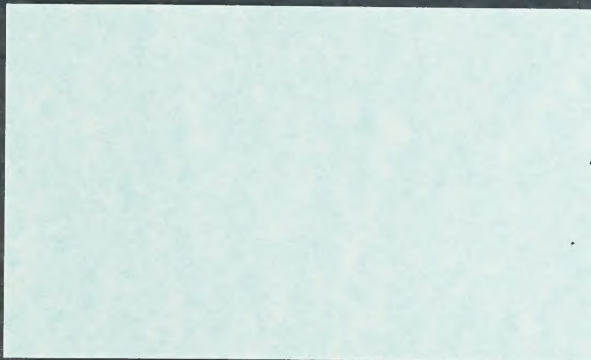

Hello Dr. Bader,

Thank you for your reply of August 24th with regard to your encounters with ACS people at the Chicago Convention and my proposed educational products. I have vigorously pursued these ideas since our last phone conversation and will take them to the AAAS Convention in Baltimore, February 8-13, 1996. I have rented booth 509 at the Convention Center in order to publicize my work in tandem with acquiring new investors. I have put together some money from recent investments. Enclosed you will find an amusing response from one of my more staunch supporters.

I will be filing design patents (ten, thus far) for a series of educational toys related to geometry, with patents pending at the convention. I call these toys: GeomeTroids, The Friendly GeomeT@ys, and have filed an application for this trademark. If you desire more information on the product, GeomeTroids, I will send it to you once the design patents have been filed.

Recently, I received Notices of Allowance for three of the four food products you witnessed earlier. The fourth, called "Nutri? Brain", has been opposed by the Nutri/System company, with a court date before the Trademark Trial and Appeal Board to follow. Kellogg's on the other hand is considering an out of court settlement, and I have included a copy of those papers, for your amusement. I feel strongly that I will win this case: 1) because neither Nutri/System nor Kellogg's has exclusive rights to the name "Nutri", and 2) my food product will not and was never intended to deceive the public with reference to its form and the form of existing products.

If you would like to become an investor in my projects, you are always welcome. In October, I met with Helen Free, "Queen of Public Outreach" for the ACS. She found my idea for a Periodic Table of Elements cereal to be quite appetizing, and will bring it before the ACS.



A friend of yours from your days at Harvard, Prof. George Bird of the Chemistry department at Rutgers (one of my mentors and investors) sends his regards. I told him about your recent book.

Well, again, I will be at the AAAS Convention so come on by if you desire to attend.

A Novel Way to Introduce Concepts from Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics to the General Public

A number of science-based groups and organizations have over the years, spent untold sums of money, in an attempt to determine why so much of our citizenry has little or no interest in the pursuit of a career in one of the natural sciences or mathematics. It is my opinion, that most of the would be (could be) science students become disinterested in the early stages of learning, because too many programs in science (and math) lack a key (perhaps the key) ingredient, that being **Amusement!** It is rather unfortunate that so many individuals never develop an appreciation for such a fascinating place to live and breathe, a.k.a. *The World of the Natural Sciences and Mathematics*. Now with the homily complete, I propose the following consumer products:

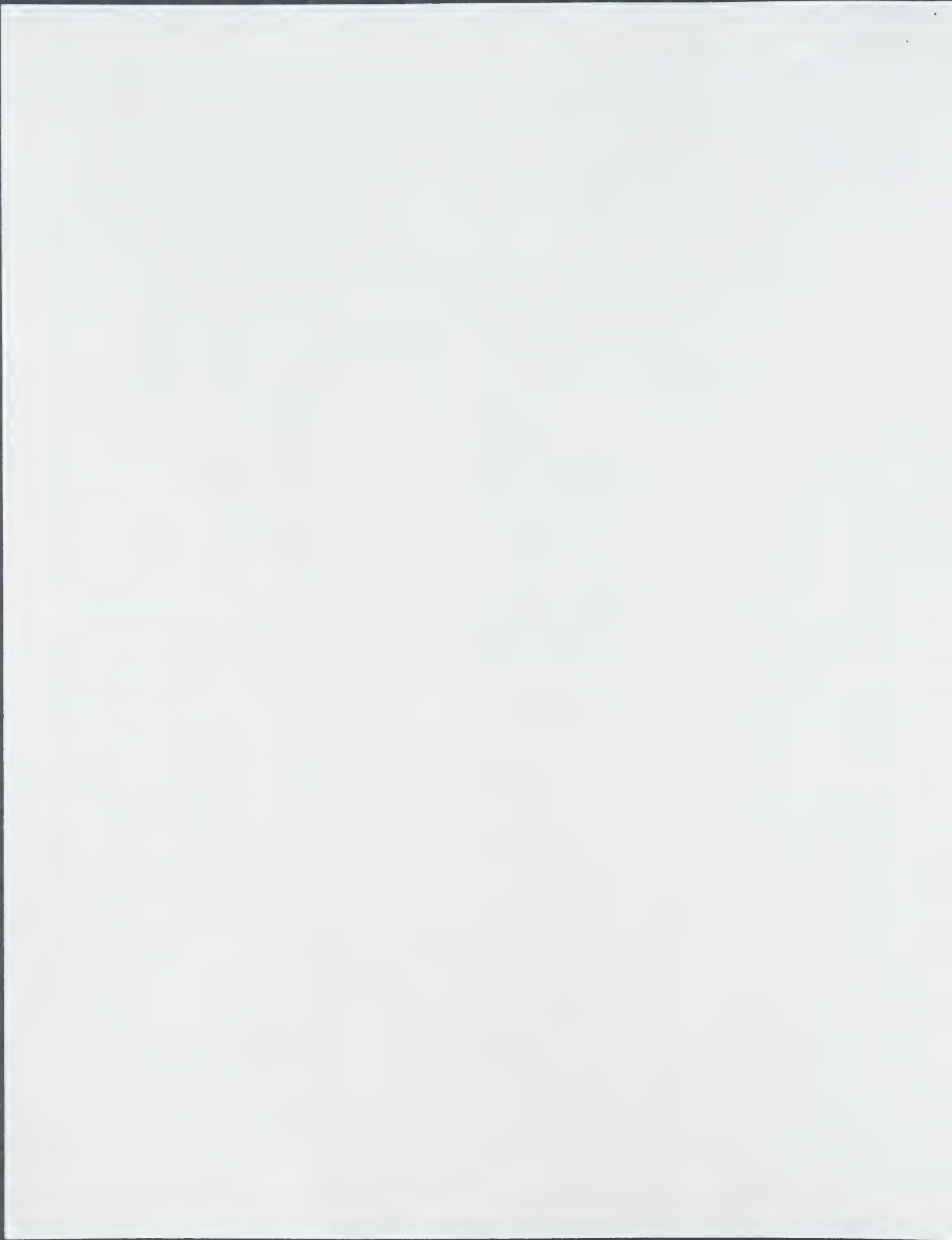
A) Elementary : a ready-to-eat cereal in the form of the elemental symbols of the Periodic Table of Elements.

B) Geometreats : cookies of geometrical design with an accompanying logo pertinent to the particular shape.

C) Nutri-Brain : cookies that introduce a variety of formulas (equations) basic to physics and chemistry.

In October of 1994, I filed Intent-to-Use trademark applications for these products (with another, I call Brain Power, which is a version of Elementary) with the Patent and Trademark Office (PTO) in Washington, DC. On July 18, 1995, these pre-approved trademarks were published in the Official Gazette of the PTO. Barring objection by outside interests, i.e. cereal and cookie companies (who have 30 days to file an opposition) the trademarks will reach the final stage of approval. However, for the granting of the official trademarks, the proposed products must be ready to market.

I have with the aid of the Center for Advanced Food Technology at Rutgers University, started work on all of these products, however, in the form of cookies. Cereals like "Alpha-Bits" are produced via extruders, which unfortunately liberate a shape that is not as defined as I would like it to be. I will pursue the cereal version of the product, Elementary, using a rolling die for a well defined shape.



In addition to the aforementioned food products, I have initiated a cartoon series in physics that I call "The Mind Machine" and another which pertains to geometry and linear math, that I call "Geometroids".

[At present, I am seeking copyright protection with the U.S. Copyright Office, for both works.]

