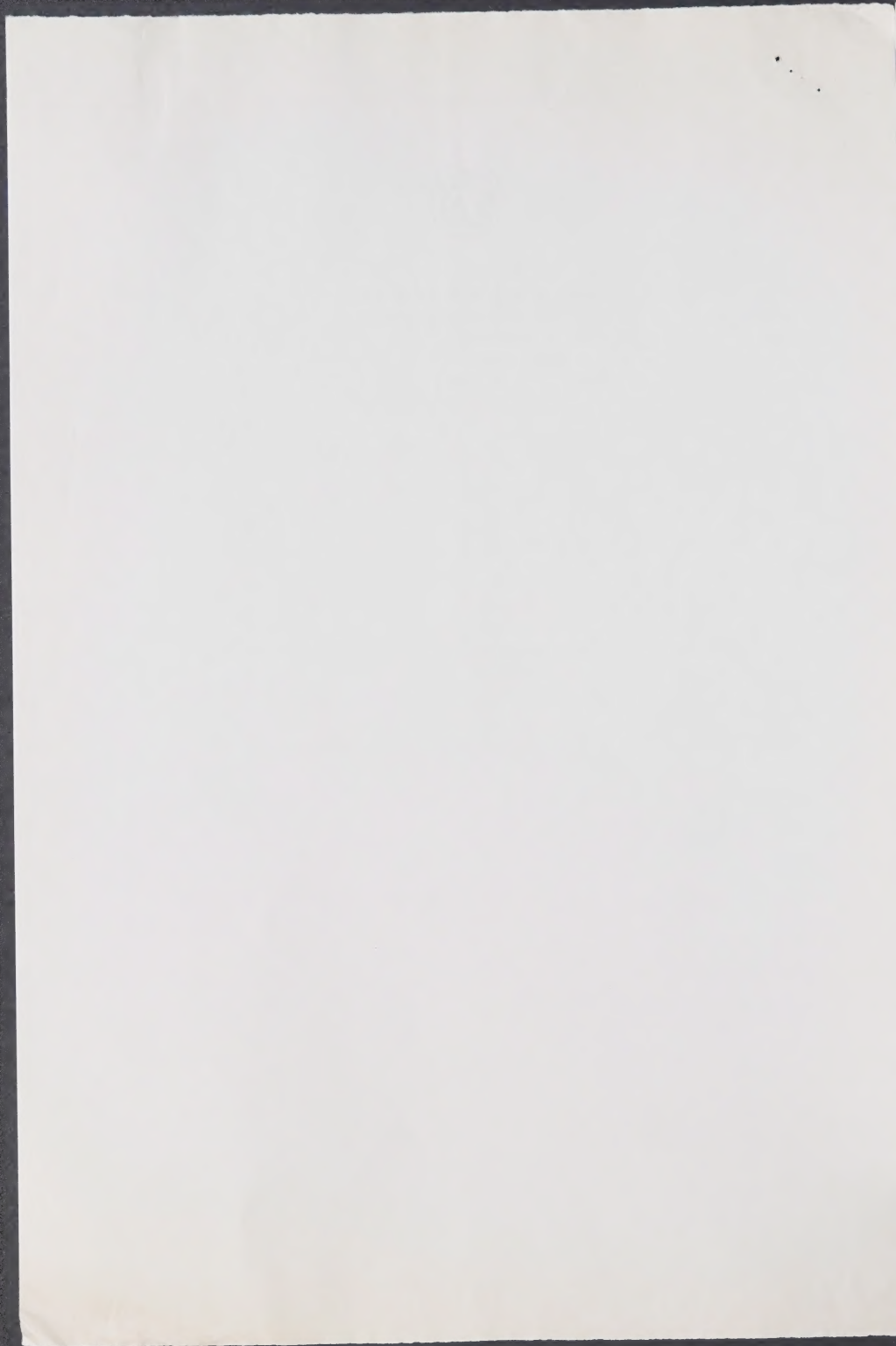

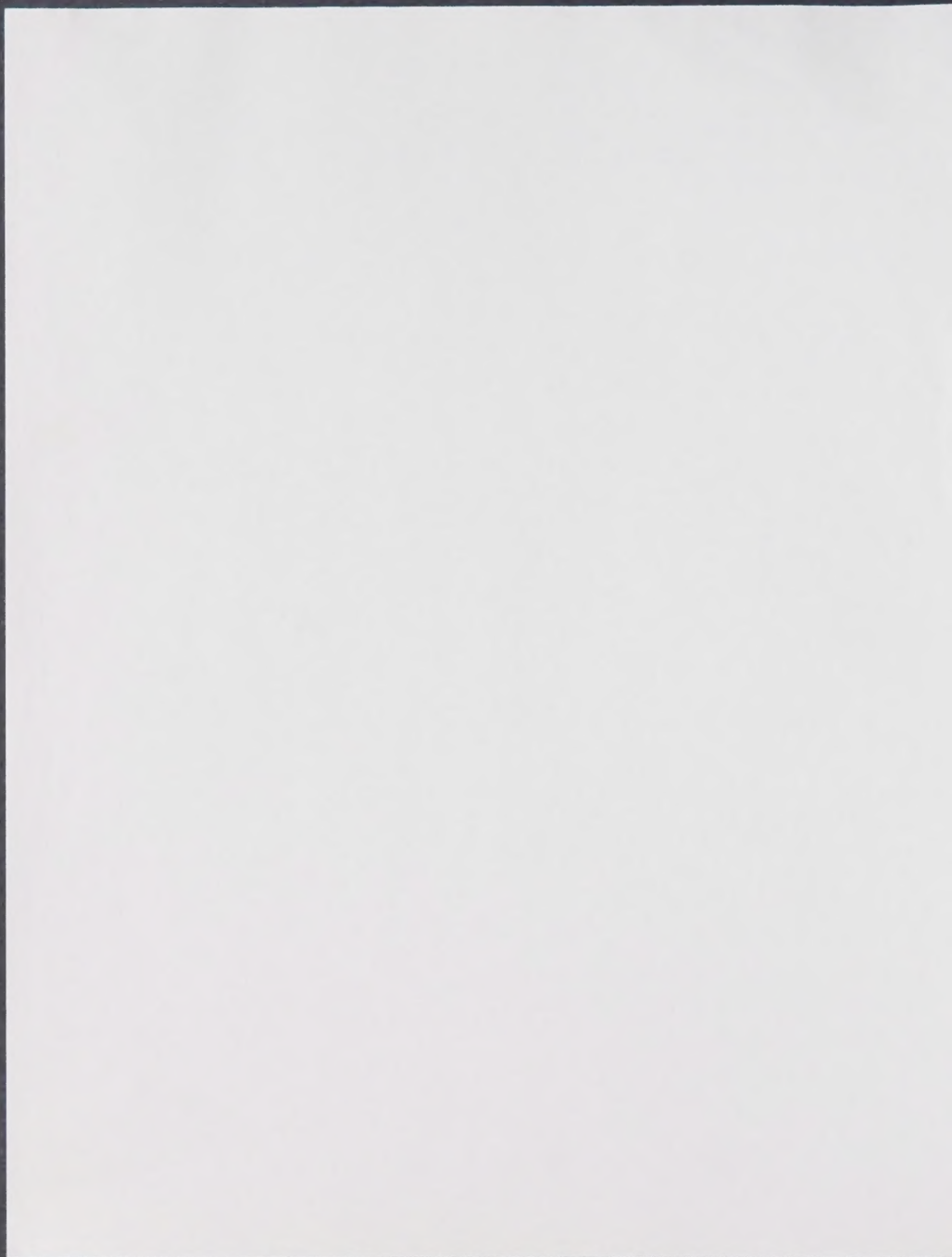

