Dear Dr. Douglas,

Thank you for your letter. I am sorry that I have not written to ^{you} since last Christmas. My spare time is rather limited at the moment.

After I returned from Canada last year, I started studying for a Degree in Physics at the University of Sussex. The courses at this University are arranged different to those at other Universities. They are concentrated mostly on modern Physics and in the final year specialisation is made in Nuclear and Solid State Physics.

I am glad to say that my Mother's health is now nearly back to normal. You will probably remember that I told you that she had a major surgical operation just before I left for Canada. However, during her recovery a complication arose and she had to have another operation two months ago. I am glad that I returned when I did, and thankful to you for making it possible for me to do so.

I notice that you are coming to London on May 2nd. If you have any spare time during your stay in London we will be very pleased to see you. It only takes one hour to travel from London to Brighton by train. I would like to show you round the University of Sussex as well, if you care to see it. However, I have examinations to sit between April 30th, and May 2nd. inclusive, but I will be glad to show you the University any time after this.

I hope very much to be able to pay back most of the money that I borrowed from you by next October. I will have an opportunity to earn the money during the long summer vacation.

It will not be possible for me to return to Queens University next Autumn, but I hope to return sometime.