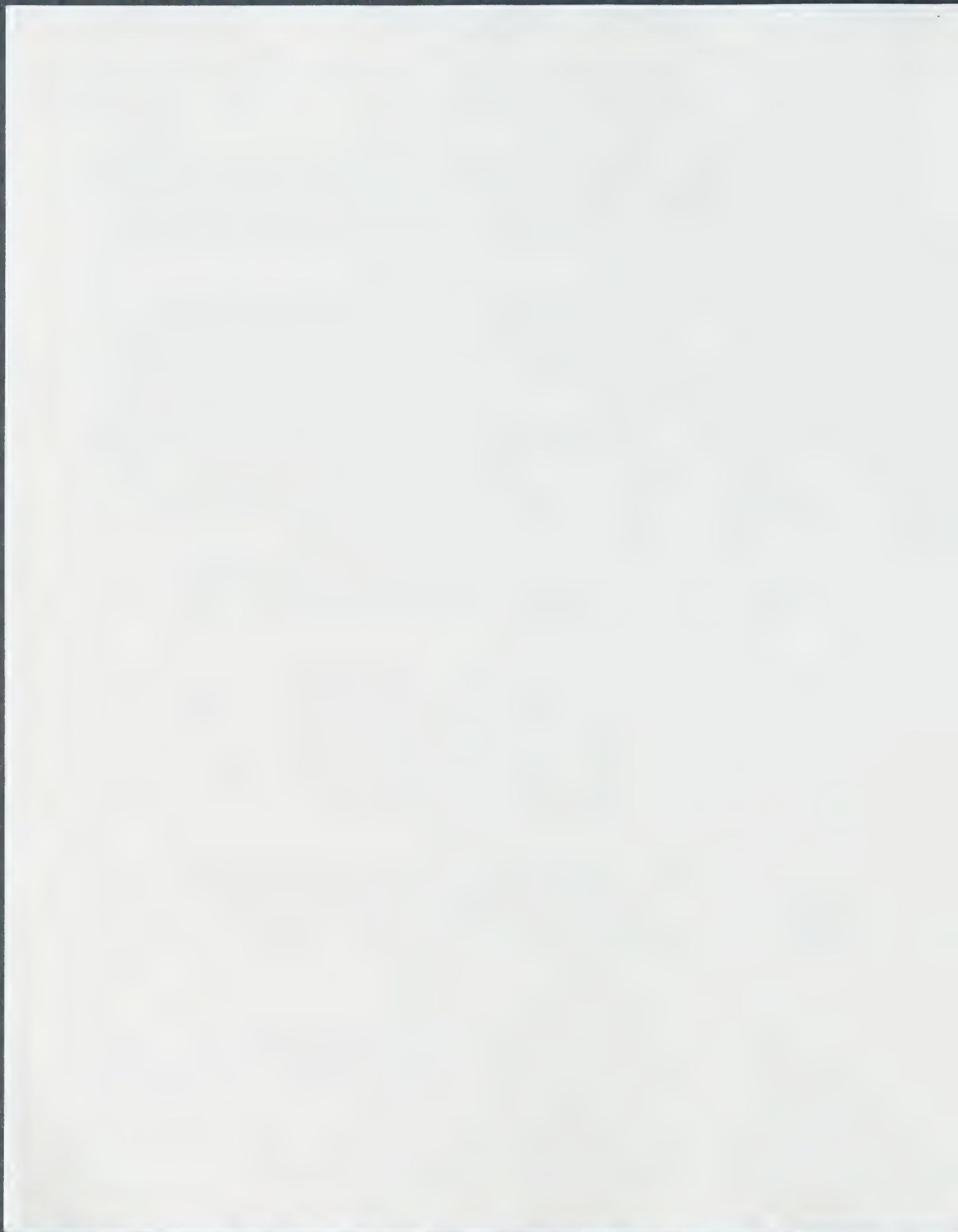
The cartoon series in physics had an interesting start, in that, I was hoping to entice Dr. Carl Sagan to participate as the "cartoon character host" of the series. Unfortunately, he had taken ill and was unable to respond to my inquiry. Luckily, in April of 1995, I stumbled onto a solution to my dilemma upon meeting with an actor by the name of Ed Metzger. Ed has been portraying Albert Einstein in a stage performance that he has developed over the past sixteen years. His wife, Laya Gelff, is the producer of the show in addition to being a literary agent. During a pleasant conversation with Ed and his wife, I asked him if he would consider working with me. He indicated that he would be pleased to host the series as the cartoon character form of Albert Einstein.

I believe that the Einstein estate would be honored to have Ed bring the *Great Scientist* to life as a cartoon character. In fact, in 1979, Ed was permitted by Einstein's son Hans Albert to bring his father "to the stage" as the following anecdote indicates:

Ed Metzger struck gold when he learned that Einstein's son Hans Albert was a professor of engineering at U.C. Berkeley. He agreed to meet with Ed and while they were talking he mentioned his father's love of jokes, "He started to laugh," Ed recalled, "and he said, 'I want to tell you a little secret very few people knew about my father. My father was really a Jewish comedian.' And I said, 'you gave me the key to the character of this man. Now I can bring him to the stage.'"

I hope to acquire the assistance of people who like myself, have an interest in spreading the Good News about Science and Mathematics. I'm certain that if I can get enough minds "together" on these issues, the people with the monetary resources will be more responsive as investors.

Actor portrays Einstein— and the fun side of genius

The day after the space shuttle Challenger exploded in January of 1986, actor Ed Metzger received a phone call from a reporter at a major New York City newspaper. The reporter asked, "Since you do Albert Einstein, would you think Einstein at this particular time, if he were alive, would suggest we stop exploring space?" Thinking for a moment, Metzger responded: "The only way I can answer that is to tell you what Einstein once wrote. He said, 'The basic religion we have as human beings is not Judaism or Christianity; the mystery of the unknown of the universe is our real, inside religion. That is a real magnetic force I want to go out in that universe. We can't stop it, and we can't deny it.'"

"So he would say, 'No, you have to explore it, but you have to explore it with a little more dignity and common sense.' That's where we fall apart."

Albert Einstein died in 1955, but the late, great physicist and Princeton resident was so revered for his sheer brain power that, even today, he's called upon to dispense wisdom. Sixteen years ago, Mr. Metzger began playing Mr. Einstein in a one-man show. So, today, whether he likes it or not, he's sometimes asked to serve as a spokesman of sorts.

"I do feel that, with all the research I've done, there is a certain level in which I can tell you, 'Well, maybe this avenue of approach would be more like the one he'd go down,'" Mr. Metzger said, speaking from his Los Angeles home. "After all, you start assimilating all these feelings and information, and you will bring the spirit of him to the stage."

