This document has been prepared from several sources,

typewritten history of the Shortt,
(also Short, Shields, Shiels)
Moss, and allied families.

by Lillian Moss Stinson Train,
most of the information here could have been lost.
We are thankful that it remains available, and can be corrected, and

suggestions. That's the only way to make this document
as accurate as possible!

Edward Shortt, living in London, Ontario, in 1950, evidently collected the material from many sources, citing some of them with numerals, but the source code is not with the document which I used. This document was badly treated: torn and stained, especially the last pages, some of which may be missing. The document was planned to be in two parts, as Edward had set about to complete the (first) section which would conclude with the first generation born outside of Scotland. I would be most appreciative of any further information you would supply to me.

Note: The Edward Shortt document goes back to prior to 1793 whereas this document begins at 1829 with the birth of George Scott Shortt.

Materials prior to 1829 are being put into the computer to complete the larger document.



Descendants of George Scott SHORTT

Generation No. 1

1. GEORGE SCOTT³ SHORTT (ADAM² SHORT, JOHM¹) was born June 12, 1829 in Dalkeith, Edinburghshire, Scotland, and died May 09, 1893 in Red Deer Lake, NWT (Alberta) Canada. He married MARY SHIELDS January 10, 1859 in Glencoe, Ontario, daughter of GEORGE SHIELS and MARTHA PORTEOUS. She was born August 02, 1828 in Birkhillside Mill, Parish of Ledgerwood, Berwickshire, Scotland, and died August 19, 1907 in Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

Notes for GEORGE SCOTT SHORTT:

came to Canada with a brother, Adam, in 1852. Was a miller, started a mill at Bruce County, Walkerton, Ontario; came West and settled on a farm near Red Deer Lake, (Alberta) North West Territories.

George Shortt received the usual excellent parish schooling for which Scotland has been justly famous since the Reformation. After completing his apprenticeship and a period of further trade training in England, he engaged in the milling business with his father in Berwickshire.

In 1852, in company with his brother, Adam, he emigrated to New York, and travelling up the Hudson River and the Erie Canal by mule boat, proceeded west to Chicago. Returning through Michigan to Western Ontario, he was, by reason of his trade, drawn to the banks of the River Lynn or NAirn, in the County of Middlesex, some twenty miles northwest of the City of London. Few other streams in what was then Canada West turned as many wheels in so short a distance --- nine mills in little more than four miles, each with an accompanying hamlet. In one of them, Siddallsville, of which is now left only the mill earthworks and a pile of rubble between the road and the stream, George Shortt obtained employment as the operator of a mill owned by John Siddall. On July 15, 1854, he purchased from George Shipley, for five pounds, lots ten and eleven on the south side of King Street in the Village of Carlisle, about a mile down stream from Siddallsville. These lots provided an excellent site for a mill, and it may be that he built a mill during that summer, for on October 20, 1854, these lots were sold to William Deacon for 250 pounds.

The profit for this sale was used a year and a half later when on May 6, 1856 he purchased certain lands in Lot B in the Gore of the Township of Delaware, described as being "three acres, one rood and nineteen poles", for 250 pounds. Theses lands lay along the River Thames some eight miles downstream from London and included "all the houses, mills, outhouses, woods and waters thereon and also a certain mill privilege with the dam, and the right to dam the River Thames appurtenant to the said premises."

This mill was in the thriving village of Kilworth, which at the time threatened to rival London, but which has long since vanished. A bridge crossed the river at this point, the mill being on the south bank, and the house occupied by George Shortt being on the north bank. In the sing of 1863 or 1864, one of the not infrequent floods of the

Thames carried away the bridge and seriously damaged the dam. The mill property was thereby depreciated, and as the authorities did not immediately replace the bridge,, the potential custom was halved. Leaving his parents at Kilworth, George Shortt removed his family to Napier, near the west border of Middlesex, where he operated the Sutherland mill, being paid one dollar a day for his services. The land in this area being low-lying and swampy, his wife contracted the common pioneer ailment known as the "ague". This occasioned a further move to Embro where he ioined his brother, John, in the operation of the "Embro Flour Mills". On September 30, 1865, he finally sold the Kilworth property for \$400, to one Benjamin Woodhull. After a stay of about two years in Embro, a third move was made to Walkerton, the county town of Bruce, the trip being made by wagon, as no railway had yet penetrated that part of the newly settled "Queen's Bush". Here on August 7, 1867, he purchased for \$1380, seventeen acres of Lot 22, Concession 2, north of the Durham Road in the Township of Brant. The following day an additional twenty-five acres were purchased for \$200. Through the lands flowed the Silver Creek described in the original survey of 1848 as "a rapid stream, with a shingle bottom from eight to twelve inches in depth and twenty-seven feet in width, and ought to afford a mill privilege". A small mill and a log house were situated on these lands. The milling business was apparently purchased as a going concern, and, as it unfortunately developed, subject to some trade liabilities of the vendor. In order to pay these debts, George Shortt took charge of Nixon Brothers will for a time. It is also known that he lost money in a bank failure about this time or shortly after, probably in the Commercial Bank of Canada which failed in October, 1867.

Subsequently a measure of prosperity was attained and a new house built. But in 1874 there occurred a steep increase in the demand for flour, which led him to invest in twelve thousand bushels of wheat at an equally steep price; but before this was converted into flour and sold, the market collapsed and he lost thousands of dollars. In 1877 he built a new mill incorporating many old country ideas, and continued to operate it for twelve years. During this period however, the clearing of the surrounding country led to a lessening of the water in the stream used for power, and at the same time the advent of the roller process rendered obsolete the old mill stones.

