PETERS History of the Peters Family  
*(Compiled by John S. Smith)*

**PETERS, John Samuel**, governor of Connecticut, was born in Hebron, Conn., Sept. 21, 1772; son of Beneslie and Ann (Shipman) Peters; grandson of William Peters, and a descendant of William Peters, son of Lord Peters of England, who immigrated to America with his brothers Thomas and Hugh, and settled in Meriden, Mass. Beneslie Peters in company with other loyalists sailed to England in 1777, and after residing there for a time secured a large tract of land in Upper Canada, where he settled with his family. John worked on a farm, attended the district schools, and in 1790 began to teach school in Hebron. He studied medicine under Dr. Benjamin Peters of Marbletown, N.Y., for six months and then under Dr. Abner Mosely of Glastonbury, Conn.; in 1796 attended lectures in Philadelphia, Pa., and practised in Hebron, 1797-1837. He was town clerk for twenty years, judge of probate for the district of Hebron, and frequently a member of the state legislature. He received the votes of one branch of the state legislature in 1824, when Calvin Willey was elected; was lieutenant-governor of Connecticut, 1827-31, and governor of the state, 1831-33. He was a fellow of the Tolland County Medical society; treasurer, vice-president and president of the State Medical society, and received the honorary degree of M.D. from Yale in 1818, and LL.D. from Trinity in 1831. He died in Hebron, Conn., March 30, 1857.



company of provincial troops, 1775-76. He was elected by congress, secretary of the Continental board of war, June 13, 1776, and served till 1781, when he was appointed a commissioner of war. In 1780 he personally subscribed £5000 for the provisioning of the army, and when he resigned his office of secretary in 1781, congress passed a vote of thanks ~~for his long and faithful services.~~ He was a delegate to the Continental congress, 1782-83; a member and speaker of the state assembly, 1787-90, and speaker of the state senate in 1791. He declined the comptrollership of the treasury tendered him in 1792 by President Washington, and was appointed judge of the U.S. district court for Pennsylvania, April 11, 1792, serving till his death. He was a member of the Philadelphia Agricultural society for over thirty years, and its first president; was instrumental in constructing the first bridge over the Schuylkill river, and was first president of the bridge company. He was married to Sarah, daughter of Abraham Robinson. The honorary degree of LL.D. was conferred on him in 1827 by the University of Pennsylvania, of which institution he was a trustee, 1789-91. He is the author of: *Admiralty Decisions of the District Court of the United States for the Pennsylvania Districts, 1780-1807* (1807). He died at Belmont, Philadelphia, Pa., Aug. 22, 1823.

**PETERS, Richard**, law reporter and author, was born at Blockley, Philadelphia, Pa., in August, 1780; son of Richard (q.v.) and Sarah (Robinson) Peters. He was admitted to the bar in 1800 and practised in Philadelphia. He was solicitor of Philadelphia county, 1822-25; was one of the founders of the Philadelphia Saving Fund society, and was chosen reporter of the U.S. supreme court to succeed Henry Wheaton. He edited "Chitty on Bills of Exchange" (3 vols., 1810), and Bushrod Washington's "Circuit Court Reports" (4 vols., 1826-29), and is the author of: *Reports of the U.S. Circuit Court, 1803-18* (1819); *Reports of the U.S. Supreme Court, 1828-43* (17 vols., 1828-43); *Condensed Reports of Cases in the U.S. Supreme Court from its Organization till 1827* (6 vols., 1835); *Full and Arranged Digest of cases determined in the Supreme, Circuit and District Courts of the United States, from the Organization of the Government* (3 vols., 1838-39; 2d ed., 2 vols., 1848). He died at Belmont, Philadelphia, Pa., May 2, 1848.

**PETERS, Samuel Ritter**, representative, was born in Walnut Township, Pickaway county, Ohio, Aug. 16, 1842; son of Lewis S. and Margaret (Ritter) Peters. He matriculated at Ohio Wesleyan university with the class of 1864; served in the Federal army as private, sergeant, lieutenant, adjutant and captain in the 73d Ohio volunteers, 1861-65; was graduated at the University of Michigan, LL.B., 1867; practised law in Memphis,

Beneslie (Bensley) Peters migrated to Kingston Ont in 1792. Here was a "Treasury" Loyalist.

