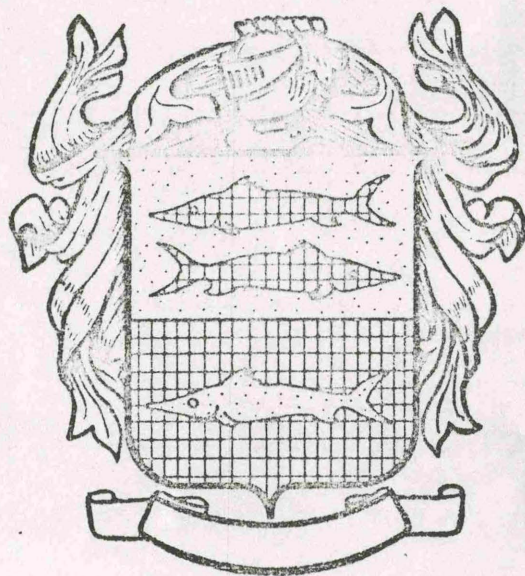

Historiography

The Snider Coat of Arms illustrated left was drawn by an heraldic artist from information officially recorded in ancient heraldic archives. Documentation for the Snider Coat of Arms design can be found in Rietstap Armorial General. Heraldic artists of old developed their own unique language to describe an individual Coat of Arms. In their language, the Arms (shield) is as follows:

"Coupe d'or sur sa., a trois espadons (poissons) nag-eants, de l'un a l'autre, deux sur l'or, l'un sur l'autre, dont le deuxieme cont., et un sur le sa."

When translated the blazon also describes the original colors of the Snider Arms as it appeared centuries ago.

Family mottoes are believed to have originated as battle cries in medieval times. A Motto was not recorded with this Snider Coat of Arms.

Individual surnames originated for the purpose of more specific identification.

The four primary sources for second names were: occupation, location, father's name, or personal characteristics. The surname Snider appears to be occupational in origin, and is believed to be associated with the Dutch and German's, meaning, "one who made outer garments; a tailor."

The supplementary sheet included with this report is designed to give you more information to further your understanding of the origin of names. Different spellings of the same original surname are a common occurrence. Dictionaries of surnames indicate probable spelling variations of Snider to be Snyder, Snyders, Sneider, Snieder, Schneider, Schnieder, and Schneiderman. Although bearers of the old and distinguished Snider name comprise a small fraction of the population there are a number who have established for it a significant place in history. They include: JACOB SNIDER (d. 1866) American inventor of the "Breech-Loading Rifle", better known as "Snider Rifle", which was adopted after 1859 by the British Government. FRANS SNIDER (Snyders) (1579-1657) Dutch painter who specialized in the painting of animals. Was both a friend and a co-worker of Rubens. DENTON JACQUES SNIDER (1841-1925) Author who was born in Cherry Valley, New York. His most famous writings include, "The Chemistry of Plant and Animal Life", which he wrote in 1903, and "Dairy Chemistry." JEFFERSON SNIDER (Snyder) (1848-1926) Lawyer who was born in Berks County, Pennsylvania and who received his A.B. from Lafayette College in Easton, Pennsylvania in 1872. He was admitted to the bar in 1875, and practiced primarily in Reading. CONRAD VICTOR SNIDER (Schneider) (1610-1680) German physician and author. His most valuable written work is believed to be "De Catarrhis", in which he gives an anatomical description of the interior structure of the nose, the lining of the cavities of the nose, and various intricate sections, the lining having been named in his honor, "The Schneiderian Membrane." JOHANN GOTTLLOB SNIDER (Schneider) (1750-1822) German philologist and naturalist who was Professor of Ancient Languages and Eloquence in Frankfurt-on-the-Oder for many years. He bought editions of several classical works, and wrote numerous treatises on natural history, among them, "Ichthyology of the Ancients", "Physiology of Amphibious Animals", and his "Greek-German Lexicon", written in 1797, is esteemed to be his highest standard work.

The Snyders came to America from Holland to join in the Dutch settlement of New Amsterdam. Some left after the American Revolutionary War to go to Upper Canada.

One Dutchman, Henrig Johan Snyder left Holland in 1709 as part of the Palatine German migration to America. He sailed with a Palatine German named Johann Schneider(Snider)

Snyder (of U.E.L. stock) moved to Odessa, Ont. In 1865. He was 22 years old
at the time. His brother stayed on the homestead.

1) The Sniders originated in Germany; Philip, John Michael, Bernhard, Johannes and Jacob Schneider left the Palatine in the early 1700's going to London, England and then on to America. Jacob and Johannes are listed on the New York Subsistence List of 1710. Johannes Sr. moved to Dutchess County, New York.

After the American Revolutionary War of 1775 to 1783, most of the children of Simon Snider, grandson of Johannes Sr. came to Ernestown Township. They were soldiers under Colonel Jessup, leader of the Ernestown settlers.

