

Dr. Paleta, on behalf of the Department of Organic Chemistry of the Institute for Chemical Technology in Prague will accept a grant from the Foundation for a Civil Society in New York (funded through the generosity of Alfred and Isabel Bader) in the amount of 10,000.00 USD. This is the first of three annual grants to be provided to the Department to assist Dr. Miloslav Nič. The Department of Organic Chemistry shall retain 10% (1,000.00 USD) of this and subsequent grants for administration of this award. The remaining 9,000.00 USD of each award will be provided to Dr. Nič to spend at his discretion as follows:

- small-scale equipment needed by himself and his students;
- chemicals for himself and his students;
- travel grants to send students to chemical meetings;
- travel grants to chemical meetings for himself;
- payments to students in the form of scholarships or payment for summer work.

II.

Dr. Nič will have until December 31, 2000 to spend the first \$9,000 grant; until December 31, 2001 to spend the second \$9,000 grant; and until December 31, 2002 to spend the third \$9,000 grant. Dr. Nič will be responsible for financial reporting of the expenditure of these funds, and will submit financial reports to the Foundation for a Civil Society in New York according to the following schedule:



1. **Fund for Understanding and Hope**, \$1,925, for international travel related to the preparation of a grant proposal to PHIARE for a large Roma project entitled "Infocentrum Demokracia."
2. **Information Center for Foundations and Other Not-for-Profit Organizations**, \$204, for training regional public library employees to provide basic information for and about the nonprofit sector.

18. **Fund for Understanding and Hope**, \$2,264, for assistance in supporting operating expenses for 1997.
19. **HOST Foundation**, \$2,434, for a bridging grant to pay for operating expenses in November and December 1996.
20. **R- Mosty Association**, \$1,370, for organizational cooperation in "Education Towards Tolerance and Against Racism" lecture series in Prague schools.
21. **Prague Organization of People in Wheel Chairs**, \$670, for US lecturer's fees in media training for organizations cooperating in assisting the handicapped.
22. **New School Foundation**, \$2,112, to continue funding a Romany tutor at an elementary school in Ústí nad Labem to assist Roma children achieve the same skill levels as their non-Roma peers.
23. **Dr. Rajko Djuri Foundation**, \$215, for a competition of Roma children in their knowledge of Romani vocabulary.

29. **Czech Helsinki Citizens Assembly - Roma Section**, \$1,666, for a bridging grant for a two month period ending on September 30, 1997. This grant would allowed the organization to continue operating until it received a large grant from the European Commission.

The first part of the paper discusses the importance of the study and the objectives of the research. It highlights the need for a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter and the role of the researcher in this process. The second part of the paper focuses on the methodology used in the study, detailing the data collection methods and the analytical techniques employed. The third part of the paper presents the results of the study, discussing the findings and their implications for the field. The final part of the paper concludes the study, summarizing the key points and offering suggestions for future research.

The study was conducted over a period of six months, during which time a large amount of data was collected and analyzed. The results of the study are presented in the following sections, and it is hoped that they will provide a valuable contribution to the understanding of the subject matter.

In conclusion, the study has shown that there is a need for further research in this area, and that the findings of this study can be used to inform future research and practice. The authors would like to thank the funding agency for their support, and the participants for their contribution to the study.

I am sending you accounting information for our very successful undertaking of the winter educational camp for children and young people entitled "Jewish Family" by our organization, which thematically followed-up on the analagous program undertaken last year. We were able to undertake this immense project through the financial support of Dr. and Mrs. Bader and the Foundation for a Civil Society. This project was realized 12/27/97 - 2/3/98 in Dolni Becevi. Throughout the day, the participants are involved in tourist (for example, Dr. Sigmund Freud's family home is very near) and sport activities. The dinners are very educational - a series of lectures on Judaism and instruction in Israeli dance and song. The program was therefore a part of the continuation of the year-round educational activities of the Jewish Society. Your grant was used to pay for half of the costs for accomodation and health insurance for the children - the remaining was covered by the participants themselves. The program incorporates 34 individuals.

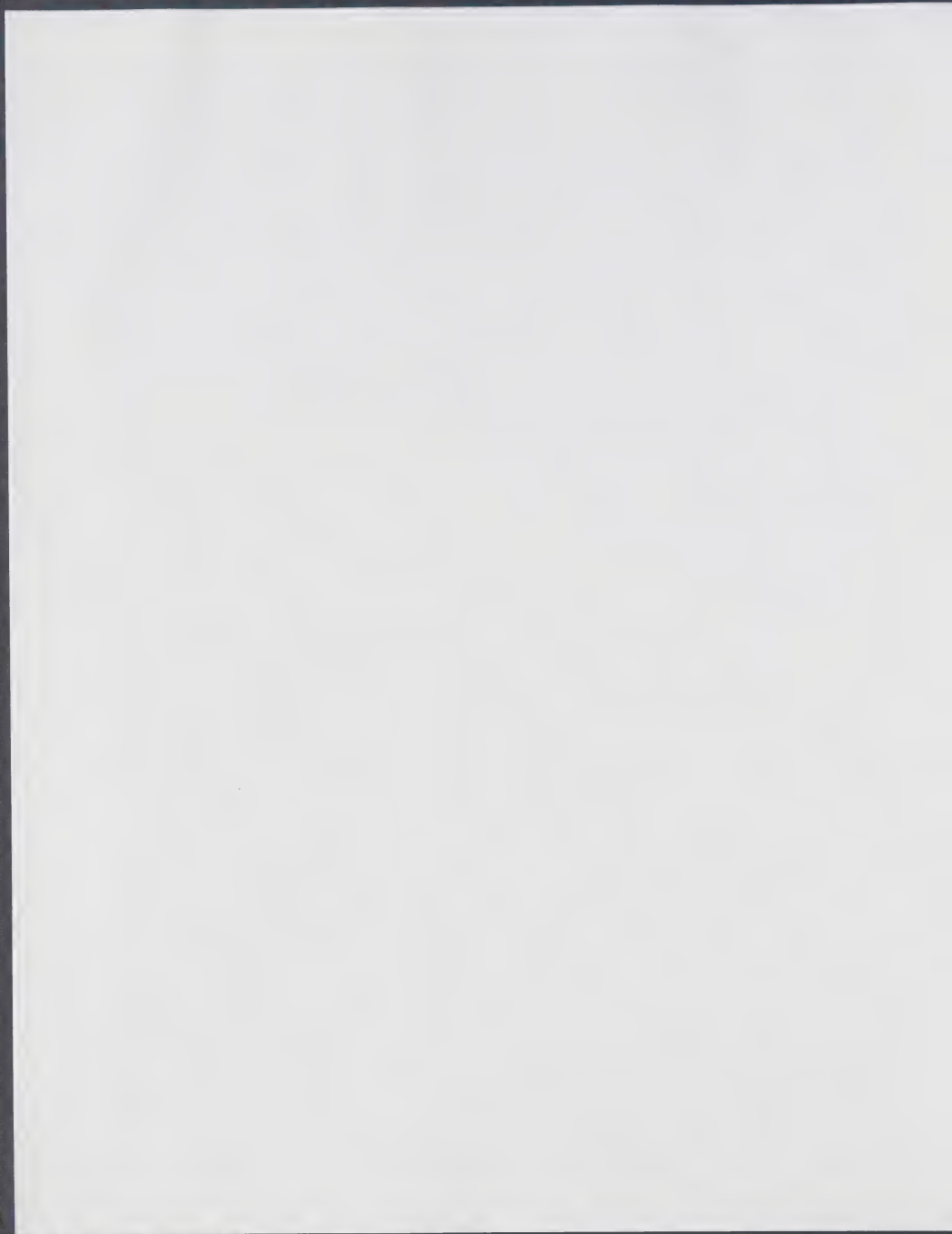

We thank you for your generosity, as well as to Dr. Bader and we hope, that this arrangement will meet your demands.