## Descendants of Andrew Peters (of Massachusetts)

### Generation No. 1

1. **Andrew<sup>3</sup> Peters** (William<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>) was born 1634, and died 1713 in Andover, Essex County, Massachusetts. He married **Mercy Beamsley** 1659, daughter of William Beamsley and Anne. She was born December 09, 1637, and died November 05, 1726.

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PETERS The name of Peters is derived from the Latin Petrus, of Biblical origin, and is also spelled Petre, Peter, and Peeters. Tor Brian, Devonshire, is the cradle of the noted house of Petre in England, and Tor Newton the birthplace of Sir William Petre, most eminent of the numerous distinguished sons of Sir John Petre, Kt., of Exeter in Devon. The youngest son, Sir William, was first brought to Court by Cromwell (and quickly became a favorite with Henry VIII) He founded eight fellowships at Exeter College and was a noted diplomat and Secretary of State, enjoying the friendship equally of monarchs Henry, Edward, Mary and Elizabeth. *Note. Sir John Petre was Secretary of State under Henry VIII. J.S.S.*

It is believed that ANDREW PETERS<sup>1</sup>, who was born in 1634 and came to New England apparently from Holland, was of this noted Devonshire family. It is claimed that he descends from the fourth son of Sir John Petre. Certainly he arrived in Boston a young man with an education well above average and well provided with money. Filled with youthful spirits, he seemed prone to get into minor scrapes, and one comic incident duly recorded in the county records serves to remind us that our colonial ancestors were flesh and blood human beings, neither all good or all bad: "May, 1663, Ipswich, Andrew Peters presented for disturbance or breach of the peace at the ordinary in Wenam, throwing cheese at Thomas Willet, and pursuing the latter when he attempted to escape until stopped by John Selado." The first record of Andrew is in 1659 when he married Mercy (Mary) Beamsley, widow of Michael Wilborne. When seen striding down the muddy street in Boston one rainy day, he was hailed as one of those "Hollanders". Andrew bought from Bridget Varney for 40 her "dwelling house.....shop, outhouses, yards, gardens, Orchards and all the appurtenances thereunto belonging" November 2, 1663. The house was of brick on a corner lot. In 1664, he had one share in Plum Island, Castle Neck and Hog Island. May 29, 1665, he bought for 66, 15 1/4 acres of upland and marsh at Reedy Marsh from Richard Shatswell of Ipswich, and January 24, 1667, he gave Ezekiel Woodward, carpenter, two small lots on Plum Island of about 7 acres in payment for the building of a barn near his dwelling house in Ipswich. In 1668 he added a leanto to his barn and built a "cyder-mill" indicating that he owned a large orchard. He was a distiller at Ipswich, holding a retail liquor license from 1662, bound "not to sell by retail to any but men of family and of good repute, nor sell any after sun sett." He purchased other real estate and in 1671 built a house over his cider-mill; had right of commonage in Ipswich in 1678. Andrew was a soldier in the Narragansett campaign, one of the courageous men who stormed the Fort in the dead of winter and pursued the Indians through the heavy snow. Before leaving Ipswich for Andover, he sold his building and orchards, except for the cider mill, to William Baker, a glover, November 22, 1687, for 65. In 1689, he was granted at Andover three acres and sixty rods of land. His "still-house" there was set afire, perhaps twice, and three of his sons killed by Indians. In 1703, Captain Christopher Osgood, military officer of Andover, received orders: "I am directed by his Excellency our Governor to build two block-houses in your town upon the brink of Merrimac River, one at the fording-place called Deare's Jump and one at a fording-place commonly called Mr. Petters wading-place." From 1686 to 1725 the settlers of Andover lived part of each year in these garrisons due to the depredations of marauding Indians; men carried arms to church and when at work in the fields. Mr. Peters was chosen by the selectmen of Andover March 1, 1699, to succeed William Chandler as innholder. He was a selectman in 1704; treasurer in 1706-07; assessor in 1710, 1711, and 1713; and on a church committee in 1712. He died December 13, 1713, and his widow November 5, 1726, in Andover.