Absolutely, Mr. Metzger said with a laugh. "He loved jokes! He told a joke every night at dinner. The problem was, he could never remember a punchline!"

Hearing about Mr. Einstein's penchant for jokes is what led the actor to do a show about him. It was the late 1970s, and Mr. Metzger had a successful career going. He'd played supporting roles in the movies *Day After Tomorrow* and *Capri*. He was working regularly as a bad guy on TV shows like *Kojak* and *Baretta*.

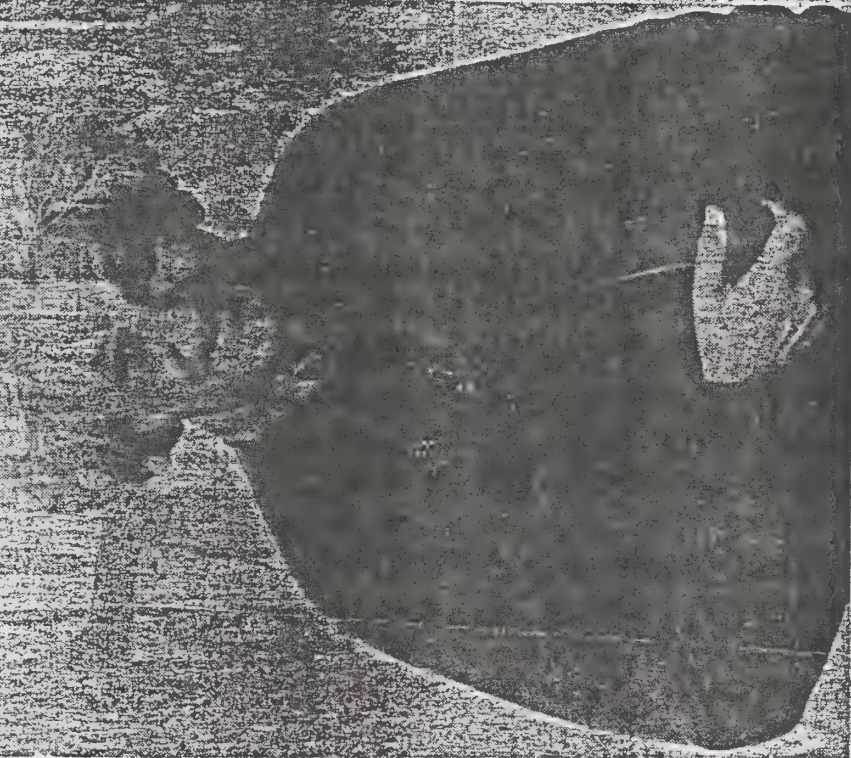
But with roots as a New York City stage actor, he wanted to return to the footlights.

"So I said, 'Let's pick on a famous man I can incorporate into a one-man show,'" Mr. Metzger recalled. "And to tell you the truth, the name Einstein popped into my head. But when he bounced the idea off writers and actors, he knew, he got a less-than-enthusiastic response. Everybody said, 'You're crazy.' Mr. Metzger said, "That's an old guy. He's boring."

But when he shared the idea with his wife, Laya Gelfin, a producer, she suggested they do some research. They struck gold when they learned that Mr. Einstein's son Hans, Albert was a professor of engineering at the University of California at Berkeley.

He agreed to meet with Mr. Metzger, and while they were talking he mentioned his father's love of jokes.

"He started to laugh," Mr. Metzger recalled, "and he said, 'I want to tell you a little secret, very few people know about my father. My father was really a Jewish comedian.' And he said, 'You gave me the key to the character of this man.' Now, to our