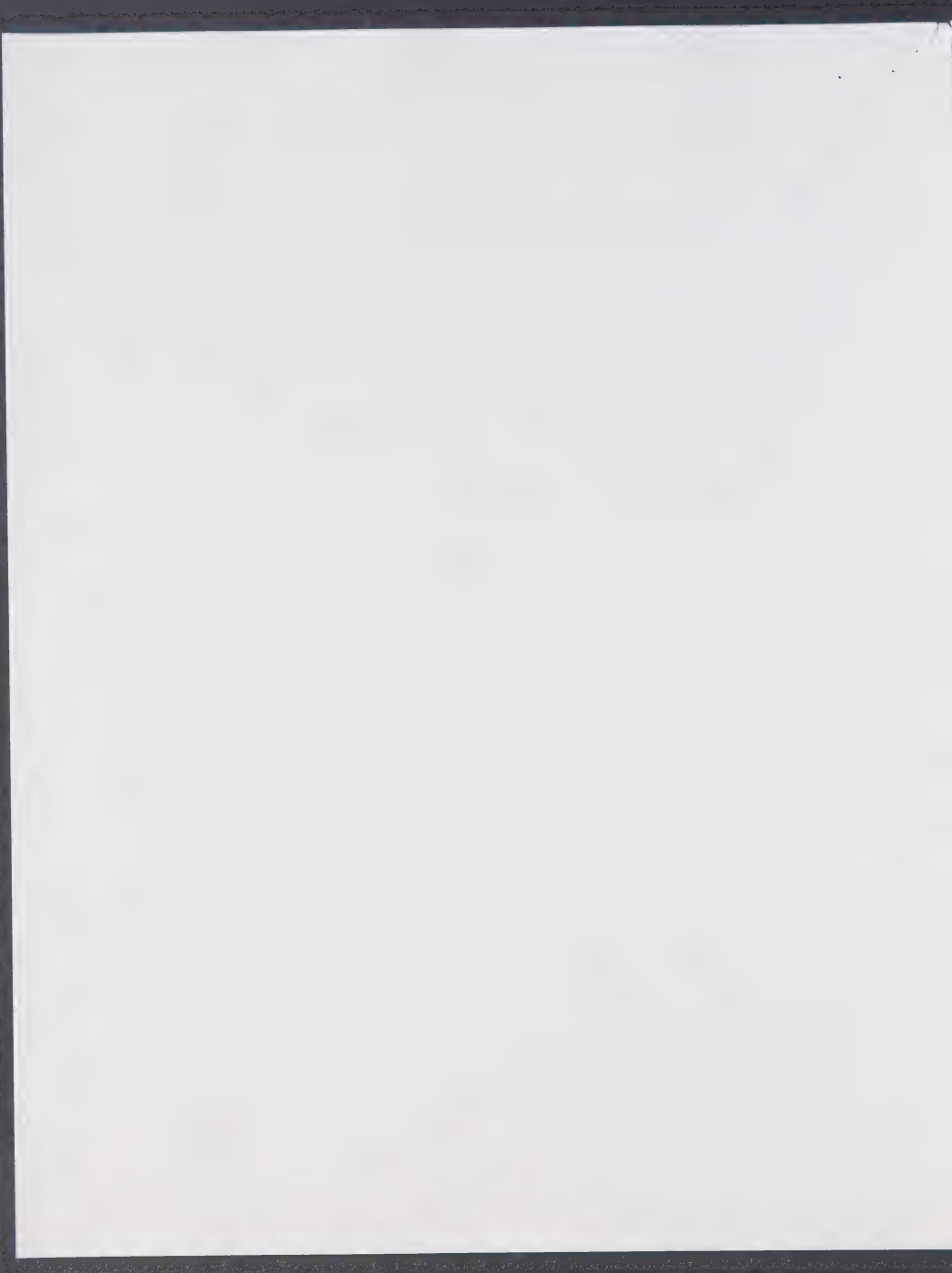

I have the pleasure to inform you that Czech Chemical Society has reserved for the deposit for "Alfred Bader Award" an account in the bank. The address and the number are as follows:

I was contacted by Dr. Z. Brož who informed me about the preparation of a law about non-profitable organizations. Incomes of such organizations, e.g. Czech Chem. Society etc., would not be taxed. The proposal of the law will be submitted to parliament in early 1994.

Since our meeting in June 1993 I have tried to inform you completely about all problems, uncertainties and possible risks connected with the Award, especially with its future. The people involved tried to find the most safe way. As a result of this effort of the Chem. Society was the proposal of "A. Bader Foundation", which not acceptable for you. The second variant, i.e. direct deposit in the Chem. Society can be save. However, it must be considered that the Chem. Society can completely separate from the Academy of Sciences; probably, in this "divorce" there will be no division of all bank accounts.

My personal wish is to assist in creation of the award of highest prestige. I am of opinion the prestige will also be connected with the financial part of the Award. The sum of 100,000 Czech crowns is sufficiently high at present time, but could become negligible after ten years. To avoid such situation I am of opinion that the Award has to follow the year inflation. If such conception will be accepted it is necessary: 1) to increase the initial deposit, 2) stepwise increase the basic deposit from year to year with superfluous yield from interest. I consulted this problem with several experts. It can be concluded that the initial deposit of 60,000 USD can secure excellent function of "Alfred Bader Award" for ever. This is my personal proposal.

I hope you will receive this letter in UK.

I would like to wish you and your wife Merry Christmas and a Very Happy New Year.

CHALUPECKY AWARD

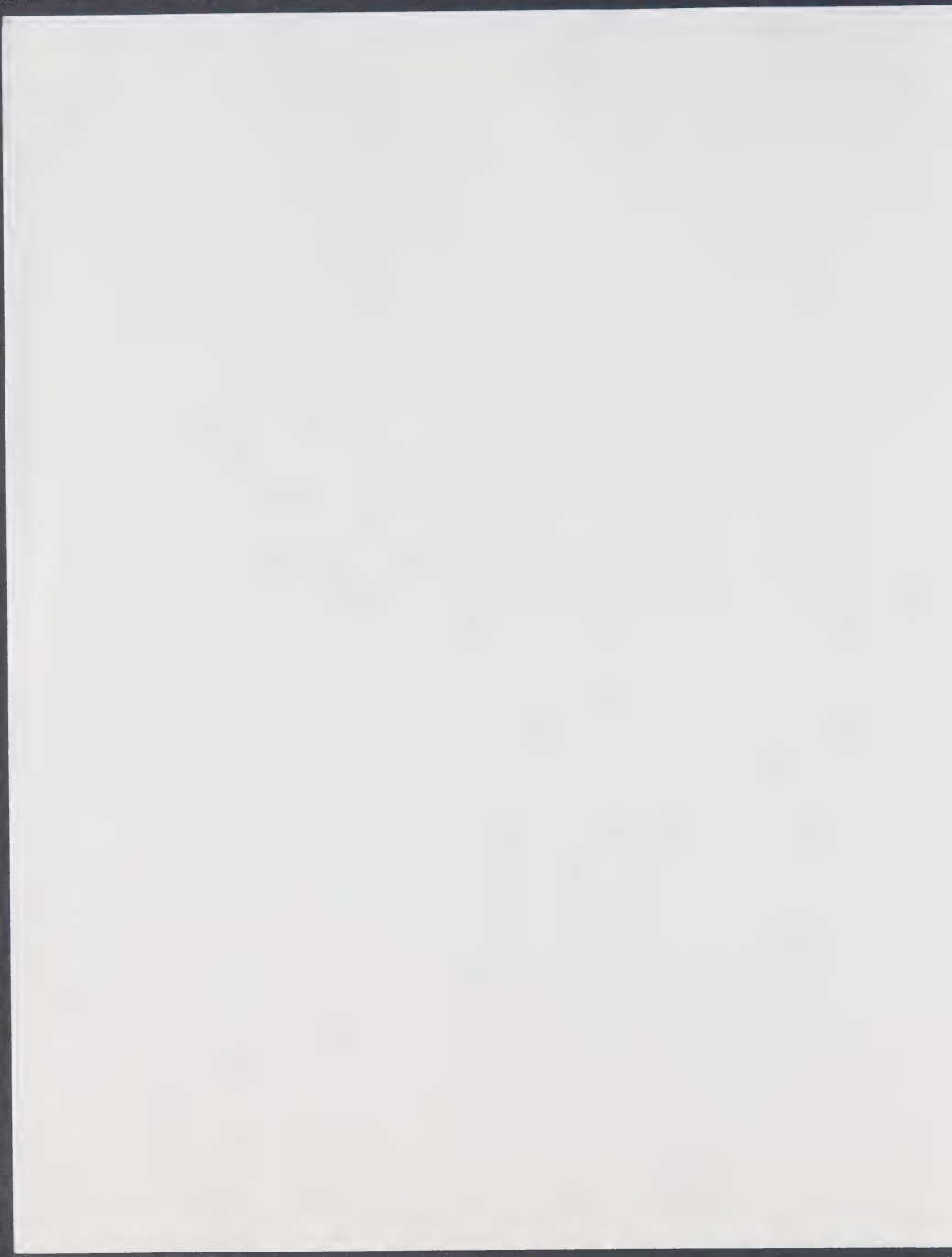
The Foundation for a Civil Society has been supporting the Chaluppecky Award since the award's inception in 1990. The fine arts competition takes place in the Czech and Slovak Republics run by a Czech and Slovak board and jury. The winner is chosen in autumn and is presented the award by President Havel in November.