Colonel John Peters (b.1740) of Hebron, Connecticut, fought in the American Revolutionary War on the British side. He was under Colonel Jessup and Colonel Butler. Colonel Peters led the disastrous raid on Bennington, Vermont, commanding the Queen's Loyal Rangers. After the war, he went to Nova Scotia, where he sought for compensation for his war losses. 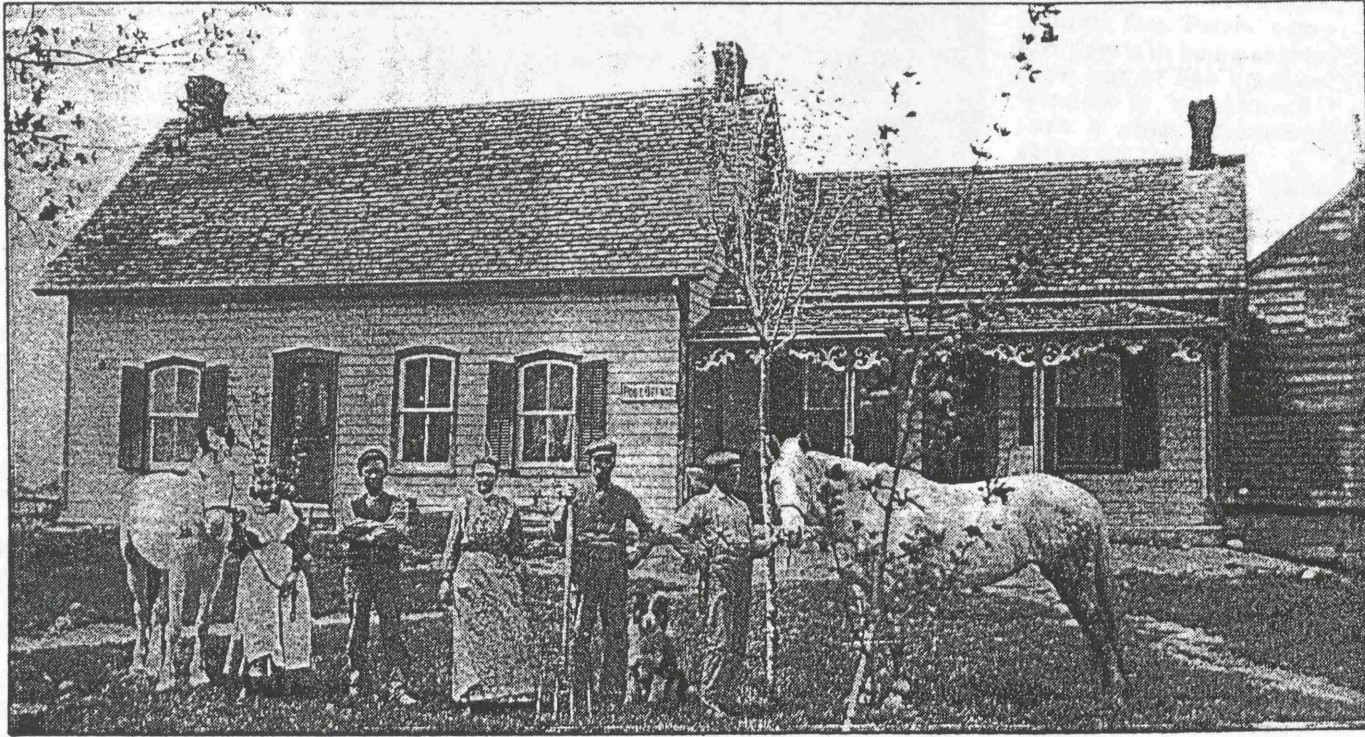

# Grand old lady of Cole Lake celebrates her 95th birthday

COLE LAKE

Hinchinbrooke Township's 'grand old lady' and its oldest resident, Mrs. George Peters of Cole Lake, celebrated her 95th birthday on March 9 in her hilltop farm home with a panoramic view of the county's picturesque heartland.

The former Maud Clow, she was born March 9, 1887, a daughter of Mathias Clow and his wife, the former Jane Saulsbury, at nearby Oak Flats. After her marriage in 1908 to George Peters, she moved to the Peters' ancestral home settled by Benson Peters, a prominent pioneer of the nearly 1800s.

Her residence is located just north of Godfrey on Highway 38.

"If I told all the things I remember over the past 95 years, the newspaper wouldn't hold it all!" she said.

Some of her pioneer memories include those of her uncle Luke Saulsbury taking kids for sleigh rides with his team of oxen, and of John Bush clearing farmland with oxen.

