## *Splashdown marks retirement for ex-area NASA engineer*

A native of Fairmont Township who spent 12 years in the space program hitched his retirement to the moon.

Naval Commander Howard C. Wagar, retired, 63, visiting area friends and relatives this week, said he prepared his resignation to Federal Electric Corp., in May. He presented it when the moon trip schedule was complete and he could date it for the day after splashdown.

Once in the space program, "I always said I was going to work until we put a man on the moon," he commented.

Wagar credits the success of the moon landing to Presidents Kennedy and Johnson.

"President Kennedy said we would endeavor to put a man on the moon in this decade and return him safely," Wagar says, "and President Johnson obtained the money."

Wagar, who grew up on a farm along

Sager Lake, graduated from Granada High School in 1924 and went to New York City to attend RCA's radio-telegraph school. He obtained a first-class radio operator's license in 1928.

Following five years as a wireless operator on U.S. Merchant Marine ships, he was a radio engineer in broadcasting stations in New York, Cleveland, Marshalltown, Iowa, Long Beach, Calif., and at the San Francisco Fair.

He was radio engineer at a Warner Brothers station in Hollywood when World War II started.

Having served in Minnesota National Guard and then in the Navy Reserve while on merchant ships, he became a World War II naval officer.

Under National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), he worked for General Dynamics Astronautics, General Electric and Federal Electric at Cape Kennedy, Kennedy Space Center and on the Eastern Test Range which extends southeast of Florida to Ascen-

sion Island and Africa.

"I had my camera and was a little over three miles away to witness the launch of Apollo 11," he says.

As a television and communications engineer, he helped lay out the television system in the space craft building.

Now he carries an engraved aluminum disc which contains metal the Apollo 8 astronauts took around the moon as a memento of his affiliation with the program — the high point in his career.

Wagar doesn't intend to vegetate. He has started tracing family history and found interesting data in New York State and Germany.

While he rents a home on NASA property in Florida, he thinks he may settle in Dutchess County, N.Y. along the Hudson River, and make another trip to Germany to continue his genealogical search.

"I've dug up enough material to write a book," he says with a laugh.