Through The Foundation for a Civil Society, the award winner receives a grant for a three-month study stay at the Headlands Center for the Arts in Sausalito, California. Headlands is an artists colony, located on a 13,000 acre section of the Golden Gate Recreation Area, overlooking San Francisco Bay. The purpose of this stay is to stimulate the artist's creative growth and expand his or her contacts in the international art community.

Jennifer Dowley, the Executive Director of the Headlands, stated in a 1992 letter: "I must admit that at first we were slightly uneasy about not having any say on the selection of people we have never met and who know little about Headlands. But they have been just superlative in their selection of artists. We have been so pleased with both artists, Vladimir Kokolia and Frantisek Skala!"

The 1992 winner, Michal Nesazal, is in California currently, and our fourth Chaluppecky award winner will be announced shortly.

Isabel and I will be in Prague from the 12th to the 16th of June and certainly look forward to visiting your office.



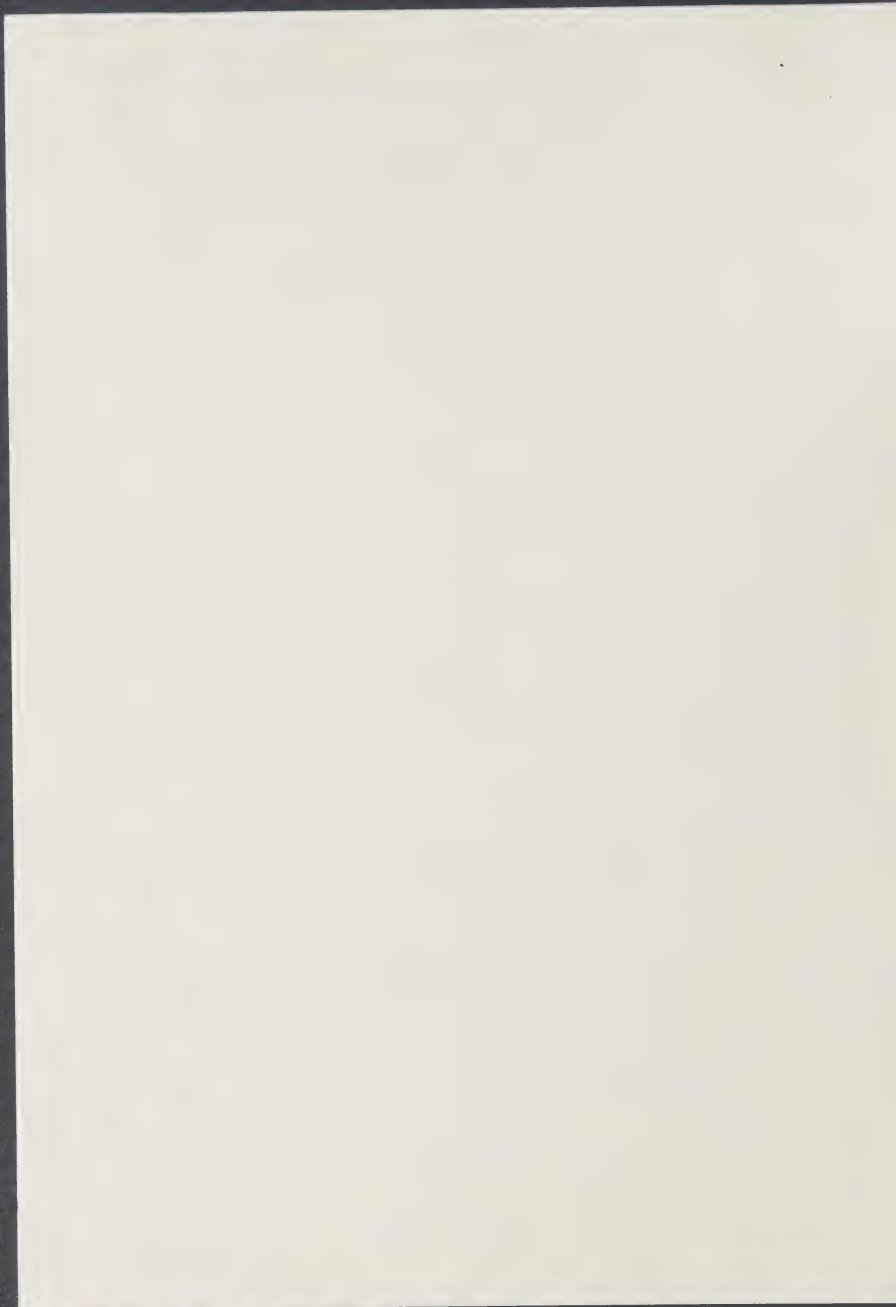

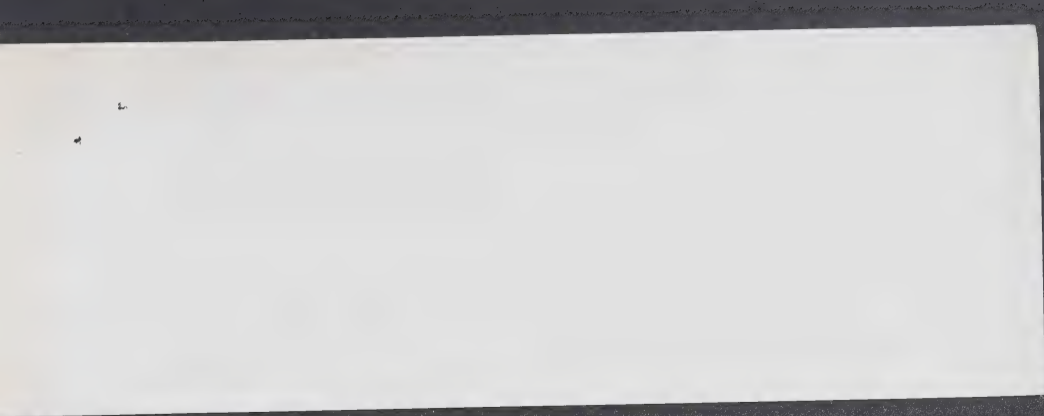
As you know, we established a fellowship for Czech students at Harvard--for one student every year--and I was happy to learn that Harvard has found a very competent student for this year.