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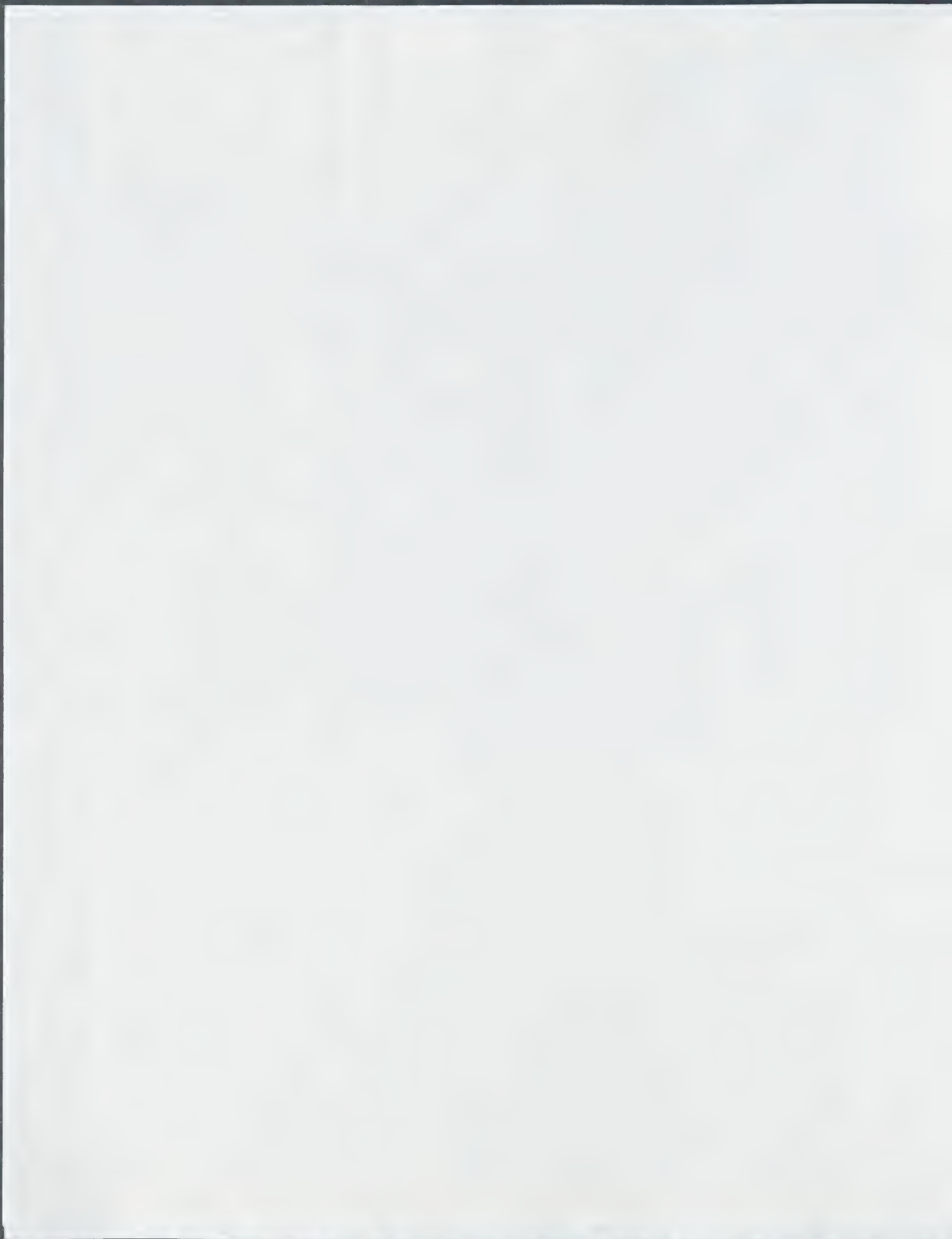

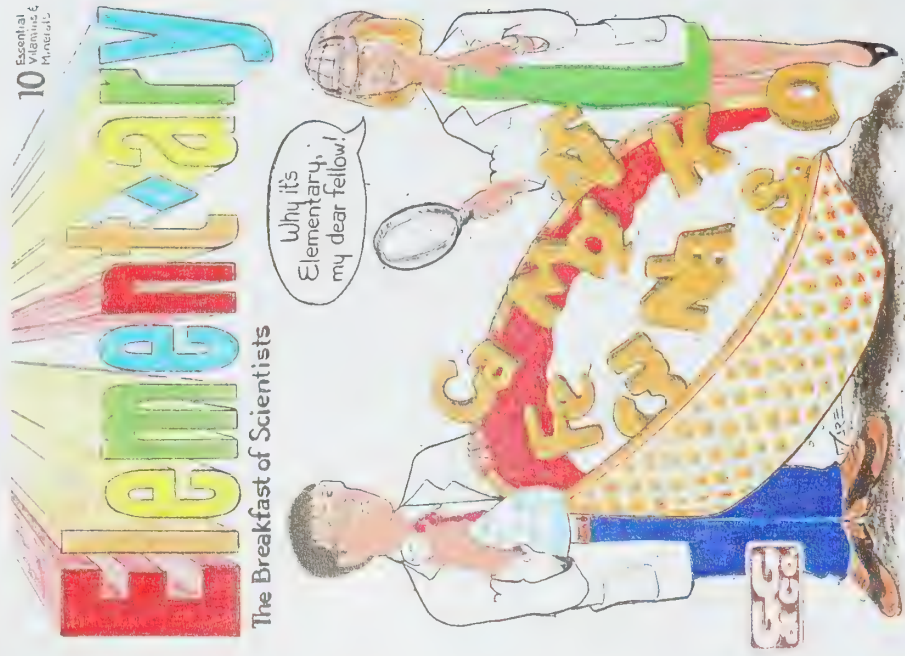

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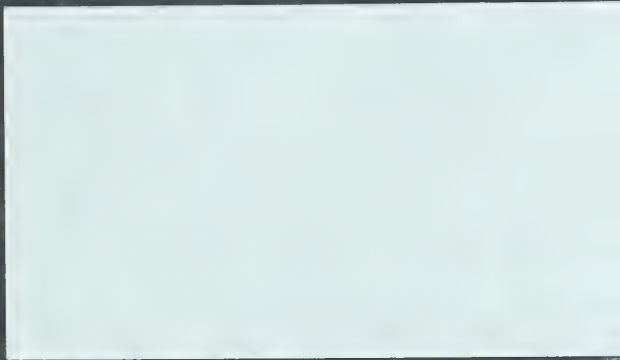

You might like to discuss your ideas with the American Chemical Society and will see their 800 number on the red piece enclosed. Dow Chemical Company might also be interested.