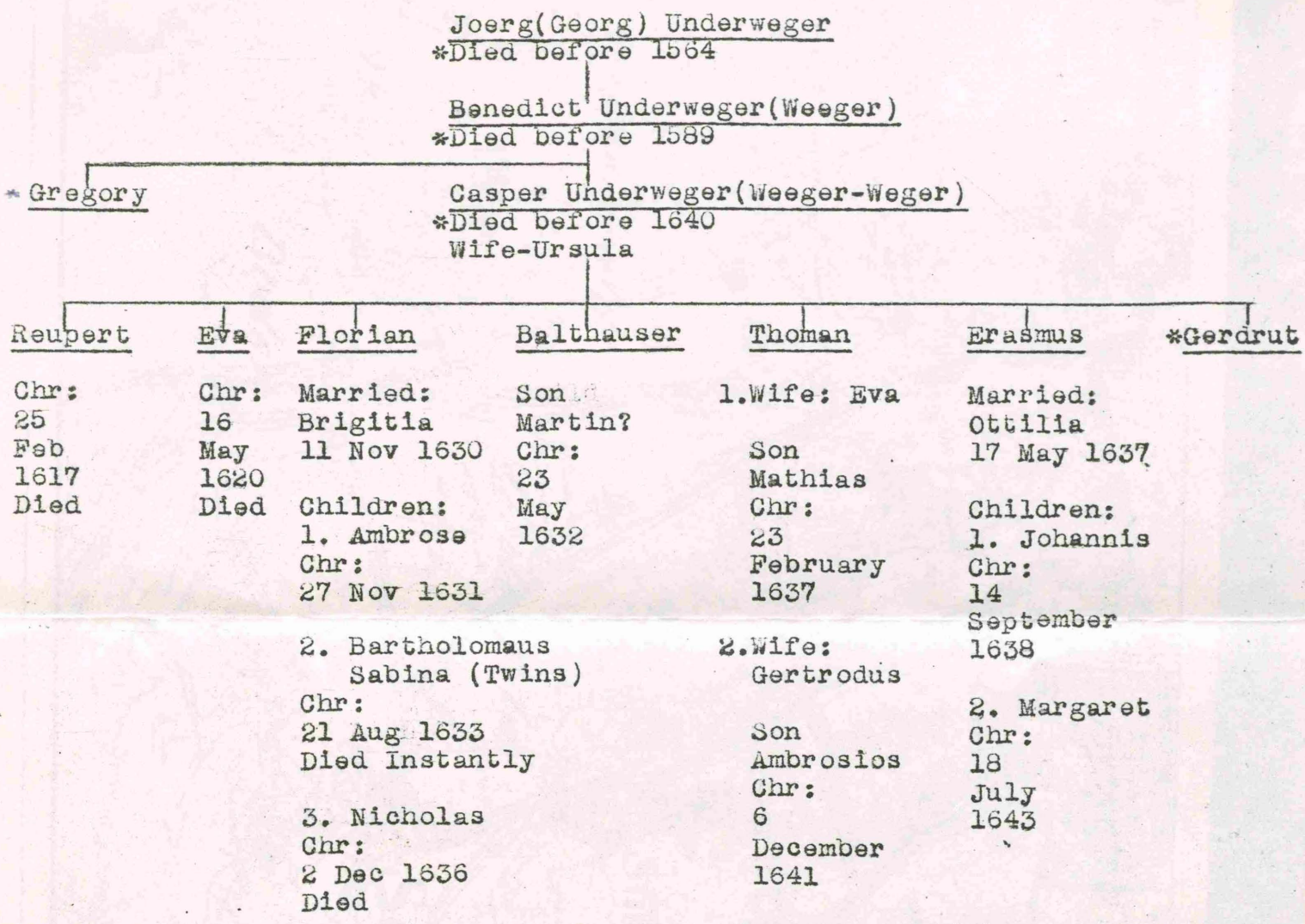

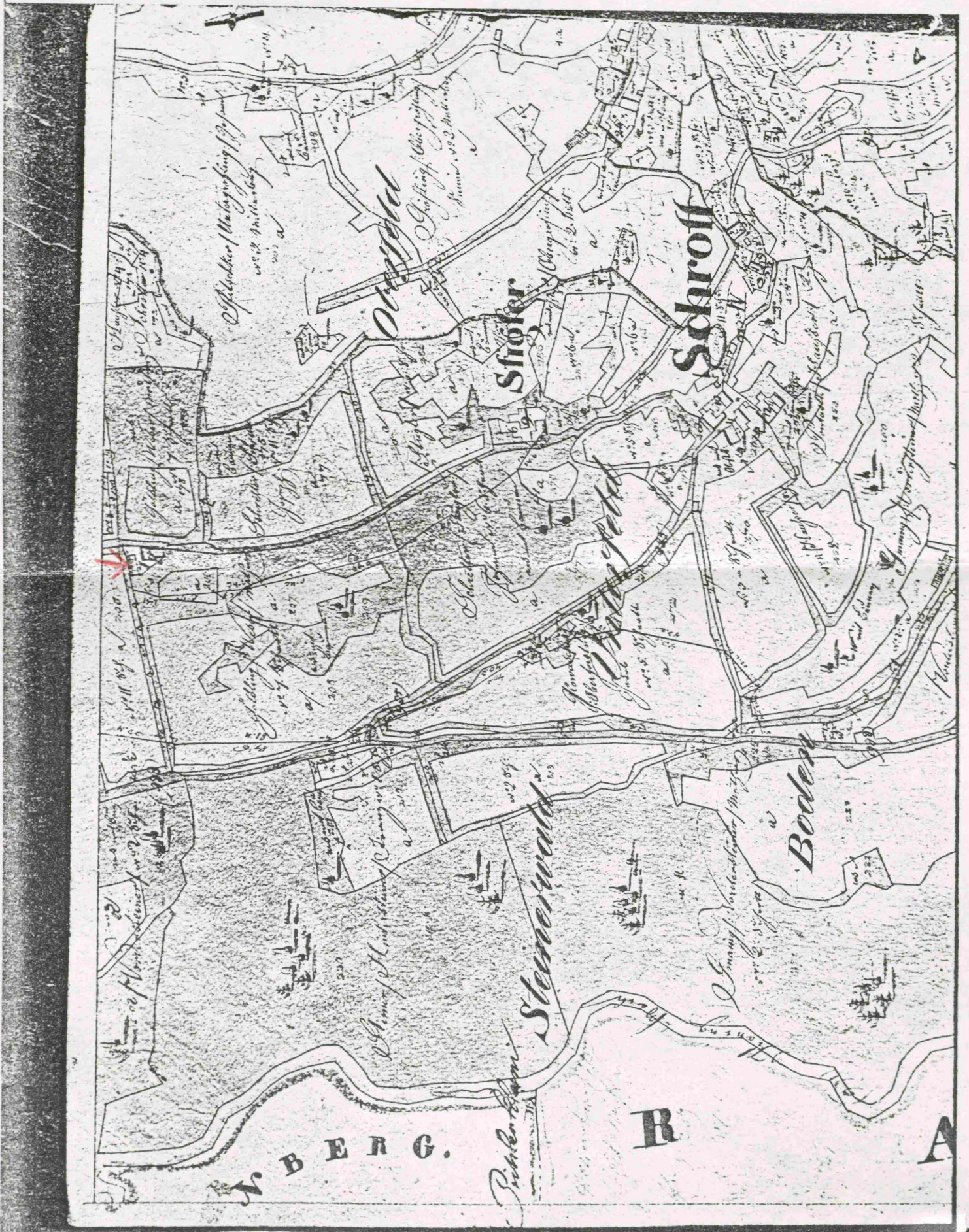