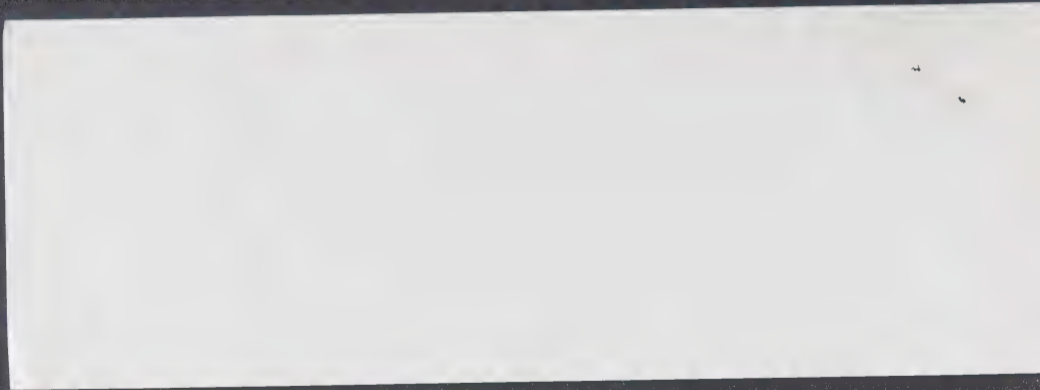


Thank you for your letter of April 22nd, and thank you especially for the kind contribution of \$5,000.00 (check no. 120) of the same date from the Isabel and Alfred Bader Foundation. I can assure you that these funds for general support for the Foundation for a Civil Society will allow us to carry on our work in the Czech Republic. We are extremely grateful and know that this gift will allow us to continue to help Czechs help themselves.

I also wanted to inform you that following your letter of April 22nd, we have been in touch with Dr. Paleta and with chemistry societies in Canada, the United States and Britain. I am happy to say that the societies have been extremely helpful and their materials will help the Czech society to avoid starting from scratch. 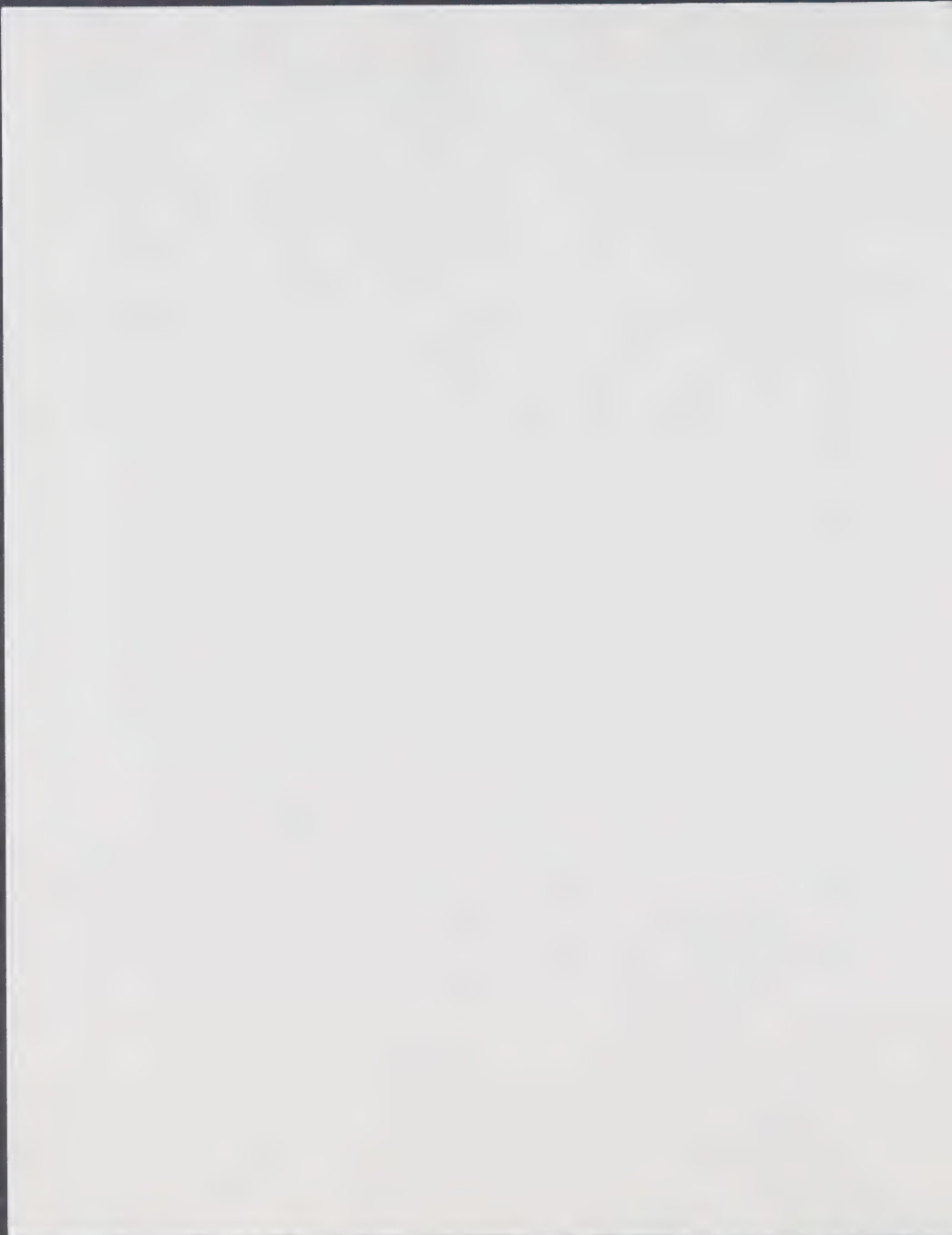

I am sorry that a speaking tour to Tennessee has delayed my thanking you for your long fax of April 8th.


Everything seems to be going well with the fellowships for the Baroque Art Historians in the Czech Republic, but I am somewhat taken aback by the red tape involved in the Bader Award for chemists. Talk about reinventing the wheel. If only Professor Paleta took counsel with any of the western chemical societies, say, the American Chemical Society or the Canadian Chemical Society or the Royal Society of Chemistry in Britain, each of which has one or two Bader awards, they would find in what an easy and laid back manner these societies select competent chemists for the awards.