Still in reasonably good health as she nears the century mark, Mrs. Peters is living proof "that plenty of hard work never hurt anyone." She has a good appetite and can eat "anything that is on the table."

She believes everyone needs a hearty breakfast to start the day right.

Every morning throughout her long life she has eaten hot oatmeal cereal, covered with rich milk, sweetened with honey, followed by two soft boiled eggs. Those suffering from cholesterolphobia please note!

Although an extremely busy farm wife and mother — she raised seven children — she found time to assist with hand milking the 25 cows on the farm for many years. She also often helped relatives with their milking chores. "I remember doing the milking; for my uncle Chet and Aunt Maggie Babcock while they were away to Kingston market selling their butter and other farm produce," she said.

Her son Williard remembers: "Mother always had a hot supper ready for us kids when we got home from school after a tiring two-mile walk from the schoolhouse."

She also specialized in raising hundreds of chickens and turkeys every year. She remembers an amusing incident from her poultry raising days.

"I came in from the henhouse with a big pail of eggs, and on opening the cellar door, I tripped on something on the top step. I fell down and

landed in all those broken eggs. What a slippery mess! I broke two ribs which sometimes hurt me even yet," she said.

As a young woman she was much in demand throughout the area as a midwife.

Family names she remembers were Reynolds, Deere and Quinn. She regrets that Carmen Reynolds, Clifford Deere and Mary Quinn of these families are no longer living.

She enjoyed picking wild berries every summer and sharing them with Hattie Steele, a blind woman who lived in Verona. She always made a point of picking her berries 'clean,' so that they were ready for preserving when she got home. "My

brother, Will, would sometimes help to pick, and when he did, we sold some of the berries to buy the sugar to preserve the remainder for winter," she recalls.

For many years there seemed to be a continual house full of visitors in the Peters' home because the CPR station was right on the farm. People from further north would come and stay over night so they could catch the train for Kingston the next morning. Return fare was \$2.10.

The Peters' large farm of 400 acres was the capital of Cole Lake in the early days.

It was not only the site of the bustling railway station, but a cheese fac-

tory, a general store, a post office and a country church. Today only the church remains.

A devout member of the Free Methodist Church, Mrs. Peters' comfort now is in being able to look out of her kitchen window at 'her church' just a short distance across the field.

When the new Cole Lake Free Methodist Church was built in 1928 George Peters' willingly donated the building site from his farmland. Prior to building the new church, worship services were held in the Peters' spacious brick farm home.

Mrs. Peters still resides in this comfortable home where she came as a bride 74 years ago. She has the unique distinction of sitting for 74 years at the same place and same table to eat her meals. "That's mother's place and no one would even think of sitting there," her family says.

Members of her family are: Williard Peters, Verona; Mrs. Meredith Wilson (Alice), Verona; Mrs. Earl Clow (Pansy), Port Hope; Mrs. Elwood Silver (Dorothy), Napanee; and Arthur at home. There are two deceased sons, Floyd and Garnet. Her husband, a cancer victim, died in 1963.

She has 11 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

John Peters was born in Hebron, Connecticut in 1740 and was educated at Yale College, where he studied law, receiving a B.A. degree in 1759. At Yale, he formed a life long friendship with Edmund Fanning, who would become the lieutenant governor, first of Nova Scotia and later of Prince Edward Island, UEL.

In 1761, John married Ann Barnett, whose father was a merchant of Windsor, Connecticut, and two years later, they moved to Piermont, New Hampshire, on the east bank of the Connecticut River. Here, John built a house, barn, and a sawmill. He became a Deputy-Surveyor of the King's Woods, and a Captain commandant of the militia.

By 1770, John and Ann had moved to Moortown, on the west side of the Connecticut River, in Gloucester County, New Hampshire Grants, in the Province of New York. He acquired large holdings there and erected a house, barn, saw and grist mills, in addition to farming. Governor Tryon appointed him a Colonel of militia, Justice of the Peace, Judge of Probates, County Registrar, Court Clerk and Judge of the Court of Common Pleas, which his law degree made him well qualified for.

The Counties of Gloucester and Cumberland (since called Vermont) desired John to attend the Congress at Philadelphia in 1774, and he passed through Hebron, Conn on his way there, where he was mobbed with his uncles, Samuel, Jonathon, and Benjamin Peters, by the Liberty Boys, because they were accused of Loyalty to the British Crown. He attended a session in Philadelphia, but refused to take the oath of secrecy to the Congress and wrote to this effect to his uncle Samuel in Hebron, who fled to England for safety. Back home in Moortown, he was seized by three mobs, ill-treated and then dismissed, at Weatherfield, Hartford, and Springfield, Connecticut.

