

discovered the town of Ganges in the Province of Languedoc, France, as a result of researching my ancestors GANGE in the West Country of England. The genealogical research that commenced more than twenty-five years ago has accumulated into different distinct families. The work is presented in different volumes, this being the first.

This volume consists of a family history and genealogy of Gérard de Vissec de la Tude and his descendants. Cheynae, Desbois and Badier, genealogists, wrote that Gérard de Vissec de la Tude was alive in A.D.1097, and that this family name and/or property was established in the Diocese of Lodève and d'Alais, Province of Languedoc, France. Later, during the 14th century, a dispute arose between the nobility of Vissec de la Tude and the Counts d'Armagnac after which the family name and/or property was associated with the ancient district of Rouergue, in the eastern part of the Province of Guienne, France. In 1786 the family estate was divided into four sections:

- 1). A family branch settled in Pézenas, in the diocese of d'Agde, Province of Languedoc.
- 2). A second branch settled in Saint Martin, Province of Languedoc.
- 3). A third branch settled in Jonquière and Sedan, Département of Ardennes, Argonne region, near the Belgium border.
- 4). A fourth branch settled in Ganges, in the diocese of Montpellier, [now in the Département of Hérault], Province of Languedoc, France.

The third branch associated with Sedan was Huguenot. Interestingly, in 1700 Jean Genge de Melvis, as a Huguenot refugee, departed from London, England, for James River, Virginia, America (R.A. Brock., ed., 1973). Many Huguenots fled religious persecution, first to Holland or Germany, some of whom later relocated in England. Relocation settlements in England included Plymouth, in the County of Dorset, Taunton, in the County of Somerset, and Bristol, formerly in the County of Somerset but now in the County of Gloucester (Bevan and Duncan, 1991; Brooke, 1991). A link has yet to be established between Jean Genge de Melvis and the family described in this volume, as well as between the Gange families in the West Country of England. Nor have links between the Gange families in the West County of England been linked to this same family, the fourth branch of the Vissec de la Tude. These leads provide an opportunity for future research.

The fourth branch settled in Ganges, thus acquiring the title of Marquis de Ganges. The focus of this volume of my book is on this family branch, who eventually settled in the British Colony of Newfoundland, now known as the Province of Newfoundland, in Canada. I also investigated the possibility of other family members having travelled with the regular army of Languedoc to North America, and settled in the area of Quebec during the winter of 1759-1760.

Credit is to be given for the work of Cheynae et al., notwithstanding the difficulties of reading it. No other records searched by myself date this family as far back as they have accomplished. Their work is entitled *Genealogy of the Decent Nobillaire of the family of Ganges 980-1948*. However, the work is undated and unpublished to the best of my knowledge. It is difficult to estimate the year the work was completed. The presentation appears to be in draft form and does not appear to be recent.

In spite of the difficulties of reading this work, I was able to synthesize the information in the Outline descendants report, the Descendants charts, and the Family group records contained in the Annex of this volume. The notes in the Family group records are information from Cheynea et al, unless otherwise stated. Additional references are intended to enrich or add to the work of Cheynea et al and in some cases to advise the reader that clarification is needed since other sources indicate different names and/or dates of events - particularly events occurring in more recent times. I have not verified the creditibility of Genealogy of the Decent Nobillaire of the family of Ganges 980-1948. This would be a difficult task because the work lacks complete documentation of sources and works cited. A number of spellings have been corrected, and sometimes guessed, due to the absence of French accents in the work of Cheynea et al.

There is no reason to believe that this family was anything but a noble and famous family. The published work of Prevost, D'amat and de Morembert (1982) has confirmed this.

he French Province of Languedoc has an ancient history connected to the "oc language" or the "langue d'oc," now considered a minority language (Encycyclopaedia Britannica, 1967. Roberts, 1976). During the 16th century, the Calvinist religion spread throughout Languedoc where a history developed regarding the Huguenots of Languedoc. This period includes the Wars of

Religions (1561-1598) and the Edict of Nantes, as well as the numerous occasions between 1620-1629 when the Huguenots of Languedoc fought the king's army. During 1790 Languedoc was absorbed into the *Département de Hérault* (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1967).

The community of Ganges had a population of 4,590 persons during the middle of the 19th century (Smith, 1855). Ganges is situated along the River Hérault, just east of where the river divides, and is located approximately 25 miles from Montpellier - the center of the judicial administration of the département. The Census Return of the Département de Hérault notes a population of 471,429 persons for 1954 (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1967). The silk factories in Ganges have a history dating back to at least 1855, whereas nylon factories are a more recent development in the community. The industries of oil and wine also contribute to the economy of Ganges (Smith, 1855. Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1967).

The ancient family **GANGES** of Languedoc is rich in military as well as ecclesiastical history. The unpublished research by Cheynae, Desbois and Badier, [undated.] has traced this family back to 980 A.D. Cheynae et al. [undated.] described this family having had the title of Vissec de la Tude. Then in 1786 one branch of the family relocated and became known as Lords of GANGES, after the name of the place they inhabited. Prevost, D'amat, and de Morembert, (1982) published the military history of Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES, Comte de Vissec, and of Charles de Lanède, 1st Marquis de GANGES (d. 1669), his wife and two of his six siblings.

The works of Cheynae et al. [undated.] and Prevost et al. (1982) need clarification regarding Charles de VISSEC de LATUDE (1638-1668), Marquis de Ganges, Baron of States, and Lord of St. Martial de Souberrace, and Charles de Lanède (d.1669). There is an assumption by the author that these two people are the same person, as certain events and details of their lives can be matched. For example, Charles de Lanède (d. 1669), 1st Marquis de Ganges, son of Jean Pons de VISSEC de LATUDE (d. 1657) and Jeanne de SAINTE-ÉTIENNE, daughter of the Baron de Ganges, was part of the ninth generation of descendants of Pierre de VISSEC, Lord of Vissec de la Tude of CAUSSE. Chenyae et al. [undated] traced the latter as being the first generation in the GANGES family tree that had

connections with Charles MARTEL [ca.688-741], Charlemagne, both of the Frankish empire, and Pepin, the King of Italy. Pierre de VISSEC, was described as a chevalier and prominent Lord at Vissec, Causse, Sorbs, in Central Europe.

The wife of Charles de Lanède (d. 1669), Anne-Élisabeth (1636-1667), Marquise de Diane de Rossan had a tumultuous life and a tragic death that are the subject of a number of novels. Such novels include Diane de Joannis, Marquise de Ganges, sa vie, sa mort tragique d'après des documents inédits, L'assassinat de la Marquise de Ganges, and La Première Marquise de Ganges, sa vie, ses malheurs et sa fin tragique. A play about her life was performed at the Théâtre de la Gaîté on November 18, 1815. The play was known as La Marquise de Ganges ou les trois frères?

