Oliver Crouse 1777-1841 the Yeoman

According to tradition Oliver Crouse was a tall, slim, fair, adventurer born in the U.S.A. of Dutch descent. As a young man he settled in the Bay of Quinte area in the early 1800's. First mention of him in official records follows:—On January 29th, 1812, Catharine, wife of Oliver Crouse of Marysburgh petitioned Sir Isaac Brock for 200 acres of land as a daughter of Lt. Donald McCrimmon U.E. Loyalist. It was granted on Feb. 24th but the Grantee died in (1813) before a location ticket was issued. In March 1814 Rev. Robt. McDowall, Presbyterian, married Oliver Crouse of Fredericksburg to Mary (Maria) Nestor of Isle de Tanti (Amherst Island) where the couple settled. The pioneer enlisted 1812 in the 1st Frontenac Militia under Lt. Col. Thos. Markland during War of 1812-14. He helped defend Kingston against the Americans and remained on the Muster Rolls until 1819. For his services the Gov't. granted Oliver Crouse, Yeoman, of Tyendinaga, Midland District of Upper Canada, 100 acres of land on January 19th, 1836. This Grant of E 1/2 Lot 7, Con. 13, Enniskillen Twp., Kent County through Stants Sager of Napanee, was sold August 26th, 1836 for £50 to Andrew Hamilton of Toronto. The Crouse family had moved c1834 to Hastings County on unoccupied Tyendinaga Twp. Indian Reservation lands (north part) where Oliver cleared land and built a log cabin.

He farmed here until his sudden death April 15th, 1841, age 64. His body was found at eventide in the woods by two sons searching for him when failing to return from cutting timber. His widow, Maria, was a short, dark Irish lady who was blind when she passed away March 1st 1866, age 80 years. On her marble slab tombstone in the Methodist Cemetery near Camden East village appears the epitaph "Mother Watch The Gate". She lived in later life with John McLeod Crouse a well-known Camden East sawyer operating a saw-mill on the Napanee River, who drowned in his own mill-pond in 1867 leaving a wife and seven children. Two other sons of Oliver Crouse, Charles B. and James went to the '49 California Gold Rush with others of the Napanee district. Two covered wagons drawn by oxen (with spare teams hitched behind) made the long trek to San Francisco travelling about two miles an hour. Successfully panning gold the two brothers returned, bought up land, but died unmarried and intestate. Richard H. Crouse became Executor of their estates and in Chancery Court action of November 6th, 1873 at Belleville his brother Philip, six sisters, and twelve nieces and nephews, became beneficiaries. Philip Crouse was a lifelong farmer of Albert in Tyendinaga Twp. with three sons and three daughters. The name Crouse means "Sprightly and Confident"