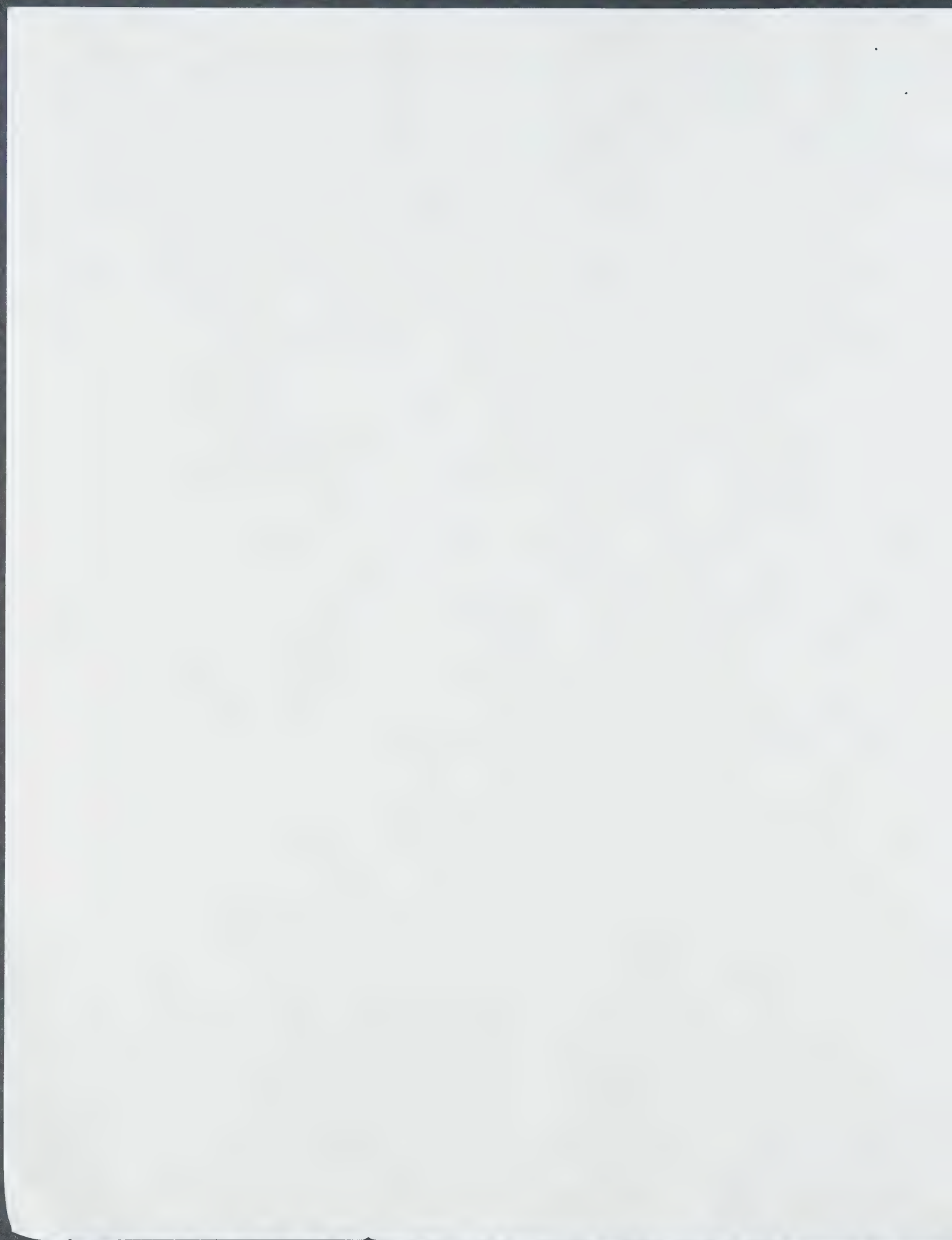

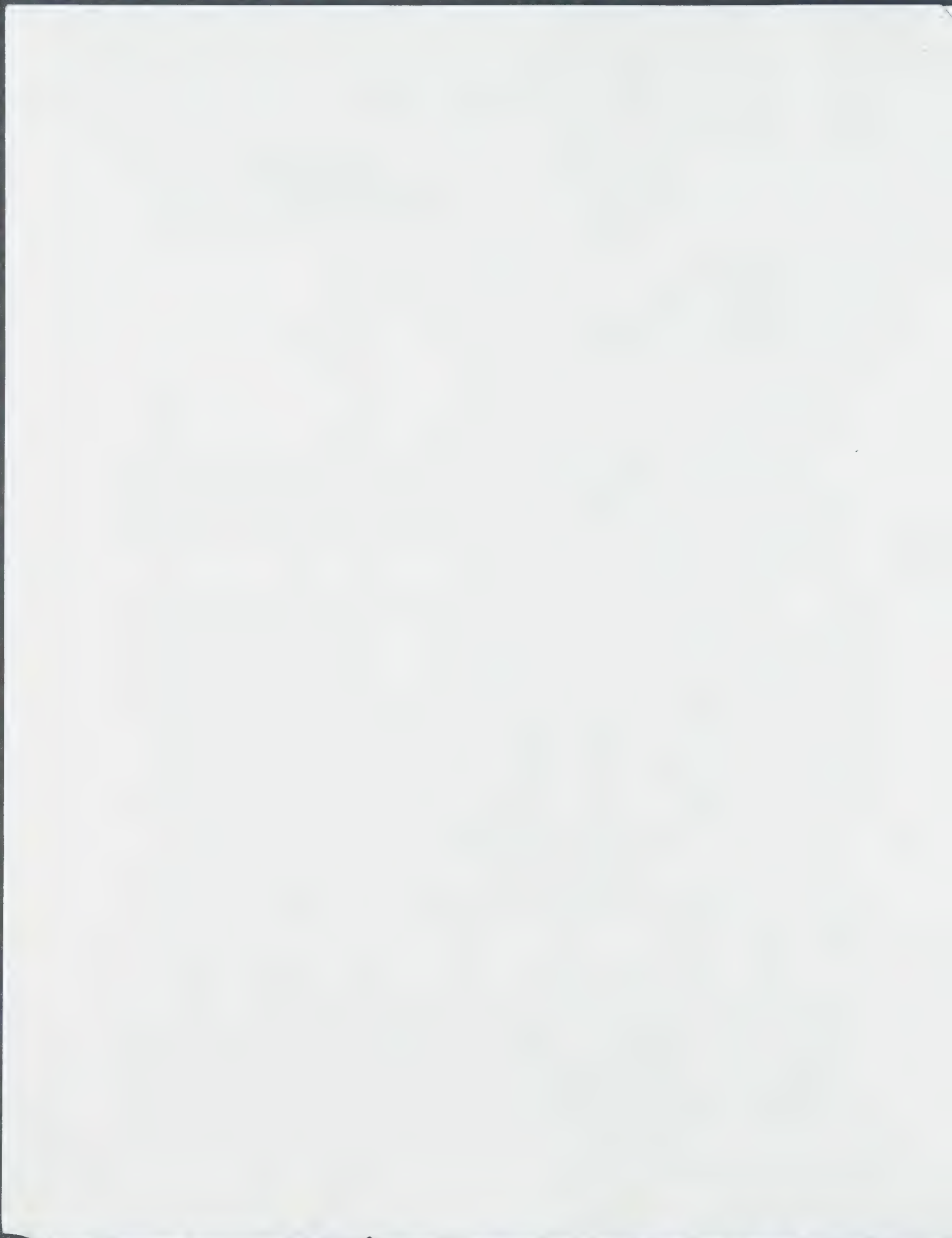
Hello Dr. Bader,

My name is Don Mueller, I'm a Ph.D. student in physical chemistry (working with Prof. John Krenos) at Rutgers. In addition to my research in atomic and molecular beams, I formed a company that specializes in the development of scientific novelties. Within the last full year, I have been working on a variety of educational products; relating to chemistry, physics and mathematics.

I have reached the point in the development of these concepts, where the acquisition of investors and other interested parties is essential in keeping the projects going. I have been contacting people throughout the country to see if these individuals would be interested in working with me, in some capacity. Recently, I sent my proposed product ideas to Dr. William O. Baker, formerly chairman of Bell Labs, and he stated that, "These concepts show an admirable educational initiative, on your part." Dr. Leon Lederman (Nobel Laureate in Physics, 1988) has also made some positive comments about my work. As did Prof. Dudley Herschbach (Nobel Laureate in Chemistry, 1986) who said, "Outstanding Don!" I actually had the privilege of meeting with Prof. Herschbach in April of this year, and he allowed me to give a full presentation of my educational products.

Enclosed you will find a series of cartoon artwork (that is prefaced by a note which I call: A Novel Way to Introduce Concepts from Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics to the General Public. This should spell out the basic ideas.

Within the last two years, several television programs related to science education have entered the airwaves. A more noteworthy one called, "Disney Presents Bill Nye the Science Guy", has received significant funding. I have enclosed an article from C&E News that gives the details. However, none of these programs are cartoon oriented. As previously mentioned, I'm hoping to put forth two distinct cartoon shows; and at present have been seeking copyright protection for both.



