

I feel very badly about not having written subsequent to my stay with you after the New York sale. I very much enjoyed spending a couple of days with you and Isabel at home in Milwaukee, and in particular having the time to talk to both of you at leisure. It was also a great pleasure to renew my acquaintance with your pictures. I am not sure that my list of the three that I like the most would remain constant, for one thing, one's feeling about pictures changes the better one knows them.

It was, above all, very kind of you to have had me to stay, and to have looked after me so very well. Thank you very much.

So much has happened since we saw each other. We are of course very sad about Dede's departure, and over here, I am particularly so, since she was very loyal and supportive of me throughout the *Despatches* fiasco, now (but only recently) officially laid to rest, thank goodness. Nonetheless, it must be said that the whole business has not affected us much here, despite the malign press coverage. It does not seem to have affected consignors, and very few even ask about it. We are in the middle of putting together a really outstanding sale for July, and we are all having to work harder than ever just in order to get round to all the people who want to consign, and to look at their pictures. I got a lovely Rubens oil sketch yesterday in Brussels, bought at the Von Hirsch sale.

The Lambert Doomer coming up in Amsterdam in early May has had its attribution confirmed by Werner Sumowski, who was so kind as to dub it an important discovery (if that is possible with such an artist). I will send you a photograph.



Let me know if you have any other really great northern paintings coming up in your next sale.



Your fax of today made my day, and I am booking flights for Isabel and myself to come to your Amsterdam sale in November.

Actually, there was no problem picking up the two paintings (you knocked down to me in Amsterdam) in London and paying for them in sterling. But then, months later I inquired why there had not been a VAT refund which was due because I had taken both paintings by hand from Gatwick to Milwaukee and had sent the appropriate paperwork to your London office.

Then finally I did receive a sterling check for £ 166.48, but drawn on your Amsterdam Bank. Believe it or not, the Royal Bank of Scotland charged me £ 38.81 to cash that check.

Of course, that can easily be avoided altogether by my simply charging the VAT due me to my quarterly VAT return. The British government pays quite promptly, and in a sterling check which costs nothing to deposit in my business account.



I am delighted that the dog is in your Spanish kennel. I just hope that they will figure out what breed it is.

Ben Hall will spend tomorrow here to look at my collection and the gallery and to appraise one of my paintings. Of course I look forward to getting to know another Sotheby's expert.



Deer Ayrel,

I very much enjoyed staying with you and Isobel in Milwaukee again last month, and it was most kind of you to have accommodated me when you had so much to do on the eve of your departure.

The small sculpture of which I took a photograph has little to do with Riemenschneider, and is probably Netherlandish, 16th Century, rather than German. My colleagues think it would bring about £1,500 to £2,000. I enclose a spare set of my photographs of the Cumaean Sibyl that I took in your office. I have not yet had a chance to discuss the picture with Christopher Brown, but I will do so in due course.

I did discuss the little Van Goyen drawing with Greg Rubinstein. Although, as you know, I like it very much, neither of us feel that at a reserve of 20,000 we would stand a realistic chance of selling it, and I do not believe we can go higher than £15,000-20,000, with a reserve at the lower figure.

Do you mind if I send a transparency of *The Curtain* to Andrea Emiliani? I think the picture must be Bolognese, or at any rate by a Bolognese painter, and he is a good and reliable connoisseur in this field. I am having your good transparency duplicated.

I am sure that you are aware that last Autunin Sotheby's put in place a more formal tructure for vendor commission rates. 
You treated me so carefully in the handling of the details of my paying for Lot 11 in your July 3rd sale that I hope you will not mind that I would like to ask you for your help in two other matters, which are much smaller in the amount of money involved.

I am grateful to you for explaining why you have acted as you did. I understand your reasons for not wishing to buy the painting. The reason why I am upset at what has happened is because you made it clear, when we saw each other in New York, that your offer of £300,000 remained opened, and I distinctly remember telling you when I was next going to be in touch with the owner. I remember saying that "I would see him on the last day of this month", and that "I would be unlikely to be able to reach him sooner". You told me that you were still keen to buy the picture and, although you did not formally increase your offer, you asked me to "do the best you can". Had either you or Otto let me know right up until 31 January that you had changed your mind, I would have been able to withdraw gracefully.