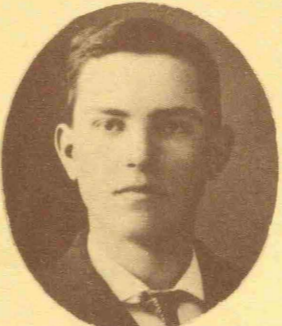

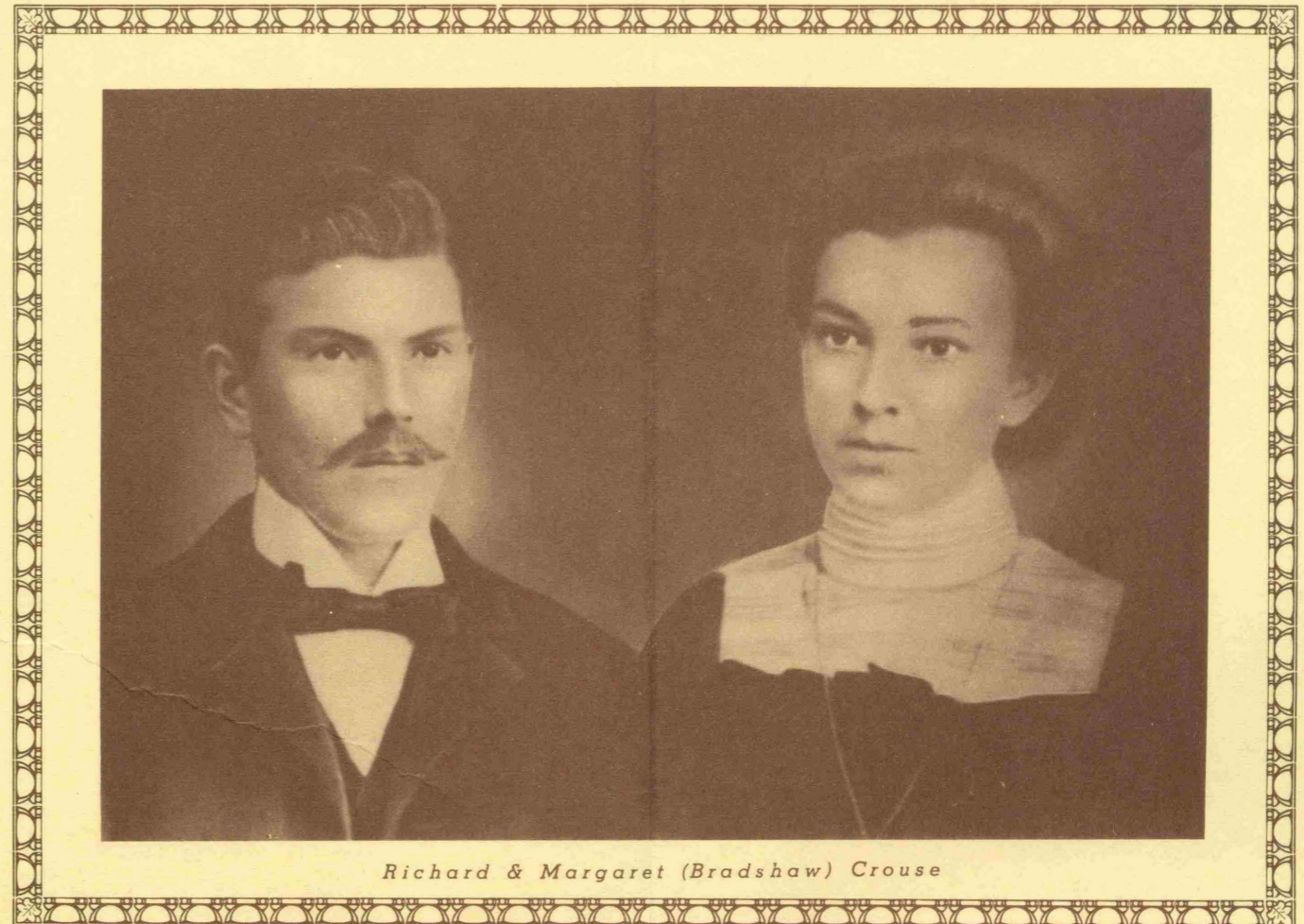

Richard William Crouse (C-25 eldest child of Oliver and Emma, was tall, dark, slim, with brown eyes. A Liberal, Union man, Methodist and Orangeman, he was progressively lumberjack, cheesemaker, machinist and millwright. Lived at Deseronto five years after marriage moving from there to Oshawa in Spring of 1906. Bought property in 1911 building home at 95 Queen Street two years later. Hobbies—woodworking, gardening, and inventing. Buried from his home September 9th 1922, to Union Cemetery at 2.30 pm. with Rev. T. E. Cotton of the Christian Church officiating.

Margaret Bradshaw 1878-1961

born—June 11, 1878; Forest Mills | died—Aug. 15, 1961; Oshawa

Margaret Elizabeth "Maggie" Bradshaw (B-21, daughter of Charlie and Ina, named after both Grandmothers. Married R. W. Crouse April 3rd, 1900 at Selby, Rev. W. Lambert of Methodist Church officiating. She was short and stocky with black hair and eyes, a devoted Christian mother. Attended old Metcalfe St. Methodist Church later joining Christian Church on Centre Street with her family. On August 17th, 1961 at 2 p.m. a large concourse of friends, relatives, and neighbors attended her funeral conducted by Rev. W. G. Dickson of Centre Street United Church.

