Your letter of January 6th reminded me of our pleasant meeting at Cambridge in December.





Dear Alfred

We are writing to you in the hope that as a valued and influential friend of this department you may be able to help and advise us with regard to our plans for the future of the University Chemical Laboratory. As you know, our building is not only in need of refurbishment, but is no longer big enough for our current and further needs. The Government is not making available funds for the maintenance of standards of infrastructure, and therefore we must turn to self-help.

One of us (DHW) has agreed to chair a fund-raising committee, and SVL is a member of the committee. RAR will provide guidance from time to time. The planned improvements include the addition of a Library and Information Technology Centre, and the building of a new wing. The sums involved are of the order of tens of millions of pounds. The nuts and bolts of this endeavour will of course be handled internally, but the academics on the Appeal Committee (David King, Steve Ley, Brian Johnson, Chris Abell and Dudley Williams) have decided that we should appoint a distinguished Advisory Board to advise from time to time.

The function of the Advisory Board would be to meet, probably no more than once a year over dinner (with a semi-formal meeting to precede the dinner), in order to give general guidance on aspects of the appeal. The Vice Chancellor Elect of Cambridge University, Professor Alec Broers, will be joining it, as will a former Vice Chancellor, Lord Butterfield.

If you are also able to join us in this important function as a member of the Advisory Board, we would be delighted. We feel it is crucial to have advice stemming from your knowledge of chemistry and chemists in both the U.S. and Europe. In addition, we will be issuing two further invitations in the U.K., one in Europe, and one more in the U.S. We should add that the first meeting is unlikely to occur until around 9 to 12 months from now, but we wish to get the Advisory Board in place as soon as possible.
