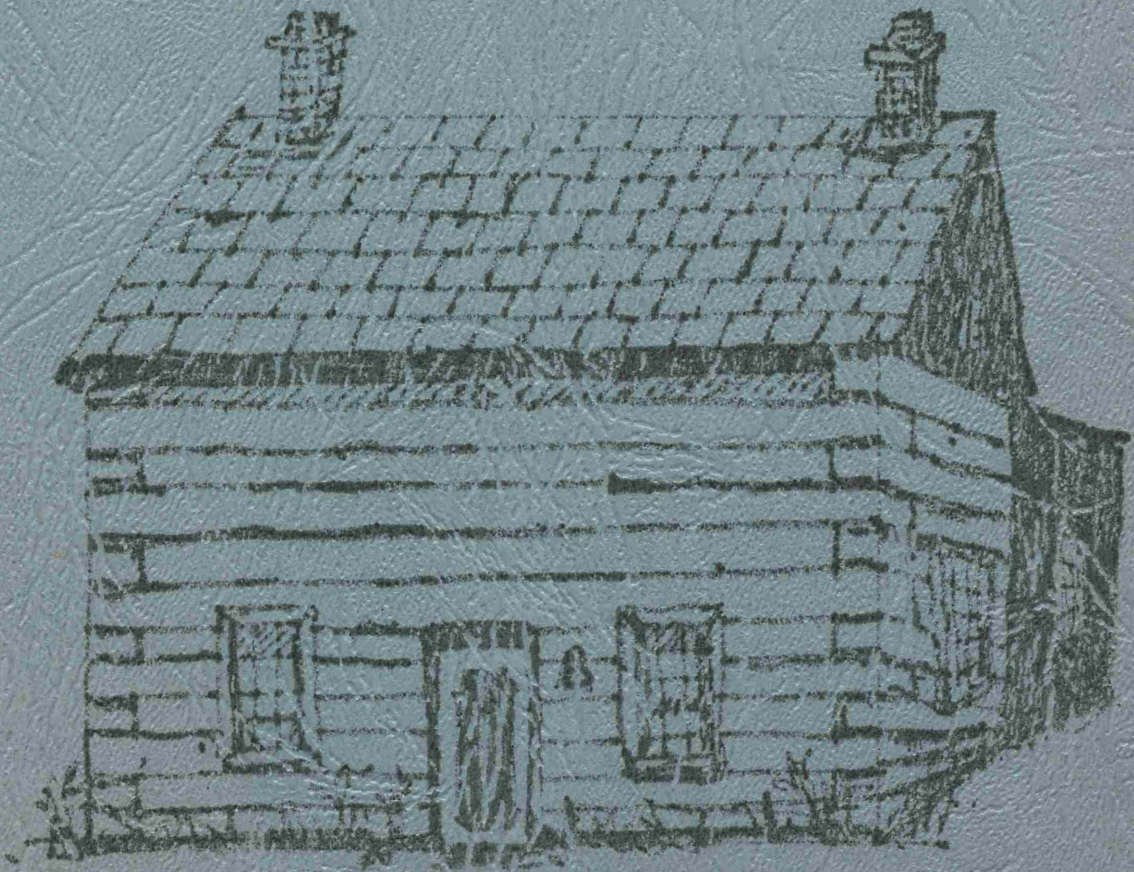

NUMBERING SYSTEM

A stands for William Gordon - the father of the emigrating generation. A1 is his oldest child - John Gordon. John's brothers and sisters are numbered A2 - A8 according to their chronological order. Each succeeding generation has a number added; if there are more than nine in a family the double number is bracketed.

B stands for Captain Hamilton Lowry - the father of the emigrating generation. He came to Canada from Ireland about 1826. I have used an arbitrary numbering system for his family because we are not sure of their number or chronological order. The Gordon and Lowry families are intertwined to such an extent that it would be impossible to write the story of one without the other.

The third family that holds a prominent place are the Herrons. A2 - Ann (Nancy) Gordon married in Ireland, one named Thomas Herron. They followed her family to Canada and left a large number of descendents. We do not know anything of Thomas Herron before he emigrated.

At present my information goes as far as the eighth generation. I have not counted the number of persons recorded here; it would discourage me from **finishing** my self-imposed task.

The record of each generation will be completed before starting the next. Where the generation of the Gordon number and the Lowry number do not coincide, the generation will be listed under the Gordon number

Any errors or omissions, of which I am sure there will be many, have been unavoidable and unintentional. For these I ask your indulgence.