According to tradition, Anne-Élisabeth (1636-1667) was used as a model for the painting *Le miracle des roses de Sainte Roseline de Villeneuve* and immortalized in this painting by MIGNARD (Prevost, et al. 1982). Nicolas MIGNARD (1606-1668) was known as *Mignard d'Avignon* and his younger brother, Pierre Mignard (1610-1695), was known as *Mignard le Romain* (Myers et al.

1963). Didot and Hoefer, (1968) described Nicolas MIGNARD as a portrait painter, an architect and a stone engraver. This artist was first situated professionally at Lyon circa 1644, at Rome (1644 - 1646), at Avignon (1647 - 1660), and lastly, at Paris (1660-1668). The works by Mignard d'Avignon include many of nobility, including Louis XIV. The painting of Le miracle des roses de Sainte Roseline de Villeneuve by Nicolas MIGNARD hangs in the Musée Pierre-de-Luxembourg, Villeneuve-les-Avignon, north-east of Nîmes in France (Girard, 1997)

Anne-Élisabeth (1636-1667) was the daughter of Gabriel de Joannis, Lord de Roussant, of Saint-Sauveur. As well, she was the widow of the Marquis de Castellane. At a mere thirteen years of age, Anne-Élisabeth had married the Marquis de Castellane who died six years later in Sicily. Afterwards she was much sought after for her youth, beauty and wealth.

The marriage of Charles de Lanède (d.1669) to this young, beautiful person occurred during July, 1658 (Prevost et al., 1982), or on August 8, 1658 (Cheynae et al. [undated.]). Two of the six siblings of Charles de Lanède (d.1669), Marquis de Ganges, caused his wife much grief. One was a soldier who died in 1669 [possibly

Bernardin], and the other a priest [possibly Henri or Gabriel (d. 1710)] who later moved to Holland, changed his surname and his religion, and then married. The surname taken in Holland by the former priest was La Martellière. The soldier and the priest each proclaimed to his sister-in-law his desire for her. However, Anne-Élisabeth (1636-1667) refused to accept their proclamations. The events that followed are the plot of the novels and plays.

Charles de Lanede (d.1669) and his wife Anne-Élisabeth (1636-1667) produced two offspring, Alexandre, (1659-1721), and Marie-Esprit GANGES who first married Henri de FAY, Baron of Vezenobre, and subsequently was the wife of Paul de FORTIA, Lord d'Urban (d. 1735) (Prevost et al. 1982).

Charles de Lanède (d.1669) had at least one great grandson, Louis-Alexandre de GANGES (d. 1794) (Cheynae et al., [undated.]) and/or Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES (b.1738) (Prevost et al., 1982). Further clarification is needed with the works of Cheynae et al. [undated.] and Prevost et al. (1982) with regard to Louis Alexandre de GANGES, 6th Marquis de Ganges, and Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES (b.1738). Again, the author is assuming that these two are the same person since certain events and details from each life can be matched. The author has chosen to use the names of the published work by Prevost et al. (1982) when the information is matched.

Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES, Comte de Vissec, was born on July 14, 1738, at Ville franche-de-Rouergue. He was the son of Louis de GANGES and Marie d'Alary, and a twelfth generation descendant of Pierre de VISSEC, Lord of Vissec de la Tude of CAUSSE, in Sorbs. The father of Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES (b. 1738) had an extensive career as a captain in the military dragons. He was a Knight of Malta, and he received the Cross of the Order of Malta. Louis-Claude-Marie-Anne de GANGES (b.1738), like his father, had a military history with the dragons. On February 1, 1757, he became Cornet in the dragons de Beauffremont. During 1759 he was slightly wounded in Minden, Germany, while fighting in the military campaign of 1758-1761 where the British infantry successfully fought the French cavalry. On April 28, 1778, he became Colonel of the 2nd regiment of Brittany, and the year after was promoted to the position of Commanding Colonel of the regiment of the Bourgogne infantry. On December 5, 1781, he rose to the rank of Brigadier. Again he rose in rank to that of Commandant in 1788 and finally to the rank of Commandant of the infantry brigade of Languedoc.

Louis-Alexander de GANGES (d. 1794), is described as having been on trial before the French Revolutionary tribunal. During 1794 he was sent to the guillotine. Subsequently his wife and child fled from France. The voyage was eventually to lead the pair to settle in Channel-Port aux Basques, Island of Newfoundland, where they and/or their decendants became landowners on Vardy Island (Genge, 1996). Smallwood (1988) stated that the GANGE/GENGE family resided at Channel circa 1840. Channel is described in the 1884 Census Returns and the population of Port aux Basques was later described in the first enumeration of the 1891 Census Returns Port aux Basques. The latter census described the total population as seventy-seven persons.

GANGE families

(later spelled GAGNÉ), in the Province of Quebec (Lower Canada).



uebec history is a rich blend of English and French cultures. Since this research determined that at least one GANGE family in Quebec, Canada originated from France, one would be remiss not to include the following findings of the surname of GANGE in the Province of Quebec. One may be curious to learn that a branch of this family emigrated to a destination that embraced the language with which these GANGE persons were familiar. The emigration may have been voluntary or a result of army activities.

The regular army of Languedoc travelled from France in 1756 under the command of General Louis Joseph de MONTCALM (1712-1759) (Wrong, 1914). The Languedoc regiment was created in 1672 as part of the regular army in France (Saguenay, 1908). Their uniform was white, like that of the French line (Stacey, 1959), and the regiment's flag was in the colours of purple and rust (Saguenay, 1908). This regiment formed part of eight battalions led by General MONTCALM (1712-1759), Marquis de Montcalm-Gozon (Wrong, 1914; Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1967). General MONTCALM(1712-1759) brought the regular army of Languedoc into battle at Oswego in 1756, Ft William Henry in 1757, Ticonderega in 1758, and lastly the Plains of Abraham in Quebec. On September 13, 1759, General MONTCALM was killed during battle on the Plains of Abraham (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 1967). The Seven Years' War had not ended in 1760 when this army was transferred to the command of François GASTON, Marquis de LÉVIS (Saguenay, 1908). LÉVIS took the soldiers of the Languedoc army into battle with him at Sainte-Foye in April 1760 (Wrong, 1914; Stacey, 1959).

Joseph GAGNÉ is noted to have married in 1781 in Ste-Foye (Elliott, 1992). This implies the possibility that he was a member of the regular army of Languedoc who settled in Sainte-Foye following the battle that occured there. Wrong (1914) noted that some members of the army had in fact joined the community of Sainte-Foye for the winter of 1759-1760 during the period of the transfer of command from MONTCLAM to LÉVIS. Elliot (1992) does not mention the surname of GANGE; rather that of GAGNÉ appears in *Les Canadiens français 1600-1900*. This leads one to question if the surname of Joseph GAGNÉ or that of his ancestors were orginially spelled GANGE.

