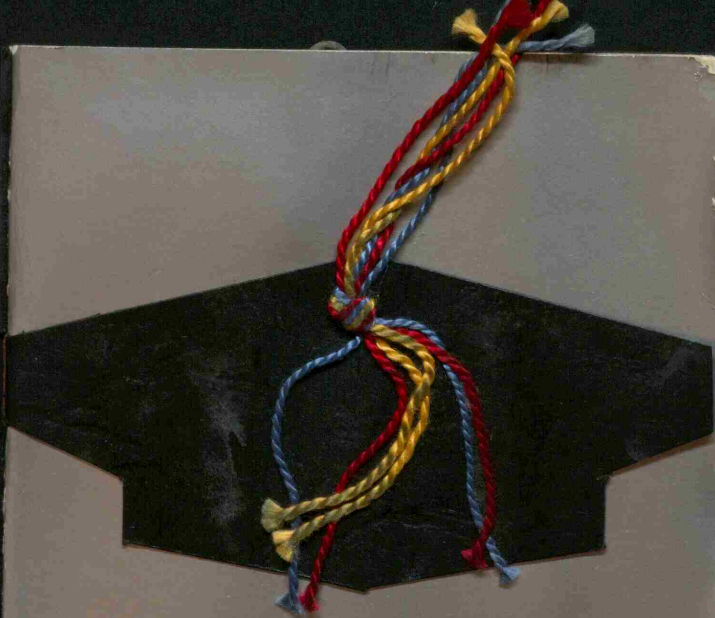

CONSTITUTION OF THE LEVANA
SOCIETY OF QUEEN'S
UNIVERSITY

Revised September, 1930.

ARTICLE I.—NAME

This Society shall be called "The Levana Society of Queen's University."

ARTICLE II.—OBJECT

The object of this Society shall be:—

1. To serve as a bond of union between all the women students of the University.
2. To cultivate the literary, dramatic, musical, debating faculties of its members, and to promote athletics among them.
3. To fit its members that they may take their place in the larger society of the world with dignity to themselves, and credit to this Institution.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERSHIP

1. The members shall be known as (a) honorary, (b) ordinary.
2. All graduates shall be considered honorary members.
3. All women students, registered intra-murally, who have paid the Levana fee of two dollars per year at the time of registration, shall be considered ordinary members.

4. Any student once a member of this Society, who has left College before completing her course, and who desires to keep in touch with the College life may become a member for the year on payment of a fee of \$1.00.

ARTICLE IV.—RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERS

Members shall have the right:

1. To make, second, support or oppose any motions or amendments, provided such be in order; to raise questions of order, of privilege, of appeal, and of all points of parliamentary practice.

2. To vote on all questions brought before the Society.

3. To hold any office in the gift of the Society subject to the provisions of Article V.

ARTICLE V.—OFFICERS AND DUTIES

1. The officers of this Society shall be:—

(a) An Honorary President.

(b) A Vice-President, who shall be a Senior (Post-Mortem) or Post Graduate. It shall be her duty to be present at, and preside in academic costume over all regularly called meetings; to assist as hostess at all social functions with which the Society is connected.

(c) A Vice-President, who shall be a Senior (Post-Mortem) or Post-Graduate. She shall take charge of at least one regular meeting during the year and perform the duties of the President in the latter's absence. If the President resigns or vacates office the Vice-President shall be President.

(d) A Secretary, who shall be a Sophomore.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary:

1. To keep correct Minutes of all the meetings.
2. To read the minutes of the preceding meeting when called upon to do so.
3. To notify all persons elected to office or to committees, and to do so in writing, if necessary.
4. To receive and answer all communications.
5. To act as custodian of all documents.
6. To sign and post up in a conspicuous place, notices of meetings, at least twenty-four hours before the meeting is to take place.
7. To prepare and give a report of the year's work at the annual meeting.

(e) A Treasurer, who shall be a Junior.

It shall be her duty to keep all monies belonging to the Society, and to pay out such sums as shall be voted by the Society. She shall deliver a report at the annual meeting.

