**The Johnson Day Brick Yard:**

Lewis Johnson Day, born in 1811, established himself in a frame house on Lot 15, CON III Kingston Township on the north side of the present Highway 2 in Cataraqui Village.

At this location he divided his time between the running of his farm and operating a brick manufacturing business that he established on a four and a half acre site located near the road.

A large number of residential buildings in Cataraqui Village and surrounding area were built of Johnson Day bricks.

Sometime after 1851, Johnson Day erected a large brick residence on his property, using bricks made in his own brick yard. An extensive brick carriage house, erected to the rear of the brick residence, gave the structure a very elegant and substantial appearance. This house was the largest residence to be built at the time in the village.

It would be expected that he had completed its construction in time for his bride, the former Mary C. Purdy,

whom he married in 1865. To this union was born a son, Dr. Lewis Johnson Day, in 1870.

In addition to the farm and brick business, Lewis Johnson Day served as a Justice of Peace for many years at Cataraqui Village.

Following the death of Lewis J. Day in 1877, the brick yard may have been run by another family member. Directory records for 1895 show his next door neighbour, Osmond McMichael, as being a brick manufacturer. Perhaps he sublet it during the interval prior to the Day property being sold to Robert A. Marrison, who moved to the property about 1900.

Robert A. Marrison gave the name "Pleasant View" to the property and this name has been carried on by the next owners, the Riley family.

The extensive grove of walnut trees that established themselves about Pleasant View were originated by Mrs. Simpson who lived next door. She is reported to have planted the first walnut tree in 1846, and it is likely that squirrels were responsible for their spread eastward to Pleasant View.

Henry Day Age 54 (b1788) is the son of Lewis Day (born 1772) m. Mary Hill b1781  
Lewis Day (b1772) is the son of Barnabas Day Sr (b1745) U.S.A. - (U.E.L)

The 1861 Census of South Crosby Township in Leeds County lists John Day Age 7 (born c1856/7) as son of John and Elisabeth Day (Born in USA and Ireland). John Day, Age 14 (born in Ont c1856/7) is on the 1871 Census of South Crosby with Anne Day Age 63 (Born in England) and Sarah Day (Age 62) Born in England. This is the only John Day (or Johnston Day) that shows up on the 1851 to 1881 Censuses of F & A, Montrose, and Leeds County townships - JES.