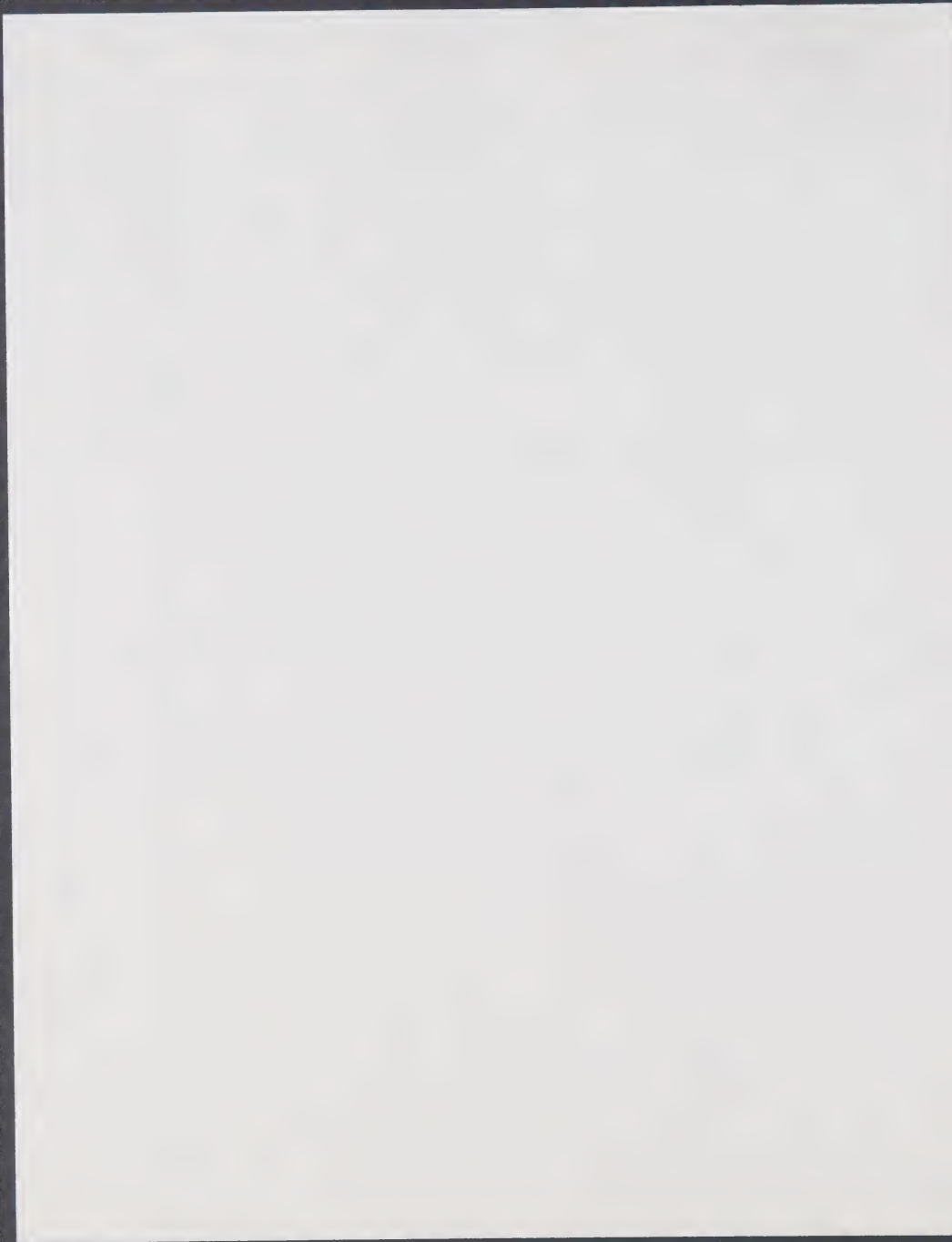
The only specific concern I have about the award process is that the award might be given to a Czech national working permanently outside of the Czech Republic. Clearly, the award is meant to honor chemists working in the Czech Republic. If they happen to be on a guest professorship for a year abroad, that should not matter, but if it is a Czech national who has emigrated, then he should not receive the award.

Also, I have never heard about members of professional societies working on committees receiving stipends to reimburse them for the work. The sum, which must be less than 10,000 crowns, is small, but that extra 10,000 crowns was meant for travel expenses and a scroll or plaque for the winner. I will discuss all this with Professor Paleta and Elizabeth Suing when in Prague.

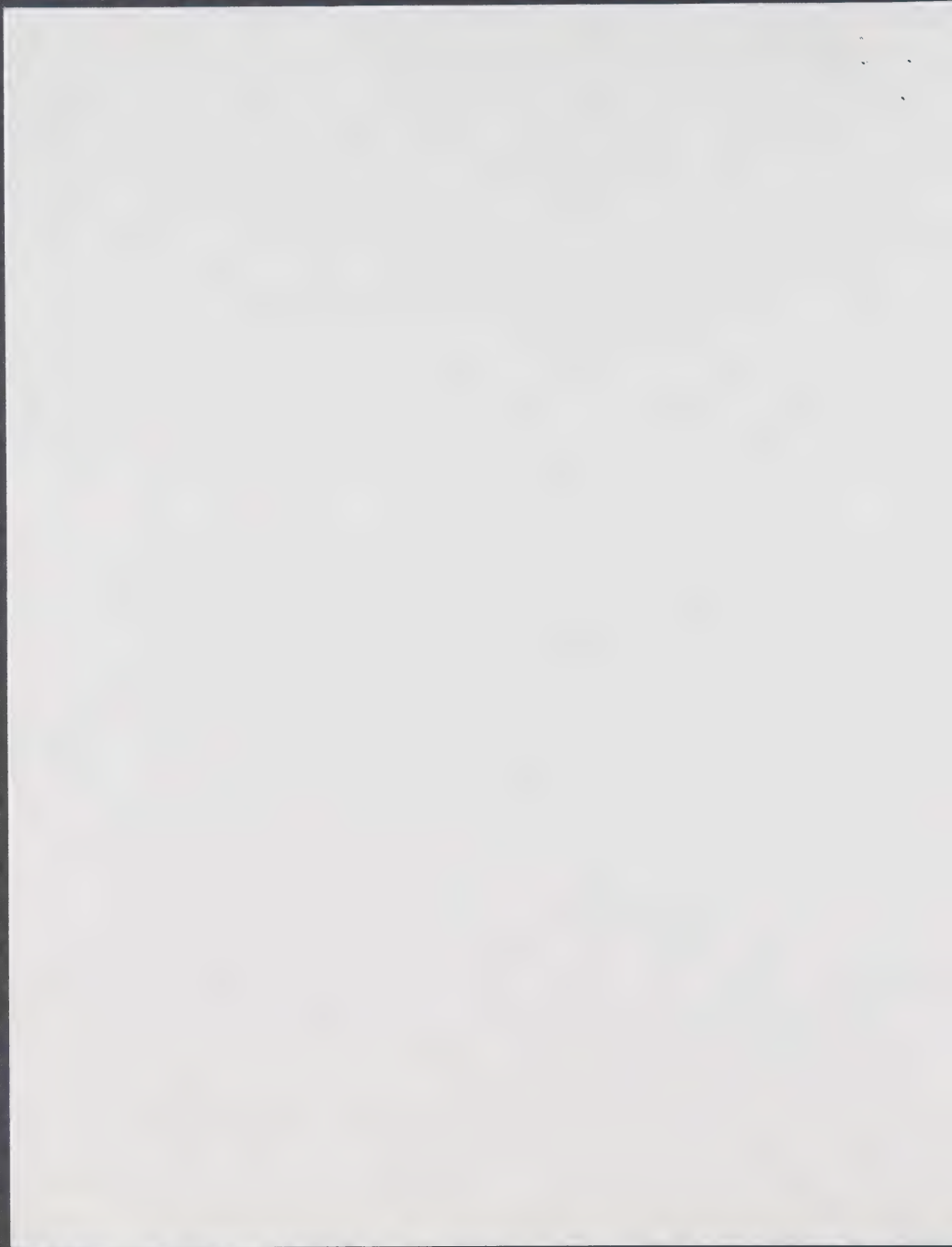
Dear Professor Paleta and Dr. Drasar:

I am so happy to have your detailed fax of January 23rd regarding the Alfred Bader Award in Organic and Bioorganic Chemistry. To turn to your seven points:

1. I would like to make payment through the Foundation for a Civil Society. My wife and I met with three officers of the foundation in New York on January 11th and were very impressed by their competence and true care for the Czech Republic. As soon as you fax me "go ahead," I will turn over to the foundation the dollar equivalent of 330,000 Czech crowns, and you will receive Cc110,000 each in 1994, 1995 and 1996. This will relieve you of worrying about investment, currency fluctuations, etc.
4. After careful consideration, we would like to set the age limit at 35.
5. This is the most important point. It is vital that the award is and be perceived as based purely on merit. Thus, the competition procedure and the composition of the panel judging the chemists nominated must be announced to the members of the Czech Chemical Society at the time that you announce the award. Obviously I don't want to censor your procedure, but want to tell you that if you put onto the panel mainly older chemists who were active in the Communist apparatus, then younger chemists will be suspicious that the award will be given on a "friendship basis" rather than on merit.

If you would like to discuss how best to set up the award procedure, do discuss this with Ms. Elizabeth Suing at the Prague office of the Foundation for a Civil Society or Ms Hannah Evans in the New York office.

Please send to the foundation and to me copies of all your announcements of the award.




