# Historiography

The Gage Coat of Arms illustrated left was drawn by an heraldic artist from information officially recorded in ancient heraldic archives. Documentation for the Gage Coat of Arms design can be found in Burke's General Armory. Heraldic artists of old developed their own unique language to describe an individual Coat of Arms. In their language, the Arms (shield) is as follows:

"Quarterly: 1st and 4th, gyronny of four az. and arg., a saltire gu.; 2nd and 3rd, az., the sun in splendour, or ." When translated the Arms description is:

"Quartered: 1 and 4) divided diagonally four times blue and silver, a red St. Andrew's cross; 2 and 3) blue, with a gold sun in splendor."

Above the shield and helmet is the Crest which is described as: "A ram, pass., arg., armed, and unguled, or.

A translation of the Crest description is:

"A silver ram walking, hooves and horns gold." Family mottos are believed to have originated as battle cries in medieval times. The Motto recorded with the Gage Coat of Arms is: COURAGE SANS PEUR"

(Courage Without Fear)

Individual surnames originated for the purpose of more specific identification. The four primary sources for second names were: occupation, location, father's name and personal characteristics. The surname Gage appears to be occupational in origin, and is believed to be\_associated with the English, meaning, "one who acted as pledge for another in the courts." The supplementary sheet included with this report is designed to give you more information to further your understanding of the origin of names. Different spellings of the same original surname are a common occurrence. Dictionaries of surnames indicate probable spelling variations. The most prominent variations of Gage are Gege, Gagge and Gages.

Information available to us indicates that in 1971 there were approximately 3450 heads of households in the United States with the old and distinguished Gage name. The United States Census Bureau in 1970 estimated that there were approximately 3.1 persons per household in America which yields an approximate total of 10,695 people in the United States carrying the Gage name. Although the figure seems relatively low, it does not signify the many important contributions that individuals bearing the Gage name have made to history.

No genealogical representation is intended or implied by this report and it does not represent individual lineage or your family tree.

#### THE GAGE CONNECTION

The family crest - and it's motto -"Courage Without Fear"

From a book entitled "The Gage Family" - by Wartman - I have learned the following.

"In France there is a town in the valley of the Seine, called Gaugy, near Rouen, where the Normans lived before they conquered England. From this place was taken the family name of Gauge or Gage.

"COURAGE WITHOUT FEAR"

The name "GAGE" has its history. One authority claims that the name is derived from an official position. He says, "Gager or Gauger". His office was to attend to the King's revenue at the seaports, and with the measurement of all liquids, such as oil, wine and honey. Another says, "Gage is a Scandinavian word which means 'a pledged warrior' or 'one to fight'. Still another claims GAGE from Gaigi, Normandy. In the first record found and dated 1180, Ralph de Gauchi or Gaugi held a fief in Northumberland, which he acquired by marriage. Robert de Gauchi was Baron of Slesmouth, Northumberland in 1165 and had a brother, Roger de Gaugi, to whom King John, in 1203, committed the custody of Argentan Castle and Forest. Willia de Gaugi, his son, of Northampton, was father of John de Gaugi, who in 1260, with Petronilla, his wife, paid a fine in Essex and in 1269 he occurs in Suffolk. Roger de Gaugi, in 1321 was returned from Suffolk to a great council at Westminster. John Gage, of this family, settled in Glouctershire, from whom descended the Viscount and Baronets Gage. Another authority, giving the same origin as the immediate foregoing, adds; 'The name Gaugy is now held by the Viscounts Gage, of Firle, Sussex; and Baronets Gage, of Hengrave, Suffolk. Le Sire de Gaugi was at the Battle of Hastings'.

There is a prominent family by the name of GAGER and it seems improbale that our name cmae from the first source mentioned. But the last two seem the proper source, and they are really one. The Normans were Scandinavian, hence the word might become a name, as we have seen. And, as the word or name signifies, 'pledge warrior' or 'one to fight', we must compare it with other things we know to be distinctively <u>Gage</u>. Take the motto - 'Courage Without Fear' - does this not confirm the Norman source? Then consider the crest - it is not a tame, meek, harmless creature, but the ram, noted for its fighting qualities. It would seem, then, that <u>Gage</u> came to us from the Scandinavian, through the Normans in Normandy. And, just as we are really Normans in blood, so we are Normans in name.

<u>ORTHOGRAPH</u> - Names on the records are not autographs; but they were written by the Secretary or Clerk, according to the sound, as the names were pronounced to him. It sometimes occurred, doubtless, that he did not catch the sound accurately, and therefore mistook the true name. It is not surprising that many of the names are incorrectly spelled. Early English spelling was entirely phonetic. Words were spelled in a variety of ways. This variance was increased by the composite complexion of the nation. Composed of members of many nations, there was great carelessness and irregularity in the spelling of proper names in staid old England; and surely in the undeveloped American Colonies, we would expect to find it worse. The spelling of our name was tentative and capricious when registered, and from the records the following forms have been taken - Gage, Gaige, Gauge, Gach, Gadge, Guage, Geage, Gaugy, Gaugi, Gauchi, Catch, Gadch, etc.' We cannot claim to go back as far as the Normans, but we do have dates from as far back as 1690.