In 1889 he sold the mills and moved to the North West Territories, settling south of Calgary, where he died on May 9, 1893. His death was attributed to a strained heart occasioned by a long chase on foot after a cow which had escaped upon the prairie. He is buried in the cemetery at Pine Creek.

George Shortt is described as a typical "jolly miller", weighing over two hundred pounds although not a tall man, and of a happy, friendly disposition. He was musical and at one time led the singing in the Sunday School in Napier. Although not a farsighted businessman, he was an extremely hard worker and in the busy season operated his mill day and night. Popular with all, he served as an alderman in Walkerton.

Upon his arrival in America, he adopted the hyphenated name of "Scott-Short", but later dropped the Scott and added a "t" to make his name "Shortt", an event which occurred some time about 1877.

He was married on January 10, 1859, at Glencoe, Ontario, to Mary Sheilds.

Burial: Pine Creek Cemetery, De Winton, Alberta

Notes for MARY SHIELDS:

The surname [in the baptism records] appears as Shiels, the variant spelling Shields being adopted after emigration to Canada. She obtained a common school education in her native parish and later went to Kelso for further education. She came to Canada in 1854-55 with her mother and other members of the family and settled in Mosa Township, County of Middlesex. She had been acquainted in Scotland with George Shortt but their proposed marriage had been opposed by her father. Meeting again in Canada, they were married on January 10, 1859 at Glencoe. She has been described by her daughter, Martha, as "a great reader and keenly interested in history. She had strong opinions and a driving force of ambition. She was very charitable, looking after ne'er-do-wells who took advantage of her". Her brother John referred to her thus, "She had been a noble Christian woman all her life, faithfully attended her father in his last sickness, and did her full share of the toil of the farm and the removal to this country. As a Christian mother she trained her family in the fear of God, and they do credit to her example and teachings. She take a prominent part in religious missionary work in the Rocky Mountains, and her door is always open to deserving travellers, her zeal and delight in good works never relaxing". She survived her husband by fourteen years, dying in Calgary, Alberta on August 19, 1907, and is buried in the cemetery at Pine Creek, Alberta

2. ADAM⁴ SHORTT (GEORGE SCOTT³, ADAM² SHORT, JOHN¹) was born November 24, 1859 in Kilworth, Middlesex County, Ontario, Canada, and died January 14, 1931. He married ELIZABETH SMITH December 03, 1886, daughter of SYLVESTER SMITH and ISABELLA McGEE. She was born January 18, 1859 in "Mountain Hall," Vinemount, Ontario, and died January 14, 1949 in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada.

Notes for ADAM SHORTT:

Dr. Adam Shortt is well-known at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. A building at the university is named in his honour.

After an early schooling at home, owing to the lack of an available school in the neighbourhood of Walkerton, he entered the Walkerton High School at the age of sixteen. In 1879 he proceeded to Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, a Presbyterian foundation, from which he graduated in 1883 as Governor-General's Prizeman and Gold Medalist in Philosophy, and from which he received his M.A. the following year. The years 1883 to 1885 were spent at the Universities of Glasgow and Edinburgh under such distinguished professors as Edward Caird in Philosophy and Lord Kelvin in Physics. Returning to Queen's University in 1886 with many academic distinctions from the Scottish Universities, he spent three years lecturing in Natural and Moral Philosophy. In 1889 he was appointed Lecturer and in 1892, Professor Political Science, a chair he occupied with great distinction until 1908. In 1904 he was a member of the Railway Taxation Commission of Ontario, the report of which is still recognized as a standard work. In 1907 and 1908, he acted as chairman of eleven boards of arbitration constituted under the Industrial Disputes Investigation Act 1907. In all these disputes between capital and labour, he was successful in securing agreements.

On September 1, 1908, Adam Shortt was named the Chairman of the Dominion Civil Service Commission, a body which was intended to work a revolution by removing the civil service from politics. This position he held until 1917 when he was appointed Chairman of the Board of Historical Publications of the Public Archives of Canada. He continued in this congenial post until his death on January 14, 1931. A trustee of Queen's University from 1909 until his death, he was honoured by his Alma Mater with the degree of Doctor of Laws in 1911. In the same year King George V created him a Companion of the Order of St. Michael and St. George. He was an Economic Representative of Canada to the League of Nations from 1926 to 1931.

He was well known for his economic and historical writings, a partial list of which includes:-

A man of varied interests, his hobbies included sketching and wood carving in which he displayed more than ordinary skill, gardening, boating and golf.

Notes for ELIZABETH SMITH:

Elizabeth Smith was related to the family (her brother) which operated E.D. Smith Processors of fruits and jams.

Elizabeth has the distinction of being one of the first three women to graduate in Medicine in Canada, obtaining her M.D. and C.M. from Queen's University in 1884. She was subsequently a lecturer in Medical Jurisprudence and Sanitary Science, in the Queen's Medical School, and a member of the Ontario Mother's Allowance Board. She died in Ottawa, on January 14, 1949. (See article by Charlotte Witton, former mayor of Ottawa, concerning Elizabeth Smith Shortt.)

Notes for JOSEPH HIGGINBOTHAM SAXON MOSS:

In the Alberta records dealing with the births of George Oliver Moss 12 October 1889 and Elizabeth Mary Moss 25 Septmeber 1903, there is notation of Joseph Higgenbotom (rather than Higgenbotham) Saxton (rather than Saxon) Moss. The use of the name "Saxton" could be in error (as it appears as Sexton for George's birth).