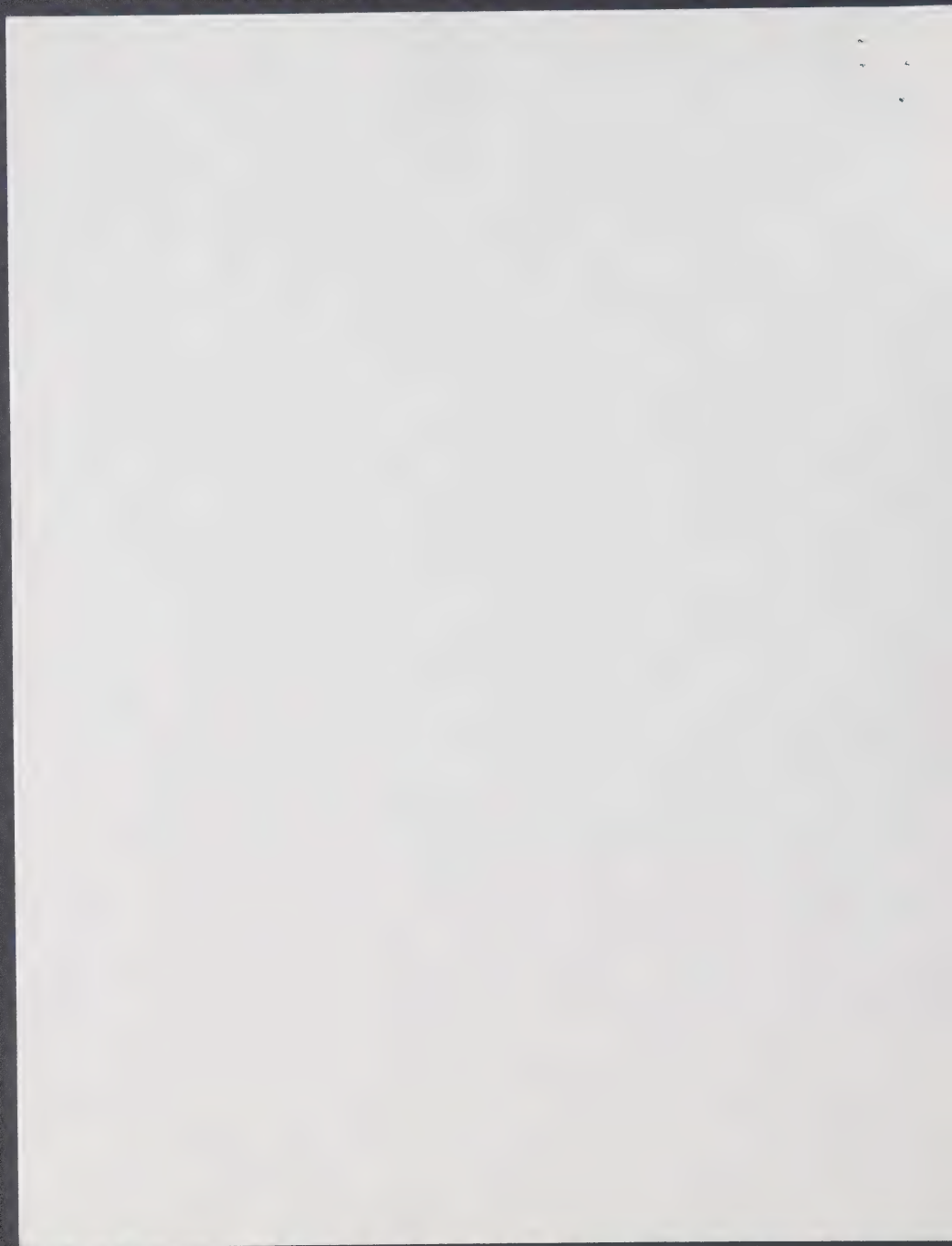

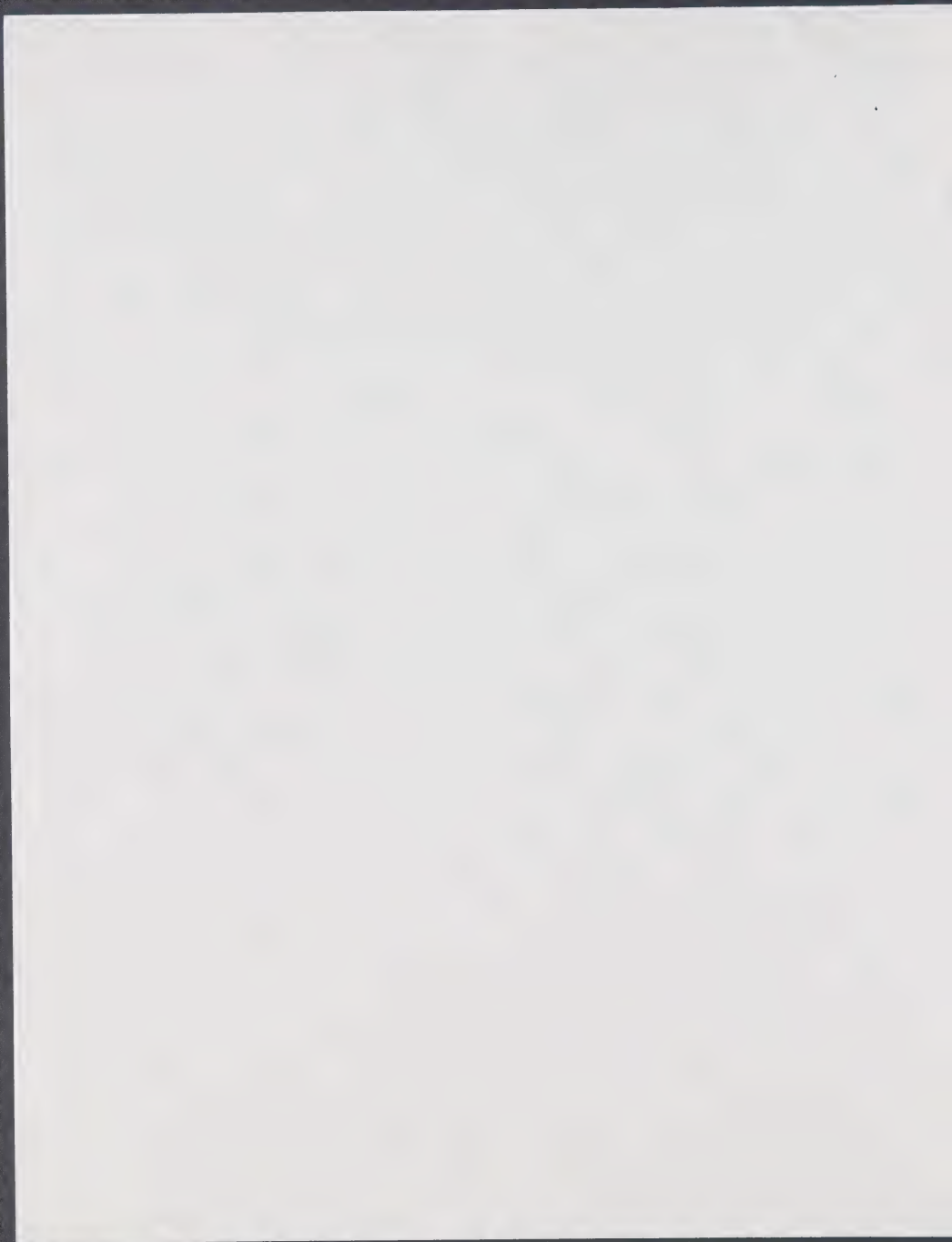
thank you for your letter with the new ideas about your proposal of establishing the Alfred Bader Award for young organic or bioorganic chemist from the Czech Republic.

We all appreciate your generous wish, which will definitely help us in maintaining the level of common appreciation of chemistry, as well as to stimulate young, talented and potent Czech organic chemists. However, as the rumors about your Award are growing and people are creating a real bias, we were authorized by the Chemical Society Presidium to communicate with you with the straight horizon of the final decision. You know both of us personally for some time so we feel you can trust our best will.

The Czech Republic is growing in its economic potential and the inflation is relatively under control, so the prognosis of interest level in this country is expecting its lowering, gradually to German level e.g. Even now the long term interests got below 14%. The vision of possible interest tax waiver is not realistic for now.