George Crouse 1879-1948

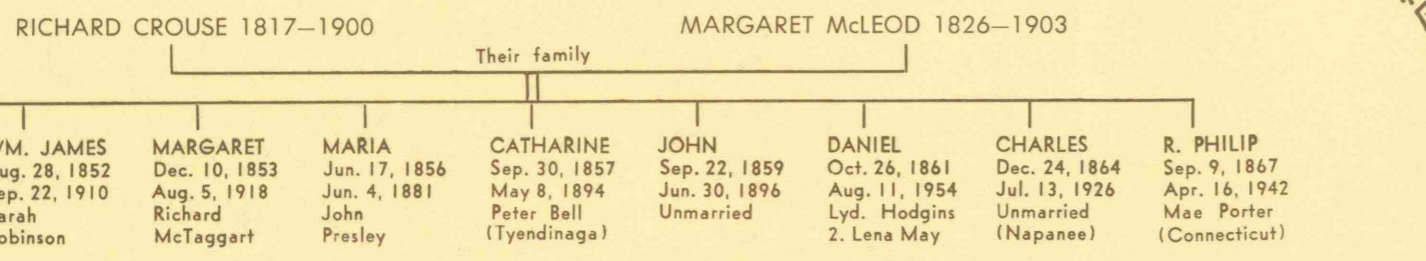
born—Jan. 20, 1879; Lonsdale | died—June 29, 1948; Oshawa

George Lafayette Crouse (C-26, son of Oliver and Emma, came to Oshawa in late Fall of 1910 from Napanee. He was fair, heavily built, with brown eyes, a machinist and Union official. As a lodgeman he belonged to the Masonic Order, Foresters, Oddfellows and Chosen Friends. Served on Board of King Street United Church. Married (2) Margaret (Shipley) Waddell in 1931. Phoebe Ann Ethel Bradshaw (B-25, daughter of Charlie and Ina, was born in Hungerford Township on the Joshua Weighell place near Marlbank. She was named after her Aunt Phoebe Ann Campbell (B-17). Married at Napanee, September 20, 1905 to George L. Crouse with Rev. J. R. Real officiating. Of pleasing personality, dark, slim, a good mother and neighbor, her untimely passing was mourned by all who knew her.



Richard Crouse 1817-1900

born—June 3, 1817; Amherst Island, Ont. died—Oct. 6, 1900; Lonsdale, Ontario

Richard Hitchens Crouse (c-9) of Pennsylvania Dutch ancestry, son of Oliver and Maria, was named after an Uncle Capt. Richard Hitchens. He was of medium build, dark, black whiskered a skilled hunter and fisherman. Of the Reform Party in politics he came to Hastings County c1834 as a youth and farmed his lifetime in Tyendinaga Township. No religious convictions.

Margaret McLeod 1826-1903

born—April 2, 1826; Cornwall, Ontario died—July 28, 1903; Lonsdale, Ontario

Member of a famed Highland Scottish Clen of the Hebrides, Margaret McLeod spoke Gaelic, was a devout Presbyterian. Fair, tall, blue eyed, a beloved person who always wore her tartan shawl. Married Richard H. Crouse March 11th, 1850 at Belleville, Ontario with Rev. Gragg officiating. Both are buried in Jones Cemetery, Albert, Ontario, near Lonsdale.

Oliver Crouse 1851-1924

born—Apr. 5, 1851; Lonsdale, Ontario; died—Oct. 6, 1924; Oshawa, Ontario

Oliver (C-16) son of Richard and Margaret Crouse (C-9) of Hastings County was tall, slim, fair and soft spoken. He had light blue eyes and a long sandy beard. As a youth he worked on his father's farm of 100 acres (1/2-Lot 37, Con. 6, Tyendinaga Twp.) which his father had purchased from the Queen on May 26th, 1847, for £62-10s. Later he worked in the hopyards of his uncle Charles Lafayette LeRoy at Shannonville. A Liberal and a Methodist he was a horse and buggy mail carrier. His hobbies were woodworking and cabinet-making. At various times the family lived at Albert, Kingsford, Thrasher's Corners and Napanee. Retiring in 1920 he and his wife and daughter came to Oshawa to reside with a son, George Crouse. Buried in Union Cemetery, Oshawa, on July 24th 1924, at 3 p.m., leaving five sons and five daughters to mourn his passing.

