This award has been founded by an endowment from Dr Alfred Bader. It is made annually for eminence in organic chemistry and includes a monetary prize of £2,000. There is no restriction on age, but nominees must not hold or have held professorships in the British Isles.

The major part of the nominee's work must have been carried out in an academic institution in the United Kingdom or Republic of Ireland and the person must currently work in such an institution. The winner may be asked to write an article on his or her research for 'Aldrichimica Acta'.

Applications or nominations must be accompanied by a CV and list of publications, together with a brief supporting statement.

Nominations are now invited for the fourth Bader Award and these should be sent to:

Thank you very much for your letter of April 19. Please be assured that the reason why we are unable to continue to stock your prints is to do with the time involved in processing the orders and shortage of manpower, rather than that they were contributing to the Fund making a loss.

It was only in regard to our other gift items that we were not covering our costs – there we had not only the advertising (the Alchemist prints did not create any additional advertising costs other than we would have spent anyway on advertising the other goods), and staff time, but also the initial outlay in purchasing the stock. I only mentioned this to give you the complete picture as to why we were discontinuing selling goods completely.

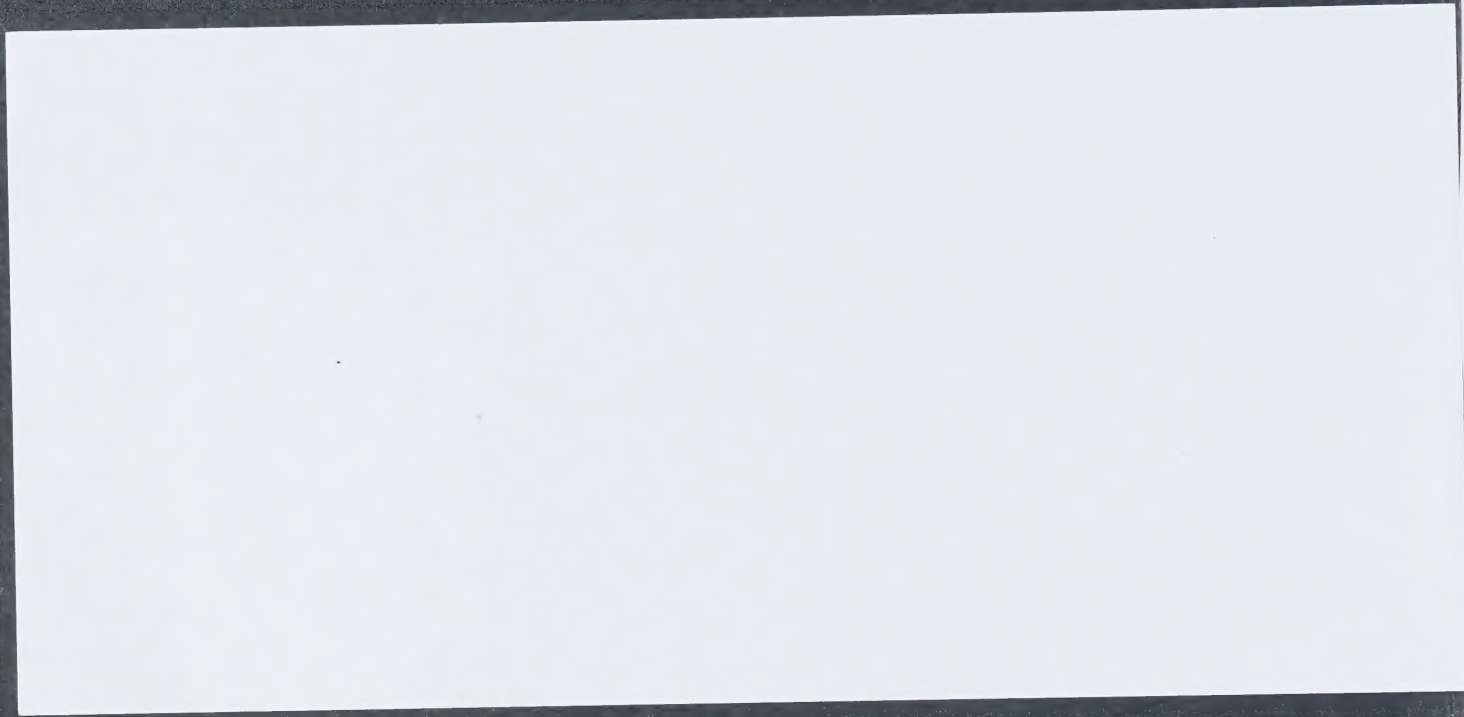

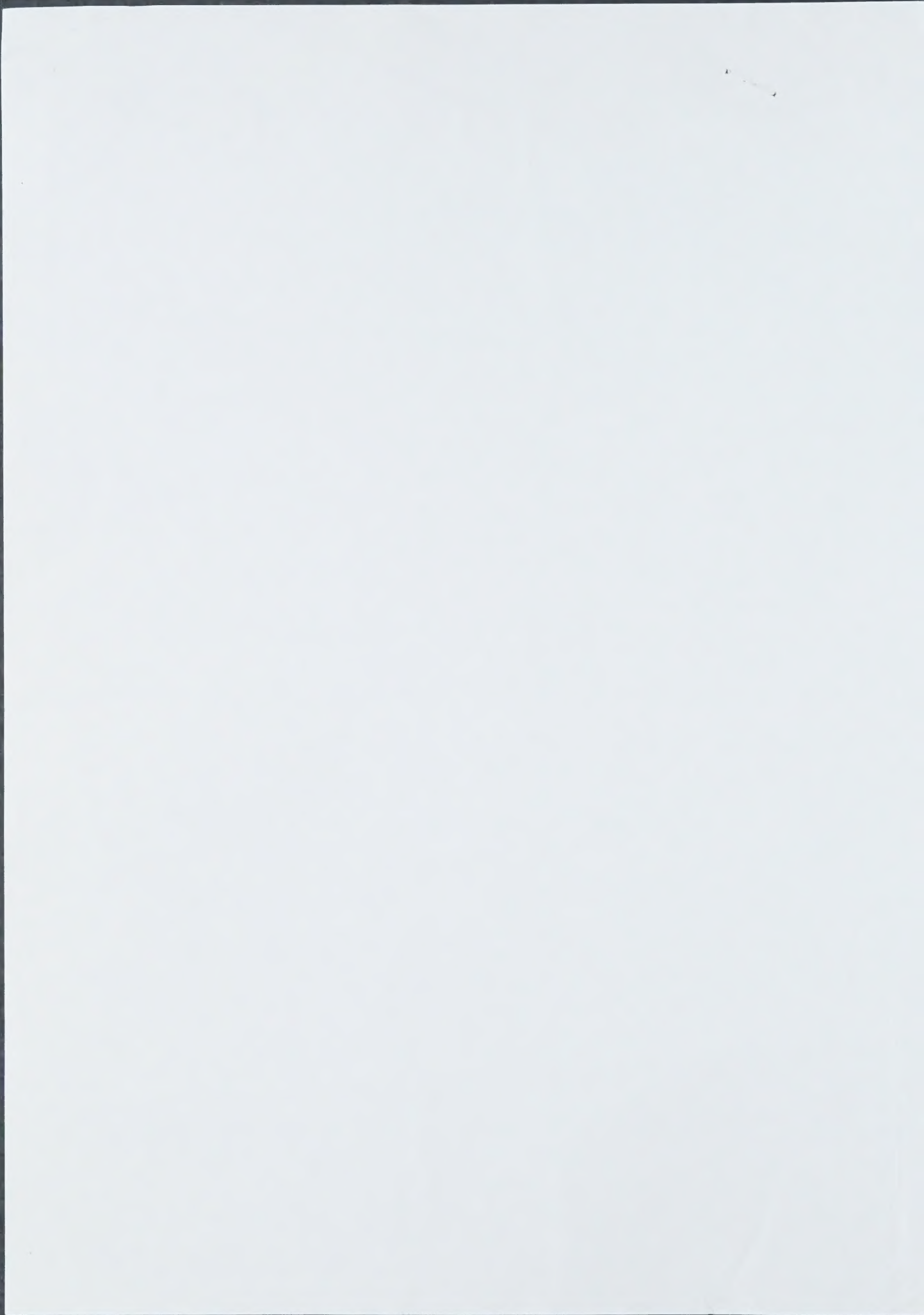
We have now had our Benevolent Fund Christmas cards printed for this year (and I am gradually getting used to having to start planning Christmas cards in January!).

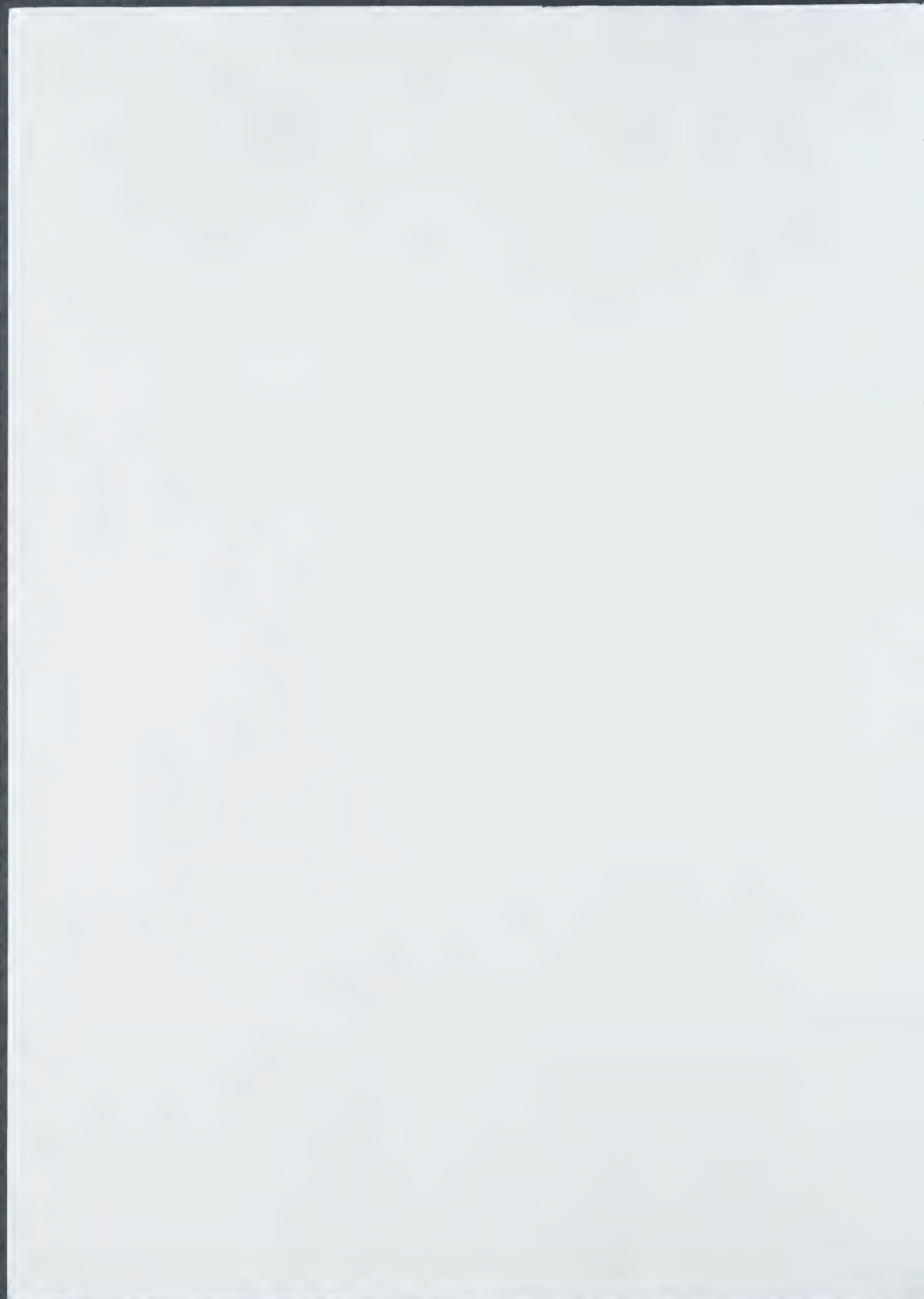

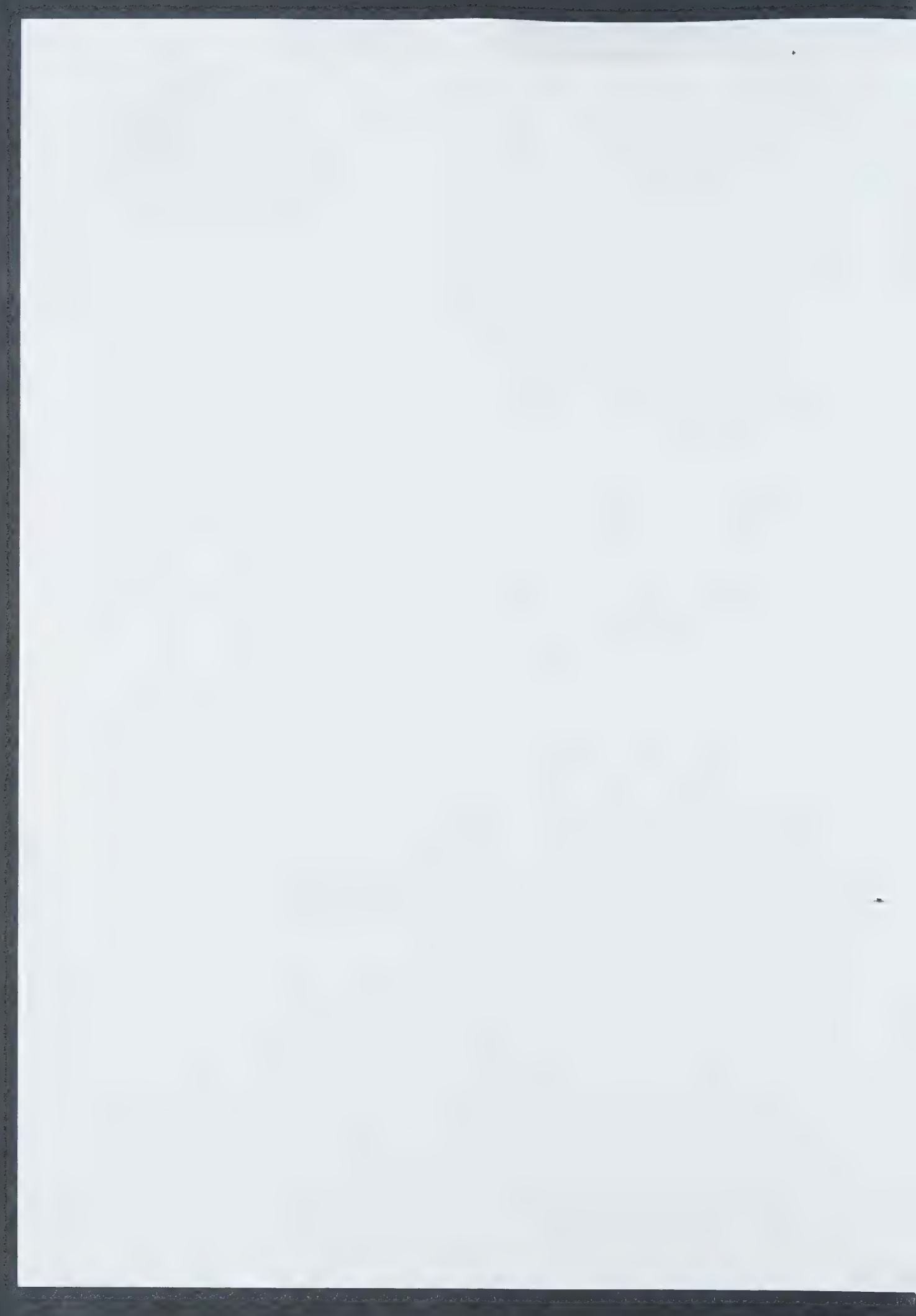

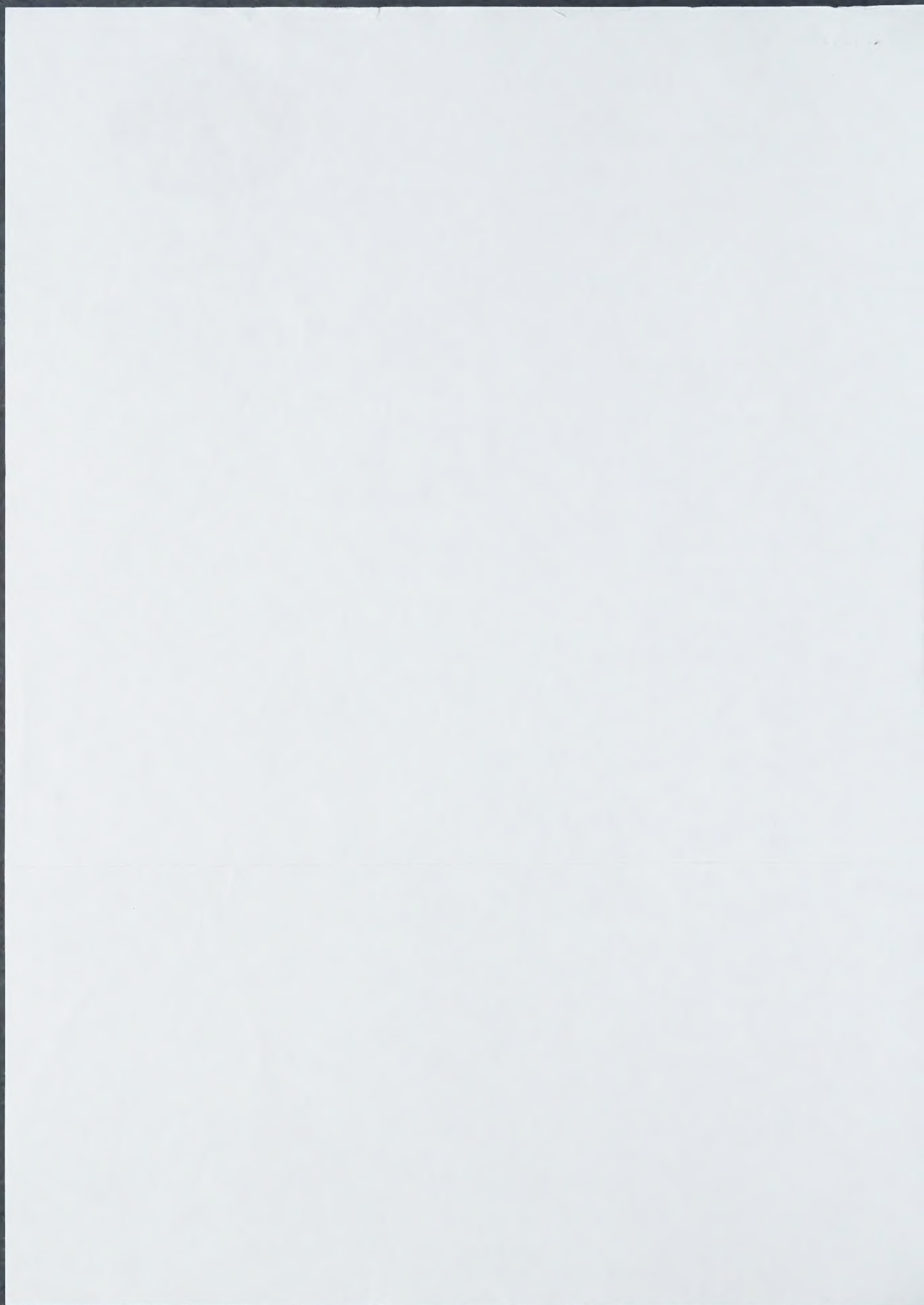