After rather long and complex discussion in the Presidium there have been accepted several recommendations to you for a very simple solution, which we try to formulate in several points:

- 1) Please deposit the sum you consider appropriate in the Czech crowns for Alfred Bader Award on the account at ČESKA SPORITELNA, PRAHA 1, VACLAVSKE NAM. 42, No. [REDACTED] belonging to the Society (Beneficiary: ČESKA SPOLEČNOST CHEMICKÁ). You can use S.W.I.F.T. transfer or send us a check. Providing you still feel the way through the (Charter 77) Foundation for a Civil Society useful, transfer the money through that channel to the account we have assigned for.
- 2) The sum of 110000 crowns for the 1994 Alfred Bader Award will be used this year, somewhere in the III to IV quarter. For the rest the treasurer of the Chemical Society could find the most safe and most profiting (which does not go hand in hand) place and form of papers. Or, as you have written, it could be deposited with the Foundation. We have no preference.




- 3) If there will arise any possibility of getting rid of the interest tax we will do it in our own interest. Currently, the tax is 15% for a long term deposit interest p.a.
- 4) We have already discussed during your last Prague visit the possible softening of the age limit to 40 for the first two years. Be so kind and advise us your current opinion.
- 5) The Award will be given in your name through the Society. The Society itself and its Division for organic and bioorganic chemistry will establish the scientific committee, as you wish, will organize the competition and all matters connected.
- 6) The amount of money will be more interesting at the beginning. When the Award will become known and prestigious, just the awarding plus the social level created around it will be "the prize", however, the money will talk a little bit, indeed.
- 7) The Alfred Bader Award nominations call for 1994 could be announced in the next Society Bulletin, which is going to be issued in the end of February if you agree.

Be so kind and inform us about your decision, preferably through the above fax.

We all mean it very serious with your proposal and thus we feel uneasy with the time running around.

Also, we are taking the liberty to wish you and your wife Isabel only the best for the year that has started. Thank you for all the care and effort.

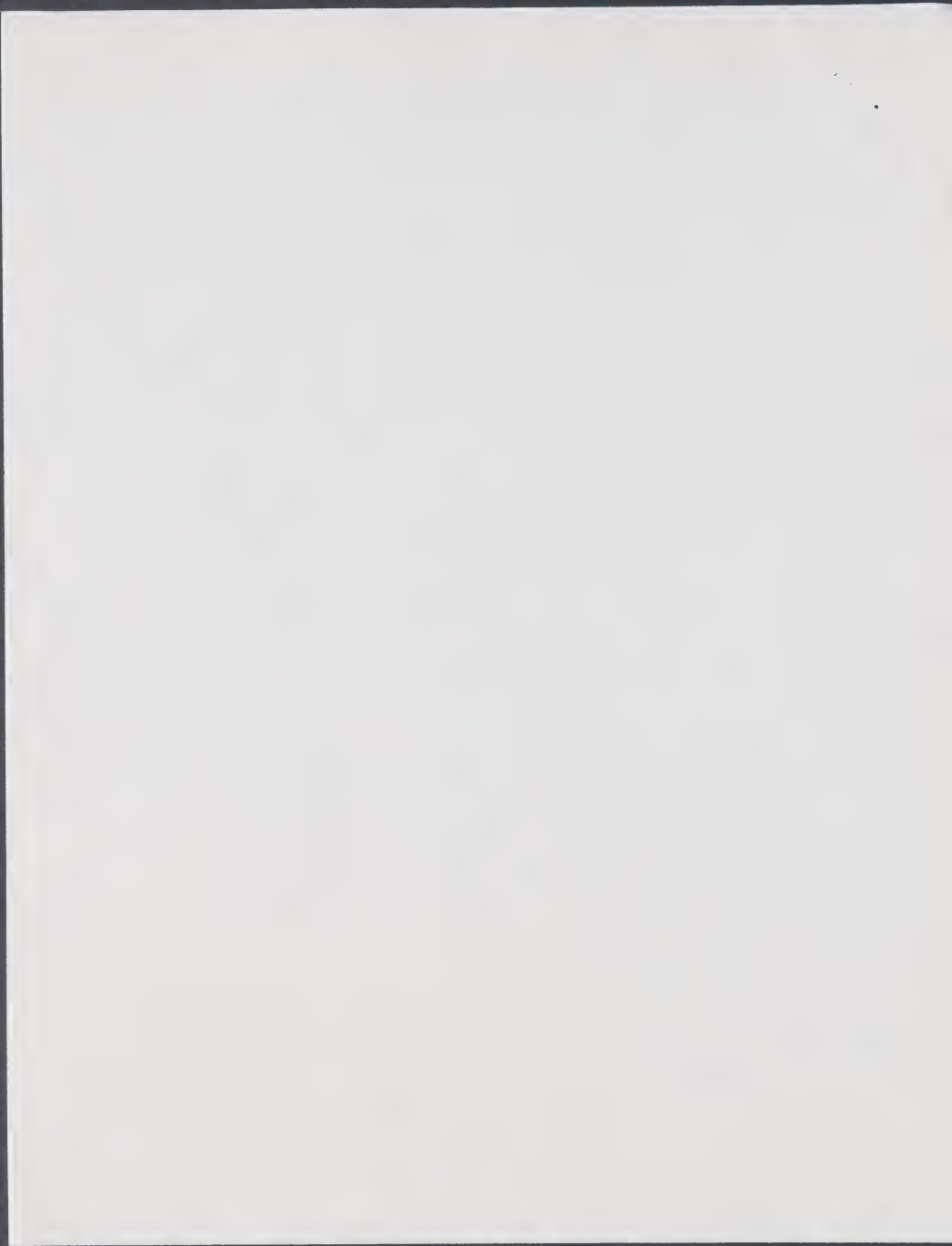

These are for organic chemists at Columbia University, Imperial College London, University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, and Harvard University. The first three are for one student each, every three years. The Harvard fellowship is for one student each year.



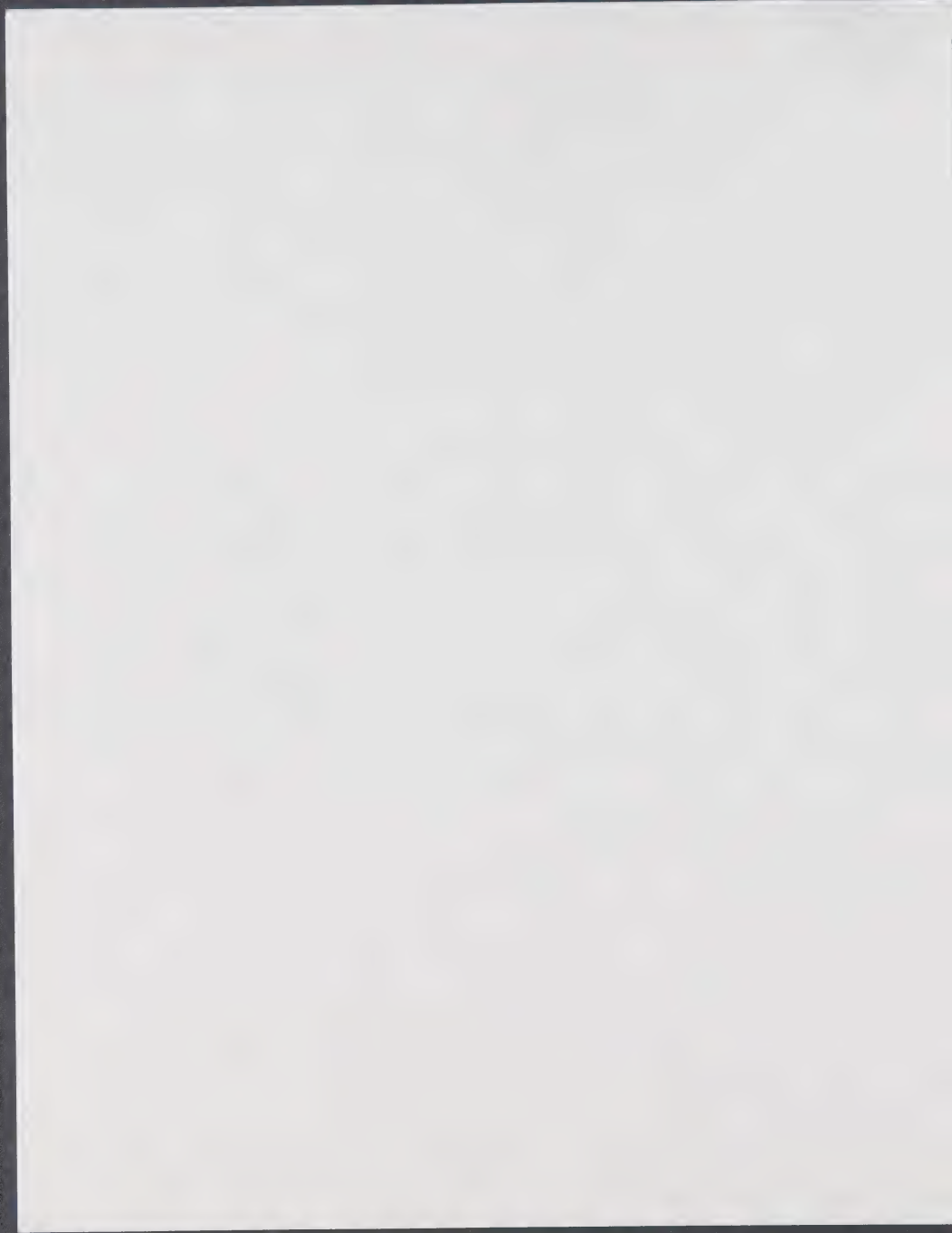
Clearly initially, the University of Pennsylvania needs the most help for the applications which will be sought for this year.