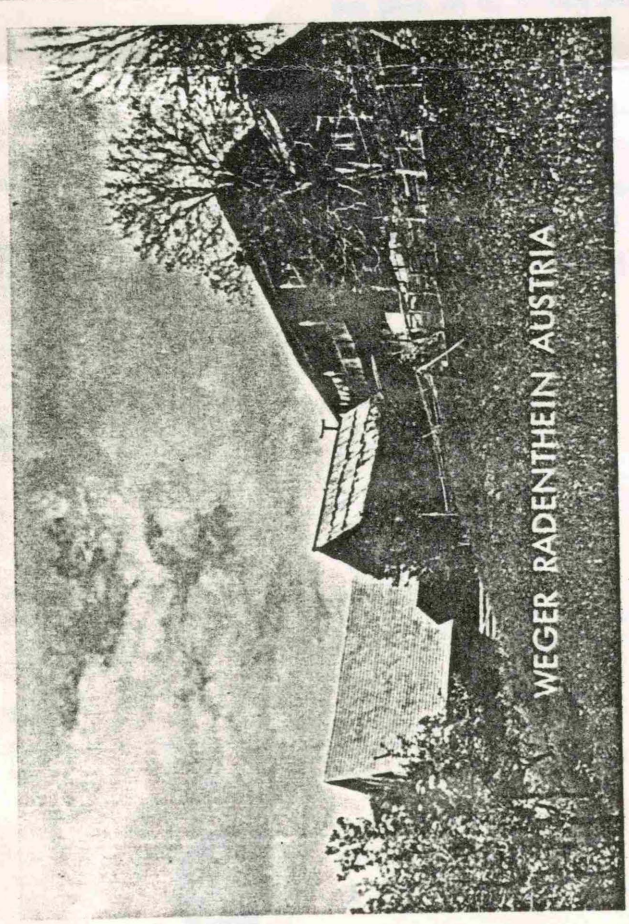


"Weger" House-Schrott Nr.7 is marked on Map. "Weber" is error-should be "Weger"