COMMENTS CONCERNING JOE MOSS' GOOD FRIEND, CHARLIE DAVIE
Members from the branches of the Joseph & Elizabeth Moss families have asked
about Charlie Davie and the relationship he and Joe Moss had. Some asked if the
Davies were related to the Moss family in some way. The answer is that there is no
blood relationship but most certainly one which exemplifies the manner in which
people in the Canadian West treasured the relationships between fellow cowboys &
neighbours, and the assistance and support that they gave freely to one another.

In the Fall of 1904 Charlie Davie filed for a quarter section of land a mile away from the holdings of Joe and Elizabeth Moss, at Long Valley Ranch (Mossleigh). They had moved to the area in 1901, so the area was just being settled. Actually, Elizabeth's brother-in-law, David Carter (married to sister, Martha) owned the quarter next to Charlie Davie. They also became friends, and Charlie played an important role in an event in the family life. But it remains that the Davies and members of the Moss family were part of a significant connection.

Mr and Mrs Charles Davie

Charlie Davie was born in Glamis, Scotland and came to Vancouver, Canada, about 1895. The Yukon Gold Rush of 1898 brought him to Edmonton in an attempt to get to the Yukon overland with horses, from there. He started out with two partners but after losing some pack horses and equipment in a river crossing in northern Alberta, they parted company. Another mishap left him with only his rifle and the shells that were in it, no outfit. He had no alternative but to head back to settled country on foot. This he did and according to his story of the trip, he became quite an expert at killing prairie chicken and other small game with a rock. After an estimated three to four hundred mile walk, he came to a ranch camp west of Red Deer.

September 23, 1904 found him in Calgary filing on a homestead in this area, the SE1/4 34-20-25-W4. This was added to later by the purchase of the NE1/4 of Sec. 34 from a Mrs. L. Carter [should be M. Carter, Elizabeth Moss' sister] whose husband died while he was building a shack on their homestead, and the SW1/4 of Sec. 34 from P.A. Robertson.

In 1915 Annie Taylor came out from Scotland and they were married at Gladys Anglican Church with Canon W.E. Herbert officiating. They had an active life in church and community affairs. Mr Davie was on the church board for many years, and serve a term as a councillor in the Municipal District of Dinton. Mrs. Davie

worked with the Ladies Aid and was church organist for over 25 years. They had no family. A nephew Gibson Davie lived with them from boyhood. He died some years ago. Mr. Davie died in 1944. Mrs Davie then made her home with a sister, Mrs. David Cathro, in Calgary, until her death in 1961.

"It aren't Charlie, it's that dawm'd On-nee!" (Some details of this story were told by Doug Shortt to David Ballard, June 2001, Victoria)

As a young man, Doug came to the Mossleigh area, from Calgary and on several occasions rode his horse from Calgary to the Carroll and Mary Ballard farm [the Loblaw place] where he would leave his horse for a period of time.

Charlie was a bachelor on his own from 1904 when he took his homestead until his marriage to Annie in 1915. He was noted for his hospitality and never failed to invite a single rider or group to stop for a rest, some food and a chat. That was the 'code' under which almost everyone operated as one shared with others never knowing when you would find yourself would need care and assistance from them in return. He also would be interested in knowing about the visitor and perhaps learning the news of the area recently travelled by his quest.

When reading the history of the various families outlined in "Furrows in Time", Charlie Davie is mentioned as having worked for, or assisted a number of people. He did various things such as line-riding (checking on the cattle herds in the Buffalo Hills east of his place) and assisting with the planting and harvesting of the crops on neighbouring farms. He also had several men work for him and they remained in the area and joined the Mossleigh community.

The community was growing, and Charlie had built a house and barn near the centre of his quarter section, having a vista of the surrounding countryside to the east. On the quarter next to his to the North, a Calgary businessman named David Carter had built a home for his family. The Carter family originally built a home west of Millarville near the Indian Reservation boundary. They, and other families nearby permitted their cattle to roam on to the Reservation but sometimes there was a "loss" of a couple of animals. This lead to some disputes with the Natives, but most were settled without incident. One day, upon the return of the Carter family to their home, all that remained was a burnt-out shell of the building. They had lost everything. They departed from the area and stayed for a while in Calgary. It was later that David Carter took the Mossleigh homestead near his wife's sister and brother-in-law, Elizabeth and Joseph Moss. With the house built, David Carter was having Charlie Davie plow a fire-guard around the building site to prevent a prairie fire striking their new home. You can imagine David's fear of losing everything again.

Charlie and David were in the area near the house talking when David was stricken by a heart-attack. He seemed to be lost, when Charlie noticed that David Carter was struggling to sit up. Helping him over to rest against the wagon wheel, they resumed their conversation and David detailed several other instructions which Charlie carried out only to return to David's side to find that he had passed away. Charlie went to Joseph Moss' home, and they made preparations to deal with the body. The next morning Joseph and Charlie took the horse-drawn wagon to Calgary carrying David Carter's body on the platform. William (Bill) Shortt remembers being at his aunt's home when the wagon drew up to the building. Aunt Martha Carter immediately knew that they brought bad news. David Carter died July 1, 1907.