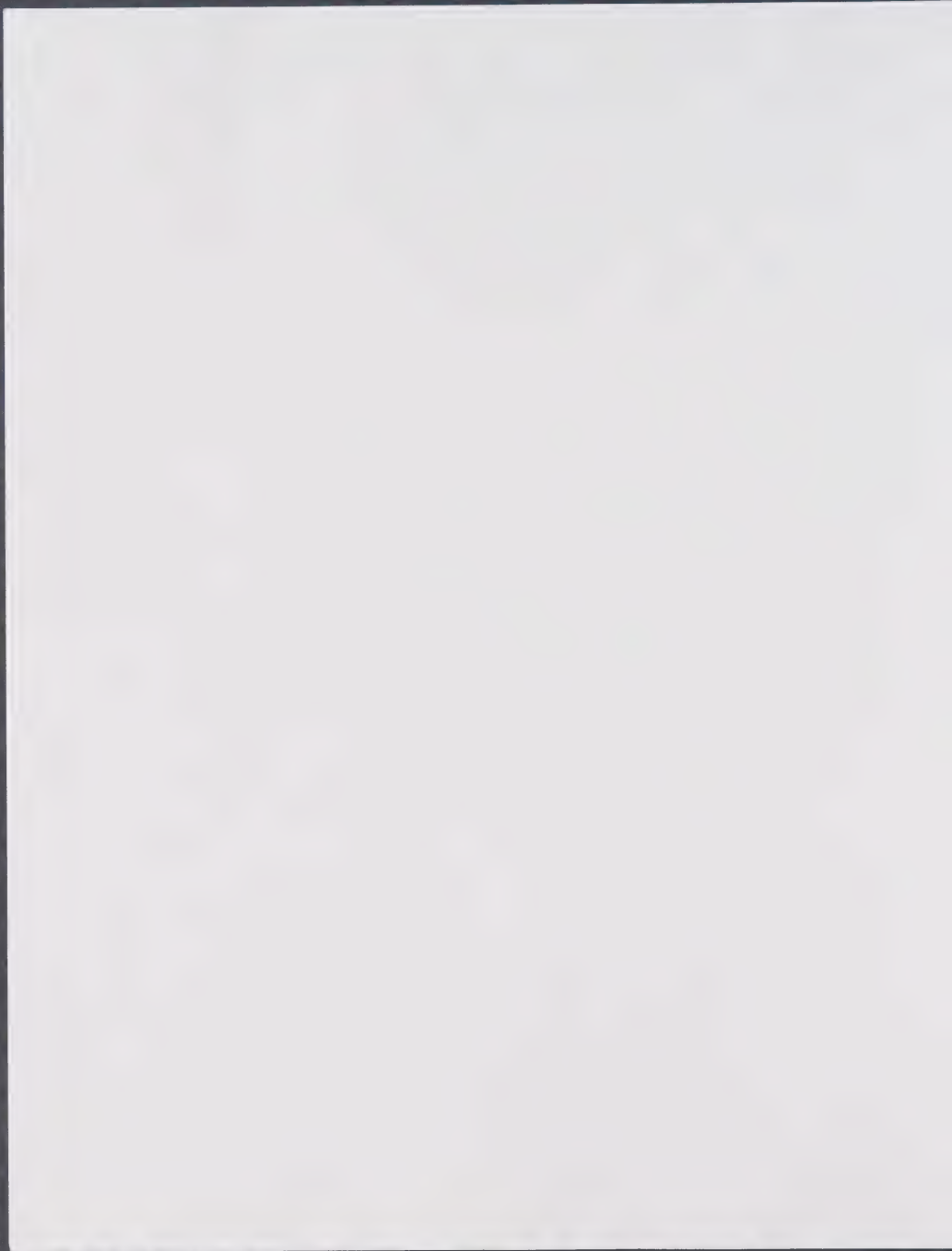
As you will see from the enclosed, we will be staying at a guest suite of