Interestingly, GANGE is absent from the works of Tanguay (1991), and Lussier (1965) as well. Rather, their work is comprehensive for the surname of GAGNÉ. This leads one to speculate about the original spelling of the surname GAGNÉ. When a comparison is made between these works and the personal submissions to the International Genealogical Index (1994), discrepencies emerge leading one quickly to realise that much more work is needed to determine the original spelling of the surname GAGNÉ. For example, the International Genealogical Index (1994) records the weddings of Pierre GANGE (born 1701) who married Angelique BOUCHARD in 1730; of Madeleine GANGE, born May 31, 1710 at St François (International Genealogical Index (IGI), 1994), whose

father was Dominique GAGNÉ (1684-1755); and of François GANGE (born 1680) (IGI, 1994) who married Marie Madeleine DUPUIS on Jan 14, 1709 at La Prairie. Tanguay (1991) refers to these same individuals by the surname GAGNÉ. Furthermore, Elliot (1992) spelled as GAGNÉ the surname of Theotiste GANGE who, according to the International Genealogical Index, married Michel BILODEAU in 1775 at Montmagny.

Interestingly, a different example was found where an individual appears to be listed as GAGNÉ in Quebec, but having migrated to Ontario, is listed under the spelling of GANGE. This person was born Samuel GAGNÉ in 1837 in Quebec, a son of George GAGNÉ, yet his marriage in 1865 to Elizabeth is recorded in Toronto, the Province of Ontario, under the name of Samuel GANGE. George GANGE was his father (Britnell, 1986). The 1871 Census Ontario, County of York, confirmed the spelling for Samuel who was born in Quebec, 34 years of age and married, to be in fact that of GANGE. The name of his wife is stated as Elizabeth and his three daughters as Elizabeth, age 5, Matilda, age 2, and Jane age 2 months. Moreover, Elliot (1992) lists a number of persons from Quebec during the early 1800's with the names Samuel and George under the surname of GAGNÉ, not GANGE.

Elliot (1992) provides details of three researches conducted on the surname of GAGNÉ. They are, *Percé, Its nature, Its History; Généalogies, St-André-Est;* and *Madawaskan Heritage*. Respectively, the researches cover the geographical areas of, Percé (circa 1600) and St-Andre-Est (1638-1964) in Quebec, and Acadia in Nova Scotia (circa 1787). However, since the 18th century, the surname GAGNÉ can be found beyond the geographical areas of Quebec and Nova Scotia, as people of this surname are scattered throughout Canada today. It could also be found in the 19th century in the district of Quebec, in the community named GAGNÉ.

On the other hand, Mennie-de Varennes (1986) noted that the surname of GANGE has existed in Laprairie, Quebec since 1751 and cited the work of Irenée Jetté as the source material. Jetté traced a GANGE family tree from 1751 to 1972 at La Prairie. The work of Jetté is stored at the Parliamentary library in Ottawa, Province of Ontario.



Rev. Morgan E.T. **GENGE** has been described as the oldest practicing and most well known clergyman of the Protestant religion in the Province of Prince Edward Island, Canada. He was born on August 1, 1864 in Channel, the British Colony of Newfoundland. He was the son of Samuel Guillaume **VISSEC de GANGES** and Marie **BRAGA** of the French Colony of St. Pierre and Miquelon. Samuel and Marie produced six children, Samuel (1841–1917), Morgan E. (1864–1946), Beatrice A. (born 1866, died prior to 1946), Edward Rhese (1870-1890), Mary Mellessa (born 1872), and Sarah Evangeline (born 1876).

The family of Morgan E.T. **GENGE** was engaged in the seal-hunting industry. Like so many during the 19th century in Newfoundland, Morgan went to work on shipping vessels at a young age. By the age of 20 he had the qualification of a master mariner and the following year, on June 13, 1885, he married Elizabeth Ann Hill (1865-1922) of Newfoundland. The couple met while Elizabeth Ann Hill was working as a teacher in Halifax, Province of Nova Scotia, Canada. They produced seven children, Colin (born 1887), Maude H.B. (1889-1910), Mary Muriel (died 1922), Raoul (died 1938), Raymond (died 1925), Lillian Dorothy (died 1943), and Halmore V. (died ca. 1996).

Sometimes the seal hunts were lengthy, taking Captain Morgan E.T. **GENGE** away from his wife and children, and also away from his undergraduate studies of theology. On the other hand, the seal hunts produced revenue for him to continue and complete his studies. When he completed his studies in theology circa 1920, he was ordained at the Church of Christ. Shortly thereafter, in 1922, Elizabeth Ann (nee **HILL**), the wife of Rev. Morgan **GENGE**, and Mary Muriel, his daughter, passed away. He then married the widow of Capt. Murdoch **MCLEOD** (1875-1949). It is believed by the author that at about this time Reverend Morgan E.T. **GENGE** moved with his family to the Province of Prince Edward Island.

Rev. Morgan GENGE also completed a Ph.D. His organizational skills were recognized by his peers, and he was given the responsibility of the construction of a number of churches, including the Manse in Charlottetown, Queen's County, P.E.I. In addition, he is credited with having established the Church of Christ at Murray Harbour, in Murray River, Prince Edward Island.

He was the pastor circa 1926 of the Central Christian Church at 217 Kent Street, in Charlottetown, Queen's Co., P.E.I. In 1927, he became the minister of the Presbyterian Church of Canada and subsequently held the pastorates at a variety of locations:

Presbyterian Church of Canada, 37 Victoria East, Kensington, P.E.I.; St Andrew Presbyterian Church, Montague, P.E.I.; The Presbyterian Church, North Tryon, near Borden, P.E.I.

He also served at churches in of Breadalbane, Marshfield, and Borden, P.E.I. Rev. Morgan **GANGE** also held positions in the Province of New Brunswick. The pastorates in New

Brunswick include the Presbyterian Church of Canada situated on the Main Street in Harcourt, near Ford Mills, Kent County which closed-up operations circa 1992, St James Presbyterian Church situated at 275 Prince William Str, Newcastle, and Calvin Presbyterian Church at 37 King Str., Chatham, the latter two situated in Northumberland County.

In 1942, Rev. Morgan E.T. **GENGE** retired at the age of 78 from the Presbyterian Church of Canada. He is mentioned in the books *My Island*, *My People* and *The History of North Tryon 1663-1973* (see Works cited).