As mentioned, Charlie was by himself for over ten years, but when he made his plans to visit his birthplace in Scotland he planned on finding a bride. The trip to Scotland and back would have been quite an undertaking, and it is thought that he was away from his farm over the winter period. Returning on the train he disembarked at Gleichen, and set out to walk to the farm. When one remembers his ill-fated trek in northern Alberta in the late 1890's, walking was something he knew all about. Setting out on that Spring day he crossed the Indian reserve and came to the Bow River. The story is told that he decided to swim across [instead of using the bridge which meant a long detour]. He stripped off his clothes and shoes. Slipping into the freezing water he reached the other side only to realize that he had forgotten that his clothes still were on the other side. Returning to them, he arranged things in a bundle which he would keep balanced on his head as he crossed once again. Once there he dressed and continued his trip, arriving at the farm in the middle of the night. The Spring nights were cold, and this would have been a long and cold hike for him.

Arrangements had been made while he was in Scotland for Annie Taylor from his hometown to join him at a date in late summer. It was planned that he would return to Alberta to plant the crop and prepare his bachelor home into a home for the two of them.

Following their marriage in 1915 Annie likely found that many things were very different in her life. She learned from others such as Glenna Loblaw Moss who with her husband George now lived on the Long Valley Ranch property.

But very early on she had to get used to having men stop by to visit with Charlie, as they had been accustomed to doing in his bachelor days. Not knowing the tradition of a welcome, a meal, and a place to stay for the guest, Annie reaffirmed her Scottish background in being reluctant to offer this hospitality. It is reported that one cowboy lamented, "It aren't Charlie," (who always provided hospitality), but "it's that dawmed On-nee" (who was reluctant to offer hospitality).

I know for myself, my recollection of Annie Davie was of a small woman with her long grey hair pinned into a bun on the back of her head, and who always made children welcome in her home. And, for her Scottish Shortbread, she was renowned. (Compiled by David Ballard, summer 2001)

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the marriage of Joseph and Elizabeth Moss, members of the Moss family reunited this Labor Day weekend to honor the occasion and relive the days of those two early pioneers of the Pine Creek and Mossleigh areas.

The weekend was highlighted by a trek, following the footsteps that Joseph and Elizabeth had taken nearly a century earlier when the moved from EdgeHill Ranch, located at Pine Creek near De Winton, to their ranch on the West Arrowwood Creek, near the present-day hamlet of Mossleigh.

Although conditions were certainly different for the present-day trekker, the descendants were able to relive the days of their parents, grandparents and great grand parents.

Among those attending were the two surviving daughter of the Mosses, Lillian Stinson Train, age 94 and Elizabeth Mary Ballard, age 85.

According to written information by Elizabeth, also the mother of David Ballard, Principal of Percy Pegler Elementary School, the trek began at the Pine Creek Cemetery, on September 5, where Joseph and Elizabeth are buried. Elizabeth died in 1911 and Joseph died in 1914.

"They then visited the site of the Edge Hill Ranch located on the land near Dunbow Road owned by Victor Heaver," she writes. "Still in evidence was the cellar of the ranch house, the willow posts put in place by Joseph Moss, and the site of the well. "The upright log construction of the barn built by Joseph was viewed at the George Naegeli farm.

"Travelling from Edge Hill Ranch to Long Valley Ranch in the Mossleigh area took only a short period of time compared to the five days it took when the family "trekked" their possessions and livestock from De Winton to the West Arrowwood in 1901," Elizabeth continues. "The site of the ranch is presently owned by Clark and Judy Christie."

Back in 1901, the Moss home was built with lumber hauled by wagons from Okotoks. Elizabeth also notes that her mother had a hand in naming the hamlet of Mossleigh. "As more families moved into the area, a school was needed and Mrs. Moss contacted the authorities to have a school district formed. Once permission was granted there was a need for a name for the school. She chose the surnames of her husband's parents: Moss and Lee.

"It is reported that this name was rejected by the authorities due to similarity with another name and Mrs. Moss resubmitted Moss and Leigh. The Moss family came from Bedford-near-Leigh in England and this seemed to be a good compromise." Previous to the trek, a gathering was held in Calgary on September 4 and featured the presentation of a family history covering nine generations of the Moss family. This was prepared by David Ballard.

James Shortt was a Presbyterian minister north of Calgary; lived later years in London, Ontario.

James Shortt received his early education in the public and high schools of Walkerton, Ontario. In 1889, he enrolled in the Kingston Collegiate Institute, matriculating the following year with the matriculation scholarship in Classics and first class honours in English. Entering Queen's University, in the honours course in classics, be obtained the sessional scholarship in Philosophy in the second year, and was graduated with first class honours in Classics at the age of nineteen. After two years on the mission field of Western Canada, he returned to Queen's University, taking his M.A. in 1897, with first class honours in Political Science. At the same time, he completed the first year in Theology, winning the scholarship in New Testament Greek. In the following year, he won the Leitch Memorial Scholarship, a three year award for post graduate study aboard. He also ranked first for the scholarship in New and obtained the Lewis prize in Homiletics. Following his graduation in Theology, he attended New College, Edinburgh, in the years 1900 and 1901, engaging in graduate work under the distinguished scholars, Marcus Dods and A.B. Davidson.

