N.B. The record from Christopher Aldworth to the present date has been prepared from personal knowledge. The remainder of the record from the beginning to Christopher Aldworth has been taken exactly as it appears in Burke's Landed Gentry and Burke's Peerage. It is obvious that the Christopher Aldworth in the Marriage Settlement of 1815, is one and the same person as the Christopher Aldworth in B. Landed Gentry. This is confirmed by the fact that (1) the Marriage Settlement states that Maria Aldworth was entitled by virtue of the last will and testament of her father, the said Christopher Aldworth to one third part of a perpetual annuity chargeable on and payable out of the lands of Ballybrack in the County of Cork, and (2) the Charles Oliver Aldworth, grand nephew of Christopher Aldworth in B. L. G. is described in B. L. G. as Charles Oliver Aldworth of Bona curra and Ballybrack. and (3) In the Marriage Settlement, Christopher Aldworth is described as "late of the City of Cork, Gentleman, deceased" and in B. L. G. note is made that he died in 1796. R.A.D. Feb 16. 1957
