As your probably know, Lee Howard has sold his condominium, and because of his allergic problems does not plan to return to Florida.



- (1) All the prints, other than the Duerer You will talk to your dealer friend in Baltimore, Conrad Graeber, and inquire whether he would take my prints on the same arrangement that you have. If he is willing, please do send them to him and send me his name, address and telephone and fax numbers.
- (2) You agreed to purchase the Duerer print for \$450 net.
- (3) At your convenience and in no hurry at all, you will pack the paintings, drawings and watercolors and send them to me here in Milwaukee by UPS.

There is no hurry about the shipment here, but if you should get it ready before I return on July 26th, please just let Cheryl Weiss in my office know.

Above all and most importantly, just get better.

Dear Alfred,

I had already finished the Peletier list when your fax arrived. Apart from the "Retameuse", there are only minor price divergences. My prices will be influenced by the quality of impression and the condition of the prints, but that won't make a lot of difference, probably some up, some down.

Although "Retameuse" may be the finest impression available in that print, it would still not account for the difference in price between the \$700 to \$900 other dealers are asking and Professor Peletier's notion of its value. The only thing that could make that sort of difference would be if it is signed, or if it is an unlisted state. I shall have to look at it.

There is an annual "Lawrence's Guide to Print Dealer Prices", and it lists Retameuse last year, a trial proof, for \$899. No listings this year. Drouet has three listings this year - \$850, \$1,485 and \$1,500. Print dealer friend of mine, Conrad Graeber, has one in stock at the moment for \$1,200.

- 2. Frances Tavernier It might be worthwhile to check the sale referred to. It is a good drawing, but I don't know by whom. Would a suggested price of \$800 seem reasonable?
- 3. That drawing of nine faces is by a well-known Belgian artist, J. B. Madou (1796-1877). May I suggest a price of \$300?

All of the other prices look very fair, with the possible exception of No. 13. I have shown this only to one expert, Christopher Brown, the Chief Curator of the National Gallery in London, who thought it very nice, French, 18th century, probably for a book on how to draw.


I am glad that you like No. 1, but you might find that at your new suggested price of \$900 for the pair it might be difficult to sell.

Printmaking has historically been a medium through which artists have expressed social, economical and political outrage. Not since Daumier, however, has any single artist made such an impact as did Hugo Gellert in his 1930s lithographs of the plight of the working man in American society. The art of Emil Bisttram is an extension of his philosophy and spiritualism. As a young man he was deeply influenced by the teachings of Jay Hambridge and Nicholas Roerich, the Russian mystical philosopher and painter. In 1931 with a Guggenhein fellowship he studied mural painting with Diego Riviera, then settled in Taos, New Mexico where one of his first commissions was to paint murals in the Taos courthouse, funded by TRAP.

Bisttram opened an art school, taught the theory of Dynamic Symmetry and co-founded, with Raymond Jonson, the Transcendential Painting Group. Bisttram's early paintings were representational and clearly showed the influences of such diverse artists as Riviera and Picasso, but with time his work became more abstract and increasingly reflected his philosphical and spiritual thinking. See Walt Wiggins "The Transcendental Art of Emil Bisttram". #102 below is illustrated on page 87.

#### Ursula Fookes, fl. 1929-1939.

The Grosvenor School of Modern Art has become synonymous with the Bithsh cool or lineout innovement of the thirles Claude Flight had written several books on the subject and was an entitusiastic advocate of the art form, believing it to be the Ideal vehicle to design the properties of the Control of the C

We don't have any information about the early years of Ursula Fookes, or even know for how long she attended the Grosvenor School, but her images speak for themselves in her hands, the rather simple techniques of the lincout are used to create works that combine sophisticated simplification of form, with the dynamism that is unmitiatably "Grosvenor School"

Fookes seems to have planned editions of between 25 and 50, although 18 not known whether the full editions were ever printed. She preferred to print her works on alganese mulbern tissue, but did also use several different types of tirm wove. Just as she varied the pager within an edition, she also changed her color combinations so frequently that it is hard to find two of her prints printed in the exact same tones and the prints printed in the exact same tones and color Most of the second section of the prints printed in the exact same tones and color though the prints printed in the exact same tones are section.

All of the prints on this list are signed (except where noted) within the image, although here again there are variations. Some prints were signed verso, whether deliberately or not we don't know. Some of the prints are trimmed to the edge of the image, others are as printed, with the usual paint smeared marrins, sometimes with annotations regarding the color pigments.

Few of the linocuts of Ursula Fookes have been seen, or offered, for many decades. We are delighted to be able to present this selection.
