Reorganization Key To Sigma-Aldrich Growth Strategy

I presume your attention was brought to this article but I did want to comment, as follows: for the past two or three years, I've seen articles about Sigma-Aldrich's strategies and growth plans; somehow it is not materializing the way it had been anticipated two to three years ago.

This is a difficult growth market. The large chemical companies are suffering badly from overproduction and underusage.

Sigma-Aldrich, at least in the past, seemed to have been immune to these economic reversals. Understandably, as the company grows, it is more difficult to sustain growth. As pointed out in the article, it's difficult today to acquire a company at a reasonable price.