(f) A Prophetess, who may be from any year, and shall deliver a prophetic address at the annual meeting of the Society.

(g) An Historian, who may be from any year, and who shall keep a record of all the principal doings of the Society and its members, and shall report the same to the Society in an address at the annual meeting.

(h) A Poetess, who may be from any year, who shall read at the annual meeting an original poem, extolling in rhyme and neat verse, the virtues, etc., of the retiring Executive.

(i) The Convener of the Program Committee, who may be from any year.

(j) The President of the debating club, who may be from any year.

(k) The President of the Levana Athletic Board of Control, who shall be a Senior, Post-mortem, or Post-graduate.

(l) The President of the Levana Council who shall be a Senior, Post-mortem or Post-graduate.

(m) A Senior Curator, who shall be a Junior or a Senior. She shall supervise the properties of the Levana Society; shall keep an inventory of these, and further, she shall have the power to enforce the proper use by the students of the Levana Room furniture, etc., and especially of the magazines and papers furnished by the Society. Also, if necessary, she shall draw the attention of the members to the rules governing the use of the Levana Room, and furnishings.

(n) Two Junior Curators who shall be Freshettes. It shall be their duty to see that the Red Room is kept neat and in order and that the papers and magazines are in their proper places. They shall make all necessary preparations for the meetings of Levana and shall assist the Senior Curator as she may advise. They shall be appointed at the first meeting in each session.

2. In all cases of qualifications for nominations the year of the nominee shall be considered from the academic viewpoint, not from that of years spent in College (e.g., a Senior shall have passed sufficient of her classes to insure her being ranked as a Senior or a graduate during her term of office, etc.).

ARTICLE VI.—COMMITTEES AND THEIR DUTIES

1. There shall be five committees—an Executive committee, a Programme committee, a Debating Committee, an Athletic committee, and the Levana Council.

2. The Executive committee shall be composed of officers of the Society as outlined in Article V. It shall be the duty of this committee to consider all matters of business, all discussions of proposed measures, recommendation concerning the finances of the Society, etc., to report the same to the Society, and to appoint the second member of the Athletic Committee of the Alma Mater Society. The Executive shall have power to appoint a new member to replace any member who fails to attend three consecutive executive meetings.

3. The Programme committee shall consist of a convener, and the vice-president of each year. They shall arrange the programmes for the regular meetings in accordance with the objects of the society. Each vice-president shall look after one meeting, when her year shall provide the programme.

4. The Debating committee shall consist of the President of the Debating Club, the Secretary, a representative from each of the four years and the representative on the Women's Intercollegiate Debating Union. This committee shall take charge of the Inter-year Debates and shall look after the Intercollegiate debates.

5. The Athletic committee shall consist of the President, Secretary-Treasurer, the Queen's members of the Intercollegiate Rules committee, the two representatives to the Intercollegiate Basketball Commit-

tee and a representative for each sport chosen as outlined in the Constitution of the L. A. B. of C.

It shall be the duty of the L. A. B. of C. to supervise the athletic interests of the Levana Society in so far as they be outside the sphere of the general Athletic Committee of the Alma Mater Society.

6. The Levana Council shall be composed of a president elected with the Levana executive and other officers and councillors as outlined in the Constitution of the Levana Council. It shall maintain discipline and deal with the moral interests of the members of the Levana Society during their College course.

ARTICLE VII.—MEETINGS

1. A meeting of this Society shall be held at 4 p.m. on every second Wednesday throughout the academic session, except when Wednesday will be a holiday; in which case the meeting shall be held on the following Thursday.

2. Special meetings shall be held at any time at the request of the President, the Executive Committee, or the written request of ten members. Unless it is absolutely impossible, twenty-four hours' notice shall be required for a special meeting also.

3. A special meeting shall be held for the nomination of officers, one week before the annual meeting.

4. The annual meeting shall be held the second week in March, at which the officers-elect shall be installed and the business of the year transacted.