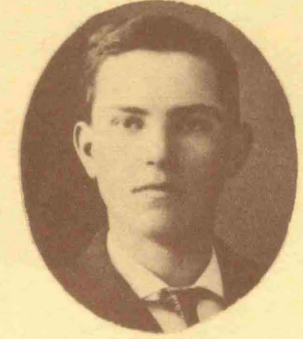

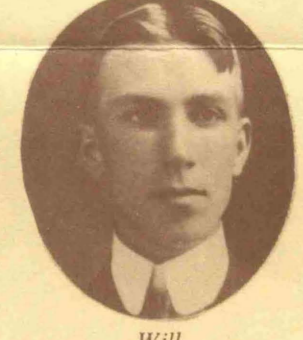

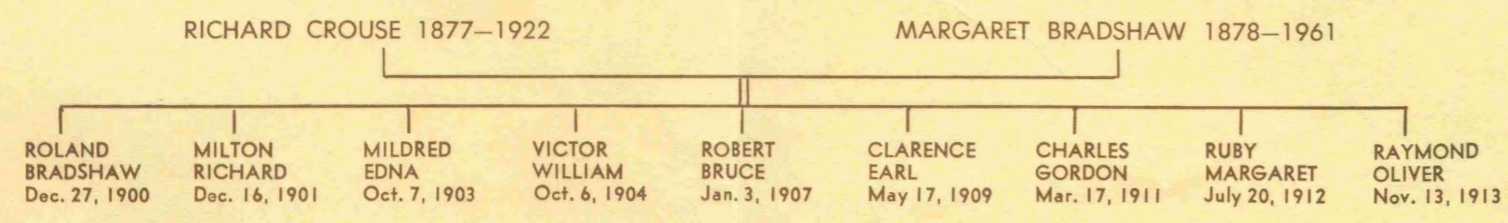

Richard William Crouse (C-25 eldest child of Oliver and Emma, was tall, dark, slim, with brown eyes. A Liberal, Union man, Methodist and Orange-man, he was progressively lumberjack, cheesemaker, machinist and millwright. Lived at Deseronto five years after marriage moving from there to Oshawa in Spring of 1906. Bought property in 1911 building home at 95 Queen Street two years later. Hobbies:—woodworking, gardening, and inventing. Buried from his home September 9th 1922, to Union Cemetery at 2.30 p.m. with Rev. T. E. Cotton of the Christian Church officiating.