On December 21, 1946, Reverend Morgan Edwin Tareyton **GENGE** passed away at the age of 83. His funeral was held at the Zion Presbyterian Church, Prince Street, Charlottetown. He was buried beside his first wife at the People Protestant Cemetery in Charlottetown (Cemetery 12, Lot 33, Stone 1602), Queen's County, in the Province of Prince Edward Island, Canada.



ange Families Volume 3 focuses upon three GANGE families who were well established in the District of Dorchester, in the County of Dorset, England. A number of members of each family were travellers, just as others were in Gange Families Volume 1 and Volume 2. The common destination of many of their journeys was North America, specifically the Province of Ontario and the Colony of Newfoundland.

Historically, the surnames of **GANGE** and **GENGE** in Newfoundland were documented in early times in a somewhat spasmatic manner. It's existence in the records is not continuous. This is in part due to the geographic isolation of the island from England and between regions within Newfoundland. The demands created by seasonal employment and later by the enlistment for World War I took many people away from their homes in Newfoundland for lengthy periods. Such absences from the homes had a negative impact upon the family lifestyle; but, at the same time, they supplied human and natural resources for more than 300 years to the markets in England and its army.

In contrast, those **GANGE** family members who remained in England but relocated to the Counties of London and Surrey to find employment did so in an area where the infrastructure was well developed. The demands upon these people during the 19th century were very different from those in Newfoundland. Generally speaking, they were obliged to change from manual employment to professions, obtain a higher education and serve the public.

The family history of the **GANGE** families in Volume 3 is one where many changes occurred. Also, it is about their successful adaptation to such changes.

The GENGE family

reve (1935) described the people with Dorset-Celt backgrounds as generally being tall in stature and with fair hair. In addition, they have their own distinct dialect. Numerous manor houses, cottages, flower gardens and orchards create picturesque scenery in many towns and villages in Dorset. The town of Charmouth, in the County of Dorset can be described as a town resting in a valley with a main/principal street having a sharp incline - not unlike some

streets in Saint John, New Brunswick and St. John's, Newfoundland, where some of the living descendants of this family branch have briefly resided.

Sufficient evidence has been gathered to determine that the great grand-parents of George GENGE (1828-1902) of Charmouth resided in the District of Dorchester, County of Dorset, in England. The will of the great grandfather of George GENGE (1828-1902) was probated in the Surrogate Court of Symondsbury and registered in the Archdeaconry of Dorset, England. The testator was William Thomas GENGE senior of Wootton Fitzpaine, a yeoman, who died October 6, 1802. He held the Spence Estate of Battiscombe in Dorset and the Guppy Estate of Wootton Fitzpaine in the County of Dorset. His only brother, John GENGE, died August 15, 1793, and his will was probated through the Court of the Bishop of Bristol. John GENGE was also a yeoman and was referred to in Dorset as John GENGE the elder of Marshwood. These two wills named children, some grandchildren and at least two sons-in-law. It is from this evidence that part of this family tree was formulated. Other evidence came from the descendants of George GENGE (1828-1902), as well as from parish records and census records.

George GENGE (1828-1902) was born at Charmouth, in the County of Dorset. He was the second born child and the only son of George GENGE (baptised 1793) of Wootton Fitzpaine, in Dorset and Sarah OWSLEY (1794-1893) formerly of Stockland, in the County of Devon. The 1841 Census Wootton Fitzpaine at Champenhay Marsh is the only evidence found where all members of this family resided within the same household at one time. They were George (bapt. 1793), Sarah (1796-1893), Mary (born ca. 1826), George (1828-1902), Hannah (born ca. 1831), Elizabeth (born ca. 1834), and Alice (born ca. 1837). Hannah and Alice were the only children noted as having resided at home during the enumeration of the 1851 census.

Mary GENGE (born ca. 1826) was employed during 1851 in the household of John COZENS at 98 Charmouth Street, in the Town of Charmouth. Interestingly, John COZENS was baptised 1807 at Charmouth - the same birthplace as George GENGE (1828-1902). A relationship between the COZENS and GENGE families other than this employment arrangement has not been established.

However, a question arises as to why Sarah, the wife of George GENGE (born ca. 1793), the former born in Devon and the latter born and raised in Wootton Fitzpaine, would give birth to only one of their children, George, in Charmouth. Perhaps such a family relationship existed since research has determined that John COZENS was baptised in Charmouth in 1807, as was Samuel GENGE, son of Richard GENGE and Mary (nee STANDARD) (1776-1853), (see Genge family of Whitechurch Canonicorum herein).

George GENGE (1828-1902) departed from the household between 1841-1851. The exact date of his departure for Newfoundland is not known, but in 1852 he is noted to have married Catherine STOKE (1835-1908) at Middle Bill Cove, near Bonavista Bay, Newfoundland (Personal correspondence, 1996). Sparkes (1978) described George GENGE (1828-1902) as one of three pioneers of Thimble Cove, Newfoundland. Elliot (1984) documented George GENGE as a fisherman residing at Greensponds, Bonavista, Newfoundland in 1871, and as a farmer at Glovertown, Newfoundland in 1898. This information assisted in establishing that George GENGE (1828-1902) moved from Thimble Cove to Greensponds prior to 1871, and from Greensponds to Glovertown prior to 1898. Since Smallwood, Horan, Pitt, and Riggs (1991) described the GENGE family as landowners circa 1880 at Bloody Bay/Glovertown, the move from Greensponds to Glovertown would then have been much earlier than 1898.

Greensponds was in the electoral District #2 for the enumeration of the first general election in the British Colony of Newfoundland that occurred on November 1, 1832. More important are the subsequent enumeration records because these records would contain names of this GENGE family. The first census enumeration of Bloody Bay was in 1836 noting a population of five. The place name of Bloody Bay changed to Alexander Bay before 1898, and Alexander Bay eventually became part of Glovertown. Glovertown became an incorporated town in 1951 (Smallwood et al., 1991; Thoms, 1967). Again, the census records subsequent to 1836 are more important because the first member of this GENGE family branch travelled after 1841 to Newfoundland. The 1869 census records of Greensponds would likely contain names of this family. The electoral District #2 that included Greensponds had changed by 1981. It was broken up into several districts, whereby Greensponds became Bonavista North District #4 and Glovertown/Alexander Bay became Terra Nova District #46. The population of Greensponds in 1967 was recorded as 655. The population of Glovertown was 376 persons in 1911, 709 in 1921, and 842 in 1935 (Smallwood et al, 1991; Thoms, 1967). The census records for Newfoundland are public records for the years up to and including 1948. On April 1, 1949, Newfoundland joined the confederation of Canada, so subsequent records are closed to the public due to the Right to Privacy Act. What is unique about the Newfoundland census records of 1910 to 1948 is that they are not closed to the public as are the census records for the same time period for the other provinces in Canada.