At home in 1775, John was seized by another mob and brought before the Committee of Safety, but was dismissed for lack of evidence. After the shooting at Concord and Lexington, the mob ordered John to prepare the militia; he obeyed, although the mob attacked his house anyway.

John Peters finally left Moortown in March, 1776 with the rebel Timothy Bedel, who was taking an expedition north to capture Quebec. At the Cedars above Montreal, Peters persuaded Bedel not to burn the village, and got a message though to Captain George Forster, who led some soldiers from Fort Oswegatchie to take the Cedars. Peters got permission from Bedel to visit Montreal for provisions; then Forster captured the fort. At Montreal, he met with Dr. Franklin, General Wooster, Col Benedict Arnold and other Commissioners from Congress. Arnold bragged that a force of 700 men was about to attack Forster. Peters sent a friend to warn Forster, who was able to escape across the St. Lawrence River.

When Arnold was about to evacuate Montreal, he decided to burn the city, and again Peters alerted the residents, who set a watch until Arnold left. Peters, however, was not able to slip away from the rebels, and went with them to Sorel, Quebec, where General

John Sullivan arrested him on the suspicion he was in communication with Forster. Peters remained with the rebels during their retreat as far as Isle LaMott, on Lake Champlain, where he was set free. Here he and a Dr Skinner hid in the woods. On June 28, they went back to the deserted rebel campsite, found a canoe, and paddled 40 miles to Fort St Johns, where they found a British force under General Simon Frazer. Frazer led them to Fort Chambly and introduced them to Governor Sir Guy Carleton. Carleton sent them on to Montreal, where the citizens gave him a warm welcome, because he had prevented destruction of their property.

John Peters later went to Fort Chambly, and became a volunteer on Sir Guy Carleton's expedition up Lake Champlain, where he served as a pilot in Fraser's vanguard. Following the defeat of Benedict Arnold's fleet in Oct, 1776, the British Army withdrew to Fort St Johns and went into winter quarters. Peters and several others found billets in Montreal.

Ann Peters and her eight children remained at home in Moortown until January 1777. At that time the Committee of Safety confiscated the Peter's property, and General Jacob Bailey, a former family friend, ordered the family out of the house and sent them in a sleigh, with one bed, toward Fort Ticonderoga, where a rebel garrison under the command of "Mad. Anthony" Wayne was in residence. They finally arrived in Fort St. John, Quebec in May 1777, well, but naked and dirty.

At this time, Carleton made Peters a Lieutenant- Colonel in the provisional ranks. On June 14th, General Burgoyne instructed him to bring the men he had raised, to accompany Burgoyne on his invasion of the northern colonies. John Peters, Jr age 15, went along as an ensign. Ann Peters and the other 7 children stayed in Montreal where they were befriended by Allan McLean, commandant of the city's garrison.

The battalion of loyalists that Peters raised were called the Queen's Loyal Rangers. Most of Peters' recruits would come from the Green Mountain area. A certificate signed by Justus Sherwood in October 1777, shows that the commander- in- chief, Sir William Howe, had a hand in establishing the corps— the reason why Carleton and Haldimand regarded Peter's men only " temporarily in Canada". The first officers appointed were Captain Francis Hogel and Lieutenant Gershom French, who were chosen by Howe on Oct 26, 1776 in New York City, long before Carleton gave his permission for the establishment of the Queens Loyal Rangers.

Peters own appointment as Lieutenant- Colonel is dated June 27, 1777, at which time Justus Sherwood was made the Corps senior Captain. Others were Captain Jeremiah French, Ensign John Peters Jr, Major Zadock Wright, Lieutenant James Parrot, Lieutenant John Dulmage, Lieutenant Philo Hurlburt and Quartermaster Titus Simons. All but Francis Hogel and Gershom French received their appointments from General John Burgoyne. Omitted were two officers who had transferred to another corps, and several who were killed in action or prisoners of war, when Sherwood compiled the list. When John Peters was sending agents into the Green Mountains to recruit for his corps, the local people were proclaiming the New Hampshire Grants the independent Republic of Vermont. Legally, it was part of New York, but most of the settlers were

from Connecticut. Many men were recruited from refugees in Montreal. Justus Sherwood brought 40 men to Crown Point, NY, half of whom were from Camden Valley under the leadership of Edward Carscallen.