Returning to Canada, he declined a call to Picton, Ontario, the work in Western Canada making a stronger appeal to him. From 1902 to 1906, he was minister of the Presbyterian Church at Davisburg, Alberta, and from 1908 to 1910, assistant minister of Knox Presbyterian Church, Calgary. From 1910 to 1917, he was minister of St. Andrew's Church, Innisfail, Alberta, being elected Moderator of the Synod of Alberta in 1913. From 1917 to 1924 he was minister at St. Andrew's Church, Olds, Alberta, and took an active part in the work of the Church at large, serving on important Boards and Committees, including the Union Committee from 1917 to 1923, the Board of Education and the General Board.

In 1924 he returned to Ontario as minister of St. Andrew's Church, Barrie, remaining in this parish until 1941. During this time he continued to serve on various church boards, including the Board of Education, the Board of Administration, and the Senate of Knox College. In 1928, he was elected Moderator of the Synod for Toronto and Kingston.

In 1932, Queen's University conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Divinity (honoris causa), and later in the same year he delivered the Robertson Memorial Lectures at Knox College, University of Toronto, and at the Presbyterian College, McGill University. In June 1934, he was called to the highest position in the Church when elected Moderator of the General Assembly. The following year he was awarded the George V Jubilee Medal.

Leaving Barrie in 1941, he assumed the pastorate of High Park Presbyterian Church, Toronto, retiring in 1944. From 1940 to 1944 he was one of the Canadian representatives to the World Alliance of Reformed Churches.

His hobbies in early years were fishing, shooting and photography, but latterly he preferred gardening and curling. In 1924 he was President of the Alberta Branch of the Royal Caledonian Curling Club. At his home, "Copsewerth", at Kincardine, Ontario, he devotes his time to his extensive gardens.

Mr Carter is survived by his wife Philippa of Vancouver, BC; daughters Mrs R W (Eileen) Ferguson of White Rock, BC, Mrs W L (Trallee) Dun of Vancouver, BC; and sons Dr. David S. Carter of Corvallis, Oregon, Mr Lindsay H. Carter of New Westminster, BC; ten grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. AUTO DEALERSHIP FOUNDER DIES AFTER VARIED CAREER

A former rodeo rider, decorated First World War flyer and founder of the Air Cadet League of Canada died Wednesday at the age of 92 in Shaughnessy Hospital. A W. (Nick) Carter also founded one of BC's oldest automobile dealerships on his return to Canada from France after the war.

Mr Carter was born at his parents' ranch at Fish Creek, south of Calgary, on April 29, 1894.

He rode horseback eight kilometres to school at the one-room Red Deer Lake schoolhouse. Later in his teens, he worked in his spare time as ranch hand, breaking horses to the saddle at \$10 a head, while attending Western Canada College boys' school in Calgary. In 1912 he was herd rider at the Calgary Stampede.

At age 18, Mr Carter enrolled at Queen's University, Kingston, and joined the 49th Queen's University Battery as a gunner. But his ambition always was to fly and he took some training in Florida. As there was at that time no Canadian air force, he went overseas in 1916 with the Royal Naval Service.

Posted to a squadron attached to the French army, he took part in daylight bombing raids on the German Steel industries in the Saar valley. During his service in France he rose to the rank of captain and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for conspicuous courage --- twice snooting down German scout machines when outnumbered, on one occasion, five to one.

He was given command of a squadron the day before the armistice was signed. On his return to Canada in 1919, Mr Carter was appointed an air station superintendent with the newly-formed Canadian Air Board. For the next two years he flew civilian aircraft on aerial surveys.

H left the civil service in 1923 and founded the A.W. Carter Ltd. automobile dealership in Victoria. He expanded the company to Vancouver in 1933 and retired as president in 1950.

Mr Carter is survived by his wife, Philippa of Vancouver; {edited for accuracy ---- sons] David, of Oregon, Lindsay Carter of New Westminster, Eileen Ferguson [edited for accuracy ---- Vancouver], and Trallee Dun of Vancouver.

A memorial service will be held on Tuesday at 3 p.m. in Kerrisdale Presbyterian Church, Rev Harry Lennox officiating. The eulogy will be given by former BC Lieut-Gov, Henry Bell-Irving. Funeral services were held last month in Vancouver for a Calgary pioneer who left his mark in aviation and the car business in British Columbia. A.W. (Nick) Carter, 92 died in Vancouver, December 17.

Born at his parent's ranch at Fish Creek in 1894, he participated in the first Calgary Exhibition and Stampede in 1912 as a herd rider. During the First World War he was a fighter pilot with Royal Naval Air Service. This started an association with aviation that lasted a lifetime and took him into various air groups, including a term as president of the Air Cadet League of Canada. In private life, he operated car dealerships under his name in Victoria and Vancouver.

MOSSLEIGH PIONEER PASSES

Elizabeth Mary (Moss) Ballard passed away peacefully on August 10, 2000 at Bowview Manor in Calgary in her 97th year.

Elizabeth Mary (Moss) Ballard was born September 25, 1903 to Joseph H. S. Moss and Elizabeth Shortt at Long Valley Ranch, N.W.T., south east of Calgary, at a site one mile west of the present hamlet of Mossleigh. The Moss' fifth child and fourth daughter, she was the first European child born in the West Arrowwood area.

When applying to establish a school in the area her mother used the surnames of her husband's parents: "Moss" and "Lee", and the hometown of Leigh, England, to create a name for the school district and for the hamlet that grew up nearby.

Mary lost her mother when she was six and her father when she was eleven years old. In the years following she was cared for by her brother and sisters and their spouses. Mary took her schooling in that one room Mossleigh School and later in Gleichen before continuing at the Calgary Normal School. She taught school for a short while before marrying Carroll Page Ballard at the Long Valley Ranch on July 7, 1925. This wedding took place in the home where she was born, by that time the home of her brother and sister-in-law, George and Glenna Moss.