Victoria University, close to the campus.


Dear Dr. Bader,

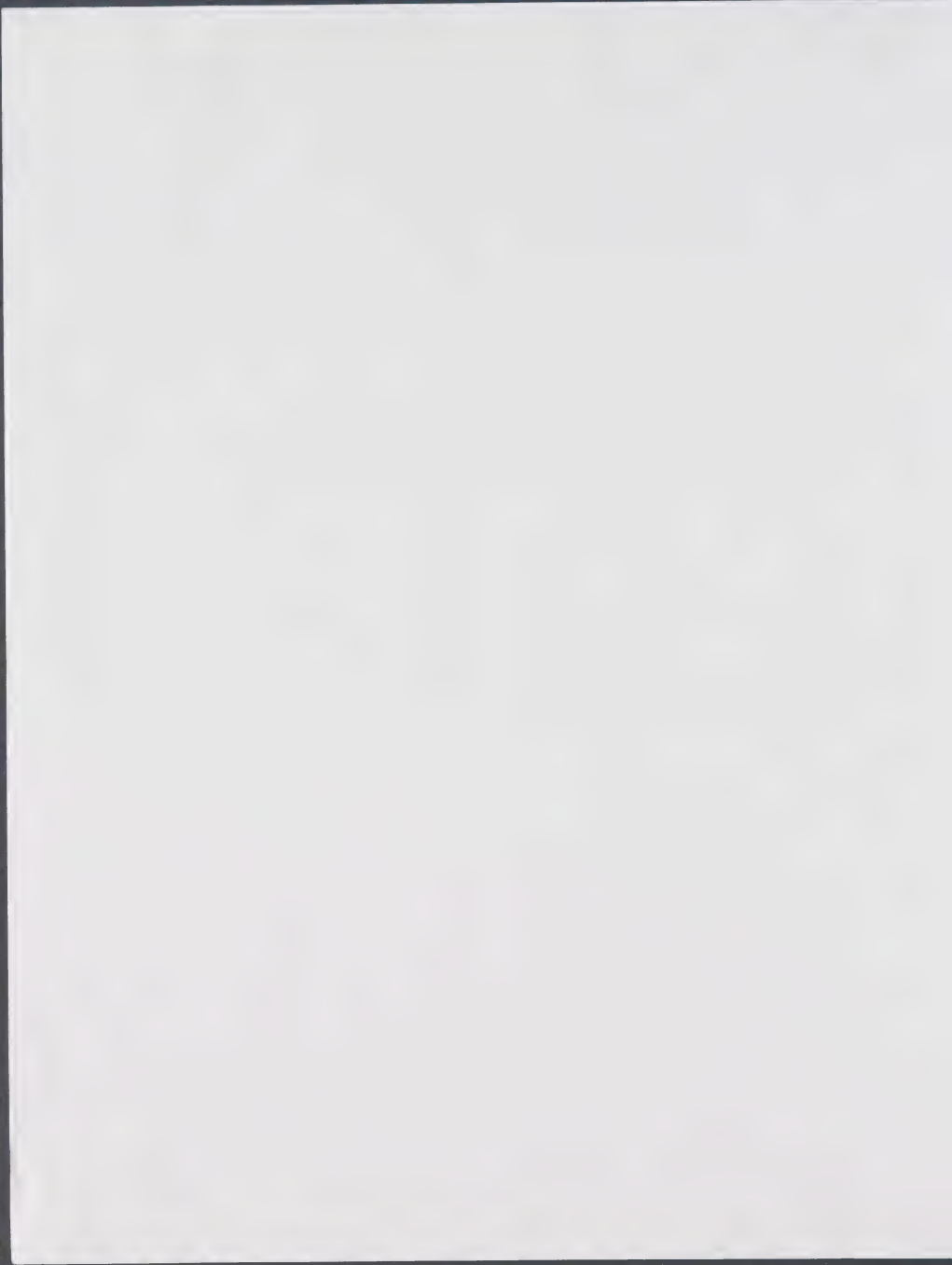

