Dear Milena:

Hannah Evans has kindly sent me a copy of your report about your travels to Rome and various towns in Germany and Austria. That report gave me a great deal of pleasure simply because I realize to what good use you are putting the funds.

Allow me to write to you briefly about the three Fellowships now given annually to Czech students in art history. Up to now, most of the students chosen have studied rather obscure Moravian and Bohemian artists of the Baroque period.

In time, we hope that Czech students will also be interested in studying the works of non-Czech artists.

Isabel and I have established similar fellowships at the Institute of Fine Arts in New York and at Queen's University in Canada. I believe that all of the students from New York have studied Dutch, Flemish or Italian artists, and the fellows from Canada are interested in Dutch and French (not French-Canadian) artists. Thus, I know that the two next applicants from Queen's are writing theses on the works of Drost and Jan van Noordt.

Why should Czech art historians not also work on Dutch, Flemish, French or Italian artists? This doesn't mean that Czech artists should be neglected, but I think a good mix would be preferable.



Dear Alfred,

thank you very much for your generous gift to help my studies in the future three years. I have arranged everything necessary with the people at the Foundation for a Civil Society.

I waited with my thankful answer to your letter of Jan.23, because I wanted to be able to give you report about the applicants for your Baroque Scholarhip 1996. Nine applications have arrived, that is about three less than the last year. But the decrease was outweighted by the fact, that in this year, for the first time, all the applications were of high quality, so the decision making has never been so difficult.

You might find it interesting, that only one application came from the students of the Prague faculty, and it is not among those who won. I consider this to be caused by the fact, that the Dozent who teaches Baroque art in Prague is strongly oriented on architecture. On the other hand, in both Brno and Olomouc several students appear each year, who are interested in precisely the kind of research you wanted to support: close material study, based on connoiseurship, of "minor" Central European painters of the 17th century. Results of their study usually bring to light forgotten personalities and oeuvres. I have arranged with the editors of the most prestigious art historical journal in our country, Umění, that they would publish the synthetic resulting articles (in English or German) by the students of your scholarship.

I hope that you will not feel sorry for the prevalence of Moravian art historians in this year's competition. I think you have met last year the Dozent in Brno, Lubomír Slavíček, who is an experienced connoiseur of Baroque painting — he remembered your last year's lecture in Brno with great pleasure. The Dozent in Olomouc, Milan Togner is also a very good man — would you not consider visiting Olomouc this year when you come to Prague? I would arrange contacts with him and he could show you the interesting collection of Moravian Baroque painting kept in that city and in Kroměříž (Kremsier).

I have chosen these applicants and their projects for 1996:

- 1. Marian Pliska (Olomouc): Life and work of Karl Josef Haringer
- 2. Jiří Jůza (Olomouc): Karl Andreas Ruthart
- 3. Zdeněk Kazlepka (Brno): Gottfried Libalt this young man exceeds for four years the age limit, but he is still one of those, who were not allowed to study under the previous regime for political reasons, now he is in his fourth university year. He has very good recommendations from Slavíček.

Dear Alfred, it is now clear, that your support helped to give rise to art historical study of previously neglected era and, besides, mostly in Moravia, which has been also neglected by Czech art historians. It is really lucky, that your scholarhip is accompanied by the activity of the two Moravian teachers, Slavíček and Togner. Also the cooperation with the Foundation for a Civil Society helped to give the scholarship a professional arrangement - in short, you have contributed to creating normal, civilized environment in our country.

What is not civilized, unfortunately, is the situation in telephones. I was promised, after two years, that our telephone may be moved in another three years, and there is nothing anybody can do about that... Please, write me in time about your travel plans in June.

Give my best regards to Isabel. I am looking forward to meeting you both in Prague.




Please, send a message to all the others. It may contain an encouragement to apply again next year. Please, in the two cases marked so, attach the recieved photographs to the message.



Isabel and I look forward to being in Prague in June, and hope that we will have a chance to visit with you.



We hope you will be successful again next year in selecting three such students.



Dear Alfred,

I am happy to report to you the results of this year's selections of applicants for your art history scholarship.

I recieved seven applications, all of them from students from all the four Czech and Moravian universities which offer art history courses (2 from Prague, 3 from Olomouc and 2 from Brno, who both currently study at the Central European University in Prague). I selected three of them, who had the best projects concerning preferably artists active in Central Europe, and who had the best references. As a result, the stipends will go to Petr Balcarek from Olomouc (life and work of Jan Spillenberg), Petr Svojanovský from Prague (life and work of Leopold Willmann) and Pavel Blattný also from Prague (work of Hans von Aachen, predominantly from the technological point of view. This last applicant is older than thirty, but his project is very good - he has good results as a restorer of 17th century canvases. Besides, I feel understanding for him, because he the Communist regime did not allow him to study art history before for political reasons: similar to my own case).