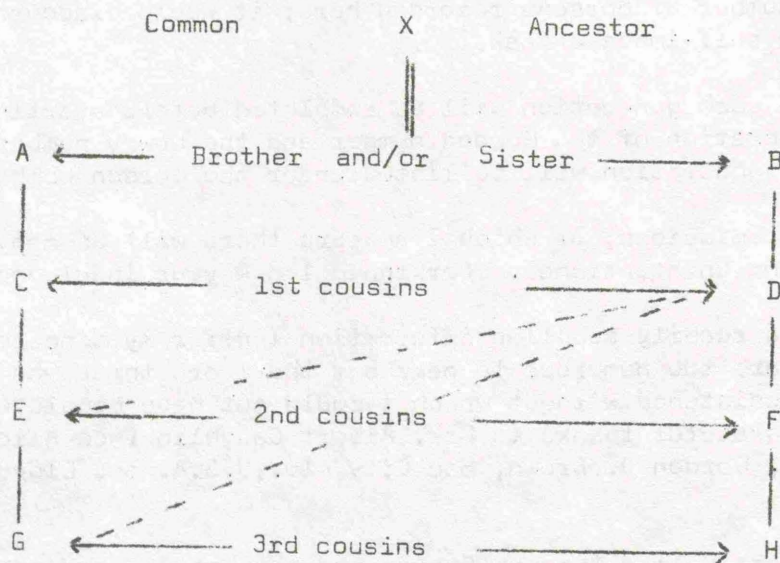

THE CLAN GORDON

To write a family history such as this, is an onerous undertaking and one which inevitably omits many details and leaves many questions unanswered. However, we know that the Gordons left France in the 11th century - perhaps in 1066 and reached Scotland in the early 12th century. In 1100, Henry I of England married the daughter of Malcolm Canmore, King of the Scots. Malcolm died while his younger sons were still children and they were brought up at the Court of their brother-in-law in England. David, the youngest, when he went north as Prince of Cumbria, and later King of the Scots was accompanied by many of his Norman friends to whom he gave lands in southern Scotland. Among these Gordons, whose earliest Scottish home was in Berwickshire where Gordon and Huntly both appear as place names. However, they soon acquired land in other parts; one of the family is said to have married a Galloway heiress by whom he acquired the lands of Lochinvar in south-western Scotland.

In the 14th century the Gordons supported Robert Bruce and fought with him at Bannockburn in 1314. For this and other services Robert Bruce rewarded Sir Adam Gordon with the land of Strathbogie in Banffshire. Later Sir Adam gave the Galloway lands to his younger son, William, who founded the family of Gordon of Lochinvar. A great grandson of the first Sir Adam married Elizabeth Keith who brought her husband the Fraser lands of Aboyne, Glentanar, and Glenmuick in Aberdeenshire. In 1402 his only child, Elizabeth succeeded him and in 1408 married Alexander Seton. Their eldest son, Alexander, took the name and arms of Gordon and continued the line to the present day. John Gordon, an uncle of Elizabeth, left two illegitimate sons, Jock and Tam, whose descendants founded many cadet families, of whom it is stated, "that many worthy gentlemen and distinguished families are sprung from that stock, who for their antiquity, their great matches and their loyalty to their king and country are not inferior to any family in Britain."

Sir Alexander Seton was created Lord Gordon in 1436, and his son, who reverted to his mother's name was created Earl of Huntly about 1445. In 1476, George, 2nd Earl of Huntly, was appointed King's Lieutenant in the North, a position which his descendants were to hold many times in the following century. Under the Earl, the clan became both police force and army at the bidding of the King. Clans entered into Bonds of Friendship with Huntly, that is mutual agreements to support and assist one another when needed. In 1462 the citizens of Aberdeen entered into a special Bond of Manrent with Huntly, whereby he undertook to preserve the freedom and property of the citizens in return for hospitality whenever the Earl and his friends visited the City and for such help as the Gordons might need in their own defence. This Bond was intended for ten years but held for more than a century.

Since the Gordons were Roman Catholics and fought for the Stuarts, under William III the Duke of Gordon was not able to hold either a political or army position. As a result many Gordons were educated in France at this time and went on to hold high places in Europe. In the Jacobite risings of 1715 and 1745 some of the Gordons were involved but were fortunate enough not to forfeit their estates.

The Gordons land was some of the most fertile in Scotland, and since the policy of the Dukes of Gordon was to do their best for their people they were rewarded by the loyalty, and even adoration of the clan. After the disarming of the Highland Clans the Gordons established an impressive record of army service. In 1790, the son of the 4th Duke raised a company of the Black Watch. In 1794, a special Gordon Regiment was formed, the 92nd (Gordon) Highlanders, now the 2nd Battalion, the Gordon Highlanders. They maintain the tradition of the Clan, wear the Gordon tartan, and the crest and motto of their Chief. The Gordons are remembered for their charge at the battle of Waterloo when, clinging to the stirrups of the Scots Greys they scattered the French to the cry of "Scotland for ever". Two Generals, Sir John Moore and Lord Roberts, honoured the Gordon Highlanders by choosing the figure of a Gordon Highlander as a supporter in their coats-of-arms.

The Gordons have a long history. An authority on the clan has written: "The great point about the Gordons is their great vitality under all conditions - the more adverse the better. Other families have risen and disappeared or become immensely weakened, but the Gordons remain, and the vast ramifications of the clan are to be found all over the world."

The Chief is Douglas Lindsey Gordon, 12th Marquess of Huntly, and his seat is Aboyne Castle, Aberdeenshire, which came to the Gordons before 1400.

But now to our ancestors, when, from where, and for what reason did our branch of the family emigrate to Ireland? All that we know is that William Gordon said he was born in County Armagh, Ireland about 1758. Nothing is known of his parents or of his brothers and sisters if any. One grandson has expressed the belief that the family had not been long in Ireland. The writer of this history might dare to hope that out of the material gathered here someone may advance additional information to round out the Gordon story.

Captain Hamilton Lowry

The Lowrys are descendents of French Huguenots who fled from France to Great Britain at the time of the St. Bartholmew massacres. ("The French Huguenots in Ireland" by the Rev. J.W.S. Lowry). The name is derived from the Loire River Valley where they had settled. First it was De Loire but over the years it became Lowry as it is to-day. After reaching Britian some continued north into Scotland. We believe our Lowrys crossed from Scotland to County Down, Ireland.