The Queens Loyal Rangers were at first quartered at Longueil and soon received orders to march to Fort St Johns to hook up with Burgoyne. Burgoyne captured Fort Ticonderoga and then ordered General Fraser to pursue the rebel army that was escaping through Vermont; with him went 300 of Peters' Queens Rangers, who knew the country well. Peters sent Captain Justus Sherwood on a scouting party in search of the enemy's vanguard. Sherwood reported back that Col Seth Warner and his Green Mountain Boys, a rebel regiment, were at Hubbardstown, after covering the retreat of General St Clair's army.

Fraser surprised some New Hampshire Militiamen and was routing them when Seth Warner appeared with his Green Mountain Boys. A full scale battle erupted. Warner lost out when Baron von Riedesel arrived with his Hessians. Warner lost 41 killed, 96 wounded, 234 captured out of 730 men—On the other side, 60 were killed, 148 wounded out of 1030 British, Prussians and Provincial troops.

Burgoyne who was at Skenesborough, decided to build a road to the Hudson. During this delay, Peters took the opportunity to bring in recruits from the nearby frontier. When the corps was first mustered in July 23, he had 262 men. Peters said he eventually raised 643 men. Peters and Sherwood apparently missed the battle at Hubbardstown, as they were out foraging.

The pay list of July 28, 1777 showed Peters had 14 non-commissioned officers. In addition to Justus Sherwood, the other captains were Jeremiah French, David McFall and Francis Hogle. Peters gave them money to be distributed to their men.

By 26 Aug, 1777, the road to the Hudson was open. The whole army went to Fort Edward, where Burgoyne settled in with Patrick Smyth. Many refugees came here from the Camden Valley. Here, Burgoyne formulated a plan for a force to go across Vermont toward the Connecticut Valley. This expedition was to be led by Colonel Frederick Baum, with his 500 Prussian troops, escorted by the Queens Loyal Rangers and Pfisters Loyal Volunteers, to obtain horses for the Brunswick Volunteers; to forage for provisions and complete Peters corps.

The Queen's Loyal Rangers and the men Pfister had raised marched from Fort Edward with Baum and fought the Battle of Bennington, Vermont. The expedition had set out on Aug 11 with about 1000 men, including the 500 Germans, the loyalists and riflemen, Baum's Brunswick Dragoons.

They tangled with superior numbers of rebels. Captain Justus Sherwood on a scouting expedition had sent word to Burgoyne that the rebels had a pile of supplies at Bennington guarded by only 400 militiamen. He advised him to stage a quick raid without delay. 1000 militia from New Hampshire had marched into Bennington with rebel General John Stark, a one time Captain Roger's Rangers in the Seven Years War of 1756-1763.



Baum scattered his forces into five parts at the Walloomsac River, four miles from Bennington. Colonel Peters was on the road to the rear with his Queen's Loyal Rangers. Peters sent Sherwood's company to join with Pfister. Heavy rain fell the night of Aug. 14, the Indians disappeared who were with the expedition; they were the eyes and ears of the British Army.

On Aug. 16, the rebel attack started on three sides. Peters said " I commanded the Loyalists at Bennington, When I had 291 of my regiment with me, and I lost about half of them in that engagement. The action commenced at 9 o'clock in the morning and continued until near 4 o'clock in the afternoon, when we retired in much confusion. I observed a man fire at me, which I returned. He loaded again as he came up, and discharged again at me, crying out ' Peters, you damned Tory, I have got you '. He rushed me with his bayonet, which entered just below my left breast, but was turned by the bones. By this time I was loaded, and I saw it was a rebel Captain Jerimiah Post by name, an old schoolmate and playfellow and a cousin of my wife. Though his bayonet was in my body I felt regret at being obliged to destroy him."