Regarding your third reason for not purchasing the picture, I know Robert Noortman has not been offered this picture either by me or by anyone else. Bruno Meissner, who sold the painting to the collector who owns it, has tried to buy it from the owner but was firmly rebuffed. I would have thought that this picture was far more suitable for a museum than for a European collector of "traditional Dutch Old Masters", and it is my view that you and Otto are far more likely to reach the right market for this picture than any one else, including myself.


Dear George:

We clearly hurt each other in our phone conversation yesterday when you called from Cologne, and so I think it important that I explain in writing why Otto and I acted as we did.

During the auction in New York on January 11th, I reiterated our offer of £300,000 all included.

Last weekend, you called me at home and told me that we could have the painting for £310,000 all in and that <u>that price was non-negotiable</u>. I had never offered £310,000, but I promised to discuss this with Otto and be back to you. On Tuesday, I faxed our decision to decline the offer. This we did for three reasons:

- 1) We have purchased a good deal recently.
- 2) As you have admitted to both of us, this is a price range that would fail at auction, and since we have had such a long time to consider the value of this painting during these protracted negotiations, we concluded that indeed it is very high, perhaps more than the painting is worth.
- 3) We understand that Robert Noortman has passed on the picture due to its high price. We were previously unaware that any art dealer had been offered the painting. We know that Sotheby's did not make the offer, but the effect is the same.


The most important factor to consider here is that I neither offered nor accepted £310,000. Since you presented me with a non-negotiable "take it or leave it" price, I decided to pass.



I am grateful to you for explaining why you have acted as you did. I understand your reasons for not wishing to buy the painting. The reason why I am upset at what has happened is because you made it clear, when we saw each other in New York, that your offer of £300,000 remained opened, and I distinctly remember telling you when I was next going to be in touch with the owner. I remember saying that "I would see him on the last day of this month", and that "I would be unlikely to be able to reach him sooner". You told me that you were still keen to buy the picture and, although you did not formally increase your offer, you asked me to "do the best you can". Had either you or Otto let me know right up until 31 January that you had changed your mind, I would have been able to withdraw gracefully.

Regarding your third reason for not purchasing the picture, I know Robert Noortman has not been offered this picture either by me or by anyone else. Bruno Meissner, who sold the painting to the collector who owns it, has tried to buy it from the owner but was firmly rebuffed. I would have thought that this picture was far more suitable for a museum than for a European collector of "traditional Dutch Old Masters", and it is my view that you and Otto are far more likely to reach the right market for this picture than any one else, including myself.

Dr. Bader has asked me to respond to your fax dated April 6 regarding the R.F. Burton-Abeokuta ... London ...1863 in 2 vols. I am also under the impression that the folding map was never present, whether by design or accident it is difficult to know.

This is, however, clearly the "remainder" copy which Penzer refers to on p.71 which was very rare in his experience as he says "which I did not think existed." He also speaks about Burton's portrait being omitted in the red-brown cloth issue, etc. and the care with which plates could be removed and (their positions?) altered. Judging from the very slight variation in the bindings on Vols. 1 and 2 in the set you describe, there may exist variants of this remainder issue, including one without map.

It is interesting to note the green cloth 1st issue, all edges uncut, is described by Penzer as 5-1/4" X 8-1/4" and the red-brown cloth remainder issue as 5" X 8", indicating some trimming perhaps. Of course, I can only speculate in the absence at present of any bibliographical information beyond Penzer, and I realize speculation is not useful in an auction catalogue.







I am so sorry not to have replied to your letter of March 17th, which, as you surmised, arrived when I was away but which I have now found. I regret that my secretary has left, which has exascerbated further my normal chaotic, mental state.

The large Italian family portrait remains a puzzle. There is a possibility of a private sale but, at the moment, the owners do not know what they want to do with the painting.