Cpt. Hamilton Lowry was born ca 1763, at Ards, Co. Down, (1851 census). He came to Canada with several of his family ca 1826 and settled in Fitzroy twp. We believe that he had been a sea captain. When he came to Canada he would be in his sixties, but must have been an enterprising man as, besides farming, he ran a hotel, which seems to have been well patronized. One description of the hotel states that it had a large dining room as well as other rooms, and across from it was a long building containing sleeping accommodation. It has been said that none were turned away because they were unable to pay. Money received was carelessly tossed into a bushel basket, which when filled was put into a storeroom.

The oldest daughter, Osay, wife of John Moorhead, was in Canada when her husband died Sept 18, 1823. He is buried in Lowry Cemetery. When Osay died in 1861 she owned 1000 acres in Huntley twp. (her will). In 1856 Cpt. Hamilton sold for 10 shillings part of L1 C8 Fitzroy twp. to the Presbyterians for a church and cemetery. The church, called Lowry Church, was built the same year. It was closed in 1925 and later demolished while the Lowry Cemetery is still in use.

In an extract from a letter written January 19, 1831, Hamilton Lowry states, "I have been a resident of Fitzroy for five years past. There I have settled with a large family of sons, and I have made extensive improvements on a tract of land purchased by me. Adjoining this there is a clergy reserve and in order to keep the family together I was anxious to obtain the same by purchase. With this in view one of my sons, who emigrated to this spot a year before the rest of the family, applied to the Commissioner in the year 1825 . . ." I believe this son to be B6 Savage Lowry. To the best of our knowledge Mrs. Hamilton Lowry died in Ireland before the family emigrated.

One story that has come down through the years could explain the name Hamilton. It seems that a Lowry man had a beautiful horse. Lord Hamilton saw the horse and wanted to buy it but Mr. Lowry refused to sell. Later the lord sent his steward to buy the horse. Again Mr. Lowry refused his offer. Even when Lord Hamilton came himself, Mr. Lowry refused to sell, but said that as the lord was so anxious to have the horse he would give it to him. Not long afterwards Lord Hamilton saw that Mr. Lowry received land in his own name, the first time such a thing had happened.

A173-34 Donald J. Lowry, Almonte, Ont., has visited Ireland on business trips (he imports Landrace pigs). Donald has made contact with Lowrys of the area from which we believe our Lowrys emigrated (Killenchy). One hundred and fifty years is a long time to go back and bridge the gap. One of the Lowrys he met visited at Donald's in October 1977. We are hopeful that some day the pieces of the ancestral puzzle may all fit together.

The chart outlining Cpt. Hamilton's family is accurate only to the best of our knowledge. The list of grandchildren has been compiled from church, cemetery and family bible records. At least these are accurate if not complete.

WILLIAM GORDON

Our ancestor, William Gordon, must have been a remarkable man: he came to Canada when almost seventy years of age, bought a farm and established a home in the wilderness and took an active part in the life of the community. This in an age when man's life expectancy was much lower than to-day. The following is the story of William and his descendents.

William was born in County Armagh, Ireland, about 1758. He was married twice but we have no knowledge of either of his wives, so believe both died in Ireland before he emigrated. The first family consisted of John, Nancy and William. Both sons came to Canada before their father and were located in Goulbourn twp. John though located in 1820, finally bought E $\frac{1}{2}$ L13 C4 Goulbourn twp and settled there June 1826. His father, William, came to Canada the next year with four sons (aged 12-27) and a daughter. They arrived in Goulbourn twp., June 21, 1827 (as recorded in Moses' Bible). William immediately bought the 100 acres west of John. The oldest daughter, Nancy, married Thomas Herron in Ireland: she and her husband, with their five children, followed the Gordons to Canada in 1832 and settled three miles from her father on L6 C6 Goulbourn twp. The family were all in Canada.

The story is told that when the Gordons walked through the Richmond swamp (at that time a trail made passable with logs and planks) they were very careful of the one who wore the money belt: he and the gold could disappear in the mire, and with it their hopes of buying land.

William was definitely the head of the family. He bought the land, later selling or renting to his sons. He sold Samuel the lot across the road and rented Moses the R $\frac{1}{2}$ of his own for a time. In 1847 Moses bought 200 acres in Osgoode twp., on the Dalmeny Road. William would walk cross-country to visit Moses and his family. This entailed crossing two rivers, the Jock and the Rideau, and involved a distance of at least 20 miles - this when William was 90 years or more. William died Dec 30, 1860 aged 102 years. He is buried in the Old Shillington Cemetery, E $\frac{1}{2}$ L12 C5 Goulbourn twp., quite near his home.

William was an elder in the Presbyterian Church in Richmond, Ont. In 1843 he signed the petition sent by the congregation requesting the deed to the property which had been in use as a burying ground since 1818. The deed was issued and registered March 11, 1845, in the names of the Reverend David Evans, Anthony Phillips and William Gordon as Trustees.

The only description of our ancestor is that given by the Rev. Wm Bell, first Presbyterian minister in Perth, Dalhousie District, U.C. "Feb 6, 1837 - preached at 4pm in a Methodist chapel 20 miles from Perth (Prospect). Here I found a worthy, kind-hearted Irishman, a Mr. Gordon, with whom I went 5 miles further and remained at his home all night. From his family, on this, as on former occasions I met with a cordial welcome and hospitable entertainment." This description may not be of William, but could be of his son John. The two farms were side by side. In his diary Mr. Bell rarely used a first name, once he referred to visiting Ben Gordon. We have a story from one of the Bell sons, who later became Registrar, Queen's University, Kingston, Ont., about a Mr. Gordon welcoming his father with a hearty handshake and saying, "I'm cruel glad to see you!" This we believe to be John Gordon, who built the stone house on W $\frac{1}{2}$ L14 C4 in 1837.