Smallwood et al. (1991) extracted some information from the census records, while Sparkes (1978) obtained his information from members of the **GENGE** family. Sparkes (1978) described George **GENGE** (1828-1902) as a leading figure within the church where he practised his faith as well as a revered member of the community where he resided. George **GENGE** (1828-1902) and his wife Catherine raised ten children, Eunice, Sarah, William, Samuel (1858-1894), Alice (1861-1936),

George (1862-1914), Eleanor, Benjamin (1867-1952), Joseph (1870-1934), and Elizabeth (1872-1941) (Personal correspondence, 1996).

Sparkes (1978) described Elizabeth GENGE (1872-1941) as a well-bred young lady who was tall and graceful. She married James ARNOLD (1872-1952), a carpenter. Shortly after their marriage, Elizabeth began to realise what a formidable mother-in-law she had. Elizabeth (nee GENGE) ARNOLD (1872-1941) had the support of her husband and some neighbours as they literally moved their house from Thimble Cove and relocated it to a permanent site at Riverhead (Sparkes, 1978). Later, Elizabeth and James ARNOLD raised a family of seven children, Sarah, Frank, Gladys, Joseph, Dorothy, Ivy, and Blanche (Personal correspondence, 1996).

George GENGE (1828-1902) and his son Benjamin (1867-1952) would have been 64 and 26 years of age, respectively, when the mother of the former died on June 17, 1893. It is unlikely that her only son travelled from Newfoundland to her bedside. The voyage across the Atlantic, via steamship, took anywhere between a forthnight to seventy days depending upon weather conditions. Consequently, the trip would have been considered too dangerous for a man of 64. In addition, she had a frail mind at age 99, and it is doubtful that she would have recognized him. A span of forty-one years had passed since her son had left home as a young man. However, Sarah (OWSLEY) GENGE (1794-1893) did not die alone, because her faithful unmarried daughter Elizabeth (born ca.1834), who had cared for her since at least 1881, was by her bedside when she passed away at Chappenhay Marsh in Wootton Fitzpaine, Sub-District of Whitechurch Canonicorum, in the registration district of Bridport, County of Dorset, England. It is evident from a copy of a memorial card details of when and where Sarah GENGE which was interred was included in Sparkes (1978) Glovertown in Pictures, that correspondence was exchanged between family members in England and in Newfoundland.

A photograph of Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952), a brother of Elizabeth (nee GENGE) ARNOLD, was published on page 17 in the book, Glovertown in Pictures #4. This photograph portrays a person mature in age, tall and slim, familiar with the use of a scythe. One may state that he was not only familiar with a scythe but also with tools to work and shape lumber, because he is described in the book Atlantic Canadians 1600-1900 as a lumberman in residing Glovertown, Alexander Bay in 1898. His brothers George GENGE jr. [1862-1914] and Joseph GENGE [1870-1934] were also described as lumbermen residing in the same place. Interestingly, a granddaughter of Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) related a story to the author of how Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) and his father George GENGE (1828-1902) built a fishing schooner (perhaps the "Heliotrope") and went with the fishing fleets during the summer months (Personal correspondence, 1996). This story corresponds with information extracted from the census records by Smallwood et al. (1991) and information gathered by Sparkes (1978). Smallwood et al. (1991) wrote that the GENGE family had built a large ship at Bloody Bay which was used for fishing off the Labrador coastline. From 1860 to 1900, fishing was an important economic activity in Glovertown. Sparkes (1978) stated that two of the 35 schooner skippers of Glovertown were Benjamin GENGE and Alexander GENGE. It should be mentioned that a link has not yet been established between this GENGE family branch and

Employment during the summer months for George (1828-1902) and Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) meant working away from home with the fishing fleets off the Labrador coast. During the winter months they would work closer to home in the lumber industry. Seasonal work was common to the many households in Newfoundland that were involved in the fishing industry. That Benjamin, his siblings and others of the younger generations were eventually to become more involved with the lumber industry is made evident by the facts that Lewis GEANGE (1897-1996) was employed with Terra Nova Division of the Anglo Newfoundland Development Company; Ivan GENGE (born ca. 1920), son of Victor GEANGE (born 1899), had shares in a sawmill in Glovertown North until 1970, at which time he sold to Sweetapple and Smart; and Lawrence GENGE (born ca. 1927), grandson of businessman Alexander GENGE (1896-1968), was employed at the sawmill of Sweetapple and Smart at Scow Duck Pond.

Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) married Adelaire WELLS circa 1886. When their children were baptised, the minister is said by some to have recorded the surname in the church registers as GEANGE rather than GENGE. Lewis GEANGE (1897-1996) kept this surname until circa 1950 when he changed it back to the original family spelling of GENGE; his offspring did not do so. In addition, when Garland GEANGE (1892-1966), a son of Samuel GENGE (1858-1894), opened a business circa 1950, he changed the surname back to the spelling of his ancestors in Newfoundland-that being spelled GENGE.

Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) and his wife Adelaire produced eight offspring, Eunice (1890-1962), Elizabeth (1893-1977), Jessie, Julia, Alice, George (1896-1915), Lewis (1897-1996), and Victor (born 1899). Benjamin GENGE (1867-1952) and his wife Adelaire were not aware that one of their children would grow up to be a war hero.

Lewis GEANGE (1897-1996) was a well liked character in the community and was noted for his patience (Sparkes, 1978; Personal correspondence, 1997). At the age of nine years, Lewis GEANGE (1897-1996) went with his father in the fishing fleet to the Labrador coast. Later, Lewis worked in St. John's and then Gander. As a young man, he enlisted in the military during World War I and went overseas to England, Germany and France. Lewis GEANGE (1897-1996) was in the trenches at the front line in France when news broke that the war had ended. The news came via his army sergeant. Pte. Lewis GEANGE, #5394 served in the Newfoundland Regiment for one year and forty-two days (Personal correspondence, 1996; 1997). A photograph of him in military uniform was published in Glovertown in Pictures, Volume 2, page 52. Sparkes (1978) described him as a war hero. He was employed at the Terra Nova Division of the Anglo Newfoundland Development Company when the first work strike occurred (Sparkes, 1987). To some, Lewis GEANGE was a hero in every sense of the word - not only in military life but in civilian life as well. There is at least one documented rescue in which Lewis was involved. He rescued people in distress under cruel winter conditions during the course of his employment. His employer had sent him to travel some distance when Lewis noticed some people in distress (Sparkes, 1978). One of his daughters, Merida,

stated that Lewis never spoke of his W.W.I experiences. So, little is known about his acts of heroism other than what has been recorded in his military records under the surname spelling of **GEANGE**, and perhaps stories circulated amongst a few surviving army comrades. It is not known what became of his war medals. In the near future, a photograph of Lewis **GEANGE** in military uniform will hang on the Memorial Wall of the Eastport Legion Branch #41 building, in Eastport, Newfoundland. It was most unfortunate that Lewis **GEANGE** passed away on October 14, 1996, since much of the history of his heroism may have died with him.

alter Membery GENGE led a turbulent life, consisting of several relocations and the death of a family member in almost every household where he resided. The ancestors of Walter were the GENGE family of Whitechurch Canonicorum Parish, District of Dorchester, in the County of Dorset, England. His grandfathers were Richard GENGE (died circa 1790), a yeoman in Whitechurch Canonicorum, and Amos MEMBERY (died 1855)

of the Parish of Lyme Regis, District of Dorchester, in the County of Dorset, England.

