprang from a cousin of King Roberts. His seat is at Broomhall, in Fife Scotland.

The first of our Bruce family who came to Canada in 1823 from Londonderry the centre of the linen trade in Ireland was probably a weaver.

Notes On Other Families

John H. Elliot's obituary states that he was born in Brockville, Ontario in 1817. He went to Lowville in 1838 and died there at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Robert Bruce May 13, 1906. Besides Mrs. Bruce he left four other children. Mrs. James Bowman of Utica N.Y., Mrs. Levi Plumb of Brown's Nurseries Ontario, Charles Elliot of Lowville, and Ira Elliot of Martinsburg. Also two sisters, Mrs. Zilpha Richardson and Mrs. Agnes Monroe of Lansdowne, Ontario.

Mr. Fred Smith who was a high school teacher and later a school inspector in Kingston, Ont. was a grandson of David Bass and his wife Elizabeth Bruce. Some time before he died in 1958 he did quite a lot of research on the family but we have not been able to see his work. It may be in the hands of his adopted son Malcolm who is living somewhere in British Columbia.

However, we do know the Basses were U.E. Loyalists. Dr. Adonych Bass and his family were living on Bunker Hill near Boston Massachusetts on June 17th, 1775 and they had ringside seats at the battle of Bunker Hill. The doctor was a Loyalist and the family immediately decided to move to Canada but unfortunately Dr. Adonych died before they could made the move. However, the rest of the family came and settled in Augusta Township in Grenville County, Ontario. It is said that the two sons were able to exchange some of their property in Massachusetts for cattle which they drove all the way up to their new home in Augusta. They made more than one trip.

APPENDIX 7

The following information about the Booth family, the husband and son of Mary Jane Bruce, was received too late to be incorporated in its proper place in the book.

Mary Jane's husband, Gershom Wing Booth, died very suddenly in Syracuse, N.Y. on July 15, 1896 of a cerebral hemorrhage. His death certificate was signed by L. F. Weaver, M.D., Coroner. He was a salesman, born in Canada and had lived in the United States for twenty-eight years. He was buried at Lowville, N.Y. on July 17. His father's name is given as Gershom W. Booth.

Mary Jane's son, Dr. Ira Edwin Booth, died February 5, 1944. His birth date is given as January 15, 1863. He died in Buffalo and was buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery. His wife, in Buffalo and was still living. She was sixty-nine Eliza Isabel Guest, was still living. She was sixty-nine years of age and her address was 401 Delaware Avenue, Buffalo. He died of uremia.

The Brown Family

The Bruce Family book was finished and ready for distribution in late December, 1974 and now some four months later I have found some further information that may be of interest to the descendants of Hezakiah Brown and his wife Mary Bruce.

This information has been found in a manuscript compiled by Mr. Howard Morton Brown of Ottawa. Mr. Brown has used a good deal of professional help in gathering this material and he has very kindly given me permission to pass it on to the members of the Brown family who have been mentioned in my book "The Bruce Family of Kitley Township".

This information pushes back the ancestral record of the Brown family a few generations and also clarifies the record of the family of Hezekiah Brown and his wife Mary Bruce. Mr. Brown's manuscript is in the library of the Ottawa Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society and may be seen and examined there for much more detailed information than I will give here.

Elder John Brown

We do not know the date of birth but Elder John Brown (Browne) died at Killingsworth Connecticut April 29, 1708. His wife Hannah was the widow of Augustine Williams of Stonington, Connecticut and a daughter of Nicholas and Elizabeth Norton of Martha's Vineyard, Edgartown, Massachusetts. John Brown had died without a will and Hannah took oath on June 8, 1709 as to the correctness of the appraisal of his estate valued at 284 pounds 17s-5d. She died before February 4, 1710 and two Bondsmen, John Crane and Daniel Williams, were sworn in as administrators of the estate.

There was only one child from this marriage.

Samuel Brown - was born April 16, 1700. He died
before 1745 and according to his grandson
Zerah Brown in his application for a land grant in Canada Samual
died while fighting in Cuba. England and Spain were at war 1739-1748,

and many men from the American colonies joined the British Army and fought in that war.

Samuel married Joanna Loomis a daughter of Hezekiah Loomis and his wife Mary Porter of Windsor, Connecticut. They were married November 8, 1721. Samuel and Joanna had ten children and after his death she married Dr. Daniel Porter of Waterbury, Conn.

Captain Hezekiah was a very outspoken loyalist. He was charged with saying in the presence of a number of people that the Congress ought to be punished for putting the country to so much cost and charge, for they did no more good than a parcel of squaws and that Boston had wrongfully undertaken to quarrel about the tea and, we had no hand in it; that our General Assembly was as arbitrary as the Pope of Rome, when it cashiered Captain Amos Bronson and engsign Samuel Scovell. Mr. Howard Browne's manuscript continues at considerable length with the affairs of Captain Hezekiah at this time.

He was married in New Brunswick and came with his family to Elizabethtown Township Leeds Co. in 1808 and into Kitley Township in Leeds Co., in 1809 where he was granted 200 acres of crown land in concession 6 lot 22.

The oldest child of William Warner was William born in New Brunswick March 4, 1804. He died in Kitley March 25, 1869. He was married November 4, 1829 to Melinda Dack. They are both buried in Lehigh's Cemetery. Hezekiah that married Mary Bruce was the second child. One of the daughters married John Woods of Kitley and a son David was a witness at William's wedding in 1829. There was also Aaron Brown a farmer in Kitley in concession 6 lot 27. We have no

record of the rest of William Warner's children.

Mr. Howard Morton Brown compiled his manuscript in 1972 and he is a descendant of Jonah Brown a brother of William Warner who came up into Leeds Co. in 1808. Howard Brown was born in Carleton Place Ont. He is a retired civil servant and he is living at 23 Crescent Hights in Ottawa. He is also a brother of Captain Roy Brown D.S.C. and Bar who shot down Baron Manfred Von Richtofen in World War I.

Mr. Brown's manuscript throws some further light, and makes some changes in what I said on page 18 of the Bruce Family Book. I found in the 1851 - 1852 census William W. Brown 18 years of age his next birthday and no mention of Wellington. However, wellington was listed in the 1861 census so I assumed wrongly that Wellington was listed in the 1861 census so I assumed wrongly that

The William W. listed in 1851-52 was William Warner the oldest child of Hezekiah and Mary Bruce and the third child listed Warren was really Warren Wellington.

This William Warner was born in 1834. He is named in his father's will of 1884. He married Lorette Livingston a daughter of John Livingston and his wife Loretta De Wolfe of Kitley. In 1861 they were living in Athens, Younge Township and he was a joiner by trade

Warren Wellington was born in 1837 and was unmarried in 1861. He was mentioned in his father's will in 1884.

Ezra was born in 1839. He married Nancy L. Livingston November 3, 1858. Nancy was a sister of William Warner's wife who was born in 1842. Ezra was not was born in 1835. Ezra's wife was born in 1842. Ezra was not mentioned in his father's will of 1884 and perhaps had died before that time.