This John lived only three years after his father. He left a family of nine, seven daughters and two sons. Of the seven daughters, six married Lowry men of Huntley and Fitzroy twps. This explains the title of this record.

First Generation

A1 JOHN GORDON - b ca 1791, in Co. Armagh, Ireland, d Aug 15, 1863, Goulbourn twp., Ont., bu Presbyterian Cemetery, Richmond, Ont. No marker. Son of William Gordon and his first wife, m Apr 6, 1823, Margaret Moorhead, b ca 1802, in Ireland, d Jan 8, 1888, Huntley twp., bu Lowry Cemetery, Fitzroy twp., dau of John Moorhead who emigrated before her. Her mother died in Ireland. Margaret travelled to Canada alone; one story is that she was shipwrecked at Anticosti Island and was badly sunburned from sleeping on the beach. She joined her father in Cornwall, and later they walked through the bush to the present day Ottawa and on to settle in Huntley twp. A story has come down that John Gordon stopped to ask for a drink of water on a hot day. Margaret drew the water from their well and exposed a neat ankle which he admired. John returned and later they were married.

John was first located Feb 25, 1820 on E $\frac{1}{2}$ L16 C6 - 100 acres in Goulbourn twp., and owned a Crown lot on McBean Street in Richmond Village. His deed states that he came from Druminnii, Parish of Mullebrach, County of Armagh, Ireland. In 1826 he paid 50 pounds for E $\frac{1}{2}$ L13 C4 - 100 acres, Goulbourn twp., and a few years later 85 pounds for two 50 acre parcels making up W $\frac{1}{2}$ L14 C4. The log house which is pictured on the cover is the first one he built when he settled on E $\frac{1}{2}$ L13 C4. In 1837 he built a stone house on W $\frac{1}{2}$ L14 C4. This house originally had three fire-places, one in the basement, one in the dining-room, and one in the parlor. These were later closed and replaced by a stove and furnace. This house is close to the road, the door was never locked and many passers-by on the way to Bytown market, stopped in the wee small hours to warm themselves by the fire, drink a cup of tea and chat with their hosts who visited from their bed in the room off the dining-room.

John owned the first horse in the community and Margaret the first stove. It is reported that John bought horses and cattle in the area of the St. Lawrence River, drove them to Richmond where he sold them. His son, A18 - William and grandson A184 - Wellie both carried on this tradition of dealing in livestock, although Wellie dealt mainly in cattle, hogs and lambs.

A2 NANCY GORDON -- b ca 1794 in Ireland, d Oct 26, 1881, Goulbourn twp., dau of William Gordon and his first wife, m in Ireland, Thomas Herron, b ca 1796 in Ireland, d Apr 29, 1881, both are bu in the Shillington Cemetery, C5 Goulbourn twp. The Herrons emigrated in 1832 and bought SE $\frac{1}{2}$ L6 C6 Goulbourn twp., the deed registered Oct 6, 1832. In 1839 Thomas bought NE $\frac{1}{2}$ L4 C6 Goulbourn twp., and he built a stone house on this second property. The first farm he sold to his oldest son, Curry. The family are given, as listed by the Rev. J.R. Conn, who married Curry Herron's granddaughter, Edna Millions. Mr. Conn who knew Curry Herron and had access to some of the family Bibles, left a written record. Curry states he is the 2nd child of Thomas & Nancy Herron; we hope the others in the family are listed in the order of birth.

Mary d Feb 3, 1874, Huntley twp., and they are both bu in Lowry Cemetery, Fitzroy twp. William farmed all his life. They had no family but in the census records we find one or more of their nieces from Goulbourn staying with them.

Samuel came to Canada with his father in 1827, m ca 1831, Mary Wilson, b ca 1809, Co. Antrim, Ireland, d June 2, 1896, Goulbourn twp., both bu Munster Cemetery, Goulbourn twp. On Jan 4, 1833, William Gordon bought E $\frac{1}{2}$ L12 C3 (50 acres) and sold it to Samuel, Jan 1, 1839. On May 14, 1855 Samuel bought W $\frac{1}{2}$ L12 C3 (50 acres). On Mar 20, 1857 Samuel sold 1200 ft. to S.S. No. 2 for the school, where a log school was built. On Feb 14, 1878 he sold another $\frac{1}{2}$ acre to the school section and a stone school was erected. This was in use until 1967 when a consolidated school system was started and the children were bussed across the twp. Samuel farmed on this property all his life.

William willed his property to Andrew in 1851 but in 1858 he added a codicil stating that it was to be Andrew's only for his lifetime; this change probably due to the fact that Andrew had no children. After the death of Andrew and his wife, the property was sold to a grandson, John Gordon, who owned the adjoining property. The house was never lived in again, the buildings gradually disappeared, last of all the barn; to-day only a few fruit trees, gone wild, mark where the home had been. The land remained in the Gordon family until 1967. It has been sold as a separate property again recently and on it now stands a modern home, built almost 150 years after William's log house.

In 1851 he was a merchant on Sussex St., Ottawa, later he moved to Bank St. Afterwards he became a clerk in the Customs and was Surveyor of Customs at the time of his death. This was the top position in the Customs division and seems to have been a matter of pride to his descendants since the fact has been quoted in several death notices.