ARTICLE VIII.—MODE OF PROCEDURE

A.—REGULAR MEETING

1. Reading minutes of previous regular meeting and special meeting or meetings, if any, and confirming and signing the same.

2. Reading and disposing of communications.
3. Unfinished business.
4. Business from the Executive to the Society.
5. Announcements from the Council to the Society.
6. Reports of Committees.
7. Propositions and Motions.
8. Matters affecting the interests and prosperity of the Society.
9. Programme.

B.—ANNUAL MEETING

1. Reading Minutes of previous annual meeting and confirming and signing of same.
2. Reading and disposing of Communications.
3. Reports of Secretary and Treasurer.
4. Reports of Committees.
5. Business from previous annual meeting.
6. Election of Auxiliary Officers to Levana.
7. Propositions and Motions.
8. Matters affecting the interests and prosperity of the Society.
9. Installation of officers-elect.
10. Programme, including the contribution of the Poetess, Historian and Prophetess.

ARTICLE IX.—THE CONSTITUTION

1. This Constitution may be amended, added to, or otherwise altered, by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided that notice of such amend-

ment, addition or alteration is given in writing and is recorded by the Secretary at the meeting previous to the one at which it is adopted.

2. A two-thirds vote of the members present may suspend any clause or clauses of this Constitution for the time being.

ARTICLE X.—RULES OF ORDER

1. No member shall be allowed to speak on a motion more than once without the permission of the chair, except the mover of the motion, who shall be allowed to reply to any argument against it. No member shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes without permission of the chair.

2. Thirty minutes only of each meeting shall be devoted to business.

3. Any motion of unusual importance, in substance or phrasing shall be submitted in writing.

4. An amendment to an amendment shall be in order.

ARTICLE XI.—GENERAL

1. At any meeting of the Society nine members shall constitute a quorum, and at any meeting of the Executive five members shall constitute a quorum.

2. The membership fee of this Society shall be used for the current expenses of the Society and for sending and entertaining of delegates, etc., unless otherwise voted by the Society.

3. There shall be no initiation and on the evenings of the Freshettes' reception there will be theatricals or a fancy dress ball.

4. During the first week of the fall term, the Vice-President of each year shall call together the girls of her year for the purpose of appointing representatives to the A.M.S. council and the President of Levana shall call together the girls of the Freshette year for the same purpose.

5. The President shall be given a gold "L" in recognition of her services to the Society and this custom shall be established.

CONSTITUTION OF THE LEVANA COUNCIL

ARTICLE I.—OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL

1. The Officers of the Council shall be:

(a) A PRESIDENT, elected with the Levana Executive in the Spring, who shall be a Senior, post-graduate or post-mortem. She shall be a student with good academic standing, executive ability, and a sincere appreciation of the ideals of the Levana Society.

(b) A VICE-PRESIDENT, a Senior, post-graduate or post-mortem, of good academic standing, elected by the Council in the Spring.

(c) A SECRETARY-TREASURER, a Junior of good academic standing, elected by the Council in the Spring.

2. The Members of the Council shall be:

Eight councillors, of whom two shall be post-graduates and post-mortems, two shall be seniors, two shall be juniors, and two shall be sophomores. All members of the Council shall be students of good academic standing.

ARTICLE II.—DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE COUNCIL

The Duties and Powers of this Council shall be:

1. To deal with matters affecting the moral interests of the members of the Levana Society, both within and without the University, and to formulate rules of conduct which, if subsequently approved by the Levana Society, shall become binding on its members.

2. To have supervision over the activities and conduct of the Freshette Year; to hold a special meeting of the Freshettes within the first two weeks of the Fall Term to explain the purposes and regulations of

the Levana Council; to approve the plan of initiation which shall be submitted to them by the Sophomore Year; to hold a court for the trial of offences committed by Freshettes against the regulations imposed upon them; to have personal interviews with all Freshettes who fail in one or more subjects at the Mid-term Examinations with the purpose of advising and assisting them in their academic work; to at all times be available for counsel and assistance.

