
I think that you could help him a good deal if you would allow him to look at your Torrentius in Schipluiden.



I am sorry that I have been so very long in writing to you about your three paintings which I was considering; photographs returned.

The easiest not to worry about is The Ascension, which I believe is an 18th century work of Dietrich after the Cuyp in Dordrecht.

The large <u>Circumcision</u> is very interesting iconographically, but I am convinced that it is neither by Bramer nor de Poorter, but rather by a follower of Bramer.

The most interesting of all is the <u>Waterfall</u>, where I was hoping that it might be by Everdingen. Prof. Seymour Slive has now written to me and I enclose copy of his letter. However, he doesn't think it is by Everdingen, but rather by an anonymous follower of Ruisdael.


I understand your asking HFL 15,000 in the hope that the artist could be identified. I think that I could sell the painting eventually as an attractive decorative work, but not based on HFL 15,000. If you would like to sell it to me for HFL 12,000, please do ship it with the portrait of the  $\underline{\text{Girl}}$ , and I will send you my check, in guilders, by return mail. Of course, I would understand your saying that this is not reasonable and keeping the painting.

Could you please make shipment of the portrait as agreed, with your arranging for the packing and prepaying the airfreight to Milwaukee and then billing me for the airfreight, which I will pay for by return. Instructions for the shipment are enclosed.