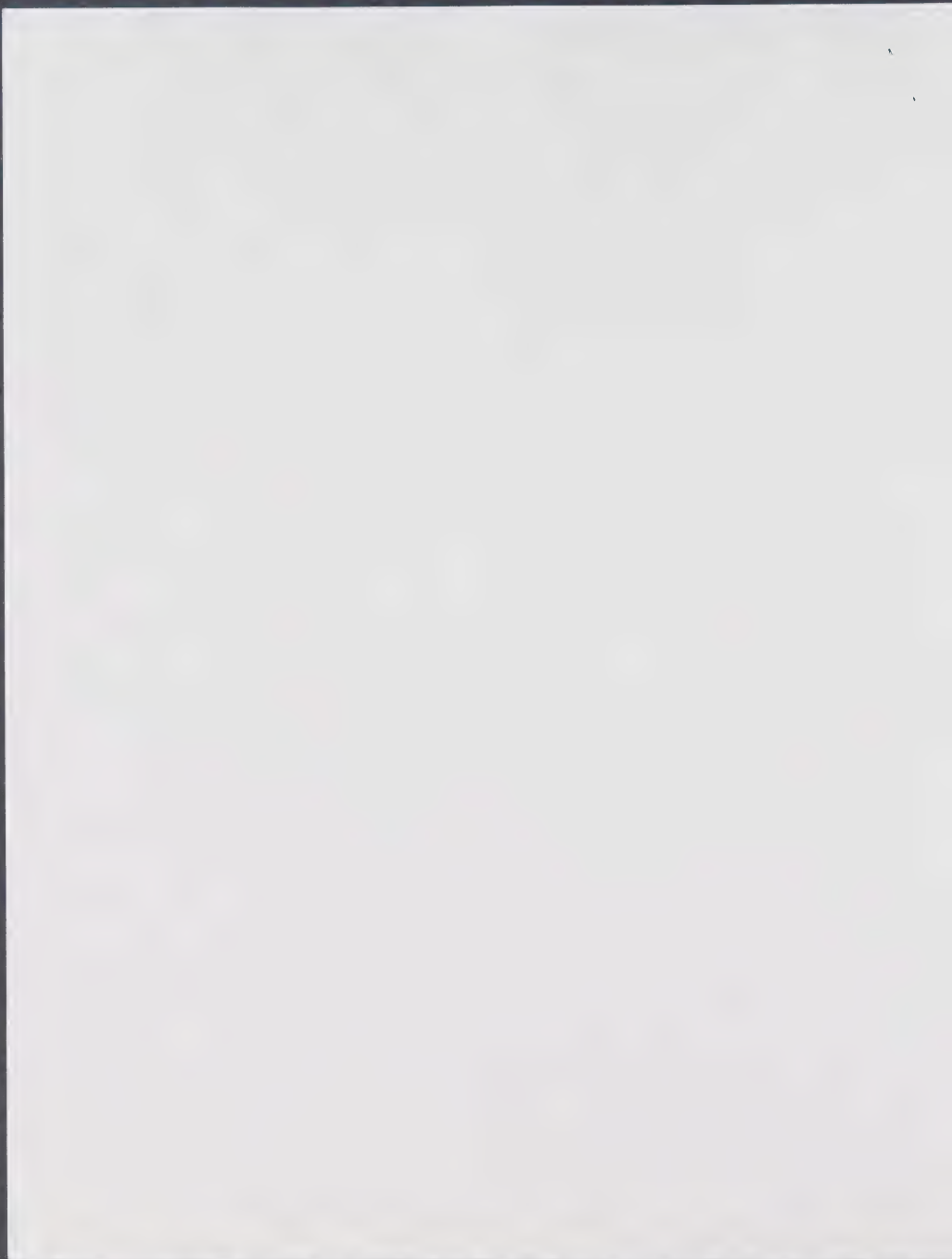

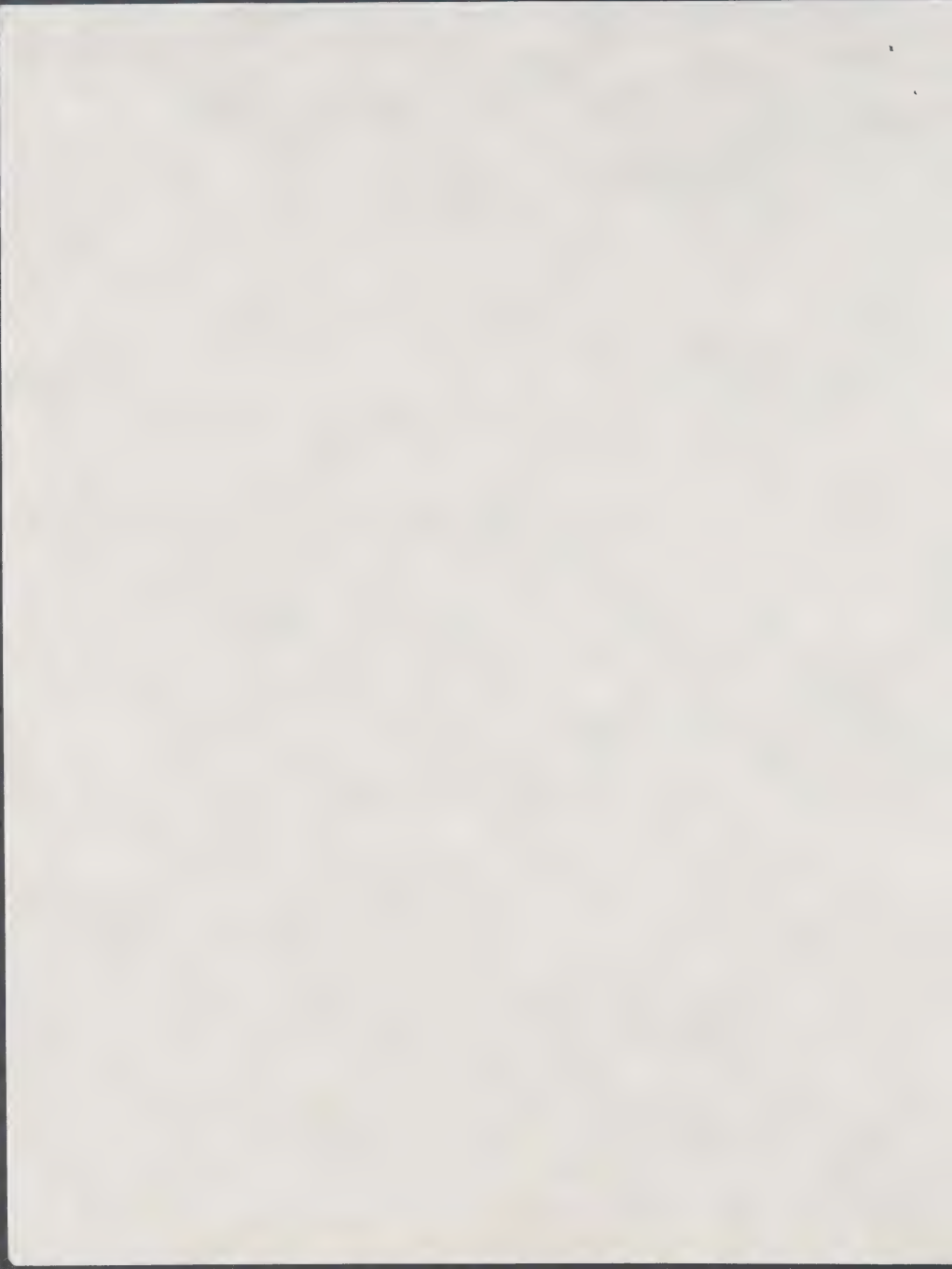

I am sorry that a speaking trip to Colorado has delayed my thanking you for your gracious letter of October 27th.