Both Richard GENGE (d. ca. 1790) and Amos MEMBERY (d. 1855) can be traced through probate wills kept an ocean away from one another. A copy of the will of Richard GENGE, signed by him on July 19,1781, is stored in the Dorset Records Office and contains the names of his wife, Jane, and some children, Thomas, John, Joan, Richard, George, William, Hannah, Jane, Sarah and Elizabeth. Richard died (ca. 1790) before many of his children were married; perhaps indicating his premature death. The names of John and James SYMES and John HODDER are also included in the probate document (Dorset Record Office, W1790/65).

The will of Amos MEMBERY (d.1855) was deposited in the Surrogate Court in Adolphustown County, in the Province of Ontario, North America (Wanamaker, 1982). This document also contains the names of those of his sons and daughters, Giles, James, Elizabeth, Sarah and Jane, who also made their homes in North America. More importantly, a grandson is named in this will, Walter Membery GENGE.

Walter Membery GENGE was born December 28, 1839 at 12 Narrow Street, the sub-district of Limehouse in the District of Stepney, London, County of Middlesex, England. The names of his parents listed in his birth certificate are George GENGE and Maria (nee MEMBERY), licensed victuallers (Public Records Office of Births, Marriages and Deaths, 1840). His parents may have operated the Three Nuns Tap Public House at 11 Aldgate High Street, London, the County of Middlesex located in the business district not far from the Bank of England and Aldgate tube/subway station. (Post Office London Directory, 1846; Mapeasy, 1992).

At that time, not too far from Aldgate High Street resided Samuel GENGE (baptised 1807), a shipsmith at 157 Horseferry Road, in the Parish of Saint Anne Limehouse, District of Stepney, London, County of Middlesex. Samuel GENGE (bapt. 1807) was a cousin to Walter Membery GENGE (b. 1839). Samuel resided at the same location between 1846-1851 and did not live far

Genge Ontario from the Stepney docks. He may have been employed at these docks. Horseferry Road still exists today and is situated on the west end of Lambeth Bridge which spans the portion of the River Thames called Lambeth Reach, in an area known as Westminster, not far from the abbey bearing the same name (Benton, 1967). On the south side of this road is St. John's Garden and Westminister Hospital (MapArt, undated). On the north side is the residence of the Marquis of Granbly (Mapeasy, Inc., 1992).

Others from the Greater London area who were cousins of Walter Membery GENGE (b.1839) were Charles GENGE (bapt. 1810), a merchant clerk, and his brother, William GENGE (b.ca. 1801), a retired farmer. Charles GENGE (bapt. 1810) resided in 1851 at 37 Bower Street, Parish of Stepney, the Hamlet of Ratcliff at Tower Hill, in the District of St. Thomas, County of Middlesex (Public Records Office, 1851). Ratcliff is in the vicinity of Lloyd's of London, the Custom House & Quay and Cannon Street Railway Station. It may well have been situated within the sound of Bow bells: A phrase I heard often as a young girl living in London. It meant that a person was not a Cockney unless born within the reach of the sound of the church bells of St. Mary-Le Bow. William GENGE (b.ca.1801) had moved from Dorset to Croydon, Surrey after the death of his mother, Mary (nee STANDARD) GENGE (1776-1853). In 1880, he was a retired farmer and resided with his brother, Charles, at Chandos Villas, Sydenham (Croyden Local Studies Library and Archives Service, 1997). Both of them moved with their families in 1881 to The Lindens, Sydenham Road, Croydon, in the County of Surrey, England (Public Records Office, 1881). Charles GENGE (bapt. 1810) is estimated by the author to have passed away sometime between 1882-1890; however, no will for this name has been found through the Probate Registry of York for the years 1882-1885. A search was not conducted through the Deanery of Croydon.

Of interest is the birthplace of the aforementioned **GENGE** persons: George (bpt. 1777), Samuel (bapt. 1807), Charles (bapt. 1810), and William (b.ca. 1801); all were born in the Parish of Whitechurch Canoncorium, County of Dorset. Furthermore, these four men had married women from their native town in Dorset. They represent members of a Dorset family who left Dorset after the agricultural riots of 1830 and before the poor flax harvest of 1851, and who subsequently found work in London (Kerr, 1968; Young and Hancock, 1970). Many, if not all of their offspring formed a generation born in London.

Walter Membery **GENGE** (b. 1839) was sent to Chideock, District of Dorchester, Dorset to live with his aunt, Mary (nee **STANDARD**) **GENGE** (1776-1853), prior to 1851. This move to the country marks a drastic change from the congested life of London. He may have been in awe before the sight of the English Channel, which is a vast body of water in comparison with the River Thames. Moreover, Chideock was a small community with a population of 863 in 1851, whereas the district of Stepney had a population of 120,000 during the same year of 1851 (Monk, 1992; Webb and Wilcock, 1989). It is not clear why Walter left Stepney but, since his parents have not been found in the Stepney and Dorset census records of 1851, it is assumed his parents had passed away between 1846 and 1851.

Walter's aunt, Mary (nee STANDARD) GENGE (1776-1853), was a widow of independent

financial means and resided at the time of the enumeration of the 1851 Census Dorset at house #82, North of Turnpike Road, in the Parish of Chideock. Relatives lived on each side of the house where Walter and his aunt resided. On one side resided Jane (nee GENGE) (bapt.1790), Walter's (b.1839) aunt, a net maker and the wife of Robert HUSSEY (b.ca.1789), an agricultural labourer. On the other side of his home, Walter's (b.1839) uncle William GENGE (bapt.1779), a widower and pensioner, made his home.

Of great interest is the fact that Jane (nee GENGE) HUSSEY (bapt.1790) inherited property at Marcombe Lake in the Parish of Chideock in the District of Dorchester, County of Dorset, from her brother, Thomas GENGE (d.1839), a bachelor of Chideock (Dorset Records Office, W 1839/40 BC 10). The 1851 Census 51 Marcombe Lake, Parish of Whitechurch Canonicorum, Dorset stated that George GENGE, a 29 year old agricultural labourer, born in the Parish of Whitechurch Canonicorum resided at 51 Marcombe Lake, in the Parish of Whitechurch Canonicorum. He resided with this wife, Eliza, age 30 and three daughters, Meliora, age 7; Susan, age 6; and Caroline, age 2 (Public Records Office, 1851). George GENGE (bapt.1821), of Marcombe Lake, was a nephew of Jane (nee GENGE) HUSSEY (bapt.1790).