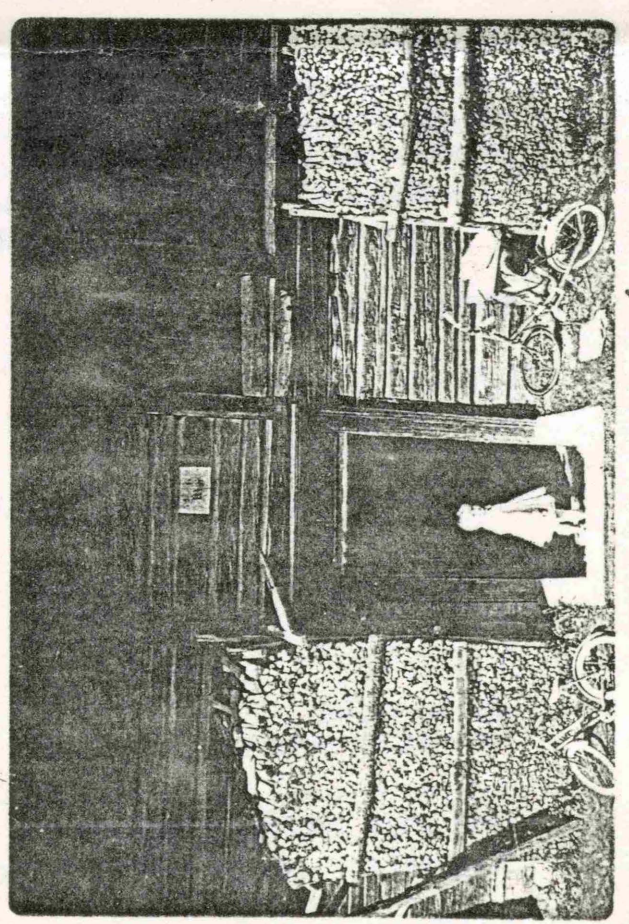

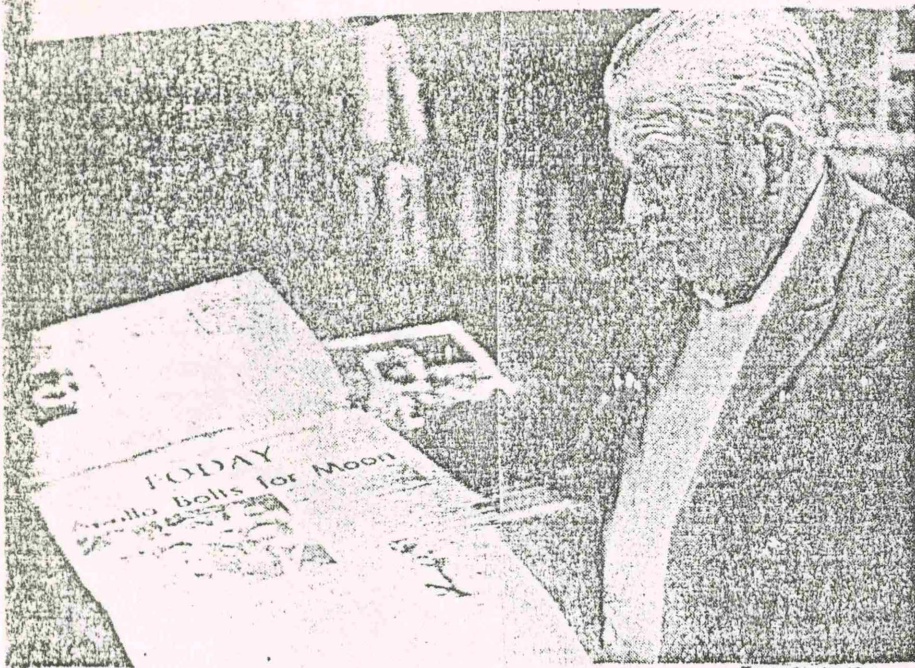

## Explore the Wager Space Shot Collection

The irreplaceable Wager Space Shot photograph collection is housed in the UCF library but most people in the community don't know about it, says Norbert St. Clair, Special Collections director.

The collection documents 20 years of space exploration, from 1956 to 1976.

"That's really interesting. I hadn't heard of it," said Mark Sinclair, director of Orlando's John Young Museum and Planetarium. "It should provide a good human-interest view of the space program.

"The replacement value—not the dollar value—is important," St. Clair said. "This collection could never be replaced."

It consists of 300 official NASA photographs and 23 volumes of newspaper clippings from around the world. Included are the NASA chronology of science and technology, the history of the Kennedy Space Center, the Mercury Project and the

Apollo Project. Other aeronautics and astronautics publications are also included.

The John Young Planetarium uses a lot of NASA information in its programs, but director Barbara Smith said she did not know the extent of UCF's resources.

Spokesmen from the Rollins College library and the Orlando Public Library said they had never heard of the Wager collection either.

St. Clair said he thinks no one in Florida has a comparably good collection.

