The reason why I am upset at what has happened is because you made it clear, when we saw each other in New York, that your offer of $£ 300,000$ remained opened, and I distinctly remember telling you when I was next going to be in touch with the owner. I remember saying that "I would see him on the last day of this month", and that "I would be unlikely to be able to reach him sooner". You told me that you were still keen to buy the picture and, although you did not formally increase your offer, you asked me to "do the best you can". Had either you or Otto let me know right up until 31 January that you had changed your mind, I would have been able to withdraw gracefully.

Regarding your third reason for not purchasing the picture, I know Robert Noortman has not been offered this picture either by me or by anyone else. Dr. Bader has asked me to respond to your fax dated April 6 regarding the R.F. BurtonAbeokuta ... London .. 1863 in 2 vols. I am also under the impression that the folding map was never present, whether by design or accident it is difficult to know.

This is, however, clearly the "remainder" copy which Penzer refers to on p .71 which was very rare in his experience as he says "which I did not think existed." He also speaks about Burton's portrait being omitted in the red-brown cloth issue, etc. and the care with which plates could be removed and (their positions?) altered. Judging from the very slight variation in the bindings on Vols. 1 and 2 in the set you describe, there may exist variants of this remainder issue, including one without map.

It is interesting to note the green cloth 1st issue, all edges uncut, is described by Penzer as 5\(1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}\) and the red-brown cloth remainder issue as \(5^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{X} 88^{\prime \prime}\), indicating some trimming perhaps. Of course, I can only speculate in the absence at present of any bibliographical information beyond Penzer, and I realize speculation is not useful in an auction catalogue.

Finally, the revised estimate \(£ 500-600\) and reserve of \(£ 400\) is accepted.

I am so sorry not to have replied to your letter of March 17th, which, as you surmised, arrived when I was away but which I have now found. I regret that my secretary has left, which has exascerbated further my normal chaotic, mental state.

The large Italian family portrait remains a puzzle. There is a possibility of a private sale but, at the moment, the owners do not know what they want to do with the painting.

It is slightly irritating for us that the Luton Hoo sale takes place in May, but the Old Master paintings are very small and, apart from the Hobbema, the only significant painting in the sale, which contains very good fumiture, porcelain, etc., neither John Somerville nor I were particularly enthusiastic about the Hobbema and this is why it has a relatively low estimate. Many people have told us that this estimate is low but I am not convinced of this. The problem is, as is often the case, with the sky, Hobbema used a very dark ground for his pictures and when they become thin, as this picture has in the sky, their appearance changes considerably and restoration is far from simple. The lower parts of the picture are much better.

There are no Rembrandt school pictures in the sale, although there is a painting, formerly called Rembrandt, which everyone agrees is much later. Apart from the Hobbema, the on Old Master painting of consequence is the large Roman flower still life. The catalogue is not out yet but I will send one as soon as it is.

Martin Zimet also told me that he has a Hobbema which he says is even better, but since he seems unwilling to show it to anyone it is rather difficult to tell if this is the case. It seems to me that the British Rail picture stands up very well with comparison to other great Hobbemas such as the picture in the Frick.

As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of \(£ 500-700\) confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing.
Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of \(£ 1,500-\) 2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between \(£ 4,000-6,000\).

Finally, we have rescued your raincoat and if you do want to come in tomorrow you can pick it up then. Looking out of the window it occurs to me that you will probably need a replacement before then!

As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of $£ 500-700$ confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing.
Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of $£ 1,500-$ 2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between $£ 4,000-6,000$.

Finally, we have rescued your raincoat and if you do want to come in tomorrow you can pick it up then. Looking out of the window it occurs to me that you will probably need a replacement before then!

As promised, herewith my fax to keep you up-to-date with the situation regarding them various items that we discussed on your recent visit here.

Firstly, the books. I have now received reports from the relevant.departments concerning both items. The 'Illustrated Madeira' by Pickens has had its preliminary estimate of $£ 500-700$ confirmed. A formal report on this is being sent to you under separate cover, although I appreciate these figures are somewhat disappointing. Secondly, the collection of Reynolds material. I have been given an estimate of $£ 1,500$ 2,000 by the expert in question. Perhaps you could let me know if you feel that this is agreeable, and I can then arrange for a report to be sent to you in due course. The sale date for the Pickens will be 8 and 9 December, and that for the Reynolds will be Spring 1995, when our Book Department will be selling a significant art reference library to coincide with our Spring 1995 sale of Old Master Paintings.

Our Impressionists and Modern Department have also scrutinized the photograph of the nude study that you left with me. They can, unsurprisingly, confirm that this is Austrian, but I am afraid that they could not identify the monogram. They would prefer to have an opportunity to study the original before placing a potential value on the drawing. Lastly, I have also received correspondence from Paris, where they have been studying your picture of the Nativity. Again, unfortunately, they cannot identify the artist, although they confirm that they too believe it to be French and executed at the very end of the eighteenth century. They are continuing to look into this, but for the moment have suggested a rather tentative figure of between $£ 4,000-6,000$.

Finally, we have rescued your raincoat and if you do want to come in tomorrow you can pick it up then. Looking out of the window it occurs to me that you will probably need a replacement before then!

In your catalog the painting was attributed to Sweerts, which surely isn't right. One of the ablest dealers I know, Neville Orgel, suggested that it is by Lievens from his Antwerp period, but I haven't seen any Lievens quite like this work. Perhaps the closest suggestion is Jacob van Oost. Comparing it with that beautiful single figure in the National Gallery in London, there are similarities, but the paint handling in London is tighter. What do you think?

More important, just what is the subject? Isabel believes that the beret on the figure in the back must indicate that this is a young man. Could it possibly be an allegory of old age, with that wonderfully painted, pensive old man thinking back to his youth?

I am writing to you with regard to the view of Venice, a photograph of which you left with me recently.

I am afraid that, so far, we have drawn a blank and cannot find an artist called 'Olivier' who could have painted it. The picture seems to date from the early 19th century, probably before 1840, and clearly has some quality, especially in the architectural details. It also has a distinctly Germanic feel about it. It could also be Austrian; the colouring is reminiscent of artists in the circle of Carlo Grubacs, but the technique looks more sophisticated.

In conclusion, the artist remains a mystery, but perhaps with more time we can pin it down. As a decorative work by an unknown hand the painting would have a value of say £7-10,000 but, of course, if we can come up with a firm attribution \(I\) think the estimate could be revised upwards. If I may, I will keep the photograph and do some further research when \(I\) am next in Berlin.

I hope that this information, scant though it is, will be of some help to you, and I hope to be in touch again in the near future.