Family and Community have always been very important to Mary. She learned to cook for threshing crews and hired men, gathering advice and recipes from her sisters and sister-in-law, and friends. In recent times she spoke about those days, and credited her pastry recipe to one, her favourite other recipes to others. The farm home was a special place to many of the nieces and nephews where good food and happy times are fondly remembered.

Mary and Carroll farmed in the Mossleigh district from 1925 to 1952, joining in the community activities to support projects and individual families. Mary was active in the Blind Creek and Mossleigh Ladies Aid groups, the Mossleigh Home and School group, and the Mossleigh United Church, the Mossleigh community hall and community curling rink, in addition to working on T.B., Red Cross and Cancer Society projects.

In 1952 Mary and Carroll retired to Calgary where Mary was active in the Pleasant Heights United Church and the Southern Alberta Pioneers and their Descendants. The church was holding services in King George School and working to raise enough money to build the church now at 10 Street and 19 Avenue N.W. Many years of working with the other ladies in the booth at the Calgary Stampede earned enough money to support the debt.

After Carroll passed away in 1973, Mary made her home at the Confederation Park Senior Citizens Home, moving to Bowview Manor in 1998.

Mary was proud of her association with the Southern Alberta Pioneers and their Descendents and prized the Gold Card membership given her on her eightieth birthday. She encouraged the family to keep active in this association.

Mary liked to remind people that she was older than the province. She was a proud Albertan who in 1955 was given a Golden Anniversary award, and in 1980 the gold medallion of the province. The province also sent greetings for her 90th, 95th, and 96th birthdays.

When Mary came to apply for a Canadian passport she had difficulty remembering what age she actually was. Seems that like Jack Benny she had been keeping her age low and that she had tinkered with the age for so long she would have to

remember how old she really was. The family found that in recent years, she often tried to add a year to her actual age, and that's why she took to saying, as she did all this year, "I'm in my ninety-seventh year!"

Mary read the newspaper from cover to cover and could always be counted on to know the details of news events. Only recently she asked for details from the headlines and discussed them with David. She was reading the editorial page two days before her passing.

She was always proud of her family. David's principalship and the awarding to him of a Fellowship in the Canadian College of Teachers were very special for her. Mary was delighted that Betty's first priority was her family and said that she would be like a "mother bear with her cubs" in dealing with them. She always wanted news from California about how each grandchild was progressing. She was particularly proud of Glen, his successes in his profession, his marriage to Tami, and the support of his inlaws. She was also very pleased that she had visits from Nanette and Austen, and Marie, Bobby, Anthony and Aaron when they came to Calgary to visit.

Christopher and Megan were the grandchildren close to her through geography and emotion, and she took particular pride in their accomplishments.

As for special memories, Diana reports that she recalls advice given to her by Mary when she was marrying David 38 years ago. The advice was: "Always keep your own bank account!"

Several others have commented on Mary's love of her dog, a high-strung Cocker Spaniel that several claimed was "demented". When this dog was injured after a meeting with a car, Mary insisted that the broken hip be restructured and put into a hip and leg cast, and the dog once again was a three-legged wonder until he cast was removed. David reports that his mother never told Carroll about the cost to save the dog.

Most would recall the wonderful food she delighted in making: bread and cinnamon buns, cakes of all types (especially Angel Food cakes), cookies and slices, and the dinners of chicken or beef served with style and true farm-sized portions.

David has many treasured moments, but feels that it is special that he had the time and opportunity to visit with his mother over the past years. She loved to tell the stories of the past and related them faithfully until the end.

Your service bulletin has on its front a copy of a painting "Sunset at Mossleigh" Jon Williams is the artist, and this painting was a favourite of Mary's. She had this painting on the wall of her apartment at Confederation Lodge, and also in her room at Bowview Manor.

To those relatives present: David, Diana, Christopher and Katrina, and Megan To Betty, Glen and Tami, and those not present: the other four grandchildren And the ten great grandchildren, and four great, great grandchildren, those gathered here extend their sympathy on your loss.

She is also survived by seven grandchildren, Christopher Ballard (Katrina Beardow) and Megan Ballard of Calgary, Rhonda McLeod, Glen McLeod (Tami), Joseph Fontaine, Marie (Fontaine) & Bobby Terrones, Nanette Giselle (Fontaine) King, all of California. GEORDIE MOSS REMEMBERED IN OUTDOOR SERVICE

A steady stream of vehicles wound their way across the land that Geordie Moss loved, carrying hundreds of his friends and neighbors to a Memorial Service in his honor at the side of the lake he built.

"The ranch was the focal part of his life. He loved the outdoor life and the work that went with it," said Pastor Lloyd Strickland, who officiated at the service with Reverend Jack Phillips. "It is fitting to remember Geordie here, in this setting."

That sentiment was echoed by Dennis, Geordie's son, who stated, "he truly loved the land. Dad tried his hand at many things, but if asked what he did, he'd tell you he was a rancher."

"Geordie Moss," said Strickland, "was a kind and loving individual who, once met, was never forgotten."

"Although he loved solitude, he also loved people," said Strickland. "He gave his love unconditionally and was loved the same way in return. Geordie seems to have always been a presence in our Valley. There are some people you just know, even if your haven't met them yet. Geordie was one of these people."

