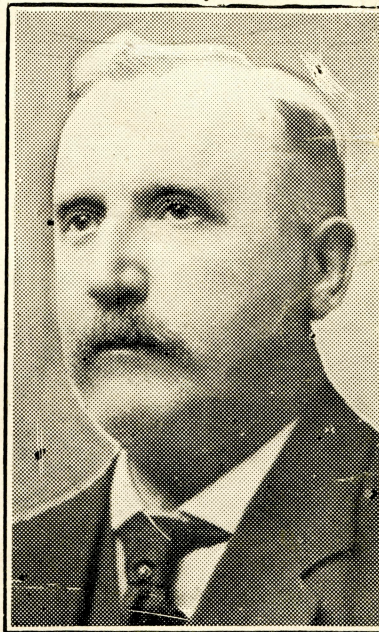

Let this be your slogan: "Kingston Industrial is growing, grow with Kingston Industrial."

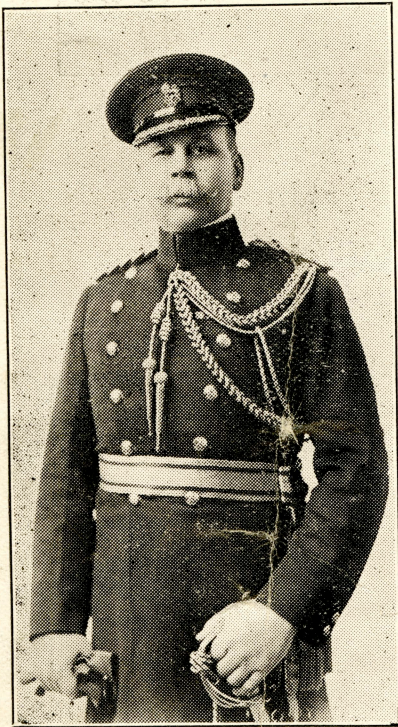

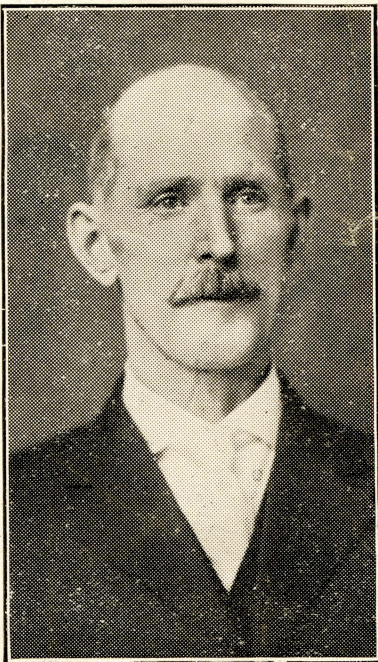

**RULES—TRIALS OF SPEED.**

All trials of speed best in 5 heats. National Rules to govern all trials of speed. Hobbles no bar. Trotters allowed 5 seconds in all trials of speed. Five per cent. to enter, 5 per cent. additional to winner. Horse eligible prior to August 1st, 1916. All Races open to the world. Trot and Pace.

Entries to races must be made to the Secretary of the Race Committee up to and including 25th September, 1916. This Rule will be strictly adhered to; horsemen will please govern themselves accordingly.
