
I would appreciate it if you or Ms. Szydel will let me know late next spring how many Project Seed One students were actually placed.







Isabel and I spent most of the last three months in Europe, hence my long silence.


I heard just before we left in May that you had not been well, and I hope that you have fully recovered.

Dear Dr. Bader:

The Chemistry Department looks forward to strengthening our relationship with you by having you visit again next year. Students always enjoy hearing about the origins and development of Aldrich Chemical, and now that story can be reinforced by your new book. Dr. Michael Schuder will be making arrangements with you later in the summer.

The department has been very active and productive this year. Our students have presented nine papers on their research at state and national ACS meetings. They have also formed teams to present chemical demonstration "Magic Shows" to over 1400 young people at Discovery World and local elementary schools. We are proud of their accomplishments as they receive fellowships and teaching assistantships to top graduate programs.

One of our challenges as faculty is to continue to provide an atmosphere in which these talented young people can develop. That requires modern instrumentation. Acquisition of a Fourier Transform Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (FT-NMR) Spectrometer is needed to be able to determine the structure of organic molecules. It is the final instrument in our 1990-95 five year plan. While the NSF has funded half of this instrument and given our proposal glowing reviews, we are looking for the matching funds to complete this project. I am attaching a copy of the fund raising letter that was sent to our chemistry alumni.


We are asking you to consider a gift of \$5,000 toward this very important acquisition. While you once told me that you support "people, not things", I am sure that you recognize that people must have some necessary things in order to be productive. For us, the FT-NMR falls into that category and keeps us competitive with the best liberal arts colleges in the state.


As per our discussion, \$1000 will be provided for each of the next three years. At the end of this three year period it is your intent to provide an endowment that would continue this award into the future.

Isabel and Alfred Bader Chemistry Award

The Isabel and Alfred Bader Chemistry Award will be given annually to an outstanding Carroll College freshman majoring in chemistry. Prospective students who meet the following selection criteria will be eligible for the Award:

- Graduate from one of following Milwaukee Public Schools: Alexander Hamilton High School, Custer High School, Milwaukee Trade and Technical School, Pulaski High School, Riverside University High School, Rufus King High School, South Division High School or North Division High School. Strong preference will be given to students who are African American, Hispanic or Native-American.
- Demonstrate significant academic potential as indicated by high school class rank and college entrance examination scores. Only those students who predict a firstyear cumulative grade point average at Carroll College of 2.50 or better will be eligible for this Award.

In the event that multiple candidates for the Bader Award are identified, selection of the recipient will be determined by the chairperson of Carroll's Department of Chemistry in collaboration with the Office of Admission. The \$1,000 non-renewable Award will be administered through Carroll College's Office of Student Financial Services.

The Isabel and Alfred Bader Chemistry Award will be presented for the first time to a freshman chemistry student enrolling at the College in the fall of 1993.

Thank you for your note of April 29, 1994 indicating that you had been able to join us at Carroll College for the Scholarship Luncheon. I am glad that you were also able to meet Eric Glad, the first recipient of the *Isabel and Ålfred Bader Chemistry Award*. He is a very hard-working and pleasant student, though a bit on the quiet side. He is not, however, as you have noted, an ethnic minority. Why then, was he selected?

As the freshmen students with declared chemistry majors were being reviewed last year during the selection of the first awardee, strong preference was given to those students who were African American, Hispanic, or Native-American. However, there were none who would have met the goal of demonstrating "significant academic potential." Thus, we felt it was most important for this first selection to have a student who had a high potential for continuing in and likely finishing the chemistry major at Carroll. Eric, we felt, had this potential and met the other criterion of having graduated from one of the designated Milwaukee public schools.

We were personally disappointed, as I am sure you and Isabel were, to not have the opportunity to meet all the desired goals of this award. Be assured that if we are to have the opportunity to select a second award winner, we will again make every attempt to match all desired criteria. However, as with many smaller schools, that is not always possible, especially with a program as challenging as chemistry.