Margaret Bradshaw 1878-1961

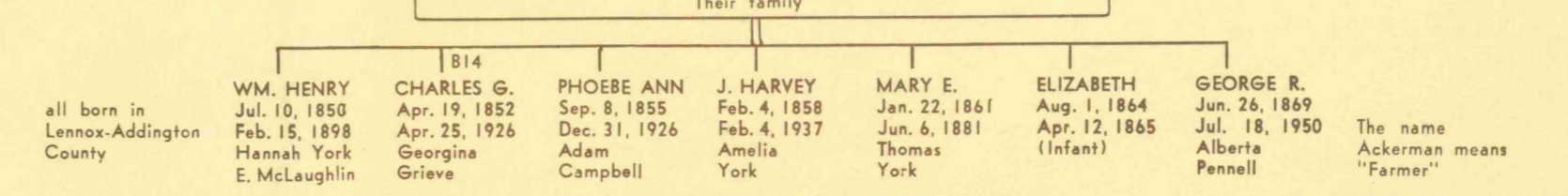


David Bradshaw was born May 22, 1798 at Fredericksburgh Twp., Upper Canada (near Napanee) son of Asahel Bradshaw U.E.L. 1761-c1827 and Azubah Flawley. The latter was a daughter of Capt. Jephtha Hawley U.E.L. (1740-1813) and Esther Castle. David was Baptized by Rev. John Langhorn, pioneer Anglican Missionary, when he was eight days old. About the year 1816 he married Mary (Polly) Carter who was born in the U.S.A. August 10, 1799. The couple came to the Twp. of Sophiasburgh, Prince Edward County about 1821 where they settled on Lot 76, Con. 2 at Allistonville, which is now in Hallowell Twp. This land was bought for £100 from Samuel McKay of Fredericksburgh. It was sold March 24, 1828 to Archibald McFaul for £200. Their children Asa, Elizabeth, and Henry were born on this place and Baptized by a Methodist Minister of Picton, Elizabeth probably died young as she does not appear in later records. The family then moved to Camden East Twp. in Lennox-Addington County, north of Napanee, where David Bradshaw purchased W¹/₂ Lot 2, Con. 3 from John R. Haynes Feb. 4, 1829. It was here that the rest of the family was born. In 1832 and 1846 the pioneer sold his farm in halves to Joel C. Penney and Archibald Rose and moved five miles north to the Roblin area.

He bought part of Lot 5, Concession 6 from James Hastie on June 7th, 1847. Seven years later David Bradshaw and his wife and family moved to Richmond Twp. where he and his eldest son Asahel lived in a one story log house farming together about two miles west of Westplain, Ontario. He was a good churchman, farmer and shoemaker. He and his wife were of the Society of Friends (Quakers) later becoming Methodists. On July 29th 1829, David Bradshaw took Oath of Allegiance to the King at Adolphustown with George Ham, J.P., officiating and always was Conservative in thought. The family took pardonable pride in their United Empire Loyalist ancestry and hundreds of descendants of the patriot still live in the Bay of Quinte area where his Grandfather Capt. James Bradshaw, U.E.L. (c1723-1797) settled about 1785. The two eldest daughters of the pioneer married early settlers of Richmond Twp. and are the progenitors of the Windover and Pringle families. Sheldon the third son and his wife Isabella settled in Camden E. Twp. He was a tailor by trade. David Bradshaw died April 16th, 1869 age 70 years. His wife Polly died of dropsy March 19th 1871. Both are buried in the south-east corner of the old Windover Cemetery at Forest Mills where their white marble gravestones still stand to their memory. The name Bradshaw means "The vast wood".

The Ackermans' were Holland Dutch and Colonial American settlers of New Jersey. A daughter of James Ackerman, Jr. and Elizabeth Hart, Margaret Ackerman was short, fair, could speak the Dutch tongue and was a Methodist. She and Henry Bradshaw were married on August 11th, 1849 and are buried to-gether near his parents in the old Windover Cemetery at Forest Mills.

Henry Bradshaw 1826-1897

born—Jan. 3, 1826; near Picton, Ontario died—Nov. 19, 1897; Westplain, Ontario
Of Irish-American U. E. L. stock, William Henry Bradshaw (B-6) was a son of David and Polly Bradshaw. Possessing a fine Christian character he was an old-time Methodist and a Conservative. A farmer and part-time shoemaker, he lived in Camden East Twp., Ontario, coming with his parents c1828. He later moved to Richmond Twp. settling a few miles west of Westplain.

Charles Bradshaw 1852-1926

born—Apr. 19, 1852; Roblin, Ontario | died—Apr. 25, 1926; Deseronto, Ont.
Charles Geddes Bradshaw (B-14, son of Henry and Margaret (B-6) was born in Camden East Twp., Lennox-Addington County. He was short, stocky, fair, with blue eyes and ruddy complexion. As a youth he was a farmer and lumberjack. A faithful Methodist and strict Conservative he served as a School Trustee. He came with his parents to Westplain, Richmond Twp. (Lot 11-Con. 9) then bought Lot 16, Con. 7 near Forest Mills after marriage. About 1880 he moved to Marlbank settling later in Albert, Tyendinaga Twp. He and his wife and family then moved to Point Anne where they operated a Boarding House and Blacksmith shop for nine years. He moved to the Belleville District then retired in 1921 to Deseronto where he purchased a three family terrace on Thomas Street. Buried from Deseronto United Church, Tuesday, April 27th, 1926, at 2.30 p.m.