Cmdr. Howard C. Wager retired from the Apollo moon shot program in 1969 and donated his 20-year collection of memorabilia to UCF in 1977.

St. Clair said it took almost a year to catalog the collection and have it bound.

The collection is located in the Special Collections Room on the fourth floor of the library.

Photocopies of any portion of the collection may be made.

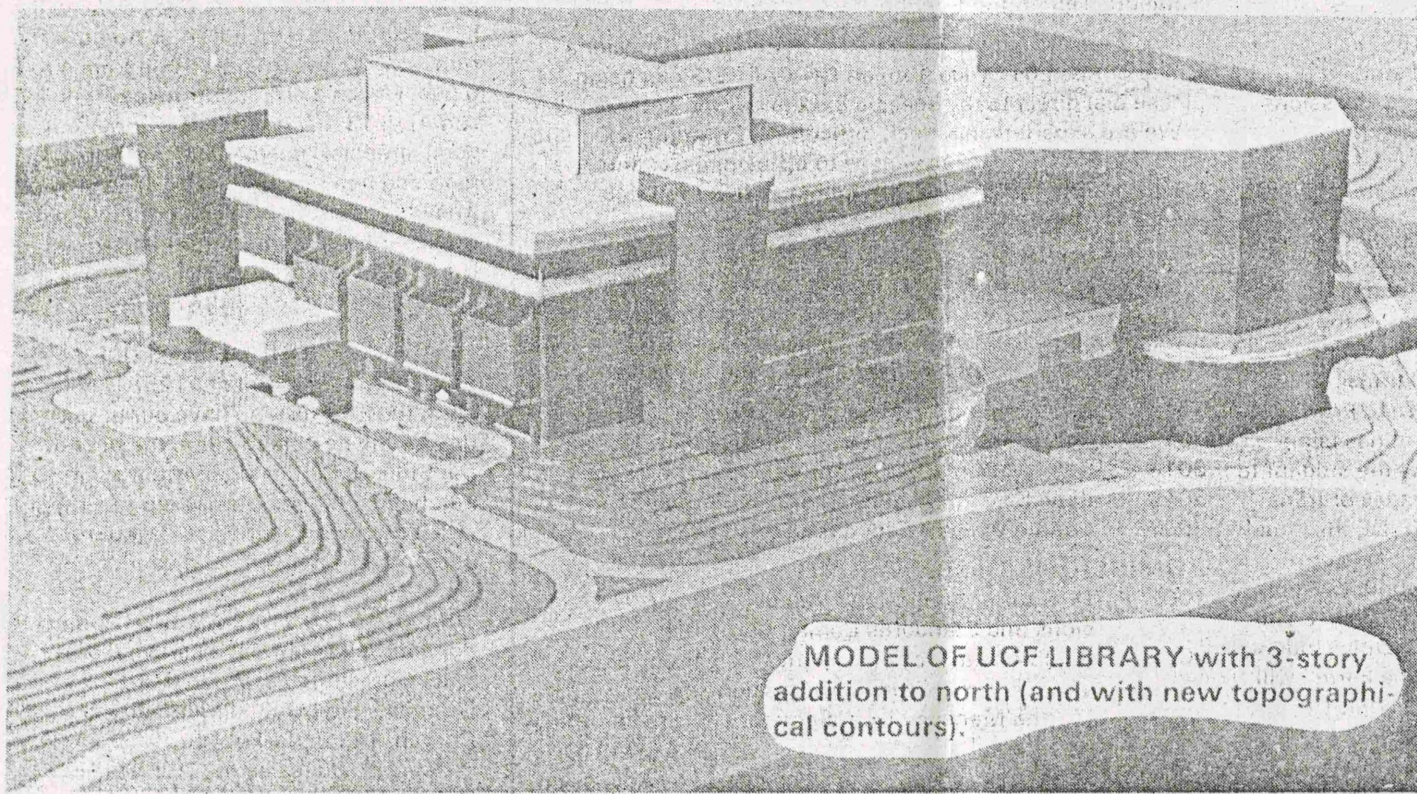

MODEL OF UCF LIBRARY with 3-story addition to north (and with new topographical contours).