A7 MOSES GORDON - b May 26, 1815 in Co. Armagh, Ireland, d June 6, 1896, Osgoode twp., bu Springhill Cemetery, Vernon, Ont., son of William Gordon and his second wife, came to Canada in 1827 with his father. He was married Mar 11, 1839, after the publication of banns, at Franktown, Ont., by the Rev. Wm. Bell, with Benjamin Gordon and Peter McGregor as witnesses, to Jessie Cram, b Aug 27, 1822, Beckwith twp., dau of John Cram & Isabelle Stalker. In the 1842 census records Moses is a tenant on the R $\frac{1}{2}$ W $\frac{1}{2}$ L13 C4 (50 acres) rented from his father. Here Moses and his bro Ben had built a log house from rock elm growing on their land. That building still stands to-day and is used as an outbuilding.

A story is told of a neighbour riding home from Richmond, stopping to talk to Moses while he was plowing in the field next the road (65). They must have boasted of their horses, because Moses unharnessed a horse, and he riding bareback, the two men raced their horses, one inside the fence, the other on the road. No one remembers who won. In Dec 1847 Moses bought L36 C4 Osgoode twp., (200 acres) and farmed there until his death. His father sold the property he vacated in Goulbourn the same month. Jessie d May 19, 1906, Osgoode twp., bu Springhill Cemetery as above.

John was born in the basement of his father's stone house which was being completed on W $\frac{1}{2}$ L14 C4 Goulbourn twp. When he married he bought the F $\frac{1}{2}$ E $\frac{1}{2}$ L13 from his father (50 acres) and received the second (50) for considerations when his father died. He lived here and farmed all his life. His house was the one on the cover. He rented a farm for a period of 6 yrs in Nepean twp. but continued to work the home place, although the family lived in Nepean 1882 - 1888.

John's farm had limestone which his family quarried, built a lime kiln where the stone was fired and burned to lime. This took a continuous fire for more than 24 hours. It also had a maple bush which produced maple syrup. In his day it was boiled in iron kettles. There was one large cedar tree on the farm, the trunk was about 6 feet in diameter and more than 150 fence logs had been cut from the limbs. People came for miles around to see the tree lying. The trunk was never cut, probably because it was too large for the saws available.

John Gordon took an active part in community life. He was an elder in the Presbyterian Church, Richmond and Jock, and a Trustee of the Manse property belonging to it. It was said he could come from church and repeat sermon word for word. He was a reader and a student of the Bible. The Rev Stuart Woods, minister at Richmond, used to tell this story on himself. About a year after his induction there he had had a very busy week, so he picked out one of his early sermons, changed it slightly and preached first at Richmond, then Fallowfield, then Jock. After the evening service at Jock, Mr. Gordon said "I liked that sermon better than the first time Mr. Woods." Margaret wove the cloth for her sons suits although they called in a tailor to make them up. She also wove blankets and other household material.

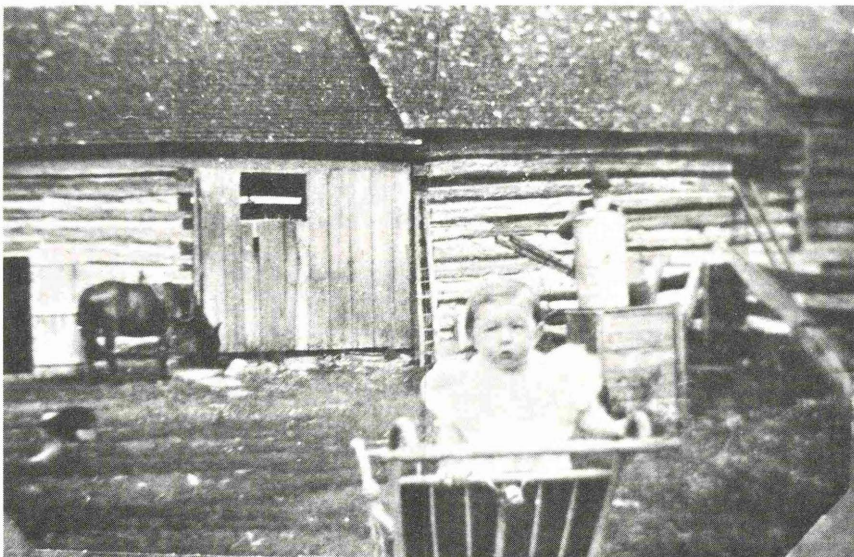

"THINGS IN THE WEST ALWAYS COME BACK"

One day in 1932 Mr. W. G. Graham of Madison, Sask. while ploughing with his tractor, stopped for minor repairs. These completed, he stooped and picked up a handful of soil to remove the grease from his hands. To his surprise he discovered that he had also picked up a gold locket. This locket was in good repair. Mr. Graham took it to the local jeweller who, discovering the initials C. B. of C., sent him to the Canadian Bank of Commerce at Eston, Sask.

Here the accountant, Mr. Bowman, told Mr. Graham he would attempt to find the owner and, if he failed would return the locket to him. He sent the locket with the above account to the Editor, "The Caduceus", the staff magazine of the Canadian Bank of Commerce. The Editor, Mr. Wagner, discovered more engraving showing it to be the award of W.B.H.L. which was interpreted as The Winnipeg Bankers Hockey League. There was also a monogram on the front, W.V.G. Mr. Wagner checked local history of the Madison area and believed the W.V.G. referred to William Verner Gordon, who had been manager of the Kindersley, Sask. branch from 1910 to the early part of 1917. Kindersley is about 25 miles from Madison.

