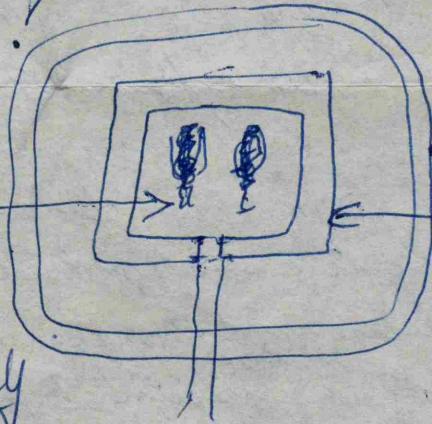
Dearest Aunt Allie,

We received today a grand letter from Daniel telling of his stay at Ashkirk with you - going to Half-Moon Bay + rowing around Foreythe. He evidently did a lot of clearing and tidying up. He says you are very well and gave all the Endicott visitors super talks on the Islands history.

Now Marianne is probably starting her last year at Queen's and is settled in with you. I hope the wedding of her Cousin Anne in France was lots of fun and that she had time for a great family re-union. Dan also tells of her great rowing successes - marvelous!

We left Howgill just a week ago - where I wrote my last letter to you. We really didn't want to leave but Ingram had to help some friends to stay - so we went down to Chester and stayed two nights with the Clearbies. They are in very good form and were very welcoming. They had been at Creevy for a month and had left Sarah and friends there. Joan & Alec are evidently very busy raising sheep at Carron. Alec flies from Sligo to Dublin each week for a day only and they are selling their Dublin house. Ingram plans to retire in 2 years - (1986) and he is in the process of buying a "ruin" overlooking Dent. Stephen + Valerie visited it at Christmas time and we saw it last week in the rain. It is a 17th fam house - with a large hole in the roof and the flooring for the 2nd floor all rotted away - no windows and very overgrown. But Ingram very enamoured with it and Monica

and Emma evidently quite reconciled to moving here. Obviously there will be an enormous amount to do before leaving the elegant Deanery with so much furniture, pictures and books. They will have to sell a lot of things. There is a good old orchard and enough land <sup>garden</sup> ~~to go~~ with the house plus a beautiful great barn that is actually attached to the house and though they have no authority to alter it for living, can be used probably for storage & maybe overflow guests. Emma is vastly spoiled & I feel no consideration for the conversation others may want to carry on but just crashes into the midst of other with dominating & rather drawn out stories in which she figures very prominently - perhaps a stage - but rather hard to take for long periods. Anyway it was a very happy visit. Mother's picture look so marvelous in that setting. We came back to Bath by way of Shrewsbury where we stopped & walked around the Castle, etc. for several hours and then on down through Herefordshire & Monmouthshire & the Wye Valley - really a beautiful

drive past quite high hills + the border hills of Wales. A brief glimpse of Tintern Abbey - then across the new Severn Bridge - past Bristol on the huge motorway and back to Bath. There were great letters here from Stephen, Valerie + Mary to catch us up on family news.

Tomorrow Isabel begins school. She + I got up this morning to do a trial run by bus to the school - She knows her way and is quite confident now about going by herself up Lansdown Hill to the Bath High School - it is right across town but from our house to the school it takes less than 20 minutes. We walked home - (all down hill) and along the River Avon really pleasant to have many marvellous routes for walking right at our doorstep! Audrey's Cousins gave us apples, tomatoes + beans when we dropped in for tea yesterday. I made blackberry + apple jam - we picked quite a lot of blackberries on a lovely walk we did the day before.

I've been asked to help out with driving elderly people to shopping + to a club once or twice a week - as their regular driver has a very sick brother - it is a mini-bus so on Wednesday I go to have a trial drive + get used to it before actually picking up the elderly + perhaps scaring them all by driving Canadian style! Actually we've had excellent driving all around England so I feel quite confident now. Our little second hand car has really been very satisfactory.