The rebels attacked Baum's positions separately; Baum may have fought off the onslaught had he placed his men closer together. The rebels blew up the tumbrel carrying Baum's powder. Peters continued

" We retreated from Bennington to the reinforcement that was coming up, which was soon attacked and were obliged to retreat to the bridge at the mills in Cambridge. General Fraser received me very kindly as I was wounded in the breast and foot." Seth Warner and his Green Mountain Boys set upon Colonel Henrich von Breyman's reinforcements two miles from the battlefield, and they were dispersed, ( as Peters said in his report above)

Not all the able-bodied Queen's Loyal Rangers left the field with Peters. Justus Sherwood took command of Pfister's loyalists after his death. Sherwood took cover and saved 46 of 60 in his company, despite heavy fire. All told, the casualties were staggering. Baum and Breyman had 1500 men between them; Burgoyne reported his losses as 1200 killed, wounded or captured. John Stark and Silas Warner lost 30 killed, 50 wounded out of 2500 men.

Back at Burgoyne's Army, now at Fort Miller, 35 miles from Bennington, Lt Edward Carscallen, Ensign John Wilson and 23 men asked to be transferred out of the Queen's Loyal Rangers and serve under Samuel McKay. Peters gave the dissidents the choice of serving with him or going to the guard house. To Sherwood's dismay, as these men were of his company, they chose to be locked up and were led away. Burgoyne sent them to McKay finally, and gave Sherwood full pay.

Back at Montreal, a false report reached Ann Peters that her husband had been killed in action. Eventually, three of Peters' sons served before the end of hostilities. Andrew Peters became a mid-shipman on Lake Champlain and Samuel Peters, a volunteer. Some of the Queen's Loyal Rangers were at the Battle of Freeman's Farm on Sept 19, when Burgoyne chose 3000 troops to attack the rebels. In this battle, rebel losses were 65 killed, 200 wounded while Burgoyne lost 600 killed, wounded or captured. Of the

Queen's Loyal Rangers, 57 were killed. The rebels had fled from the battlefield which Burgoyne declared a victory.

Peters knew the score as to this so called victory. On Oct 7 Burgoyne under-took a large reconnaissance of the rebel position with 1500 men and two 12- pounder guns; he advanced on the rebel camp at Bemis Heights. General Fraser was killed when the rebels broke through the British line. At dark, Benedict Arnold and Daniel Morgan's rebels overwhelmed a redoubt held by von Breyman's Germans and this so called second battle of Freeman's Farm was over.

On Oct 8, Burgoyne began his retreat toward Ticonderoga, leaving the more severely wounded men behind. The retreat halted at Saratoga.

By Oct 14, Peters knew that surrender was imminent and he feared for the safety of his remaining Queen's Loyal Rangers.

The fate of the Loyalists captured at Bennington had filtered through to the rest of Burgoyne's army, including many reports of harsh treatment. Peters approached General Phillips, the 2nd in command, and informed him that although Burgoyne had ordered the loyalists to escape and make for Canada, he would not leave without written permission. Burgoyne wrote out this permission and Peters, John Peters Jr, Major Zadock Wright and 32 other men set out for Canada.

Despite some escapades with rebels, the Peters party reached the Hudson River above Fort Edward, where a loyalist ferried them across the river and helped Peters obtain provisions. At Lake George, Peters was challenged by Major Irwin of the British Army, where he produced his written orders. Eventually, they got to Ticonderoga, under General Powell, till the fort was evacuated and they returned to Montreal. Captain Justus Sherwood, the only Queen's Loyal Rangers officer with Burgoyne was captured with him, along with 10 privates.

Safe with Peters were 5 captains, 4 lieutenants, 3 ensigns, 1 adjutant, 1 quartermaster, 1 surgeon's mate, 9 sergeants and 53 rank and file. Major Wright's name was not on the record, which was compiled in May 1778. By that time he had been captured while scouting in rebel territory. Some 500 Queen's Loyal Rangers lost their lives by this time.

Colonel Peters left Montreal for Quebec City where Govenor Carleton put him on subsistance list at 30 lbs per muster and took care of the Peters family. The remainder of the Queens Loyal Rangers were posted to Fort St Johns for the winter, where Sir John Johnson was in command of all corps that had been with Burgoyne. Some of the men went on scouting trips along Lake Champlain and into the Green Mountains.

In June 1778, Peters went to Quebec City to meet the new govenor, General Frederick Haldimand. Haldimand told Peters to lead a party of 60 whites and 100 Indians to march on Cohos, on the Connecticut River to destroy the settlement there. At Lake Champlain, orders were received to abandon this mission, and Peters was to go on to Onion River, where he and a force of 34 destroyed the block house, some buildings there and then returned to Fort St Johns, 23 Aug, 1778. Apparently, Haldimand thought Peters' entire party would be lost if he continued on to Cohos.