Many people have helped in the preparation of this book - among them - Martin Gage, Grover Gage, Eva Gage, Norman Gage, and of course, the immediate family of my husband, Bert Law.

It has been fun putting it all together, and I would like to dedicate it to all of the Gage's who have gone before.

This information below came from Martin Gage, and from it I have been able to put a lot of the families in their proper sequence. For the sake of convenience I have called the

Samuel Gage b. 1690-95 Samuel Gage Each of the following generations will have a number - I think that we can go as high as 11 or 12 generations.

This information of the Gage family was found and received by the Devon and Cornwall Research Group. The research member's name was Mrs. C.S.Blott, of Plymouth, Eng. With using a computer index showing back to the year 1710 it named Samuel marrying a Mary Moor in 1723 at Uplyme, Devon. It is presumed he was born between the years 1690-95. The parishes covered by the computer index were - Uplyme, Axmouth, Axminster, Musberry, Combeplyne, and Rouston. With the computer only showing back to 1710, it was suggested that the next place to search would be the next county of Dorsetshire, as Uplyme is very near the border and the Gage family may have resided there at one time.

Benjamin moved from Uplyme to Axmouth when he married in 1826. His name was spelled
Gaige when he arrived, but for some reason it was changed to the spelling of Gage.
This was common for spellings of names to vary from parish to parish. He was a
farmer, having a farm of 200 acres, a farm manager, 2 servants, and 8 labourers.
He died in 1841 at the age of 48 of consumption. To-day this is known as T.B. As
far as it is known the Gage family were mostly farmers. But one of Samuel's sons
became a man of the sea. Benjamin and Elizabeth had at least 6 children, and among
them or in addition possibly twins.

## CHAPTER I David Benjamin Gage

He was a small man with beautiful, curly snow white hair - a Gage characteristic as was his red nose, both of which some of his children and grandchildren have inherited. In his early years he delivered bread in the Kingston area by horse and cart for the princely sum of \$5 a month. He had several grocery and butcher shops in Kingston. On some of the following pages you will see pictures of them. His sons and grandsons worked for him in the store. His wife, Cassie, was in the words of her grandson, 'everything that a grandmother should be'. Cassie was loved by everyone. After her death, David Benjamin lived alone in his home and when he was over 90 years of age, he painted his house. He was a strong Methodist and bellonged to Queen Street Church. On Confederation Day, July 1, 1867, he & his father

walked from Bath to Kingston - a distance of 17 milee. dit ! Ada Lena Gagelooked like her Dad and had his wonderful white hair. She was fond of needlework, especially needlepoint. Harry Law was a Barnado boy and he was one of them who made good. After working on several farms, he found his way to Kingston and worked for a short time in Bibby's - a mens wear store. Then he joined the permanent army and over the years he rose to the rank of Major. He was the first Canadian soldier to land in France during World War I, since he belonged to the medical corp. During the war, Ada, with Gage and Bert, spent a year in England as an officer's wife. After the war, Harry sold insurance and became a member of the Million Dollar Club. Then he taught physical education at K.C.V.I. in Kingston and in Shawinigan and Verdun, Que. He was always interested in flowers and his roses were a sight to behold. He was in great demand as a judge of flowers at the local fairs. He also became an artist of some note. He was a pupil of Kierstead. And he built a lovely cottage on Cosy Island at Knowlton Lake. It was another show place for flowers and many wonderful family gatherings were held there.



Mark Walroth<sup>10</sup>Smith graduated from Loyalist College in Belleville in social work and is engaged in that type of work in Belleville.



Bertram Gordon<sup>O</sup>L#W worked in Shawinigan, Que. at C.I.L.Dupont for a number of years. In World War II he went overseas as part of the dental corps. After that he returned to Queen's University and got his B.A. degree. Then he attended O.C.E. in Toronto. The account below is written by his grandson - Martin Gage.

My grandfather was born Mar. 3, 1870 in Kingston. His parents were Richard and Jennifer (Edwards) Gage. To this union were born 6 children, all boys, my grandfather was the 5th child born. He married my grandmother in 1896. She was born Feb. 8, 1871 at Owen Sound. Their children were Charlotte May Gage, Herbert Matthew Gage, & George Harvey Gage.

