

As Bob may have told you, he plans to be in San Diego later his month and hopes that he might be able to acquire some more samples from you.



Dear Dr. Bader:

Herewith I enclose a series of solid samples of modest amount per sample, to be examined for possible entry into the Library of Rare Chemicals at Aldrich Chemical Company. I am glad that you will be able to give them to the folks in the Library.

I have decided to leave the labels on the original containers, only adding a RED small number, if necessary, for the responsible persons to note a comment on the list provided with these samples. I may add a piece of clear 3M tape only if it appears necessary. I have prepared a list of the compounds, drawing them by hand and any additional text found on the label for each vial, then noting carefully how many small vials there are of each compound. I hope this will be useful in avoiding a mix-up of samples. I have also added the name(s) of the student(s) involved in the synthesis of the compounds. Most of these compounds are from the late 60s until mid-1970s; they were each stored in the sample container currently sent to you, behind a closed, glass sliding door in my office lab.

The 5-nitro-2-pyridyl compounds and the 5-nitro-2-thiazoyl compounds prepared by R. Fouts have not been published--instead, what I plan to do is to send a copy of the experimental section of the M.S. thesis completed by Mr. R. Fouts in 1974 to you, Dr. Bader, for transmittance to the Library at Aldrich. This should help to establish purity, at least at the time of preparation. Two miscellaneous ketone derivatives are also enclosed.

The 3,5-dinito-2-thienyl compounds were the results of work of Fred Stults(undergrad, later worker) and Milo Prodanovich(M.S., early 70s), published in Journal of Heterocyclic Chemistry, 1972. I have enclosed a copy of this paper in the box containing all the samples.

First of all, I have sent you pictures of your visit here that I hope you and Isabel might enjoy -- I have the negatives in case there is one or more you wish duplicates of.







## DR, ALFRED R, BADER

Dr. Bader was born in 1924 in Vienna. Growing up he faced many difficult times with the rise of Nazism. As a consequence of this, he was forced to move to Canada at the age of 16. Fortunately, this turned out to be an invaluable experience for him, as he was adopted by a family in Montreal a year and a half later. He then had the opportunity to attend Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. Here he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering Chemistry, Bachelor of Arts degree in History, and a Masters of Science degree in Organic Chemistry. Later he went on to Harvard University where he received his PhD.

Presently, Alfred Bader lives his life according to what he calls his "ABC's": art, the Bible, and chemistry. Most people know Alfred Bader as the founder of Aldrich Chemical Company, but he is also an avid art collector whose collection has included works by famous artists such as Rembrandt and Rubens. Dr. Bader has also written an autobiography, and tonight you will have the opportunity to purchase an autographed copy of this book, "Alfred Bader: Adventures of a Chemist Collector". Dear Alfred:

Barry Sharpless, Dave Boulton and I still glow from our visit last Saturday with you in Milwaukee.

I especially wanted to thank you for the opportunity to tour your gallery and your house and to view with you the wonderful masterpieces in your collection. I have unwrapped the Epstein "boat picture" and have already noticed details in the painting that make me love it even more: in the ship's hull there are many complicated layerings and swirls, algal greens, mud browns and mustard yellows, etc., etc. I have never thought of myself as an "...art-lover", but I actually think this is what I am. In September, I was invited by Hambros Bank in London to come over and make a presentation on the U.S. biotechnology markets. This was to an audience of completely non-technical investors, so as a heuristic device I interspersed slides of famous paintings with the main slides from my talk. I began with Pollock and ended with Breughel (to give you a sense of the fun I had in putting it together and the eclecticism of the scope.) So, independent of any business project, I hope that we can stay in touch on this level; and the next time I see you, I would be happy to bring the biotechnology/art talk along, which you may get quite a kick out of.

As far as the business opportunities go that we discussed: I believe that they are robust and timely. The accelerated discovery through combinatorial automated methods of new industrial catalysts is an exciting concept especially with the team assembled. Apparatus from the combinatorial chemistry and high-throughput screening world of drug discovery when transposed onto the discovery of new industrial catalysts should enable intuitions such as Barry's to make great leaps consistently. Barry believes he would be able to cut down the seven-year discovery time, which is the time that elapsed between the publication of each of his major reactions, to one year. We need displace but a single energy-and cost-intensive chemical transformation with a well-catalyzed version to create enormous value. In addition, if we could generate financial leverage and assure a supply of interesting chemical building blocks through the creation of a building-block business on the side, then so much the better-provided that we do not distract ourselves from the main effort.



We are now in the process of writing a short, to-the-point business plan outlining what we believe will be the most economically efficient way to finance and operate over the first twelve to twenty-four months. I expect to have this to you within thirty days.

Separate and apart from the catalyst plan, and based upon your stated interest in Alzheimer's disease, I enclose a summary of a business that I have been developing in a novel area of Alzheimer drug discovery. KBS is on the Scientific Advisory Board and we are having a great time trying to finance Acumen utilizing corporate partnerships only. You may or may not have an interest in this, but I thought it would be food for thought as to how to proceed in Alzheimer's disease at least at the Helen Bader Foundation level. Any member of the Acumen team would be more than happy to sit down with you and others to outline how we view various areas of Alzheimer's research and where we see the greatest needs and the greatest progress likely to be made.

I truly enjoyed meeting you and Isabel and look forward to our future interactions.

He will call the first week in January to discuss expenses, honorarium, etc.



Hence, as we discussed, I have booked the Monday and Saturday flights for us. I will send you copies of the invoices when I receive them.



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
