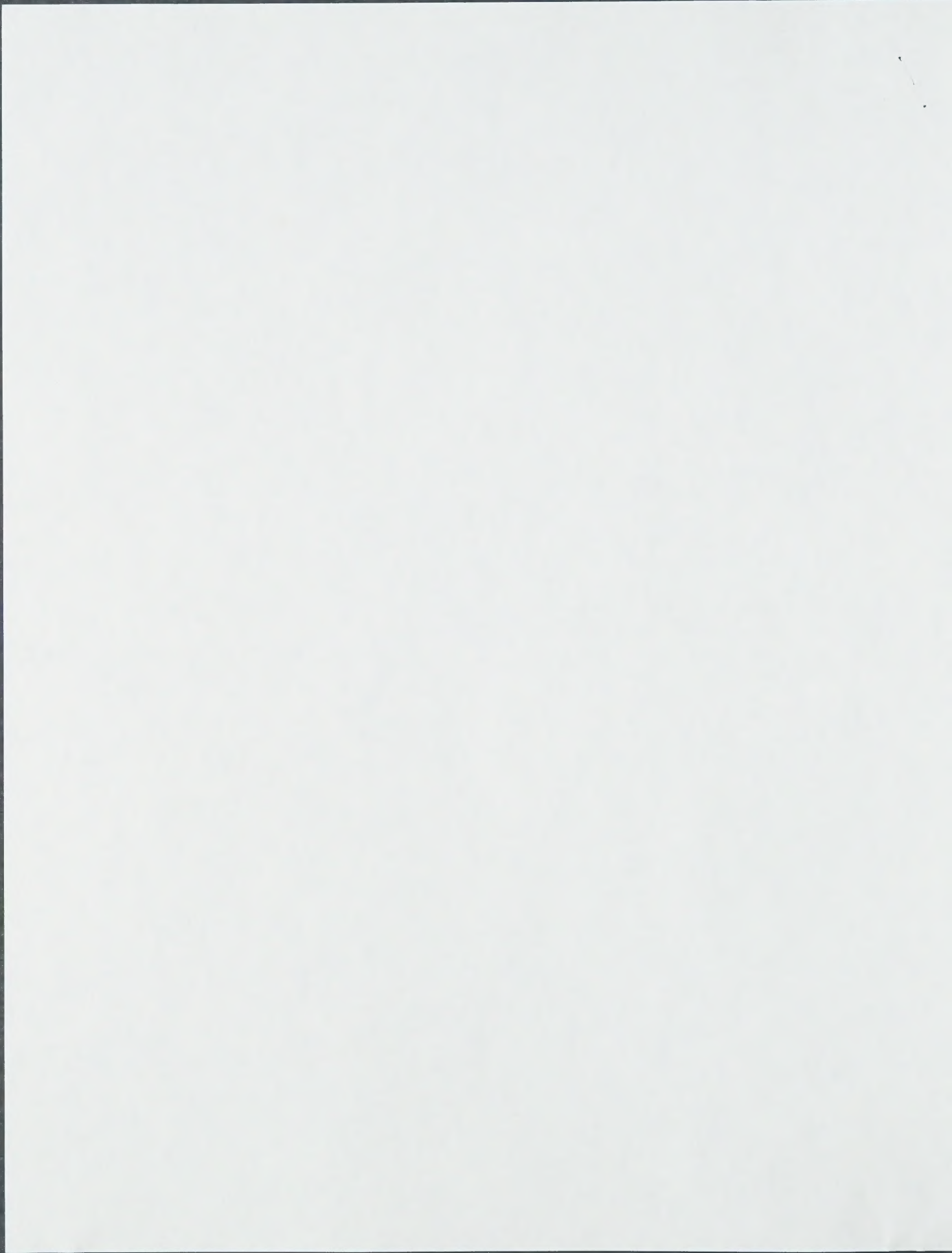

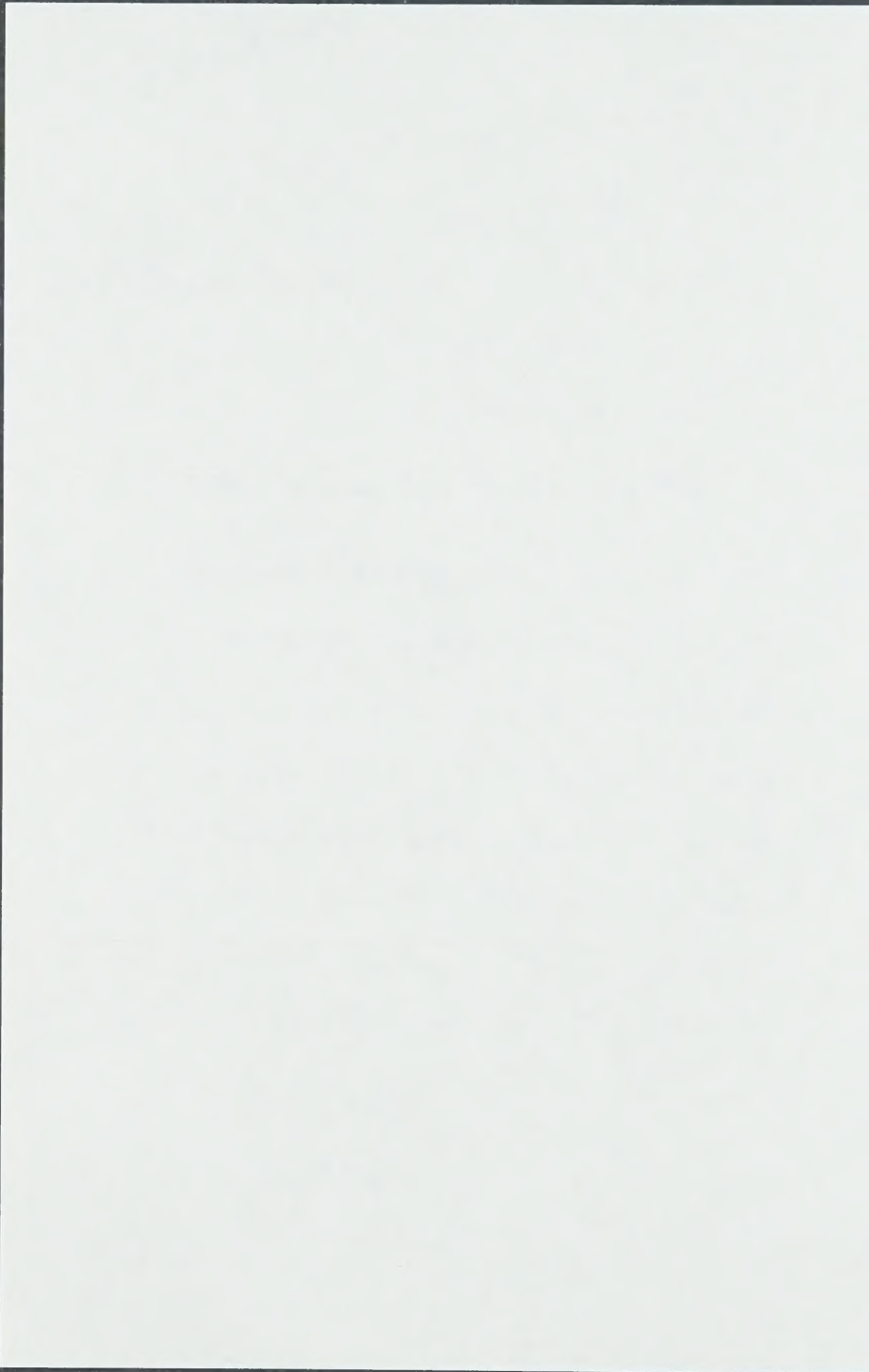

As I promised, I am writing to propose to you the details of our understanding about the Isabel and Alfred Bader Student Travel Fund which you have generously endowed. There are two parts to this understanding, the public, which is represented by the notice in our Announcement of Courses and the private or file agreement, that will guide our use of the fund. We propose:

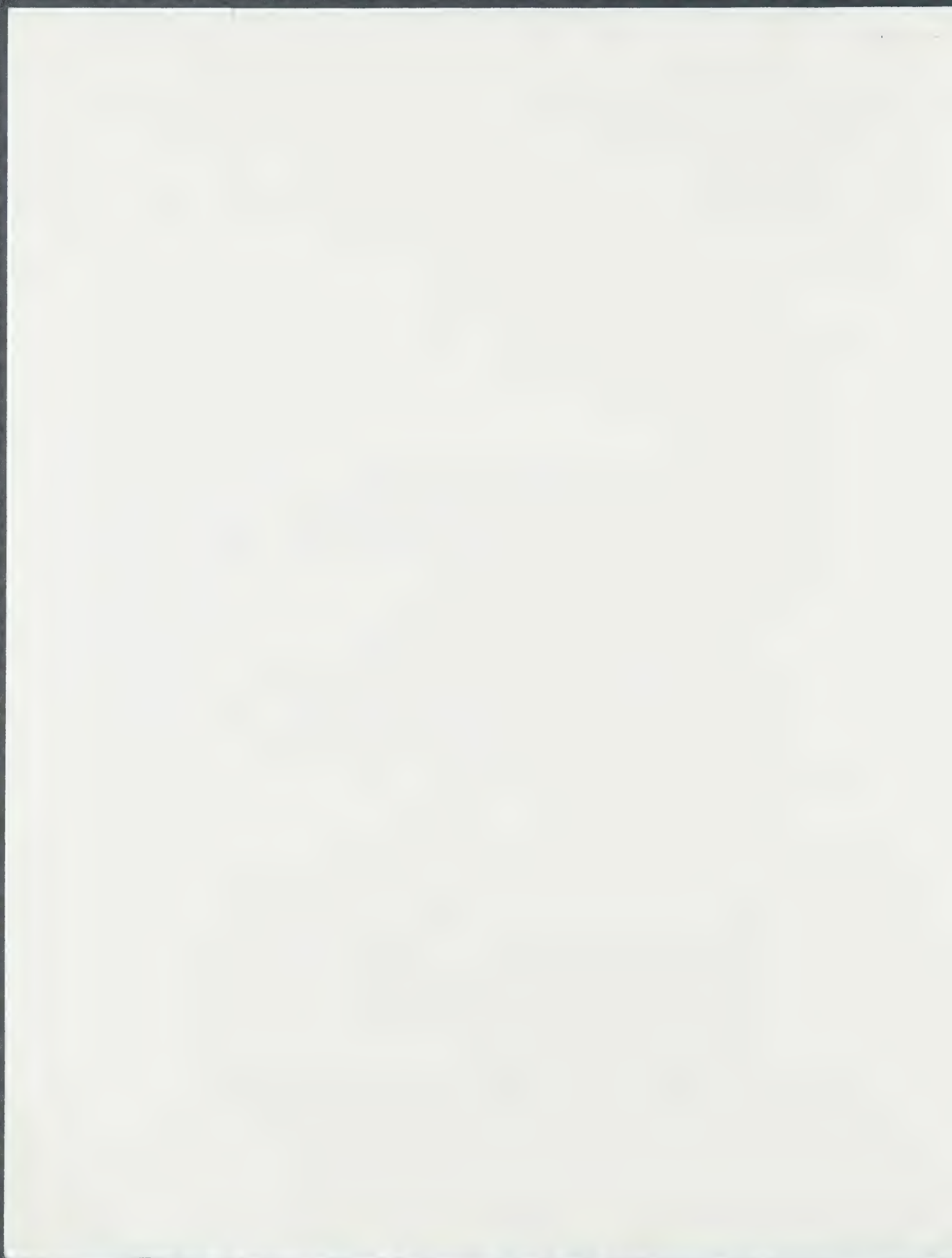
Statement for Announcement of Courses.

The Isabel and Alfred Bader Student Travel Fund has been established to support limited travel by students, who could not otherwise afford to do so, to avail themselves of special opportunities related to their work. Application for such support may be made to the Academic Office at any time.

Agreement on Use.

The income from the endowment provided by Dr. Alfred Bader in February 1986 is intended to support travel by students to make use of special opportunities, such as exhibitions, conferences, and the like, related and beneficial to their work. In awarding funds from the Isabel and Alfred Bader Student Travel Fund, the Institute will, to the best of its ability, assure itself that the student in question has no other means available for such travel.

Income from this endowment shall be applied, if possible, to that purpose; income in excess of the amount awarded in any year shall, at the dis-


cretion of the Director of the Institute, be carried forward to the next fiscal year or added to principal. If the endowment should thus reach \$100,000 or such larger figure as, in the determination of the Director of the Institute, is greater than is consistent with satisfying the primary purpose of the endowment, income from the endowment shall be used in support of other needs of excellent students whose means are insufficient to proper pursuit of their work.