My grandfather was a harness maker by trade. This carried him to many places in Ontario. In 1905 he moved his family to Winnipeg & worked for the Great West Saddle Co. They lived there for a number of years. In 1915 my grandfather moved to Alta. taking up a Homestead in the Hanna, Craigmyle area. In the next few years he travelled to many different areas - Gadsby, Didsbury, Delia & finally back to Craigmyle. He had many failures to his crops caused by the weather - hail and droughts. With the mode of travel changing he was finding it difficult to work at his trade. In 1933 he moved to Edmonton and became a market gardener. In 1936 my grandmother suddenly died leaving my grandfather totally in limbo. In 1938 he sold his property (148 - 118 Ave.) & moved to the U.S.A. In 1950 he came back to Canada after losing his 2nd wife in a divorce action. He came to my father's place to live & he was only a couple of months there when he had a series of heart attacks. He died before the Dr. could arrive. He is buried in the Forest Lawn Cemetery at Ponoka, Alta. where both of my parents are buried.

My grandfather loved and enjoyed good band music. He played in the Salvation Army bands when he was a young man. The service given for his memorial was by a member of the Salvation Army who played in the same band as he did while in Edmonton.





The following is another account sent by Martin Gage. It gives a few more details of life in the West at that time. The pictures are also courtesy of Martin Gage.

My grandfather homesteaded about 100 miles south east from where I live. It is known as the Prairie. For some unknown reason it was called the Goose Lake Line. My parents married and lived in this area, a small town named Craigmyle. My mother's parents came West from Ontario in 1910 and settled in a nearby area called Youngstown. My mother's name was Gladys Cathleen Martin. She died in 1957 & my father died in June of 1980 at White Rock, B.C. He is buried in Ponoka. My father farmed for a short time, ran grain elevators, became a poultry producer, and when he moved to Ponoka from Edmonton in 1941 he bought a grist mill and also started a chicken hatchery. He sold this and then raised chickens for 'friers'. He sold this, went to B.C. and ran a hatchery until he retired in 1970.

I was married in 1958 but sadly it ended in a divorce in 1973. We had 2 children a boy & a girl. I remarried in 1975. In 1949 I commenced work at the Alta Hospital in Ponoka - on the nursing staff and I have recently retired after 35 years of service.





There was no family by this marriage. Below is an account of the George Harvey Gage family written by his son - Martin Gage.

My father was born in Gananoque, Ont. When he was 5 years old his family moved to Winnipeg, Man. where he received most of his education. After 10 years in Winnipeg, they moved to Alta. At age 18, my father was on his own farm. In 1924 he married my mother, who was born in Chatham, Ont. Her parents lived at Youngstown, Alta., 20 miles to the east of Hanna. Their names were Matthew and Jeanie Berry (Adams) Martin.

My lather was farming for a time & then he became an agent for the Alta. Wheat Pool in Youngstown and Stanmore areas. He was let out of this position during the great depression in 1929. He then went back to farming in the Hanna area but the drought or dry years made it impossible to grow anything at all as all the fields were a dust bowl. This did not happen for one year, but for many years until ways were introduced to correct this from happening again. I can see my father standing in his fields just shaking his head in disbelief at what was happening. Then my parents moved to Calgary, but soon we moved on again to Edmonton about 300 miles west. My father farmed some and started to raise laying hens and sold the eggs. We moved closer to the city ( 14420 -118 Ave.) He gradually increased his poultry flock until 1940 when he was totally burned out. For a number of years while still in Edmonton , my father worked for the Provincial Hatcheries. In 1941 he sold his property and bought a feed mill in Ponoka, Alta. He had this for 5 years. Then he sold the mill and started a hatchery. He kept this only a short time and sold it. He then became manager for a poultry farm raising 'friers' for the Central Alta. Dairy Pool. At this time my mother died. For awhile he ran his farm. Then he remarried. In 1965 my parents left the farm and moved to Surrey, B.C. and he became an operator for a hatchery for the local Co-Op. In 1970 my father retired and moved to Victoria. B.C. In 1975 they moved back to the mainland at White Rock. B.C. He died there in 1980.

My father was a man who enjoyed peopleand would do most anything for them without any expense to them. He said many times that if he charged another dollar for his produce he would have been a rich man. He loved good band music and played in the bands in Youngstown and Ponoka. He enjoyed watching good baseball and hockey games. He was on the local executives for both, was a member of the B.P.O.E.(Elks) in Youngstown and Ponoka, on the first Board of Directors for the Ponoka Credit Union in Ponoka, and was one of the first members to join the Alta. Wheat Pool in Youngstown when it was organized. He was not a religious man but was active in his church body.



I can remember my father saying when he arrived in Edmonton with my mother and 4 children that he had only 50 cents in his pocket. My sisters had already started to school and the second year we were there I started. We had 7 miles to walk in the summer and in the winter a neighbour would use a horse and sleagh covered over with a tarpaulin and with hot bricks in a container to keep us warm. In 1937 we moved closer to the city. NOw we were only 3 miles from the nearest street car line and 5 miles from the nearest school. The school was the other way and we had to walk. Summer was pleasant but winter was very cold at times. The older children made the trails and the younger children carried the lunches and homework.