3. To take the initiative in the administration of reproof or discipline should need arise. (It is understood that any matter calling for reproof or discipline is always first to be reported to the Council.)

4. To see that order is maintained among the women students in the college buildings.

5. To explain at the first regular meeting of the Levana Society the purposes and regulations of the Levana Council and to put in the hands of each woman student a copy of such regulations.

6. To report at the last meeting of the Fall Term and at the Annual Meeting the work done by the Council.

7. To dismiss a councillor who fails in her duty, and to substitute a worthier.

ARTICLE III.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS OF COUNCIL

The duties of the following officers of the Council shall be as follows:—

1. The PRESIDENT.

(a) Shall preside at all meetings of the Levana Council.

(b) Shall act as President of the Society in the absence of both President and Vice-President.

2. The *Vice-President* shall perform the duties of the President in her absence.

3. The *Secretary-Treasurer* shall record in a suitable book, provided for that purpose, all business transacted by the Council, and shall keep all monies collected by the Council.

ARTICLE IV.—MEETINGS

The Council shall convene at the call of the president, at least once a month, oftener if necessary.

ARTICLE V.—ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS

The officers of the Council with the President as Convener shall confer with the Levana Executive to choose the eight councillors each spring after the Levana Elections.

RULES FORMULATED BY THE LEVANA COUNCIL AND ADOPTED BY THE LEVANA SOCIETY

I.—*Regulations Regarding Halls and Lecture Rooms:*—

1. After Fall Convocation, the women students are expected to wear college gowns while in the New Arts Building.

2. There shall be no conversation during lectures.

3. Silence must be preserved in the halls and corridors during class hours.

II.—*Regulations Regarding the Use of the Levana Room:*—

1. Magazines must not be taken from the Levana Room. They must all be returned to the racks before the student using them leaves the room.

III.—*Regulations Regarding Lodging Houses*:—

1. Women students must not lodge in houses in which men are lodging.

2. Women students must receive their gentlemen callers in the drawing room of their lodging house.

SUGGESTIONS

1. The Women's Residence at Queen's does not accommodate all the women students. All girls, therefore obliged to seek rooms in the city are earnestly requested to maintain such relations with their landladies, in desirable houses, as will make it possible to retain these houses on the approved lists from year to year.

2. That there should be no conversation between men and women in the halls and corridors.

3. Women students are reminded that the second bell which strikes seven minutes after the hour is a signal for the beginning of lectures. All should be in their seats in the lecture rooms before it ceases ringing.

4. Women students of Queen's are expected to conduct themselves at all times and in all places in a manner befitting a loyal Queen's student, who has at heart the best interests of her Alma Mater.

CONSTITUTION OF THE LEVANA DEBATE
COMMITTEE

ARTICLE I.—NAME

This committee shall be called The Levana Debating Club.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECTS

The objects of this Club shall be:—

1. To promote the interests of debating among the members of Levana.
2. To give training in public speaking.

ARTICLE III.—MEMBERS

1. The membership shall be open to all members of Levana.
2. A member in good standing shall be one who signifies to the secretary her wish to have her name placed on the membership list.

ARTICLE IV.—RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF MEMBERS

1. To make, second or support any motion or amendment; to raise questions of privilege, points of order, questions of appeal, or any other points of parliamentary practice.
2. To vote on any or all questions affecting the club, its members, or interests, at any or all of the club meetings, regular or special and to vote at the election of officers.
3. To hold any office within the gift of the club except that of Honorary President.

ARTICLE V.—ELECTION OF OFFICERS

1. Officers except the president shall be elected by the club.
2. The officers, except the president, shall be elected at the last meeting of the spring session.
3. The names of the officers elected shall be submitted for approval to the Levana Society.

ARTICLE VI.—OFFICERS

The officers of the club shall be:—

1. A *President*, who shall be a member of the Levana Executive and shall be elected with the Levana Executive from any year.
2. A *Secretary*.
3. A representative from each of the four years.