In Sept 1778, Peters marched his corps to Sorel where the governor had established a base for all his provincial troops, except for Butler's Rangers. Peters had joined Robert Leake, Ebenezer and Edward Jessup in petitioning Haldimand to have their small corps formed into a second battalion of Sir John Johnson's regiment, but Haldimand refused. Also, Peters tried to be paid for his service under Burgoyne, which Haldimand refused until he received official reports from Burgoyne. He continued on the subsistence which Carleton had placed him. One subsistence list dated July 19, 1779 which authorized a payment of 1,634 pounds sterling to cover the period from June 25 1779 to Aug 24 1779, the money to be divided among the various small regiments. Peters share was 30 pounds.

Haldimand placed great confidence in Justus Sherwood, keeping him at Fort St Johns as an intelligence gatherer. Peters continued complaining that he had not been paid what he deserved and had gone over the governor's head. He wrote to his uncle Rev Samuel Peters in England, who applied to Lord George Germain, who wrote to Haldimand to settle Peters account. Haldimand was offended by this action, and appointed a board of officers to examine Peters' claims. Peters was the eventual loser. He had hoped to be paid as a lieutenant-colonel until the end of hostilities. However he did deserve the pay of a battalion commander for his services with Burgoyne. Records do not show if Peters received his full pay. Peters charged two of his officers, Capt Jeremiah French and his brother Lt Gershom French with selling flour to the civilians from what they had drawn from the army commissariat. Sherwood had witnessed one such transaction and appeared against the men.

By Autumn 1780, Haldimand brought his small units to strength, all regiments to 10 companies of 56 men. In Dec 1780, Haldimand issued orders that the several corps of loyalists would be regarded as one regiment, under Major John Nairne of the Royal Highland Emigrants.

A muster roll dated July 14, 1781 at Vercheres show how the few men Peters had were employed, only him and 11 officers, 83 privates, who were scattered all over.

In the final months of 1781, Haldimand amalgamated the King's Loyal Americans and the Queen's Loyal Rangers to form a new regiment-- the Loyal Rangers. The other small units were all absorbed into the second battalion, King's Royal Regiment of New York. Edward Jessup was named major - commandant of the new corps. Ebenezer Jessup, the provisional lieutenant-colonel of the King's Loyal Americans was made a Captain in a command of a company of pensioners. John Peters was made a Captain in a company in a company of invalids, a shattering blow to him.

The invalids were those who had retired because of illness or injury, commissioned officers excepted. By Peters own account he couldn't understand why he had been demoted or invalided. Mr Mathews, a secretary to Gen Haldimand told him for an answer that Peters had a wife and 8 children and might starve if he refused the captains pay. He wouldn't have been allowed rations if he refused to take it, as his subsistence money had been stopped.

John Peters had been an effective lieutenant-colonel during Burgoyne's campaign, was an embittered man, ready to make mischief after the Queen's Loyal Rangers were disbanded. This regiment was sacrificed on the Bennington battlefield and never recovered from that blow. It could have become a full battalion or at least a more substantial corps, if Haldimand had a more positive recruiting policy.

The subsistence of 9 s per day was hardly adequate for a man like Peters, who suffered a great deal on Burgoyne's campaign, and after it in exile. Haldimand's action in giving Peters the command of invalids, virtually placing him in retirement, seems unjustified.

Later, after arguing with Haldimand over settling in S Quebec near the American border, John Peters, his wife and six children went to Cape Breton, then later he went to England to press his claim for re-imbusement of the money he had expended on the Queen's Loyal Rangers. He died there after 1786.

The above narrative was found in the Ontario Archives and was published in the Globe on July 16/1877. It is also found in the original by Col. John Peters (b1740) in the Peters Family History in Queen's University Archives in Kingston, Ont. (Part of the Haldimand Papers).

Also found in the chapter on Lt. Colonel John Peters by Mary Beacock Fryer in her book "Kings Men - The Soldier Founders of Ontario".

Lt. Colonel John Peters (b1740) had a son named John (b1762) who was a lieutenant or ensign in the American Revolutionary War at a young age. He migrated to Ontario. The balance of Colonel John Peters family settled in Nova Scotia.