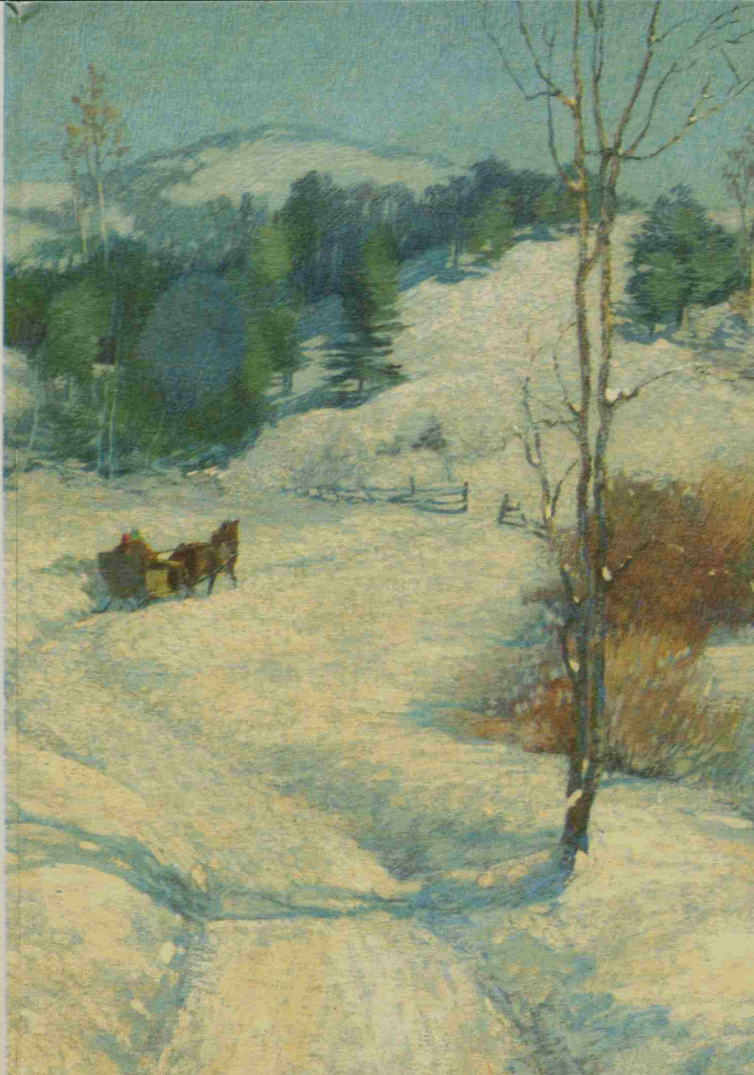
Audrey has not started on her Salisbury researches yet but will begin this week - now that

Isabel will be on a regular routine. It will only take her about half an hour to go to Trowbridge where the Wiltshire Record Office is. Many of the ecclesiastical records are still in Salisbury so eventually she will have to do some work there.

I wrote to Mary L'Esrange several days ago but have not heard from her yet - I hope she's not here in England so that we'll miss her - more likely birding in some exotic place! We've not decided when we might go to Ireland - perhaps a winter visit as we may go to France in the summer of '85.

Dan says the weather cooled off in late August + early September with you - we have the same here but it is more pleasant as Bath can be a very muggy place when there is no wind + temperatures are high. Tomorrow I'm starting my swimming routine at the nearby "Leisure Centre" - a huge complex of pool, squash courts, etc. which is quite new - these leisure centres have become quite common in English towns + seem very popular. The pool is open from 7-9 for adults so I hope to keep up last year's good pattern.

You may not remember me. My name was Jean Goodwin and I married Douglas Jackson, the son of Dr. Wm. Jackson who was a close friend of Dr. George Douglas.

My husband was born when his father was pastor of Douglas Methodist Church. At that time your grandfather was Principal of the Wesleyan Theological College. Dr. Douglas christened my husband and gave him the name "Douglas". There is no initial after the name 'Douglas'. I am sure his father felt that the name 'Douglas' was so important that it was to be the one and only:
