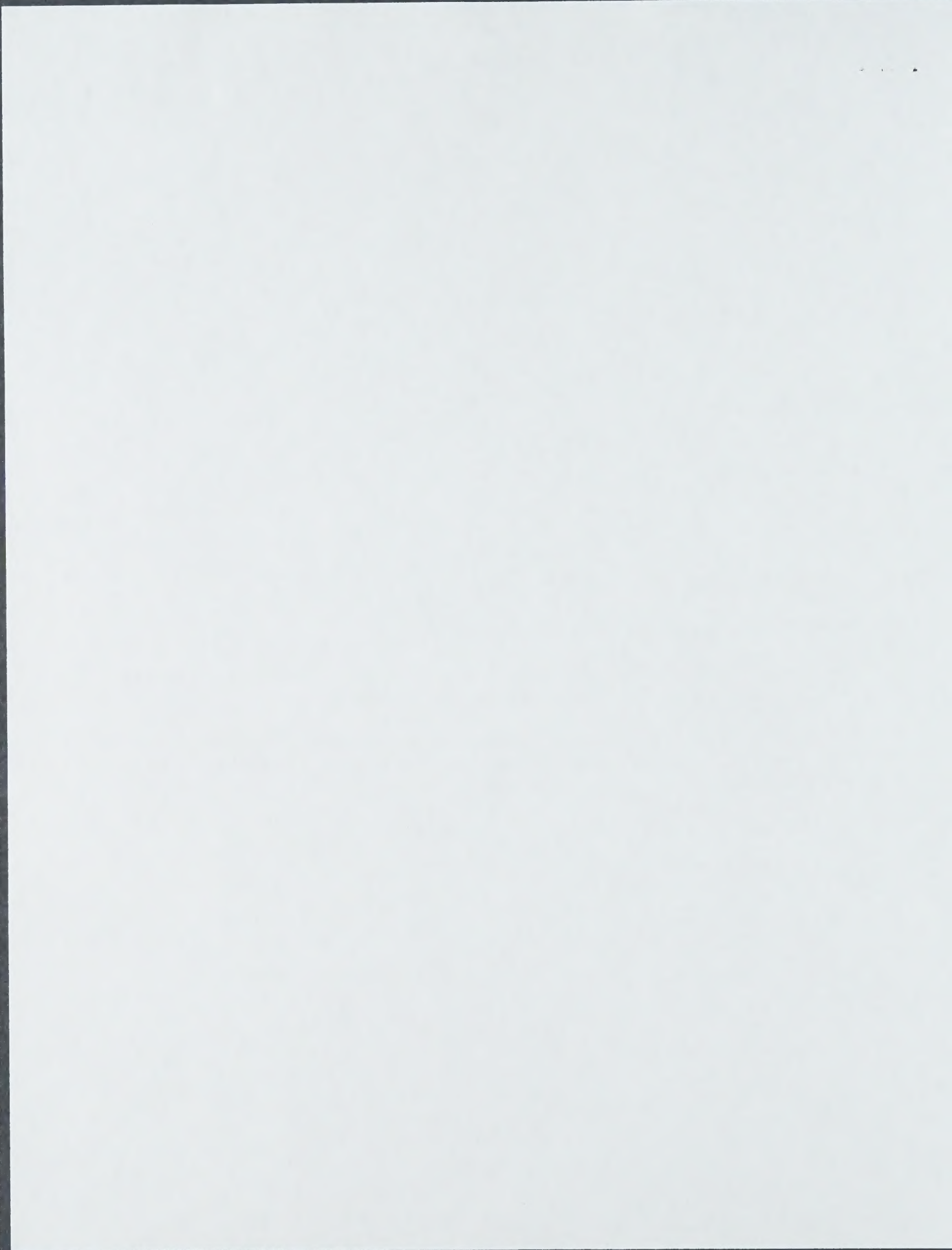


Dear Dr. Bader,

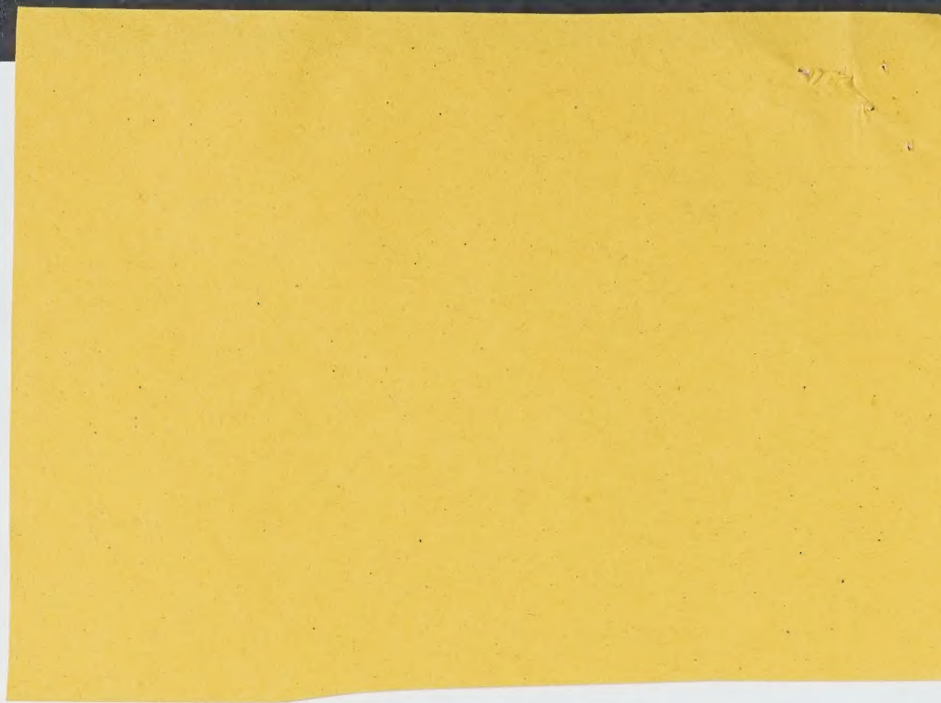

I also do hope that this occasion may offer an opportunity to meet you personally after having read and heard about you, your achievements and your contributions to Canadian society.

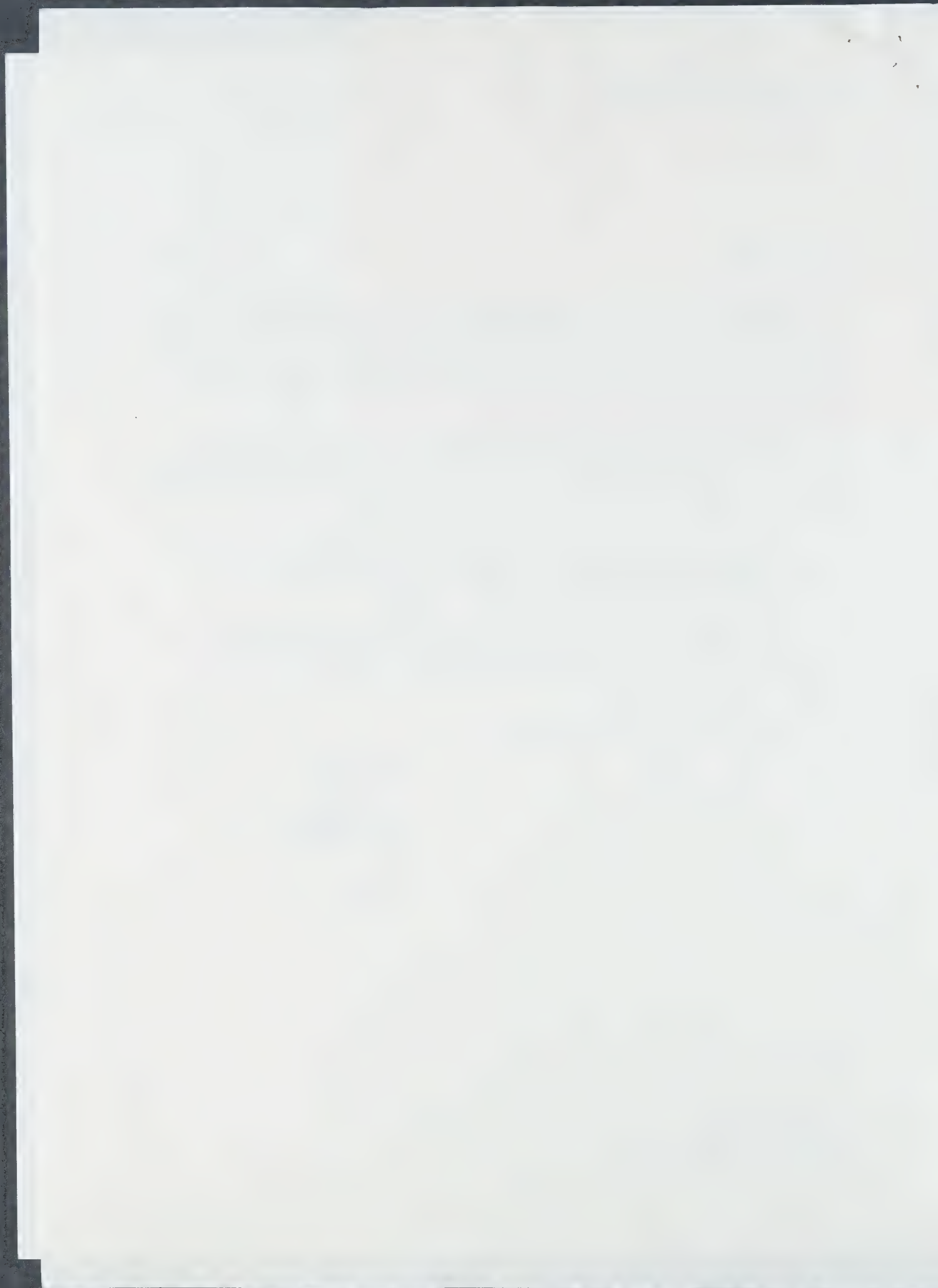

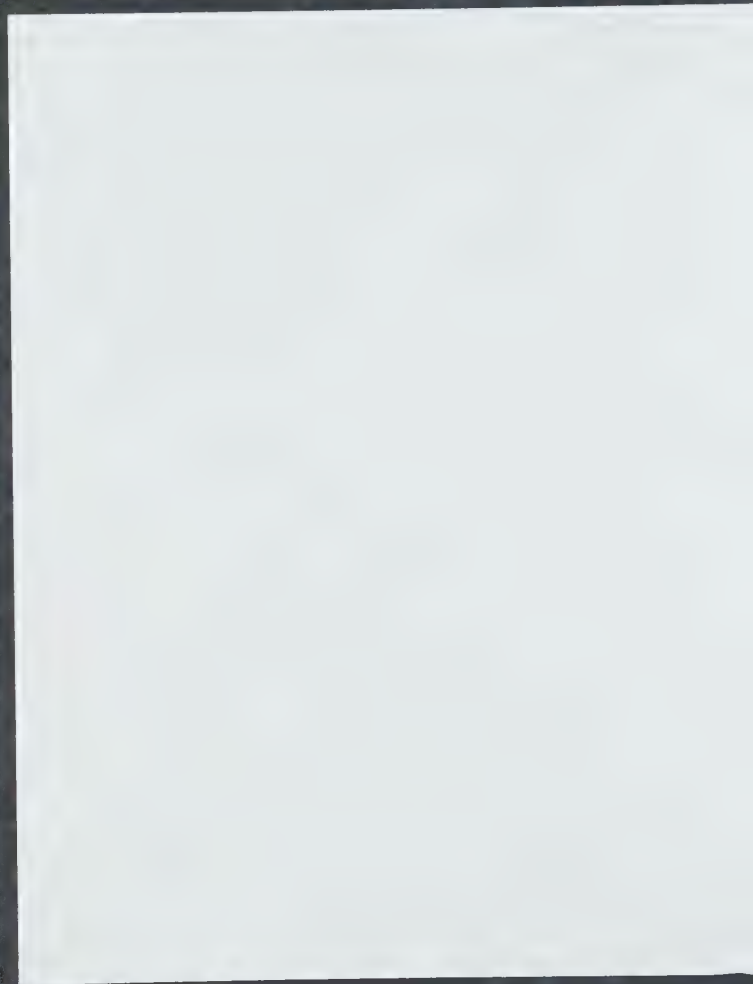


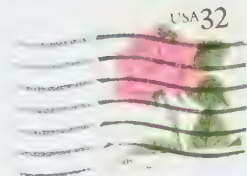
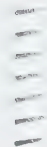
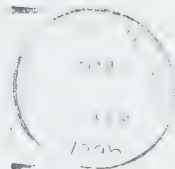


Travel Directions to Waukegan Park

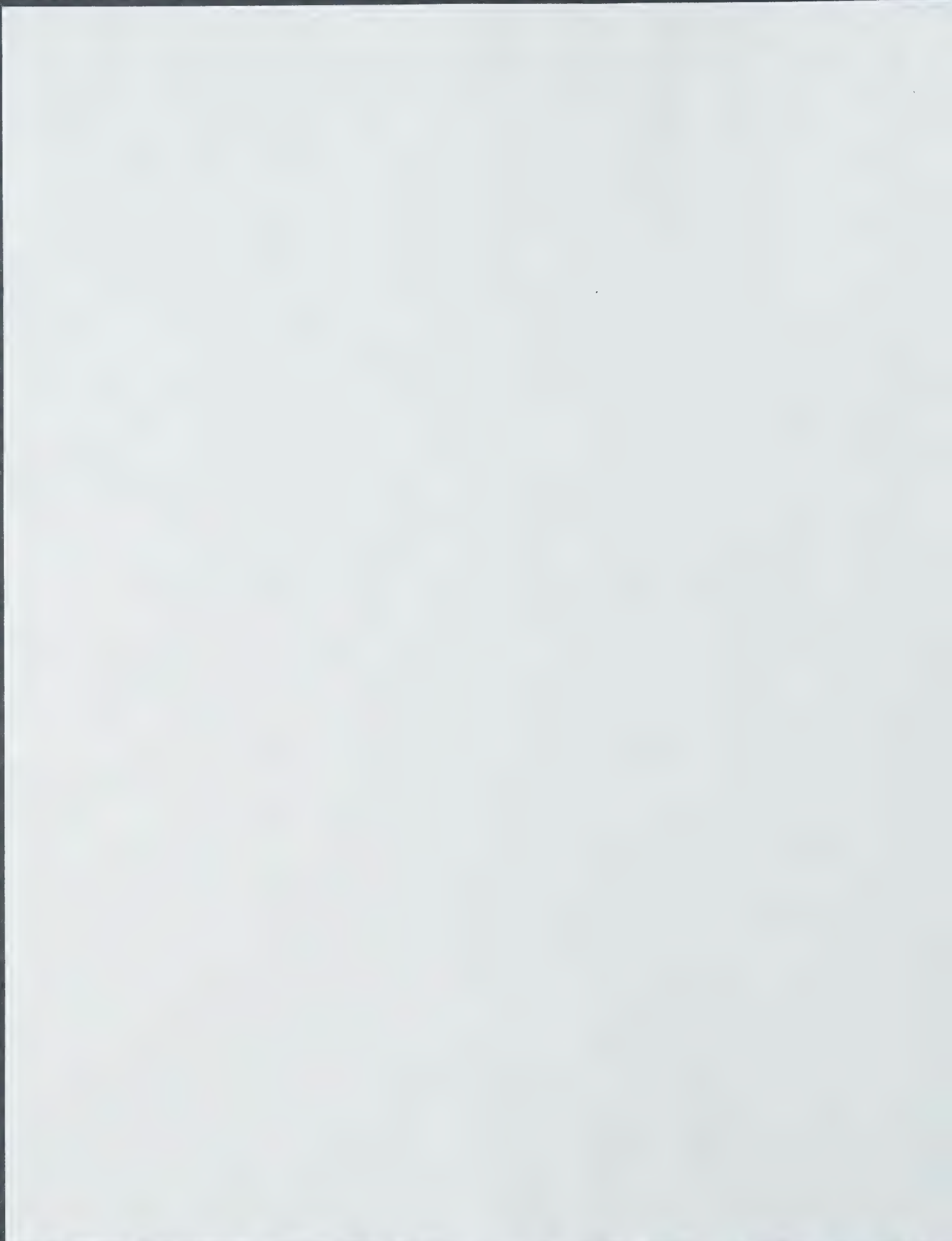

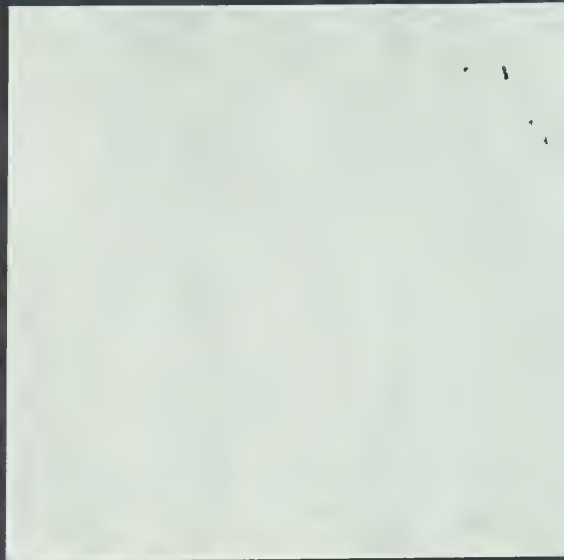

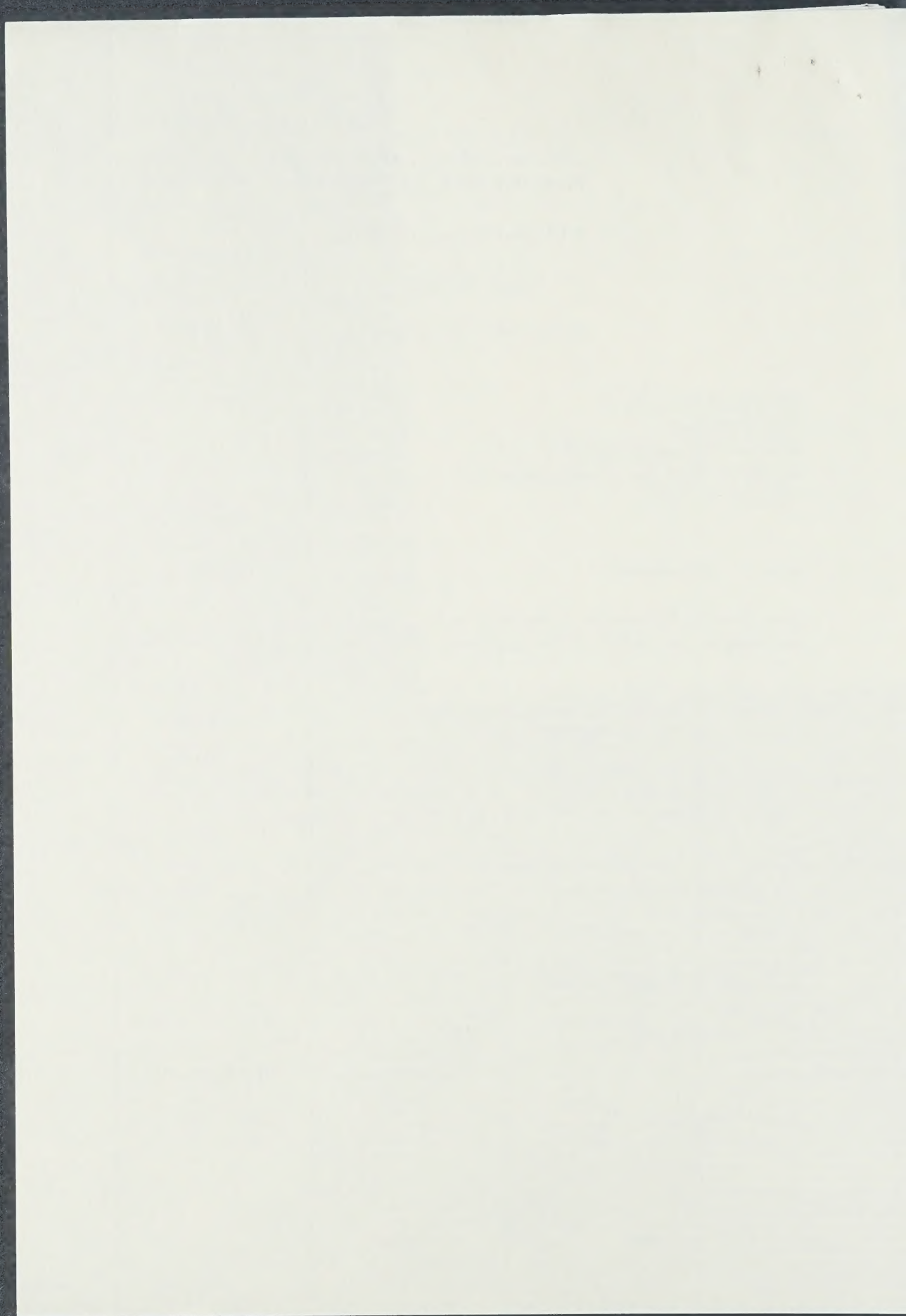

Address: The Founding of Sigma-Aldrich

The award of **Distinguished Fellow** is given for meritorious service to the Division, to ACS, and to the chemical industry.

Dr. Bader was born in Vienna, Dr. Bader fled to England at the age of fourteen, ten months before the outbreak of World War II. He was then interned in 1940 and sent to a prisoner-of-war camp in Canada.

Released in 1941, he earned degrees in engineering chemistry from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario and a fellowship in organic chemistry at Harvard. This was followed by an assignment in Milwaukee as a research chemist for PPG (Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company) and his later cofounding of Aldrich (today, Sigma-Aldrich). Sigma-Aldrich is now the world's largest supplier of research chemicals.

He also translated his love of art into collecting and owning an art gallery in Milwaukee.

His new book, *Adventures of a Chemist Collector*, has been published by Weidenfeld & Nicolson and is marketed through the American Chemical Society.

His work at Aldrich represents a unique example of technology transfer. The exchange of ideas between the university setting and Dr. Bader provided for a dynamic and vital link between academic departments and commercial success.