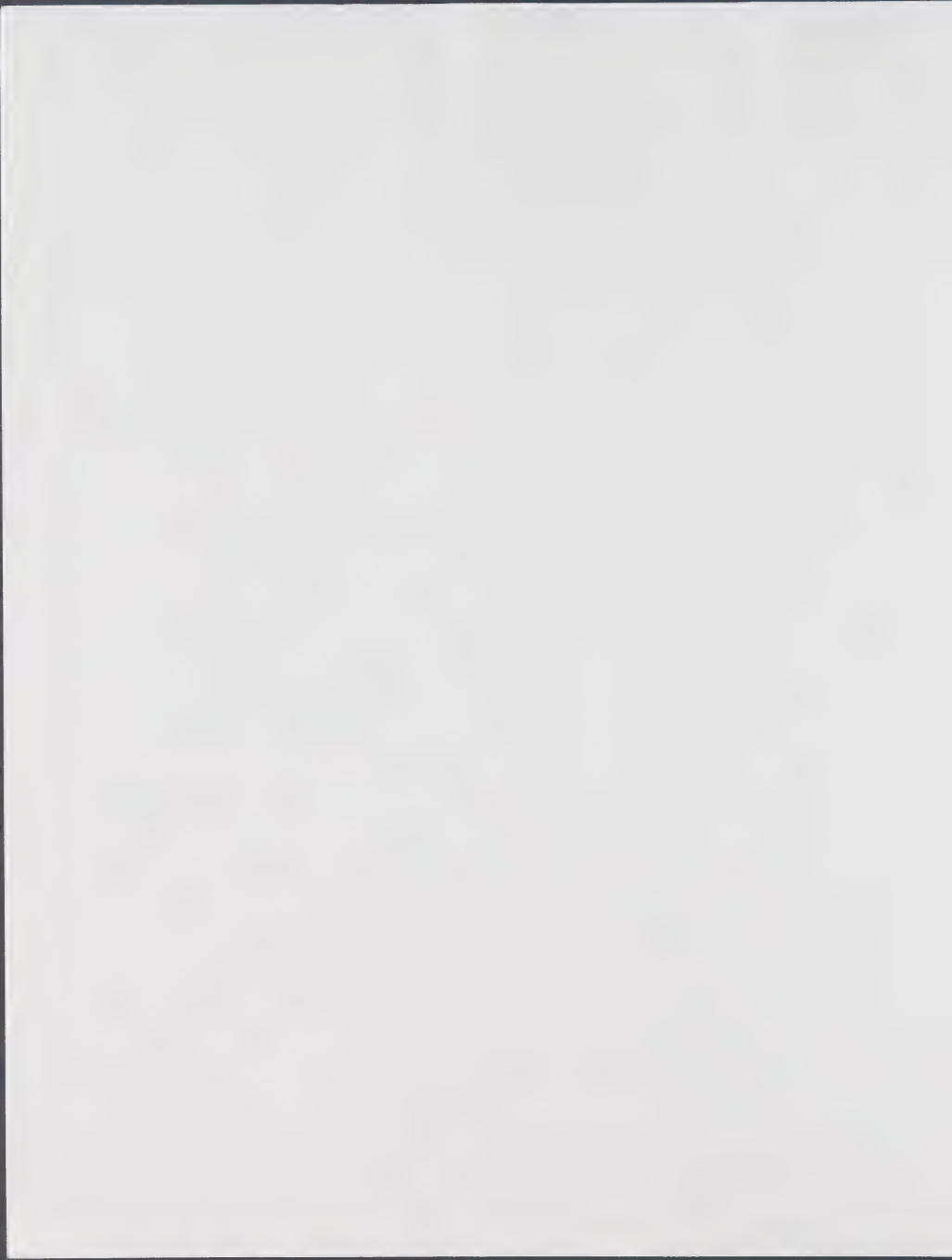

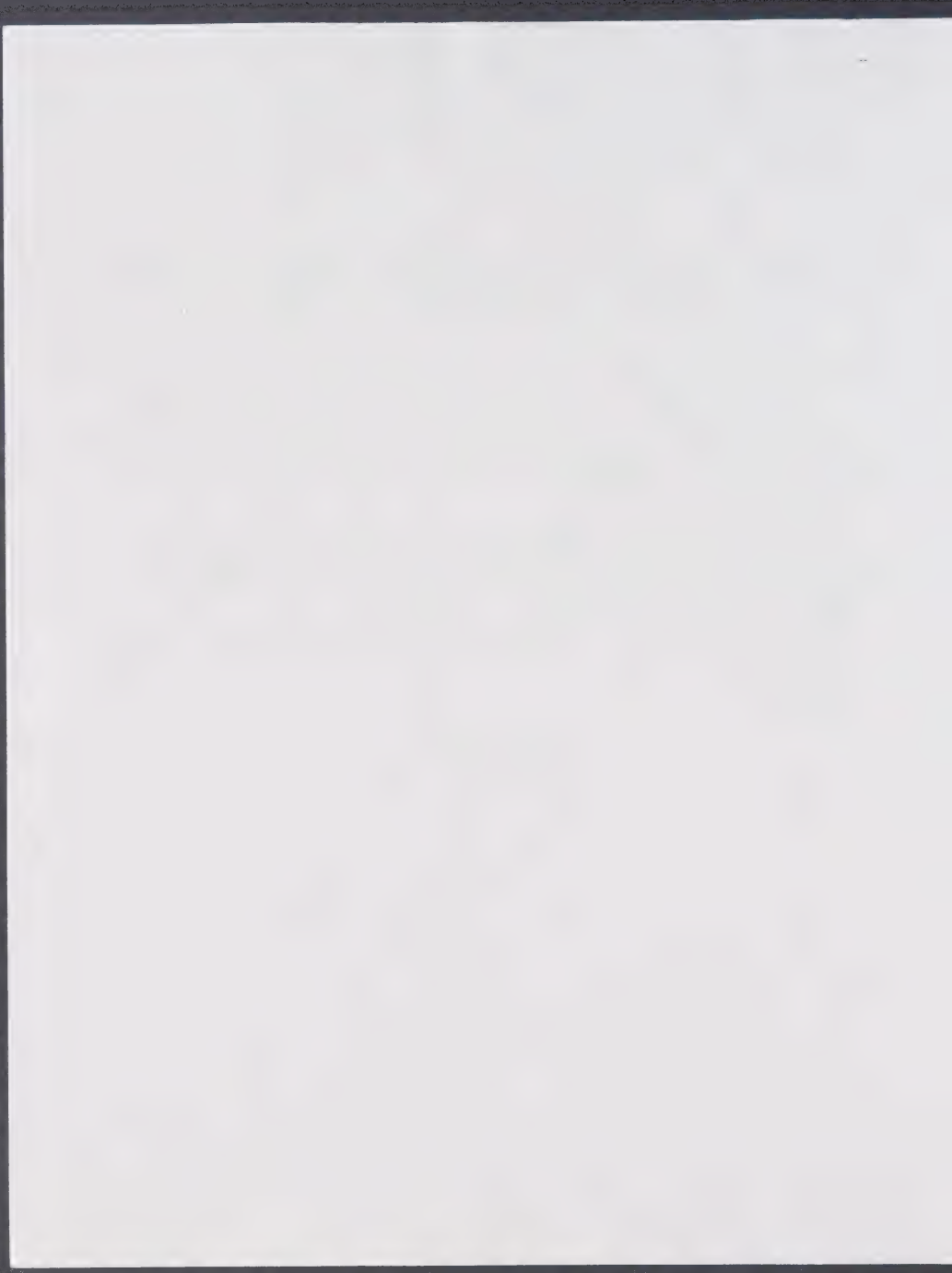

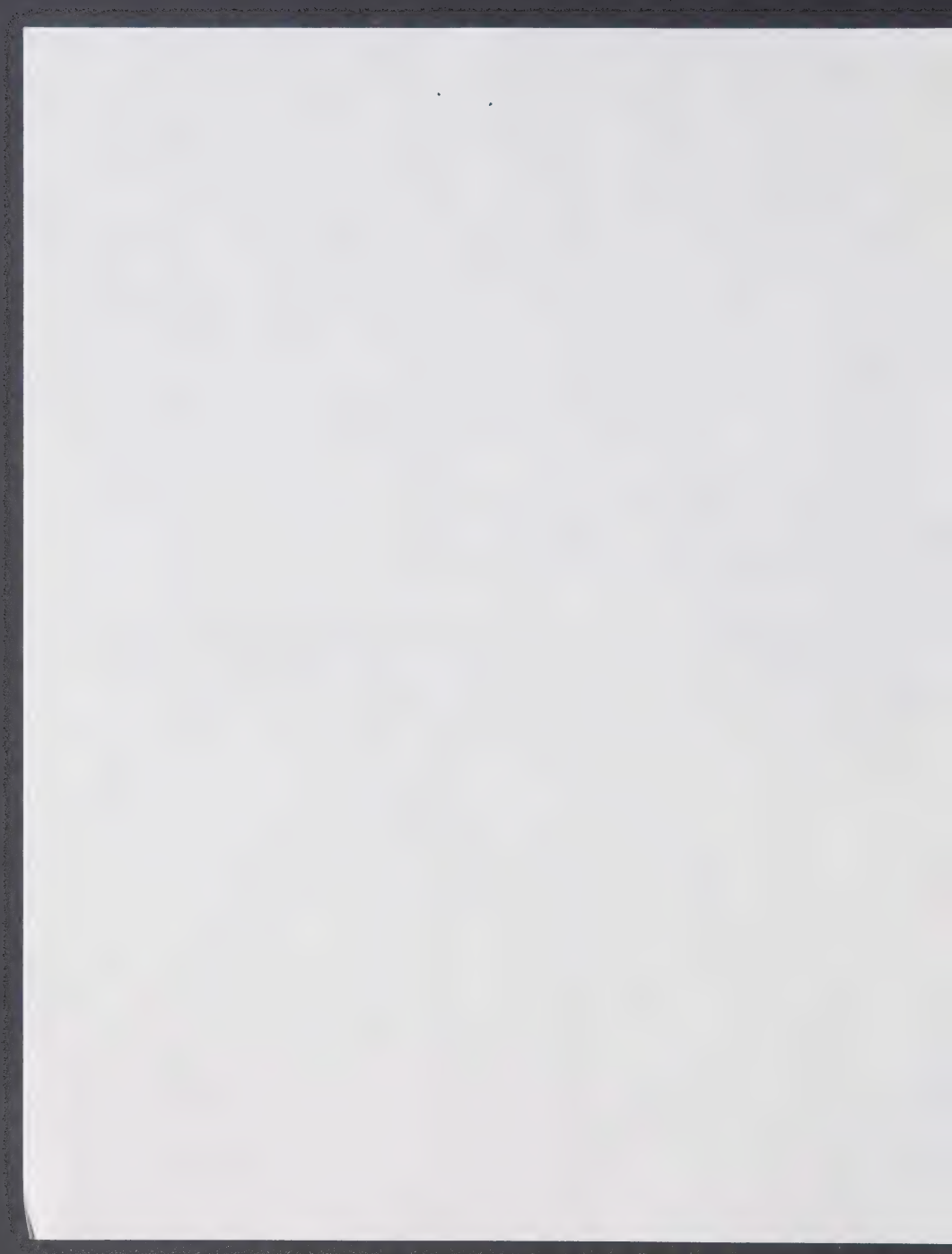
Dear Al,

ARTHUR K. WHELOCK JR.

Curator of Northern Baroque Painting,
National Gallery of Art, Washington

One of the Museum's best-loved speakers, Arthur Wheelock most recently lectured at the Museum in December 