ARTICLE VII.—MEETINGS

1. The time of meeting shall be decided each year by the executive.
2. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VIII.—MODE OF PROCEDURE

The mode of procedure shall be:—

1. *Business*.
 - (a) Reading minutes of previous regular meeting and special meetings, if any, and confirming and signing of same.
 - (b) Reading and disposing of communications.
 - (c) Business from the Executive to the Society.
 - (d) Reports of Committees.

(e) Propositions and Motions.

(f) Matters affecting the interests and prosperity of the Society.

2. Debate or Lecture.
3. Programme.
4. Criticism.

ARTICLE IX.—AWARDS TO DEBATERS

1. Gold Q's with pearls to indicate the year shall be awarded to Intercollegiate debaters, if they win, and gold Q's without pearls, if they lose.

2. Bronze L's with the year engraved shall be awarded to the winners of the Inter-year debates.

RULES GOVERNING INTER-YEAR DEBATES

1. The leaders of debate shall each have ten minutes, the seconds seven minutes, to present their arguments. The leader of the affirmative shall be allowed three minutes to close the debate, and in this reply no new argument shall be adduced.

2. At least two weeks before the debate, the challenging year shall select three subjects for debate, and place them in the hands of the Vice-president of the year challenged, the challenged year shall select one of these subjects and the side which it will defend, and notify in writing the vice-president of the challenging year within twenty-four hours. (The challenging year shall be the Senior-year in point of time in college.)

3. At least five days before the debate, the Convener of the Programme Committee will select three judges and submit their names to the Vice-Presidents

of the years interested in the debate. These names shall be posted with the notice of meeting.

4. The subject of the debate shall be submitted to the judges at least three days before the debate, by the Convener of the Programme Committee.

5. The judges chosen shall be Professors' wives, members of the faculty or graduates not in actual attendance at the University.

6. No member shall be allowed to debate twice for the same year unless in the final debate for the cup, and then, not twice in the same year.

7. Debaters appearing before the Society shall not receive assistance from organized year debating societies with gentlemen members.

8. Any year not conforming to these rules, while the opposing year does, shall be adjudged to have lost the debate by default.

THE LEVANA ATHLETIC BOARD OF CONTROL

ARTICLE I.—NAME

The Athletic Committee shall be called The Levana Athletic Board of Control.

ARTICLE II.—THE OBJECT

The object of the committee shall be:—

- (a) To promote Athletics for all members of Levana.
- (b) To enforce the By-laws governing Athletics.
- (c) To supervise and carry out the inter-year games, intercollegiate games and exhibition games, in the spirit of good sportsmanship.

ARTICLE III.—THE OFFICERS

The committee shall be composed of the President, elected with the Levana Executive, a member of the Levana Executive chosen from the Senior Year who shall preside at all the meetings of the L. A. B. of C. The following members of the Committee shall be elected at the Annual Levana Meeting to which the retiring President of the Levana Athletic Board of Control shall bring nominations from the committee, subject to further nominations by the members of Levana:—

- Secretary-Treasurer.
- Sports Convener.
- Tennis Convener.
- Baseball Convener.
- Swimming Convener.

Ground Hockey Convener.

Basketball Convener.

Ice Hockey Convener.

Each convener shall be at the head of a committee made up of one representative from each year who shall be the manager of her team but who does not act on the Levana Athletic Board of Control.

The following members shall be appointed by the Levana Athletic Board of Control:—

Senior Representative to Intercollegiate Basketball League.

Junior Representative to Intercollegiate Basketball League.

Senior Representative to Intercollegiate Hockey League.

Junior Representative to Intercollegiate Hockey League.

Senior Representative to Intercollegiate Tennis Tournament.

Junior Representative to Intercollegiate Tennis Tournament.

One member of the committee shall be elected by the Freshette Year in the fall at the first meeting of the year, to represent that year.

ARTICLE IV.—DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

1. The President:—

(a) To preside at all Meetings.