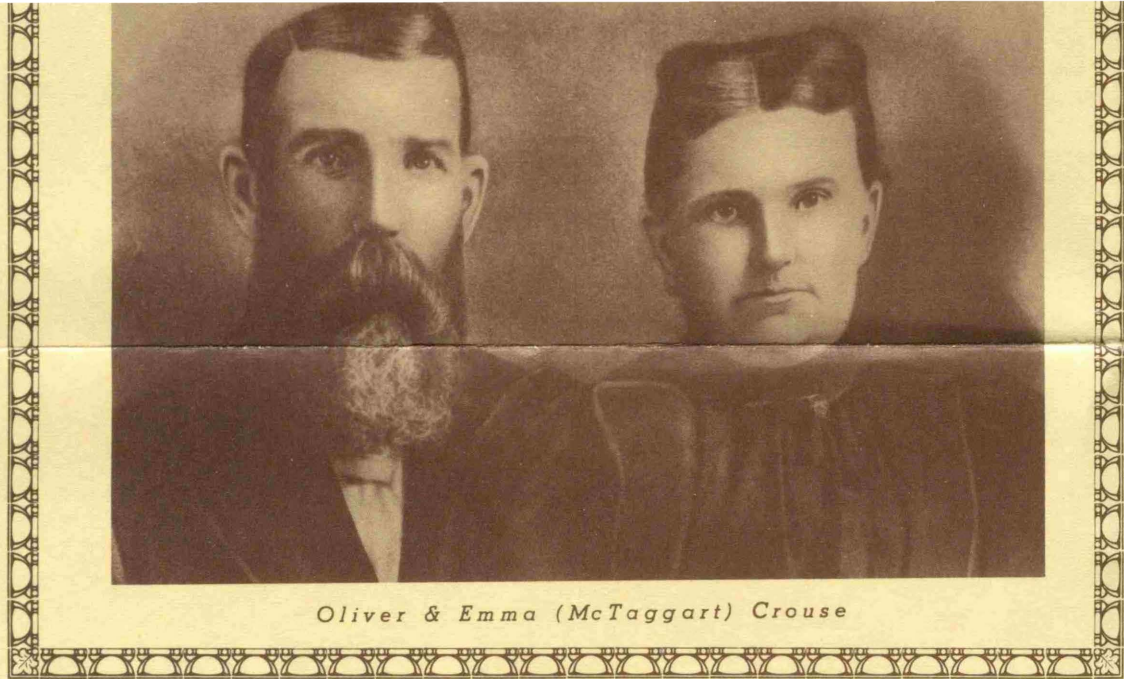

Emma McTaggart 1855-1929

born—July 16, 1855; Lonsdale, Ont. died—Dec. 14, 1929; Northport, Ont

Emma McTaggart (M-8), a daughter of George and Anne (M-1) was born on Lot 38, Con. 5, Tyendinaga Twp., Hastings County. She was dark with brown eyes, Quakerish in dress, possessing a fine sense of humor. Her main interests were her family, relatives, and home. She was an ardent cultivator of house plants and flowers. On December 22nd, 1875, she married Oliver Crouse at the Methodist parsonage home of Rev. J. Kilgour, Shannonville, Ontario. After the passing of her husband she and daughter Della moved (1929) to Northport to live with another daughter, Mrs. Herbert German. Funeral:—Tuesday, December 17th, 1929, at 9 am., by Rev. C. E. Cragg. Interment in Oshawa. The name McTaggart means "Son of the Priest". The family is from Galloway, Scotland, and is a sept of the Ross Clan. They came to Canada 1786 via New York State.