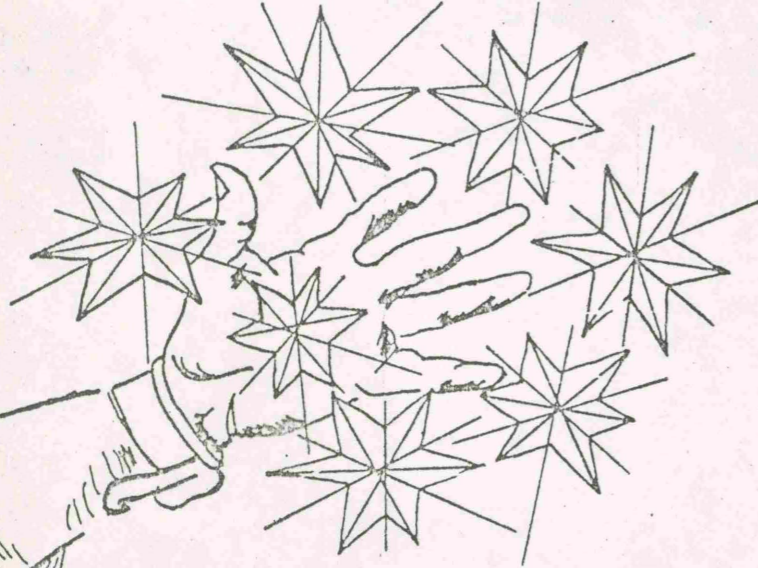
## \$8.4-million expansion-of-library bids due March 9

*The Music Collection is limited at present to musical scores, including more than 60 major operas by noted composers such as Berlioz, Leoncavallo, Mozart, Puccini, Strauss, Verdi and Wagner. These works are mainly in the original language, many of them in two or three languages. There is a copy of Madama Butterfly dedicated to the Italian Queen with a printed autograph by Giacomo Puccini. Most of the scores were published in Europe before and around the turn of the century, including songs by Brahms, Schubert, Schuman, and Strauss. The collection includes church music, some in Latin by noted composers, such as Bach, Haydn, and Mozart. Some of the scores are in poor physical condition, also requiring very special care and handling.*

*Wagar Space Shot Collection. This unique collection of newspaper clippings documents the space program and moon shots from 1956 to 1973. More than 265 official NASA photographs are included, as well as the NASA chronology on science and technology yearbooks. Additional holdings consist of books on the history of the Kennedy Space Center, Mercury Project, Apollo project and a few other publications on aeronautics and astronautics. The newspaper clippings are arranged chronologically in folders in vertical file drawers.*

*Old Florida Structures, in sepia and silver prints, is a collection of photographs by Richard Spencer of the F.T.U. Instructional Resources staff.*

*These photographs of Florida buildings and building details, document large wood frame and brick houses built before and around the turn of the century. They are the photographer's point of view, his selection and composition.*

AN OLD DOCUMENT

Mrs. W. L. Clark and son Thomas have returned from a visit to her old home around Napanee. While there she had the honor of dining with Mrs. Peacord, at a party given at the Rectory on the Mohawk reserve on the Bay of Quinte. Mrs. Peacord is a first cousin of the late Dr. Orenhytekha. Rev. Mc Creegan of this parish married Longboat and his bride.

Mrs. Clark brought back with her an old document of historical interest and a family treasure. It is her grandfather's honorable discharge from the British Army that fought in the American Revolutionary war. As one of the U.E. Loyalists his property was confiscated by the United States Government and he and his sons were each given a grant of land in Canada. The discharge read as follows: His Majesty's Provincial Regiment. 2nd Battallion King's Royal Regiment of New York. Johnson\*\* \*Knight and Baronet, is Lieutenant Colonel Commandent.

These are to certify that the Bearer hereof, Thomas Weegar, private soldier in Capt. William Redford Crawford's Company, of the aforesaid regiment, born in the Parish of Nine Partners in the County of Albany, aged 20 years, hath served honestly and faithfully in the said regiment for three years and in consequence of His Majesty's order for debanding the said regiment he is hereby discharged and is entitled by His Majesty's late order to the portion of land allowed to each Private soldier of His Provincial Corps who wishes to become a settler in this Province. He having first received all just demand of Pay, Cloathing, & from his entry into the said Regiment, to the Date of his Discharge, as appears by his receipt on the back hereof.