1995 while his acclaimed Vermeer retrospective was drawing record-breaking crowds at the National Gallery. To inaugurate this major new lecture series, Dr. Wheelock will examine the conviction of the seventeenth-century Dutch that they, like the Israelites, were God's chosen people. This bold assurance found dramatic expression in paintings of biblical subjects by Rembrandt and other Dutch Baroque artists and is reflected in works of art in the Museum's collection. The topic would have fascinated Dr. Abram Kanof, who loved to discover visual evidence of beliefs and customs shared by people from different cultures and religions.

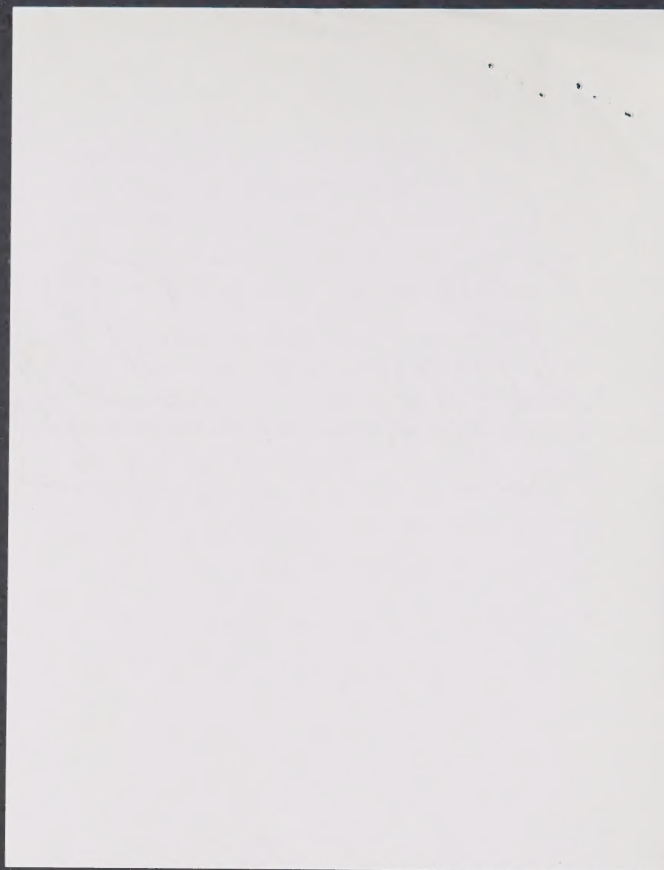