Also in Chideock resided William GENGE (b.ca.1801), son of Mary (nee STANDARD) (1776-1853). In 1851, William operated a Grocery and Beer retailer outlet at 106 Land Cottage and his young wife, Charlotte, was a draper, whose products were also sold at her husband's shop. Charlotte was born circa 1817 in Charmouth, in the District of Dorchester, Dorset. William was also a landowner in 1871, owning of one acre of land. (Somerset & Dorset Family History Society, 1871). James STANDARD (b.ca.1778), the brother of Mary (nee STANDARD) GENGE (1776-1853), was also listed in the same household at 106 Land Cottage, Chideock (Public Records Office, 1851).

When Mary (nee STANDARD) died on January 26, 1853, one may assume that the fourteen year old Walter Membery GENGE (b.1839) would have been taken under the wing of one of his many relatives who lived in Chideock. Sadly, this was not the case. Mary had died interstate and her son, William GENGE (b.ca.1801), posted an Administration Bond. He, a neighbour, Joseph BISHOP, a shoemaker at 107 Chideock Hill, and John GRINTEN of Ryall, in the Parish of Whitechurch Canonicorum, are those who are named in the administration bond and who settled her affairs and estate (Dorset Record Office, A 1853 5 DA). William GENGE (b.ca.1801) later moved to Croydon where he resided with his brother Charles GENGE (bpt.1810).

Walter's next voyage was much further afield. Willingly or not, he travelled circa 1854 across the Atlantic Ocean to North America to reside with his grandfather, Amos Membery (d. 1855). Miserably, within a short period of time after again resettling, his guardian and relative died. Walter was still in his teenage years when this happen.

Walter Membery GENGE (b.1839) was located in the 1871 Census Fredericksburg South Township, Lennox & Addington County, Ontario, where he was listed as a 30 year old married farmer with two children. His wife was Matilda, born circa 1834 in Ontario. Their son and daughter were also born in Ontario; they were named George Genge GENGE (1864-1916) and Nellie GENGE (1869-1945).

The County of Lennox and Addington Museum and Archives have burial records of the interments of George and Nellie GENGE in the Deseronto town Cemetery. Information is lacking for the husband of Nellie, Edward COLE. Walter is presumed to have died prior to 1901 because he was not found in the 1901 Census Fredericksburg South Township, Lennox County.

Some questions emerged during the compilation of this family history of the GENGE family branch

Was Richard GENGE (d. 1790) related to the brothers, John GENGE (b.1793), of Marshwood, Dorset and William Thomas GENGE (d.1802) of Wootton Fitzpaine, Dorset (see Genge family of Dorset, England (later of Glovertown, via Thimble's Cove, Newfoundland herein).

What relationship existed, if any, between the families of Walter Membery GENGE (b.1839) and Thomas MEMBERY (b.ca.1773) who resided in 1851 at 53 Hawkmoor Farm, Hawkchurch, in the District of Exeter, County of Devon, England

Was there a connection between this GENGE family branch and George GENGE (b.ca.1812) who resided in 1851 at 52 Hawkmoor Farm, Hawkchurch, Exeter, Devon



dward Henry **GENGE** was born in 1843, and his brother, Wesley, was born circa 1846. The *Sherborne Register* and the *1881 Census Surrey* list the birthplace of Edward Henry **GENGE** as Trent in the County of Somerset, but an earlier census lists the birthplace for these two people as Winchester in the County of Hampshire, England (House, 1900; Public Records Office, 1851;1881). Another piece of information that is potentially misleading to a

researcher is that Edward Henry was listed in the records searched as Edwin until 1881.

Edwin GENGE, Wesley GENGE, and their parents were enumerated in the 1851 Census Dorset at 66 Cheap Street in Sherborne (Public Records Office, 1851). Their parents were John GENGE, a glover, who was born in Hardington, and Elizabeth (nee PITMAN), who was born in South Cheriton. Both were natives of Somerset County, and their ages are listed in this census record respectively as 38 and 35 (See also Gange Families, Volume 2. Ganges Families from the County of Somerset). John GENGE'S unmarried sister-in-law named Mary Ann PITMAN was included in this census record as a household member as well. She was also born in South Cheriton, Somerset (Public Records Office, 1851).

Not far from the borders of Somerset and Dorset is the town of Sherborne to where this family moved between 1851-1861. Sherborne had a population of 5238 in 1851 (Monk, 1992). Handcock (1989) situated Sherborne a mile from the County of Somerset and termed it a market town. Business activities in Sherborne included the importation of seal skins from Newfoundland via Poole. The members of the tanner's guild worked the skins, transforming the raw material into finished goods. The finished leather goods were then moved for sale to the merchants' houses of Sherborne. Besides a castle in Sherborne, there is a school that boasts numerous graduates who later went on to be regarded as notable persons. One such person was Edward Henry **GENGE** (born 1843), the son of John **GENGE** (born circa 1813) and Elizabeth (nee **PITMAN**) (b. ca. 1816).

House (1990) listed only Edward and his mother as the only persons in this family. Therefore, it is more than likely that the father, John GENGE (b.ca.1813), a glover, and Wesley (b.ca. 1846), a brother of Edward Henry GENGE (b. 1843), resided elsewhere or had passed away while Edward Henry GENGE (b. 1843) attended Sherborne school during 1861 and 1862. Reinforcing this impression is the absence of the name of Wesley GENGE in the 1881 Census Surname Index for the English Counties of Dorset, Somerset, Devon, Middlesex, Surrey and Hampshire (Public Record Offices, 1881).

House (1990) noted the achievements of Edward Henry GENGE (b. 1843). Among them was a medal for mathematics for both years he attended Sherborne school in 1861 and 1862. When he left in 1862, he enrolled in the Bachelor of Arts program at St. John the Evangelist College at Cambridge University, England. This college has a history dating back to 1629 (Cairns, 1963). In 1866, Edward graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree and in the same year accepted a post at Loughborough School in the County of Leicestershire, England. The following year, Edward Henry GENGE (b. 1843) was ordained. He remained in Leicestershire until 1872, at which time he departed for Croydon in the County of Surrey where he accepted the post of head of the mathematics department. At the same time he was also employed as assistant master at Whitgift Grammar School (House, 1900; London Borough of Croydon, 1996)

Whitgift Grammar School was founded by John WHITGIFT circa 1596. The school and almshouse founder, John WHITGIFT, was buried in the parish church of St. John the Baptist, in Croydon, Surrey. However, in 1867 this church was destroyed by fire and restoration was undertaken by Sir George Gilbert SCOTT (Benton, 1967). The younger George Gilbert SCOTT was also an architect of the 19th century (Leigh, 1973).

