Dear Alfred:

Thank you for your letter of May 3rd.

I am sorry that we have not been able to award the Alfred Bader Fellowship for Study in Holland. The problem is not that Egbert does not have good students but rather that either they do not need to be in Holland (e.g. someone who has been there to see the pictures and to consult archives and is back in America to complete writing) or they are not needy; Egbert has been blessed with some solvent students.

I am not in favor of awarding money to those who do not need it; it seems unfair to those who need it very much. We could, however, change the terms so that we give preference to a student of Dutch art who will work in Holland but, failing such a candidate, to one who will be here rather than there.

I shall be grateful for your thoughts.

In response to your note, I am a dealer in old master paintings and know little about sculpture, tapestries and drawings.