If you agree with these two statements, you could indicate that fact by returning the enclosed copy of this letter for our files. If, on the other hand, I have misunderstood your wishes, please let me know, and I shall revise the statements.

This is yet another marvelous addition to the Institute's ability to help our students provide themselves with the best possible training in the history of art. We are all profoundly grateful.

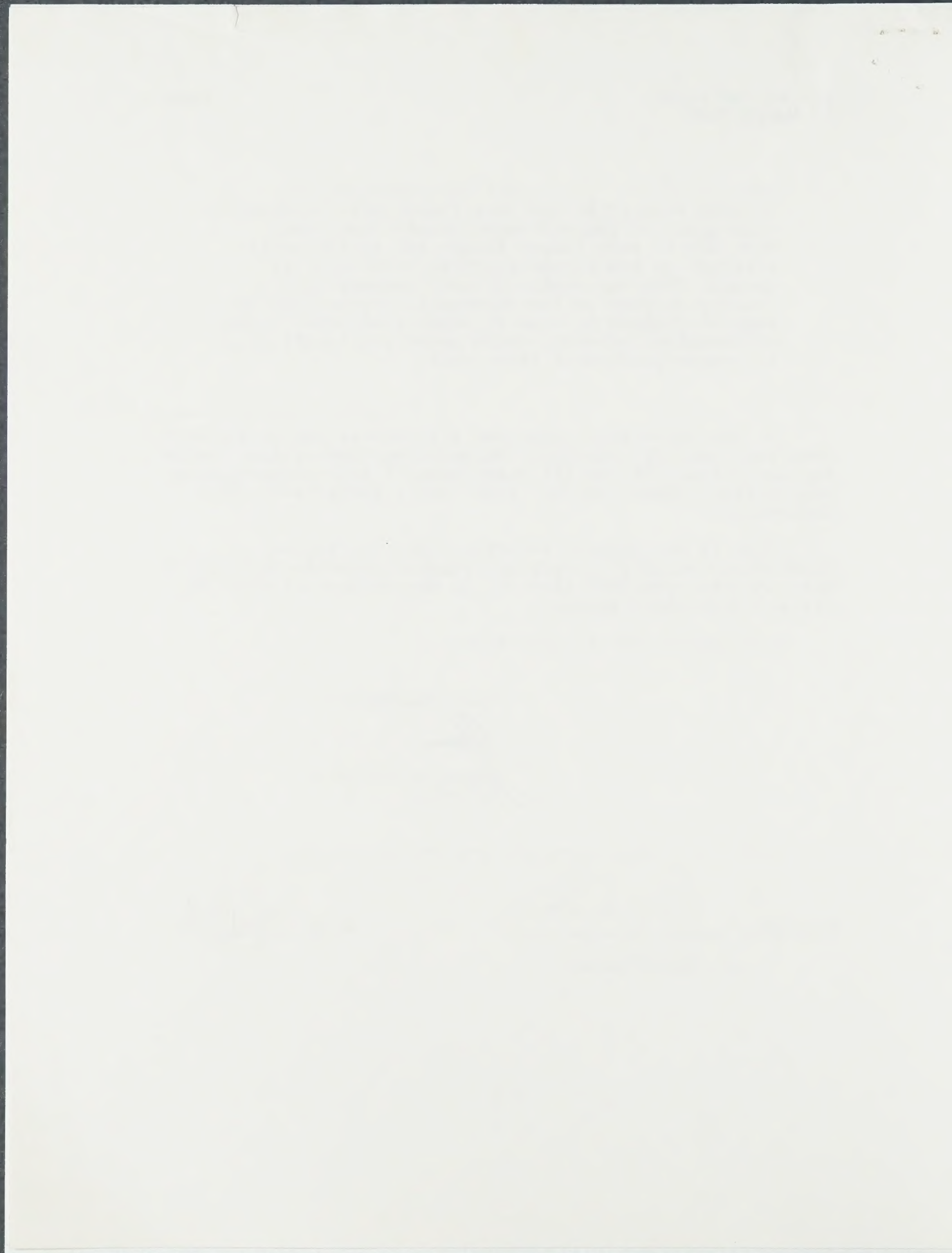

I am pleased to invite you, on behalf of the Faculty of the Institute of Fine Arts, New York University, to join us as a Visiting Fellow.