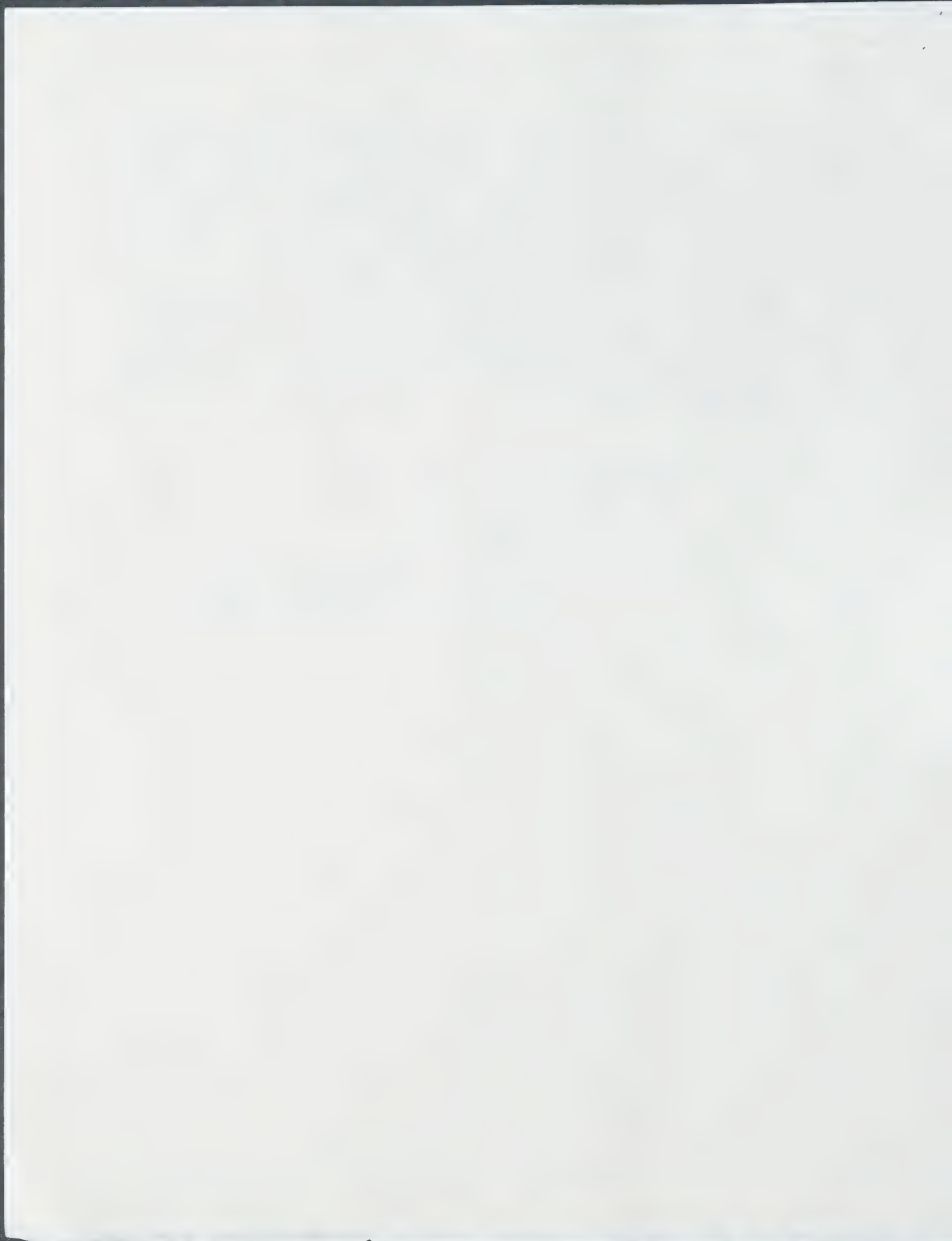
Of course, I'm certainly not the first to consider the marketability of science in America, but I'm hoping that the scientific community at large will find my concepts to be an attractive way to lure a few non-scientists into the web of the physical sciences and mathematics. As Dr. Leon Lederman stated in "Reference Frame" of Physics Today, March 1994 (I've enclosed a copy): "The tools are there: TV, radio, newspapers, magazines, movies, posters, cereal boxes, McDonald's place mats and so on."

My advisor, Dr. John Krenos has written a letter of recommendation on my behalf, in order to inform potential investors and other interested parties of my good character. Having done so, I'm hoping that these people will be more at ease and ultimately would be more likely to invest their money and/or time in working with me. A copy of this letter is included in your package.

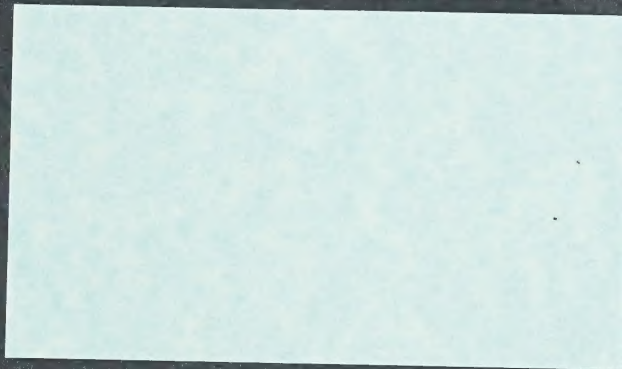