George McTaggart 1817-1879

born—July 13, 1817; Demorestville, Ont died—Nov. 13, 1879; Lonsdale, Ontario

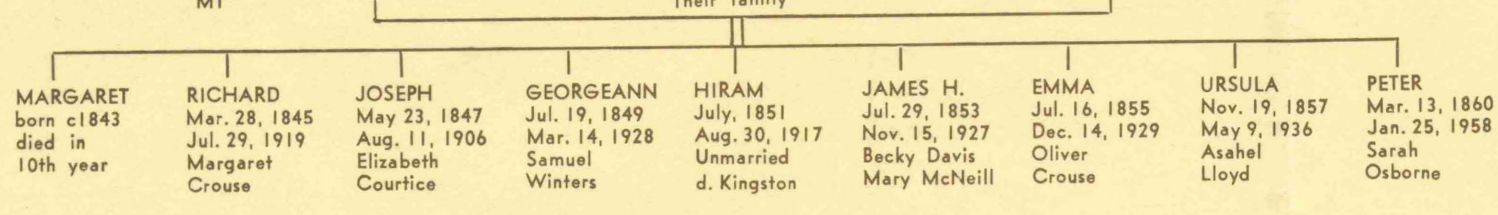
A member of the Free Church of Scotland, George McTaggart (M-1) was of Loyalist and Scottish ancestry. He came to Tyendinaga Twp. as a young man in the 1840's. He was a farmer, expert carpenter, barn-builder, and coffin maker. A cripple with a large blonde beard and blue eyes, he was buried in the Presbyterian churchyard at Lonsdale, Ontario, age sixty-two.

Anne Morden 1818-1898

born—Sept. 9, 1818; Demorestville, Ont. died—March 24, 1898; Lonsdale, Ontario

Eldest child of Joseph R. Morden 1795-1885, and Margaret Betskey, 1798-1841, Anne Morden was of Welsh Extraction. Her people were early American settlers who later became prominent Loyalists of Sophiasburgh Twp., Ontario. Tall, dark, brown eyes, humorous, she dressed plainly befitting her Quaker creed. Buried in Jones Cemetery Albert, Ontario, near her home.

GEORGINA GRIEVE 1852-1929

born—Aug. 12, 1852; Roblin, Ontario | died—Mar. 25, 1929; Deseronto, Ont

Georgina (G-6), daughter of William and Elizabeth Grieve (G-1), was born on Lot 21, Con. 8, Richmond Twp., Lennox-Addington County. She sang in the Presbyterian Church Choir, played the piano, and learned the Tailoress trade. Proud of her Scottish ancestry she was a brunette with dark eyes, a ready smile, and gentle manners. Married to Charles Bradshaw in her Grieves Corners home on September 8th, 1875, by Rev. Barnett, Methodist Circuit minister. Buried beside her husband in Deseronto Cemetery on Wednesday, March 27th, 1929, with Rev. W. D. Harrison of the United Church officiating. The name Grieve means an "overseer" or "Bailiff", a Border Scots family of Roxburghshire. Her Grandfather Robt. Fairbairn born c1786 settled first at Bytown (Ottawa) probably helping to build the Rideau Canal. His wife Kate was buried at sea just before the landing in Canada.

ELIZABETH FAIRBAIRN 1817-1879

born—May 13, 1817; Lowlands Scotland died—1879; near Roblin, Ontario

Of an old Border Scots family Elizabeth (Bessie) Fairbairn came to Canada c1828 in a wooden sailing ship. She was the eldest child of Robert Fairbairn who settled in Richmond Twp. in the 1830's, and his wife Kate Scott. She married William B. Grieve on July 1st, 1842, and is buried with him in the Camden 5th Concession Presbyterian Church graveyard, near Roblin, Ont.

WILLIAM GRIEVE 1818-1885

born—Mar. 29, 1818; Castle Craig, Scotland died—Sept. 22, 1885; in Napanee, Ontario

William Bell Grieve (G-1) was a tall distinguished Scotsman with curly hair. He came to America as a child and settled in Richmond Twp., Ontario, on 100 acres where was erected a log cabin and a Tavern which was licensed in 1846. The place became known as Grieve's Corners. A Presbyterian, he later moved to Napanee erecting a Hotel on the Market-place in 1879.