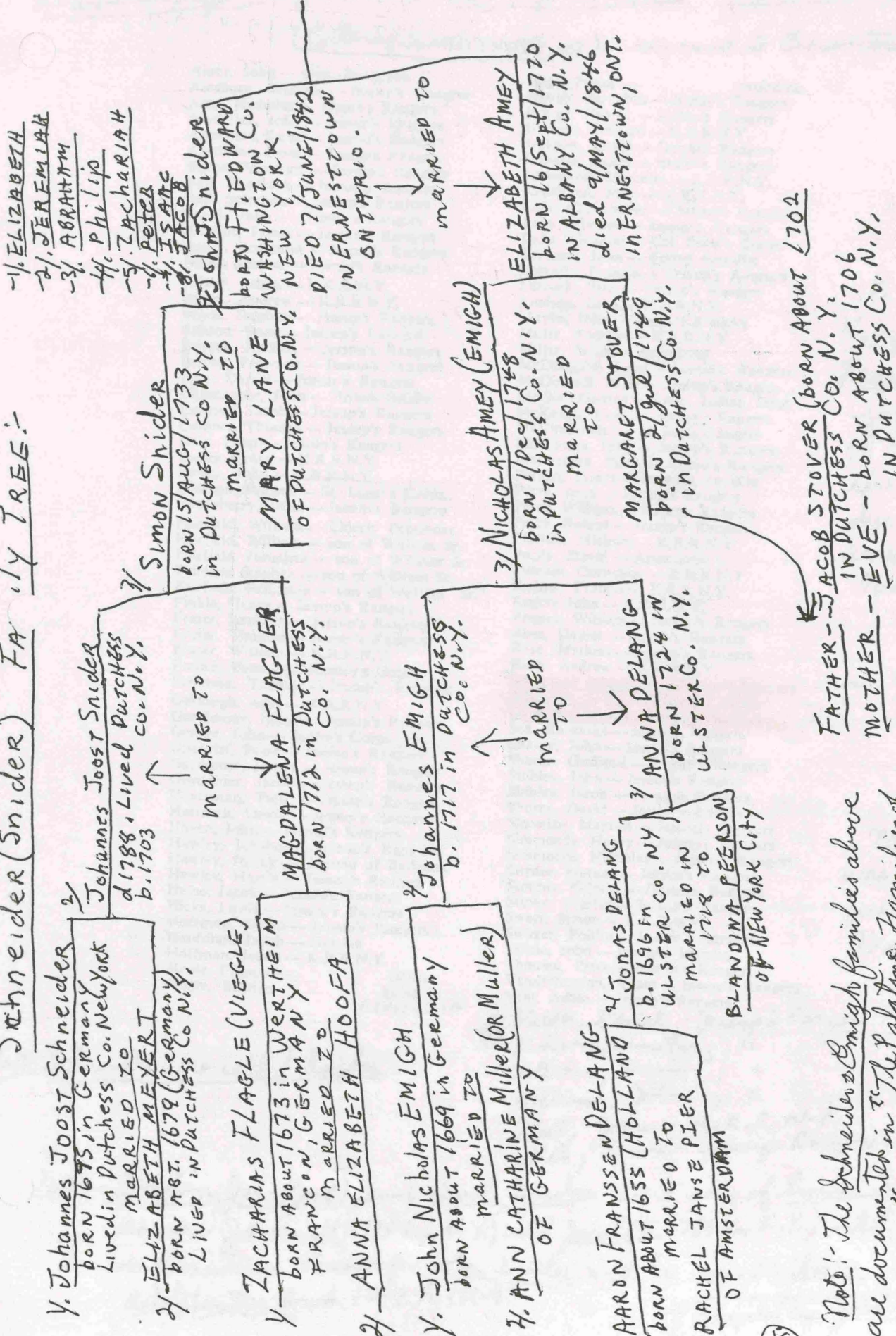
2) Russ Waller - U.E. - noted historian, in his book called U.E. Loyalist Links in L.A. County, lists the names of the Snider U.E. Loyalist settlers with their birth dates, names of their children and grandchildren and great-grandchildren.(about 10 pages)

3) The Napanee Museum and Archives has a Snider Family File which should be read by anyone who is interested in the Snider Family genealogy.

4) Dr. Burleigh of Bath, Ontario - famous genealogist, collected two large files on the Snider Family which can be read at the Queen's University Archives, Kingston, Ontario. It contains many family tree branches, early history, American colonial history, Revolutionary War history, Loyalist history, etc. plus correspondence files, coats of arms etc.

5) The Snider families can be found today all over Ontario and most Canadian provinces and are to be found in the Censuses of the Townships of Ontario 1851, 1861, 1871, 1881, 1891 & 1901 (available at the Stauffer Library, Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario and at the Ontario Archives in Toronto)
