
Dear Dr De Witt

Now that we have received all the contributions for the book for Alfred and that we have embarked on the editing process, we thought that it might be useful to send you a brief update on the current state of play.

First of all we would like to thank all the authors for submitting their contributions in such a complete and timely fashion. The book will contain 23 essays on various aspects of – mostly – Netherlandish art, accompanied by a considerable number of illustrations, hopefully many in colour. The publication of the book has been made possible through the generous financial support of Isabel Bader and Alfred's two sons, Daniel and David.

The book will be published here in London under the imprint of Paul Holberton Publishing. We are very pleased that Paul has taken on this project and that he will copy-edit the text. He has a long-standing relationship with the National Gallery and has edited many of the Gallery's recent exhibition catalogues.

At present we are in the process of reading all the contributions and ordering the remaining photographs.
