Dear Dr. Vitali:



Daer Dr. Ebert-Schifferer:

Thank you for your letter of March 14 regarding the possibility of my loaning my painting by Guidobono of <u>Tobias Leaving his Blind Father</u>. I have been so slow in replying because the <u>letter</u> was addressed to the Milwaukee Art Museum and arrived while I was abroad.

I will be happy to loan the painting under the usual conditions of your museum covering the costs of packing and insurance. I have found it best to ask a professional, Mr. Larry Stadler at the Milwaukee Art Museum, to look after the packing. For instance, some three years ago Dr. Christopher Brown of the National Gallery of London asked me to loan 15 paintings for his exhibition of Rembrandt and the Bible, which was held in Japan. Mr. Stadler packed all of these paintings, and I was very happy to note that each one returned to Milwaukee completely unscathed.

Thus, if you decide that you would like the painting, please instruct Mr. Stadler to pick up and ship it.


Following your request, I had my conservator look at the painting carefully. It is oil on canvas and hence shipment would not be too hazardous, and the conservator assured me that it is in stable condition.

I trust that if my painting does go to your museum you will in time supply me with a catalog.

> KUNST IN DER REPUBLIK GENUA ART IN THE GENOESE REPUBLIC 1528 - 1815 Schirn Kunsthalle Frankfurt August - October 1992

Dear Mr. Bader,

for late summer/autumn of 1992, five hundred years after Columbus discovered America, the Schirn Kunsthalle is preparing an exhibition on Genoese art, based on a project by Mary Newcome-Schleier who is the main scientific curator of the show. This Genoese exhibition will thus be part of our series promoting knowledge and research on specific Italian art periods, a programme which we started by "Guido Reni and Europe" in winter 88/89, followed by "G.G. Savoldo and the North Italian Renaissance between Lombardy and Venice" this summer (organized together with Brescia) and in which an important Guercino exhibition in late autumn 1991 will precede the Genoese project.

The exhibition will have nine period sections which will include mainly painting, sculpture, but also outstanding items of decorative arts like tapestry, ceramics, furniture, silver and textiles. In order not to overload the exhibition, we have tried to choose only few, but highest-quality pieces of every artist, items that for this reason cannot simply be replaced by any other of the same hand. The exhibition will, of course, be accompanied by a scholarly catalogue to which, for instance, Michael Jaffé and Prof. Rudolf Preimesberger (who is curator of the sculpture section) have already agreed to contribute.