(b) To make a report to Levana at the annual meeting of all the activities during the current year.

2. The Secretary-Treasurer:—

(a) To keep the Minutes.

(b) To notify persons elected to office.

(c) To carry on all communications.

(d) To post notices of meetings.

(e) To obtain a sum of money from A. B. of C. for petty cash fund.

(f) To pay all bills and keep an account.

3. The Conveners:—

(a) To be head of the committee composed of one representative from each year.

(b) To arrange schedules for games and practices for inter-year teams.

(c) To post notices for year games and practices.

4. The Year Representatives:—

(a) To manage the year team.

(b) To work on committee with convener of the respective sport.

(c) To keep the record of attendance at practices and to name those eligible for awards.

5. Intercollegiate Representatives:—

The Senior representative presides at Intercollegiate Meetings when held at Queen's and the Junior representative carries on all correspondence regarding Intercollegiate affairs, and acts as secretary when the meet is at Queen's.

ARTICLE V.—BYLAWS

Section I.—Meetings.

The regular meeting of the Levana Athletic Board of Control shall be held the first Monday of each month. Special meetings shall be held at any time at the request of the president.

Section II.—Amendments.

Any amendment to the constitution must be given as a notice of motion in writing to the Levana Society

at the meeting previous to the one at which it is adopted.

Section III.—Finances.

Intended expenses must be submitted to the Athletic Board of Control with the exceptions of small bills such as stamps, telegrams, etc., which are paid out of the petty cash fund. This fund shall be obtained by the Secretary-Treasurer from the Secretary of the Athletic Board of Control.

Section IV.—Eligibility.

1. Every member of Levana shall have the privilege of playing on a team representing the year with which she will graduate.

2. (a) Every student shall be eligible to compete in an Intercollegiate contest who is an amateur.

(b) Eligibility for players in Intercollegiate contests shall be found in the files of the Levana Athletic Board of Control.

3. (a) Graduates proceeding to the degree of M.A. or Ph.D. shall play on the final year team and are girls who have won places on their year teams.

(b) Graduates of one faculty proceeding to a degree in another faculty shall be considered as undergraduates and therefore eligible to represent the year with which they graduate.

ARTICLE VI.—AWARDS

Section I.—

A year crest (2" x 2") shall be awarded to those girls who have won places on their year teams.

Section II.—

An A shall be awarded to those who have won a place on a Champion year team. This A shall be 6" by 4½" with the year on the cross bar, the color being determined by the game — blue for Ground Hockey, Red for Ice Hockey, Yellow for Basketball.

Section III.—

A crest of diagonal blue and red (3½" by 4") with the inscription Queen's and the year of the player in yellow, shall be awarded to those girls who have won places on champion year teams in two different sessions or two different sports in same session. In the corners shall be placed smaller figures of the year of award in the color of the sport in which the award was won.

Section IV.—

A felt award shall be given to the singles and doubles champions of the Tennis Tournament.

Section V.—

A felt award shall be given to the girl who makes the largest number of points at the Track Meet.

Section VI.—

A shield shall be given to those who play on an Intercollegiate team as regular or substitute.

Section VII.—

A gold Q (6" by 4") shall be given to girls who play on a team in the Intercollegiate series which has won at least 50% of the regular scheduled league

games. A Q shall not be granted to students of the first year until they have obtained academic standing for the first year.

Section VIII.—

A Tennis Cup donated by Levana, shall be engraved every year with the names of the singles and doubles champions.

Section IX.—

(a) In all cases of award, the winner must have played in all matches of the series and been present at three practices, except in the case of injury or other exceptional circumstances. The record of attendance, etc., shall be signed by the manager of the team.

(b) The power to give any award in exceptional circumstances shall rest with the Levana Athletic Board of Control.

Section X.—

(a) All awards shall be exact copies of models kept by the Levana Athletic Board of Control.