It is slightly irritating for us that the Luton Hoo sale takes place in May, but the Old Master paintings are very small and, apart from the Hobbema, the only significant painting in the sale, which contains very good furniture, porcelain, etc., neither John Somerville nor I were particularly enthusiastic about the Hobbema and this is why it has a relatively low estimate. Many people have told us that this estimate is low but I am not convinced of this. The problem is, as is often the case, with the sky. Hobbema used a very dark ground for his pictures and when they become thin, as this picture has in the sky, their appearance changes considerably and restoration is far from simple. The lower parts of the picture are much better.


There are no Rembrandt school pictures in the sale, although there is a painting, formerly called Rembrandt, which everyone agrees is much later. Apart from the Hobberna, the ony Old Master painting of consequence is the large Roman flower still life. The catalogue is not out yet but I will send one as soon as it is.






Thank you so much for your letter. I shall ensure that you are not charged the £90 for illustration of the book. I was a little surprised at two things in your letter. Firstly, although I do agree it could be extremely difficult to buy the Georges de la Tour, I cannot imagine that it would be difficult to sell. I would love to have the opportunity to sell it on the open market !

Secondly, I cannot agree that the Hobbema is too highly priced at £2 million. It is considerably better than the previous Hobbema to appear on the market which made $\pounds 1.6$ million. Martin Zimet also told me that he has a Hobbema which he says is even better, but since he seems unwilling to show it to anyone it is rather difficult to tell if this is the case. It seems to me that the British Rail picture stands up very well with comparison to other great Hobbema such as the picture in the Frick.

I very much look forward to seeing you in December and January and shall make an effort to find the time to come to Milwaukee.





As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of £500-700 confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing. Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of £1,500-2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between £4,000–6,000.

Finally, we have rescued your raincoat and if you do want to come in tomorrow you can pick it up then. Looking out of the window it occurs to me that you will probably need a replacement before then!







As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of £500-700 confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing. Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of £1,500-2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between £4,000–6,000.

Finally, we have rescued your raincoat and if you do want to come in tomorrow you can pick it up then. Looking out of the window it occurs to me that you will probably need a replacement before then!

When George Gordon, you old master expert, visits me in Milwaukee next, I will introduce him to Michael and suggest that George look at some of Michael's books.







As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of £500-700 confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing. Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of £1,500-2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is "agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between £4,000-6,000.



I find the painting, photograph enclosed, truly enchanting. Now cleaned, it is clear that it is in very good condition, the only abrasions around the edges where frames hit against the canvas.

In your catalog the painting was attributed to Sweerts, which surely isn't right. One of the ablest dealers I know, Neville Orgel, suggested that it is by Lievens from his Antwerp period, but I haven't seen any Lievens quite like this work. Perhaps the closest suggestion is Jacob van Oost. Comparing it with that beautiful single figure in the National Gallery in London, there are similarities, but the paint handling in London is tighter. What do you think?


More important, just what is the subject? Isabel believes that the beret on the figure in the back must indicate that this is a young man. Could it possibly be an allegory of old age, with that wonderfully painted, pensive old man thinking back to his youth?

I am writing to you with regard to the view of Venice, a photograph of which you left with me recently.

I am afraid that, so far, we have drawn a blank and cannot find an artist called 'Olivier' who could have painted it. The picture seems to date from the early 19th century, probably before 1840, and clearly has some quality, especially in the architectural details. It also has a distinctly Germanic feel about it. It could also be Austrian; the colouring is reminiscent of artists in the circle of Carlo Grubacs, but the technique looks more sophisticated.

In conclusion, the artist remains a mystery, but perhaps with more time we can pin it down. As a decorative work by an unknown hand the painting would have a value of say £7-10,000 but, of course, if we can come up with a firm attribution I think the estimate could be revised upwards. If I may, I will keep the photograph and do some further research when I am next in Berlin.

I hope that this information, scant though it is, will be of some help to you, and I hope to be in touch again in the near future.