Other residents of Croyden in the County of Surrey during the last half of the 19th century who were named GANGE and GENGE who were born in the Counties of Somerset or Dorset include William GENGE (b. ca. 1801) and Charles GENGE (b. ca. 1820) who were brothers, William GENGE (1835-1862), and Frank GENGE (b. ca. 1858). The brothers William and Charles GENGE were residents of Croydon in 1859 upon their retirement from work on a farm and in a merchant house respectively (London Borough of Croydon, 1997) (see GANGE Family Of London, herein). In 1861, William GENGE (1835-1862) was a coach trimmer who resided with his young family in Croydon (London Borough of Croydon, 1996). He was the son of Francis GENGE (born 1796) of Crewkerne, Somerset. Upon his death circa 1862, William's (b.1835) widow moved to Kingston-upon-Thames, Surrey, and their daughter lived with her grandparents in Crewkerne (London Borough of Croydon, 1996; P.R.O.,1881) (see Gange Families, Volume 2 Ganges Families from the County of Somerset). Another resident of Croyden was Frank GENGE (b. ca. 1858), a butcher journeyman who was born in Broadway, in the County of Somerset, and who in 1881, was residing with George COX (Public Record Office, 1881).

James **GENGE** (b.ca.1849) lived at 157 Horseferry Road, Saint Anne, Limehouse, Stepney, London, in the County of Middlesex, England with his father Samuel **GENGE** (bapt.1807) in 1851 (PRO, 1851). He resided with his family not far from Croyden in Beddington during 1881. James and his wife, Susannah, age 33, were listed in the 1881 Census Surrey with their two sons, Laurence, age 3, and Charles E., age 6 (see GENGE Family of Whitechurch Canonicorum, herein).

The surnames of GANGE and GENGE do not appear in *The return of owners of land 1873: Surrey (excluding the Metropolis)*, but what does appear is perhaps a business arrangement between H.B. BATTON, a resident of Yeovil in the County of Somerset, and others (no names listed) which specified that they were the owners of 243 acres of land in the County of Surrey (West Surrey Family History Society and Webb, 1995). Interestingly, the surname of BATTON appears in the 1851

Census Somerset in Chard, Chiselborough and Yeovil - the same places where the surname of GANGE and/or GENGE appears (Knight, 1988). This raises the possibility that persons with the surnames of BATTON and GANGE/GENGE have done business in Surrey with H.B. BATTON.

The enumeration of the 1881 Census Surrey, Surname Index reveals that Reverend Edward Henry GENGE (b.1843) was married and was raising a young family. His wife, Annie, was then 37 years of age, and the children were listed as George G., age 8, Emma G., age 7, Eleanor B., age 6, and Richard L., age 4. All the children had been born in Croydon with the exception of George Gilbert who was born in Preston, which is stated in the census as being in the County of Somerset, but which is actually in the County of Dorset. And again, the birthplace of Rev. Edward H. GENGE was stated as Trent, which they situated in the County of Somerset, but which is actually in the County of Dorset.

This **GENGE** family branch appears to have a closer association with Somerset than with either Dorset or Hampshire, given the documented information regarding birthplaces (P.R.O, 1851; 1881; House, 1900).

Croydon, Surrey, was the home of Rev. Edward H. GENGE (b.1843) and his family as they entered into the 20th century. The address of 1 Poplar walk, Croydon, passed from one generation to the next, from the Reverend to his son, George Gilbert GENGE (b.ca.1873). George, like his father Rev. Edward H. GENGE (b.1843), had a notable career, but it was in medicine rather than in the church. George Gilbert GENGE, is listed in the professional medical directories of the Royal College of Physicians of London for the years of 1900, and 1947 (Personal correspondence, 1996). Among his numerous achievements are the Peacock scholarship for two consecutive years, 1891 and 1892, and the Mead and Gold Medals from St. Thomas' Hospital. He also received the Members Royal College of Surgeons (M.R.C.S.) and Licentiate Royal College of Physicians (L.R.C.P.) degrees from London University in 1894. His medical career spanned 50 years and was primarily associated with Croydon General Hospital. However, he may have been on active duty during W.W.I. through his role as an admiralty surgeon. George Gilbert GENGE (b.ca.1873) was the Croydon General Hospital Officer in 1898, and was appointed the Honourable Secretary of the Croydon Medicine and Panel Committee (Croydon Times, 1946).

The will written on December 9, 1902 by George Gilbert **GENGE** (b.ca. 1873) of 4 Lansdowne Road in Croydon, Surrey, states that he was married to a woman named Catherine. The change of residence from 1 Poplar walk in 1901 to 4 Lansdowne Road in 1902 may have been precipitated by the death of one or both his parents. George Gilbert **GENGE** passed away on July 4, 1947 at the age of 74. The newspaper, *Croydon Times* printed the obituary of George Gilbert **GENGE** on July 6, 1946. His will that was written on December 9, 1902 named his wife, Catherine as the sole beneficary. This document was found through the probate jurisdiction of The Family Division of The High Court of Justice, Probate Registry in York, England.

Both George Gilbert GENGE (b.ca. 1873) and his son, Donald Sealy Gilbert GENGE (b. ca. 1914), also in the medical profession, gained notoriety and respect among their peers in the medical

profession. Members of at least three generations of this **GENGE** family branch of Sherborne, Dorset, graduated from Cambridge University. Both George G. and Donald Sealy Gilbert **GENGE** (b. ca. 1914) obtained the degrees of M.R.C.S. and L.R.C.P.

George Gilbert GENGE (b.ca.1873) and Donald, his son, were associated with St. Thomas' Hospital, Lambeth Palace Road, which is situated on the east side of the River Thames near Lambeth Bridge. Lambeth Bridge leads to Horseferry Road, where Samuel GENGE (bapt. 1807), a shipsmith, resided in 1851 (see GANGE Family of London to Ontario, via Dorset herein). Samuel may have been a family relative since James, one of his son's, moved to Beddington, near Croyden, in the County of Surrey, England.

A connection has not yet been established between Donald Sealy Gilbert GENGE (b.ca.1914) and the families of Robert Sealy GENGE, the author (see *Gange Families, Volume 2. Appendix 1*), and Thomas GENGE, who married to Susanna and whose daughter, Sarah Sealy Marwood GENGE, bapt. June 6, 1812 in Yeovil, in the County of Somerset, England (International Genealogical Index, 1992).