Geordie's niece, Jean McLennan Jensen, remembered his teasing ways, saying, "we'll miss our uncle with the flashing eyes who loved to tease. As adults we were very proud of how he looked after his land."

Four uniformed ambulance attendants, including Strickland, and an ambulance on site, paid tribute to Geordie's 20 years of service with the ambulance service, first as a volunteer driver and then as Unit Chief, retiring in the late 1970's.

"It was appropriate to bring the ambulance today," noted Strickland. "Although I doubt he knew much of the present crew, it was a gesture the present crew wanted to make."

Geordie Moss passed away on May 26 at the age of 72 years.

My earliest memory of Uncle Geordie is ME, running upstairs behind a sister who is screaming, "Quick, Hid, Uncle Geordie is coming!" Fearfully and obediently I followed, asking why we had to hide. Her answer, "Because he teases!" Well, I soon learnt it was a game, I had nothing to fear. I would hear over and over again through the years the words, "Oh Geord, don't tease!" from his mother, his wife, his sisters. But we all loved the teasing attention that he gave.

Uncle George's and Aunt Lois' home was always open to us. Summer days in their home, spent with cousins and friends, have left us with wonderful childhood memories: Train trips to New Westminster, rides down through the Fraser Canyon in the back of a truck that is fixed up for our comfort with hay and tarps; Uncle Geordie's love of huckleberry pie gave our days in New Westminister a focus as we hiked through the creek beds, balanced on logs, filling our buckets with little red berries that Aunt Lois would make into delicious pies.

Back here on the farm, the barn and haylofts, the old watering trough, irrigation ditches, the hay wagon, and horses provided us with the opportunity to gather together as a family to play and to explore. We were always made to feel welcome. We never questioned the fact that we may be a nuisance, although we must have gotten in to way of work, taken up valuable time, for someone had to provide us with food, drinks, and bedding.

On reflection, I realize not only did they provide us with happy memories shared with cousins, but equally important they supplied us with a safe haven away from our own homes that is so important in a child's development. Widening our horizons, their home gave us a safe place to explore and practice skills we would need in life: communicating, sharing, taking risks, travelling away from the safety of our own homes.

As adults, we are proud of how well our uncle has maintained and look after his land.

We will miss our teasing uncle who could talk so fast.

The uncle with the expressive eyes that sparkled and flashed.

The uncle who gave us many wonderful memories.

Geordie was born in Armstrong, BC, but lived his first seven years on the family ranch in Mossleigh, Alberta. He came to Birch Island with his parents and sibling in 1929, and except for his army service and a short stay at the coast (Coquitlam) in the early 1950's, Birch Island has been his home.

His parents, George Senior, and Glenna purchased land in Birch Island and raised Hereford cattle on what they name the CC (Canyon Creek) Ranch. They also raised their family of seven children --- five daughters and two sons.

Geordie attended school in Birch Island up to grade eight, then went to Olds School of Agriculture, where he graduated in 1940. He joined the Canadian Armed Forces (Ordinance Corps) in 1942 and served overseas, returning home in 1946.

He was a director on the Dutch Lake Park Board for several years, a member of the Upper North Thompson Livestock Association, and in its early years, a member of the Raft River Riders Club. He was also a charter member of the Vavenby and District Legion Branch 259, serving on the executive during his time of membership. Geordie was a dedicated volunteer driver for the North Thompson Ambulance Association --- later he served as Unit Chief, retiring in the late 1970's.

Softball played a big role in Geordie's childhood and adult years. He pitched for the Birch Island Yellowjackets over a span of thirty years. Square dancing and bridge playing were two of his longtime favourite social activities.

His ranch has been the focal point of his life. He loved ht eoutdoor life and the challenges involved.

After he built the lake, he took pleasure in watching other enjoy it --- many times, he'd be busy putting up hay, while family and friends had fun in and on the water.

Family reunions were another source of pleasure for Geord. These gathering gave him plenty of opportunity to sharpen up his teasing skills and lots of chances to sit in his lawn chair to visit and discuss the issues and he love to take groups out on his homemade raft to cruise around the lake --- captain of the "Lady of the Lake" -- he was in his glory at these times ---- we have many friendly gatherings and family reunions to remember.

Beneath those shaggy brows, his blue eyes always held a twinkle, and beneath the sometimes gruff exterior was a very special husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend. He gave his love unconditionally and was loved in the same way in return.

It is fitting to remember Geordie here, in this setting, with all of you today. It is a

loving way to celebrate the life of a one-of-a-kind individual --- once met, never forgotten!

Meditation by Lloyd Strickland

Geordie seems to always have been a presence in our Valley. WE moved to Birch Island in 1965, and slowly got to know people throughout the area. Because I was preaching for a sort of upstart church, it took awhile to become acquainted, but there are some people who you just knew even if you hadn't met them yet. Geordie was one of those people.

I wish I could say that I've become accustomed to having funerals, or in dealing with death, but that is not the case. One cannot live and minister in such a small valley as this, for as long as we have, without feeling an especially heavy burden, when someone like Geordie passes away. And, I feel that there is a loss here today that touches us all.

Working ambulance in a small town can do that to you. These days there are special programs to help the crew cope with the horrible calls. In Geordie's day you simply went back to work at whatever you were doing before the call came in, and you were on your own to deal with the intrusive memories. But Geordie stuck it out for a long time, and he gained the respect of all those in our valley as he did the job.

To Lois --- you have always been the pillar of strength. Your love and concern for the hurting souls of our valley, your steadfast Christain convictions, and your commitment to our heritage have long week an example to all of us.

