

Speaker Biographies

Alfred Robert Bader

Mr. Bader went to England in 1938 to escape from the Nazis in his native Austria. In 1940 he was interned by the British government and sent as a prisoner of war to Canada. After his release in 1941 he studied chemistry at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario and later received his Ph.D. from Harvard. His numerous publications and patents deal with his work in organic chemistry and the fine arts.

Mr. Bader founded Aldrich Chemical Company which, in August 1975, merged to form Sigma-Aldrich Chemical Corporation.

Scott W. Borst

Mr. Borst has been involved with different facets of the commercial development process for close to ten years. His professional background includes responsibilities as a Product Development Manager, International Sales Manager, Commercial Development Manager, and Business Director. Mr. Borst is currently the Marketing Director of Derivatives and Biocides for ANGUS Chemical Company. In addition to managing the day-to-day business of ANGUS, he has primary responsibility for developing new markets with existing technology.

Mr. Borst received his M.B.A. degree from Indiana State University and his Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from Indiana University.

He is active member of the Commercial Development Association, currently residing on its Board of Directors. He is also a member of the product Development Management Association and the National Paint and Coatings Association.

Carol A. Cooper

Dr. Cooper is currently Senior Consultant with the Corporate Strategic Planning Group of Miles Inc. She is part of a small, hand-picked group that functions as internal consultants to the various Miles business units across North America working with them on a variety of projects. Dr. Cooper joined Miles (formerly Mobay) in 1979 as a New Venture Analyst and since then her responsibilities have ranged from managing the sales of Mobay's domestically produced organic chemicals to screening and evaluating new business opportunities.

Having been an active member of the Commercial Development Association for many years, Cooper is currently President of the Association. Most recently she was involved in the establishment of a not-for-profit Educational Foundation for the Association.

He previously managed the marketing of polymers into the graphic arts industry. In addition, he teaches business and management outreach at the University of Wisconsin. His professional affiliations include the Commercial Development Association, where he serves as a Director, and the Planning Forum.

Mr. Dankwerth received his B.S. in Chemistry from New York University and his M.B.A. in Marketing Management from Pace University.

E. Keith Ford

Mr. Ford is Manager of Environmental and Regulatory Affairs for Boehme Filatex. His responsibilities include managing safety and regulatory issues for all sites and overseeing the quality assurance programs. He is in charge of all permitting, environmental and safety reporting and sets corporate policy on all regulatory issues.

Beginning his career as an Environmental Chemist at Milliken Chemical, Mr. Ford was responsible for plant environmental and safety compliance. He worked at Blackman Uhler from 1985 to 1988 as an Environmental Engineer and was responsible for ensuring compliance with all permits and safety requirements. In 1989 he joined Sandoz Chemicals Corp. as an Environmental Chemist and was in charge of product safety work for business groups within Sandoz.

A member of SOCMA's Responsible Care® Committee since 1991, Mr. Ford has been Vice Chair since 1994. He received his B.S. in Biochemistry from Mississippi State University.

DuPont at the Belle, WV site in 1979 and later transferred to DuPont's LaPorte, TX site. Dan Quayle


Former Vice President Dan Quayle is Chairman of the Competitiveness Center of the Hudson Institute. The Center is a non-partisan, educational institution founded in March, 1993, to help America meet the challenge of global competition, now and into the next century.


As the 44th Vice President of the United States, Mr. Quayle served as President of the United States Senate. He was also a statutory member of the National Security Council, the first Chairman of the National Space Council and head of the Council on Competitiveness, a post he held throughout his term.

Mr. Quayle's public service began in 1971 as an investigator for the Consumer Protection Division of the Indiana Attorney General's Office. Later that year, he became an Administrative Assistant to Governor Edgar Whitcomb. From 1973 to 1974, he was Director of the Inheritance Tax Division of the Indiana Department of Revenue.

In 1976, Mr. Quayle was elected to Congress from Indiana's Fourth Congressional District, defeating an eight-term incumbent Democrat. He was reelected to the seat in 1978 with the greatest percentage margin achieved to that date in the northeast Indiana district.









To come back to Informex: For the organic chemist it is much more interesting than Chemspec and of course much more compact than the Achema.