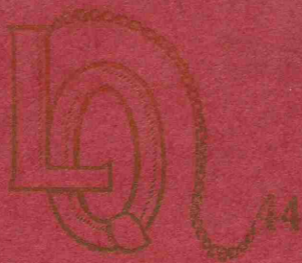
(b) No girl shall be allowed to wear an Athletic award until she has earned the right to do so.

(c) An A and a Crest shall not be worn together by any person at any one time.

(d) All awards must be worn on a Queen's sweater, Queen's blazer, tunic or plain white sweater.

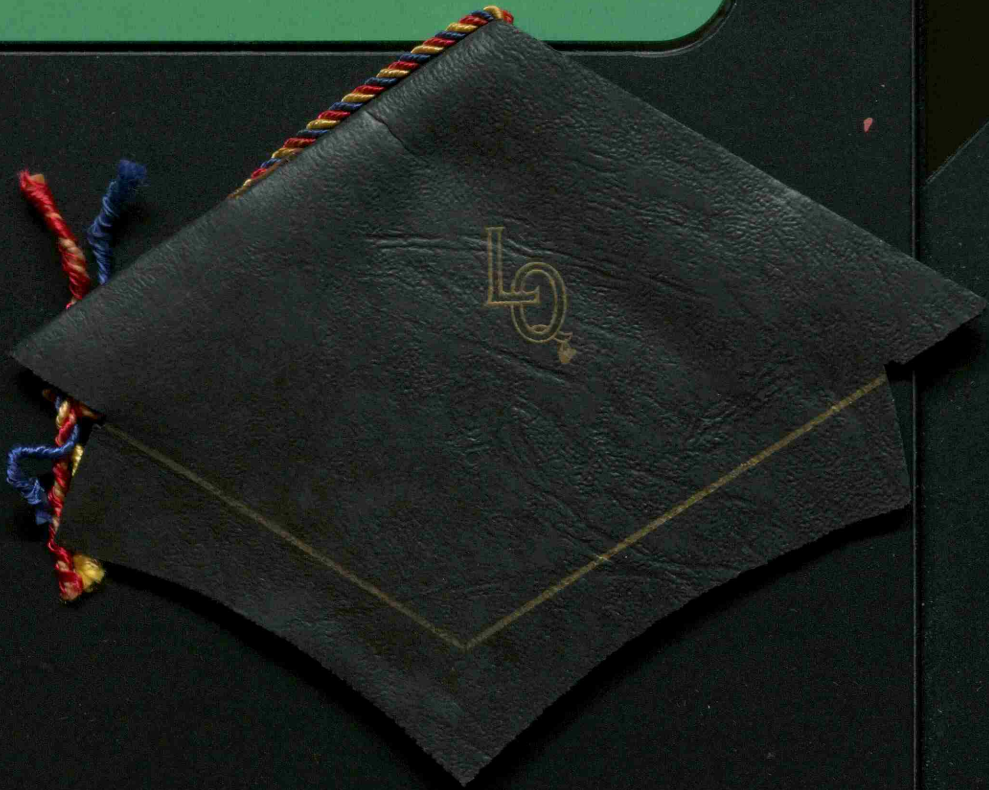

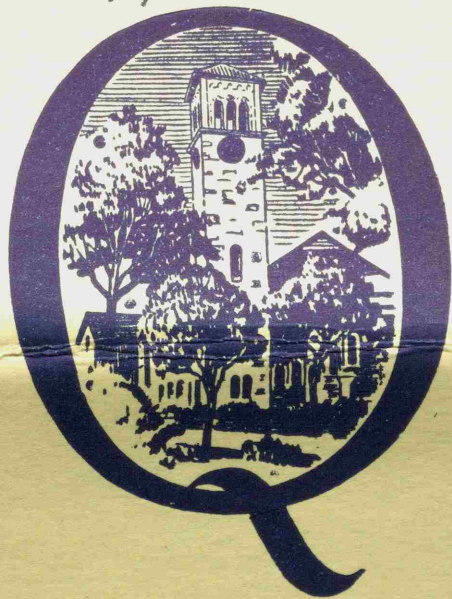