It is our turn today to open our hearts of concern to you. May God give you comfort and strength.

Jay was born November 23, 1922, the fifth child and second son of Thomas James McKeage and Alice Josephine Moss in Scotfield, Alberta. He was 11 years old when I was born and was always an important influence in my life. Jay and his brother George were very close and for a long time, I thought they were always to be referred to as one - they were called 'the boys' - the boys did this or the boys did that, or more often, where are the boys?? And, they were as different as two brothers can be. George was always more serious and secretive, while Jay was always open, bubbly, and giggly. Whenever they were caught in one of their many pranks, George, the stoic would refuse to cry, and would laugh at Gram when she was spanking him- which only made her madder and the more he laughed, the more she spanked - it was always a battle of wills with them. But Jay, as soon as he saw the uplifted hand, would start yipping and howling and sorrying and his spankings would be cut short. He's also the one that would tell everyone all year that there was no Santa but for a month before Christmas he proclaimed loud and often "I sure believe in Santa Claus!" to ensure that there would be something for him under the crepe paper wrapped barrel hoops that represented the Christmas tree.

When I came along, the boys had a few things to teach me. The first thing was to learn how to ride a horse. They had a little black Shetland pony called Sassy Little. I was about 4 so she was the right size for me - NOT- The boys were on either side of the horse . Jay boosted me up from one side - I continued on over in one smooth motion and landed on my face in the dirt on the other side where George laughed and laughed - the only time I remember him laughing. It was Jay who rushed around, picked me up and tried to clean my face

One cold winter day, the boys were to haul the carcass of a dead horse out on a stoneboat for disposal. I was getting colder and colder and telling them about it until Jay told me to get off and run like Hell!. I didn't know this Hell guy but I had heard Grandpa say the same thing when he was coaching baseball so I figured he must be some fine runner. So I got off the stoneboat and ran as fast as I could and soon warmed up. When we got back to the farm house, I told Grandma all about the exciting morning and that I was cold and got off the boat and ran like Hell.!! When she gasped and asked where I had heard such a word, I was surprised at how fast two boys could disappear from the farm house.

As I was growing up, it was Jay that took me ice skating on the winter ditches, or swimming in the dugouts on the prairies. Or riding in the horse drawn school van in the winter time. He was just starting to invite some of the young girls to the Sunday baseball games when we moved up to Lacombe, then, suddenly, he was seventeen, quit Oyen High School, and joined the Navy.

At first, the navy life seemed to be a romantic adventure personalized in the colored photograph that sat on Grandma's mantle place for years.- his curly hair, baby blue eyes, and charming smile belied the horrors of the war that he fought overseas from 1943 through 1945.

What relief we all felt when he was safely returned to Canada in the summer of 1945. I was intrigued by his kit - hammock, uniform, wool blankets that he brought home and the 'souvenirs' he had picked up from dead Germans and prisoners of war. These things held a morbid fascination for all of us. But it was the nightmares that he experienced that really frightened me. He would suddenly sit straight up in bed , his eyes opened but glazed, his body drenched in sweat, and screaming at the top of his voice. I didn't know what was happening or what to do but somehow realized that he was not a threat to me, but was terrified himself. He was 23 years old.

Jay returned to Youngstown for a while. He met a young teacher in Sunnynook and was soon engaged to Jean Gray. The engagement lasted about long enough for one aunt to announce to the rest of the family that Miss Gray 'smoked!!' and then it was broken off. I never did hear why.

Jay soon hired on to the CNR as a linesman and worked in the north for a few years before deciding to work as a fireman. He worked out of a number of CN towns around Alberta. - Hanna, Mirror, Edmonton, High River. He managed to get himself engaged a couple of times but just when he was about to get married, he'd end up in Calgary and run into Jean Grey and the engagement would be broken. One of these engagements, I presumed had been the result of having to find a home for a refrigerator he won as a big bingo prize.

During these nomad years, Jay got into some heavy drinking which also got him into some heavy scrapes. He was a legend among the drinking establishments of Edmonton. One time he was driving down Jasper Avenue in Edmonton after a few too many and was annoyed at a car coming straight at him and not dimming its lights. The other car would not swerve into the other lane and too late he found out it was a street car. The damage to car and Jay was quite extensive.

As Jay got into his thirties, he was working more and more into and out of Calgary and once more he met up with Jean Grey. Neither of them had ties to anyone else and so in 1958, just after Mary and I were married, Jay came home one day and said to Grandma "Are you doing anything next Saturday? " She said "No, I don't think there are any ball games on." So he asked, "Would you like to come to my wedding?" So , on August 16, 1958, Jay and Jean were finally married. They moved to Prince Rupert for a while and then he got a transfer to Jasper. In June of 1961, Jean came into the Royal Alexandra Hospital in Edmonton and Lori Jean was born there.

It was in Jasper that Jay perfected his golfing skills and really got into the woodworking and carving hobbies. - His antler cribbage boards ,putters, golf carts, aluminum siding and carpentry skills.

In the 70s Jay transferred to Victoria and we were able to visit more often but then we lost contact again when they moved to Oliver. After Jean died, he was fortunate to meet such a nice person as Monique who saw him through his last illness.

Well, now the boys are together again and I am sure if someone asks me where the boys are or what are the boys doing, I can safely say that as usual, Jay is the one who is looking out for me and everyone else. Anchors Aweigh Sailor Boy.
