Welcome to Milwaukee again. I hope your European journey was OK and you have returned home safely and satisfied.



Dear Alfred and Isabel

I do hope you both are brave as always.

What can I do for you? This idea comes to my mind quite often. Paintings? No. Chemicals? Not anymore. Jewish culture items? Yes! The last is the most probable! I knew that Jewish culture is ancient, but thought that it was focused in the Middle East region mainly. Recently I learnt that Jewish settlements appeared in Eastern Europe far before the Russian ancestors come there.

Unfortunately, this point – who is more "ancient" on this or that territory, is a source of inter-national collisions in the past and in our times as well. I'm far away from these speculations, because a simple question leads such debaters to a standstill: "Do a black person born in center of Kiev or Moscow, when become adult, has more or less civil rights than the rest population?" If a reply is "less" – I'm stopping talking with my opponent. If "yes", the subject of argue become meaningless. However everyday practice shows that this ancient (if not animal's) subject is still actual. Such bitter conclusion!

Your generation – is a generation of my parents, who gave me many anti-Nazi lessons. The Soviet Union education system made the great contribution as well. So, me, myself can't complain on my international creed. What a great surprise for me when I realized that more than a half (my personal estimation) people of my age in Ukraine don't mind on the neo-Nazi wave come up in the country. They use ani-Russain phraseology, some of them are really hate not only Russians, but the population of Crimea and Donbass as well. I do not take into account the generation of people younger than 30 years. After the Soviet Union collapse they were told, who is the main enemy of Ukraine since their childhood. I can understand such mood of people in the Western part of Ukraine. But I cannot explain the anti-Russian sentiments among the people of my generation in the rest Ukrainian territory.

Of course, the wind comes in from TV-propaganda, broadcasting, internet, newspapers. They are kind of mirrors intended to reflect the reality. Unfortunately, experience shows that these mirrors (both Ukrainian's and Russian's, both European's and American's) – all these mirrors are the mirrors taken from a laughing room. All of them distort reality. All of them are engaged in propaganda and, to a greater or lesser extent, are sowing hatred among nations and peoples. The question is why most people give in to this malign influence?

The sharp example comes from the Russia-24 TV. After the Turkish plane shoot down Russian aircraft over Syria and Erdogan behaved in the most inappropriate way, I did not expect that the Russian media would fall to the anti-Turkish rhetoric. It would be no reproach if it would be Anti-Erdogan attack, but why anti-Turkish? More than three million Russians had rest on Turkish resorts annually. I visited Turkey several times, visited several labs, know several very good Turkish people for almost 20 years. It was even more surprising for me when this anti-Turkish rhetoric has picked up plenty of common Russians in social networks. These moods reminds me the described pogroms of the German stores took place more than a hundred years ago, at the beginning of the

First World War in St. Petersburg and other Russian cities. Unfortunately, history does not teach people.

The situation is even worse in the Ukrainian mass-media. In the meantime, the state power shows its complete impotency, when small group of radicals, so called "activists", once decided to blow electrical supports which feeds Crimea. The supports blow, but Ukrainian government is unable to cope these "activists" who continue protect the blown supports. This is only one example taken from the chain of governmental impotence. At the same time practice shows that the new Ukrainian government is even more corrupted and more aggressive than the previous one. They are not able to CREATE something, they are able to RUIN only.

Ok, I think it is enough for the negative points. Let's come back to the book. This year I visited the Crimea for five times. Last Autumn I met with my best school friend Kostya, who is deputy director of Livadian palace, where Stalin, Churchill and Roosevelt met at the beginning of February 1945. This book presented to Kostya by the author. I looked it though and found that it contains quite comprehensive historical facts about Jewish ancient culture, their contribution to the culture of Crimea and the entire Russian culture. It contains the facts of Holocaust during Second World War as well as the contribution of Jews into the Great Victory.

Kostya is not a fan of such books, so he gave it to me when I told him that it will be a good present to your couple. So, I think it will be interesting for both of you.