Mr. W. Verner Gordon was then (1932) Superintendent of the Maritime Region, when Mr. Wagner forwarded from Toronto the locket plus the story. You can imagine his surprise at receiving something lost 15-22 years before. He remembered losing it when he travelled the area south-east of Kindersley, sometimes by car but also on horseback. The locket contained a picture of the winning hockey team of 1906-1907 and was so well preserved that not withstanding its miniature size the manager of the Halifax branch could distinguish and name all of those in it. (A picture of this team is on Plate 16).

Mr. Gordon immediately wrote to all concerned to express his delight at the return of the locket and included a tangible expression of his thanks to Mr. Graham, the finder, who had taken the trouble to ensure its reaching the owner. This story is about A645 William Verner Gordon.

PIONEERING BY BANKERS

Sometimes we think of farmers as the only pioneers. The following is a brief account of two men who opened a branch of the Canadian Bank of Commerce at Provost, Alta. in 1910. The details are recorded in an article published in "The Caduceus" July, 1925, by S. Dunbar.

Mr. Dunbar received instructions to join A645 W. Verner Gordon at Hardisty, Alta. thence to proceed to Provost, which was 60 miles from the railway. Having missed Gordon by one day he got the use of a good fur coat, hired a cutter and driver and set out in 30° F below zero for his 60-mile drive. It was cold and he was sure they had the slowest team in the country. The drive took two days. They spent the night in a half-way house at Ribstone Creek; Three homestead seekers and himself shared a bed in an outhouse and slept in their clothes including their fur coats. They had to rise early so the cow could be brought in to be milked.

The two bank men brought the population of Provost to twenty-seven. He says, outside of ourselves and the odd Scandinavian all seemed to hail from Bruce County, Ontario. There were three general stores, a hardware and very little else. Since Verner Gordon arrived first he

pre-empted the only decent bed in town in one of the general stores. Dunbar got temporary quarters over the store and frequently woke up with his head covered in snow (blown in through the cracks) and to the washing water frozen in the pitcher. They had the use of a broken-down safe but put in it only their few books. To maintain double custody of the cash, Dunbar carried it in his hip pocket while Gordon carried the gun.

Banking duties did not take our full time and talk sessions sitting around on flour bags in the general stores settled many world problems. It was a lonely country, the real prairie, and you could see for miles in every direction. All supplies were freighted in from Hardisty and the big event of the week was the arrival of the mail on Saturday. In a couple of months an amateur carpenter had completed a building for the bank. They moved into half of it, sharing it with the drug store. However, the new building was like the store, not airtight.

After some months they felt the need of a haircut. Before they operated on each other, they heard of a farmer who had worked for a week in a barber shop! When he finished they knew why he had lasted only a week. Gordon left after some months and a new manager was sent in. Shortly afterwards the railway was completed and a good hotel was built. Then they moved across the street to a much better building. Provost was on its way.

"BLESS THIS TOWN"

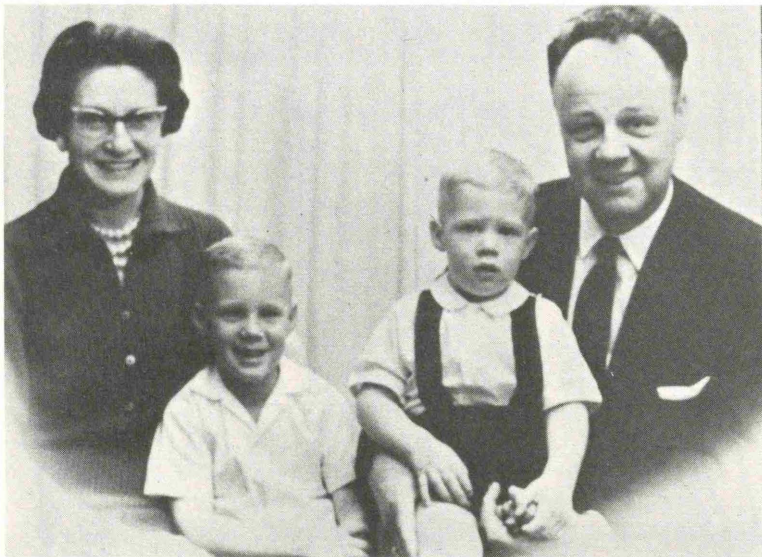

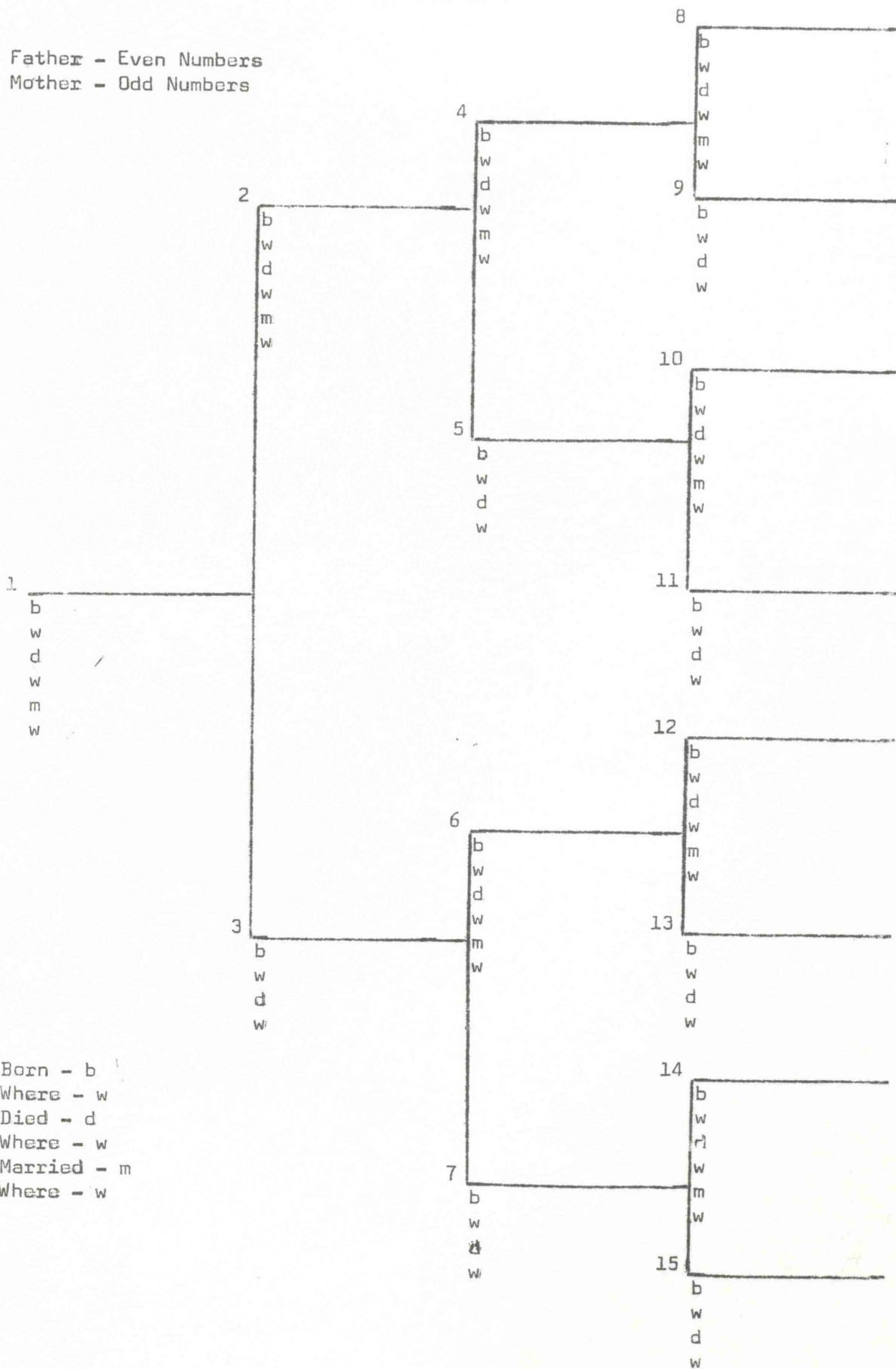

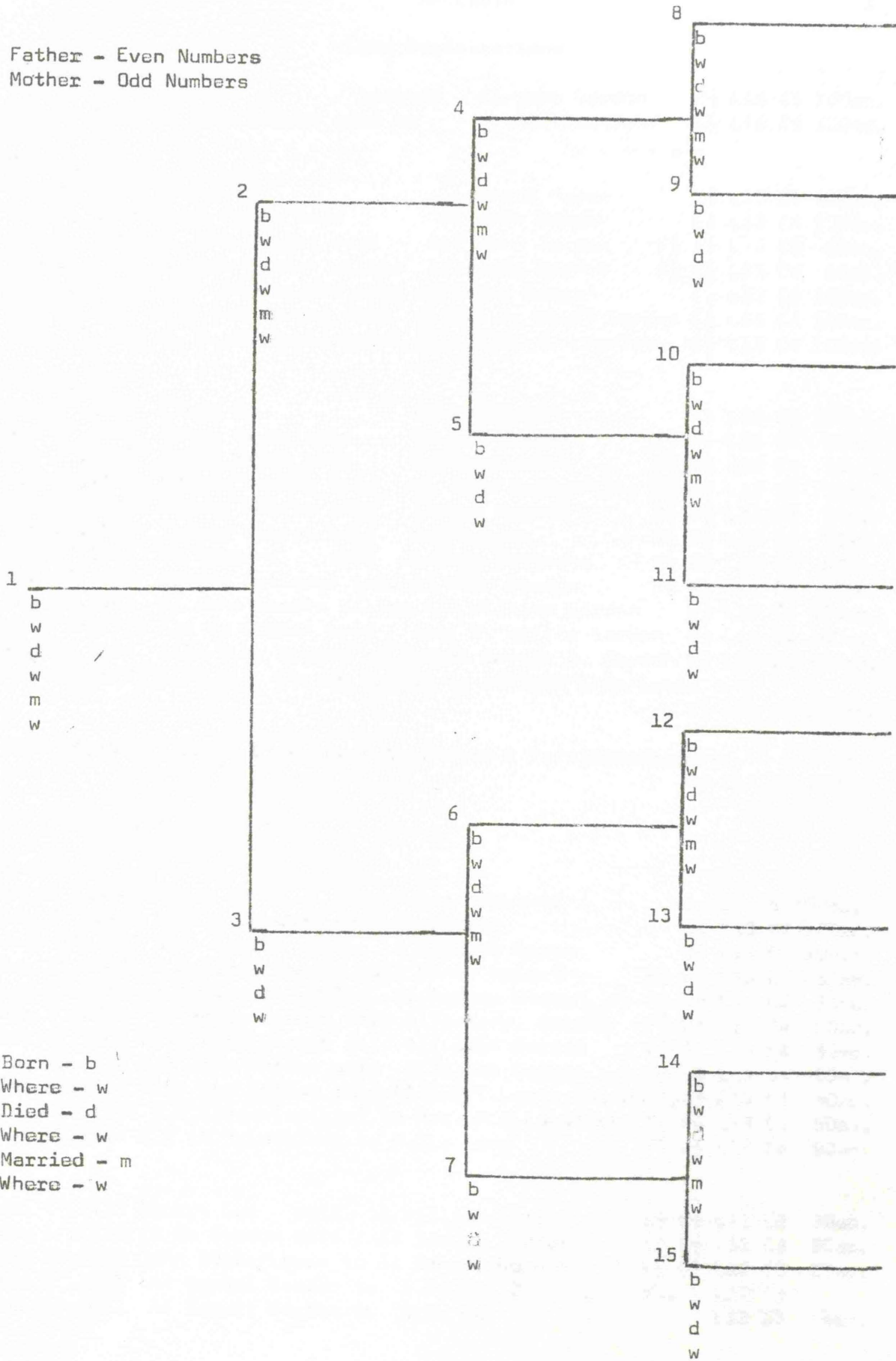

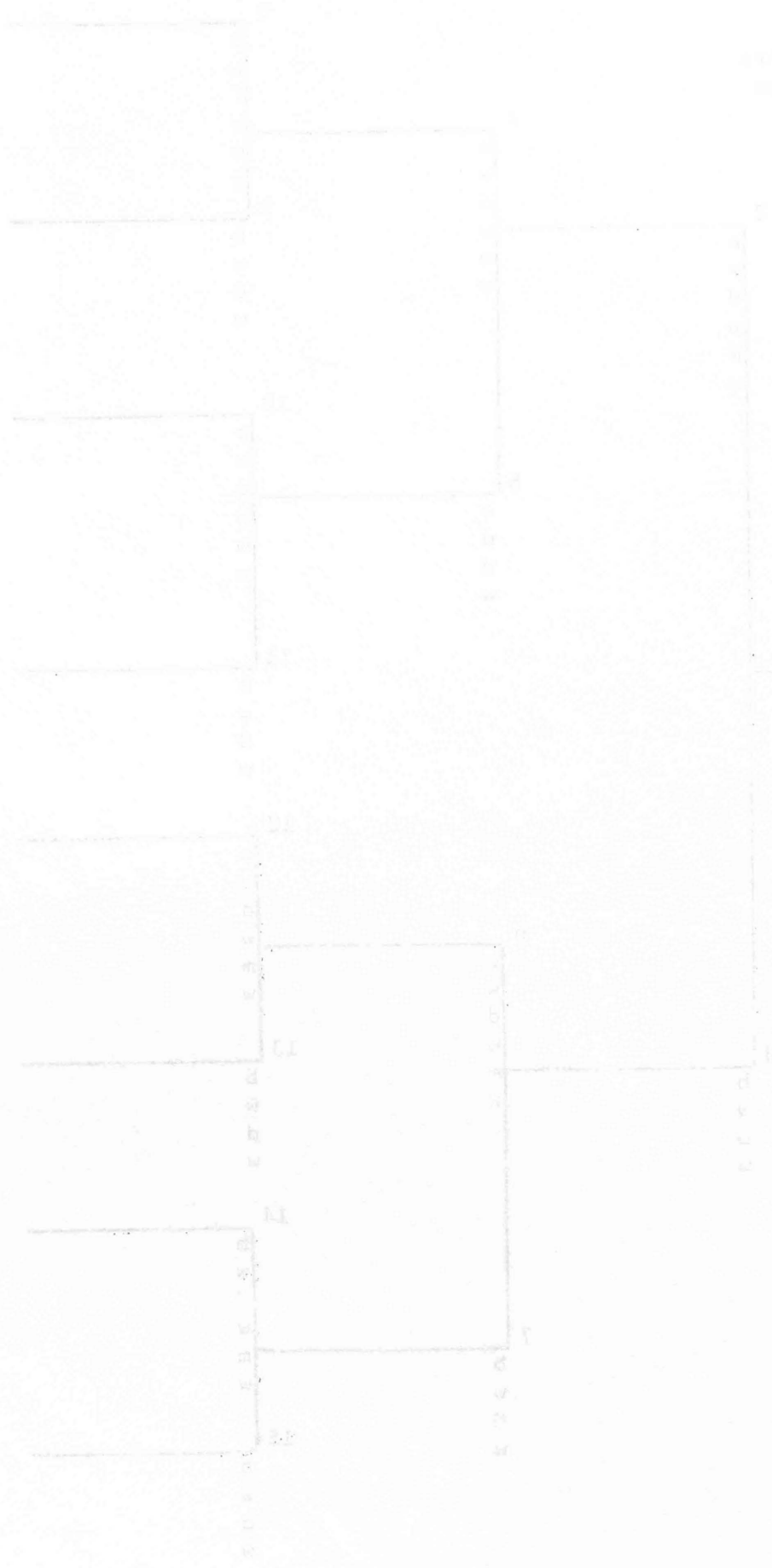


Figure 1 - Grid Layout