Thank you for your fax which I received today. I think that the letter to Dr. Paleta explains the situation well. If it is possible, I think it would be useful to add a sentence at the end of the second paragraph on the second page as follows:

For your information, Dr. Bader, Elizabeth is the Program Officer in the Czech office who will carry out the liaison work in the Czech Republic on behalf of your various initiatives. I believe she has already contacted Milena Bartlová to offer our assistance and I am confident that we can help to disseminate more broadly the information about the Art History Award.

Additionally, with respect to the establishment of a chair in organic chemistry, I have been making some preliminary enquiries about the administration of the various departments of Organic Chemistry in the Czech Republic. I will, of course, have a much clearer picture in March following my visit, but those Czech chemists with whom I have so far spoken have uniformly agreed that in terms of academic quality, Charles University would be the most appropriate university to create a chair. More difficult are the financial/legal "mechanics" surrounding the establishment of a chair.

Finally, I am looking forward to receiving more information about the fellowships for Czech Ph.D. students in Chemistry at Columbia, Penn, Harvard and Imperial College London. I think that we could definitely assist those universities to "recruit" more effectively in the Czech Republic, where information dissemination is so difficult.

It was truly a pleasure meeting with both you and Mrs. Bader last week. Best regards to both of you.

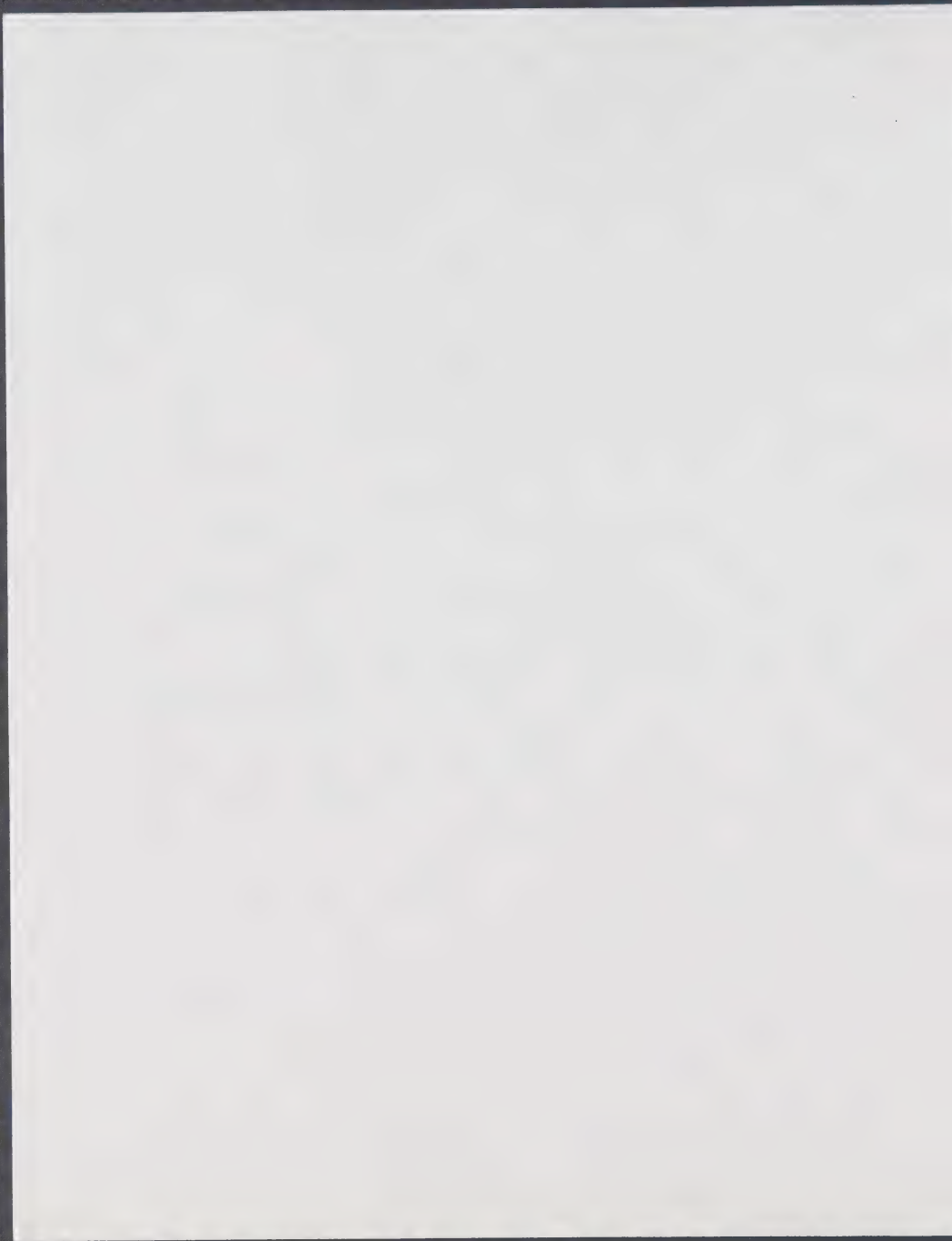

We would very much like to establish an annual award for the best organic chemist, and as you will see from the enclosed, we have had quite contradictory advice. At first, the Secretary of the Czech Chemical Society, Professor Oldrich Paleta, suggested setting up a foundation, the members of which were to be paid for making the selection. This seemed terribly bureaucratic to me, as the American Chemical Society, Canadian Society for Chemistry and British Royal Society of Chemistry all give just such awards and charge nothing for the selection. Now, Professor Paleta has suggested (in his letter of December 15, per copy enclosed) that we just send \$60,000 to secure a 100,000 Czech crowns award "ever after." Incidentally, that is about 50% more than the Canadian and the British chemical societies require for the same award amount.

On the other hand, Professor Dr. Rudolf Zahradnik has suggested in his fax of December 22, copy enclosed, that we overcome the initial difficulties by making just an annual award.

Perhaps the best thing to do is to ask you to give 100,000 crowns per year for the first few years and to deposit the funds with you.

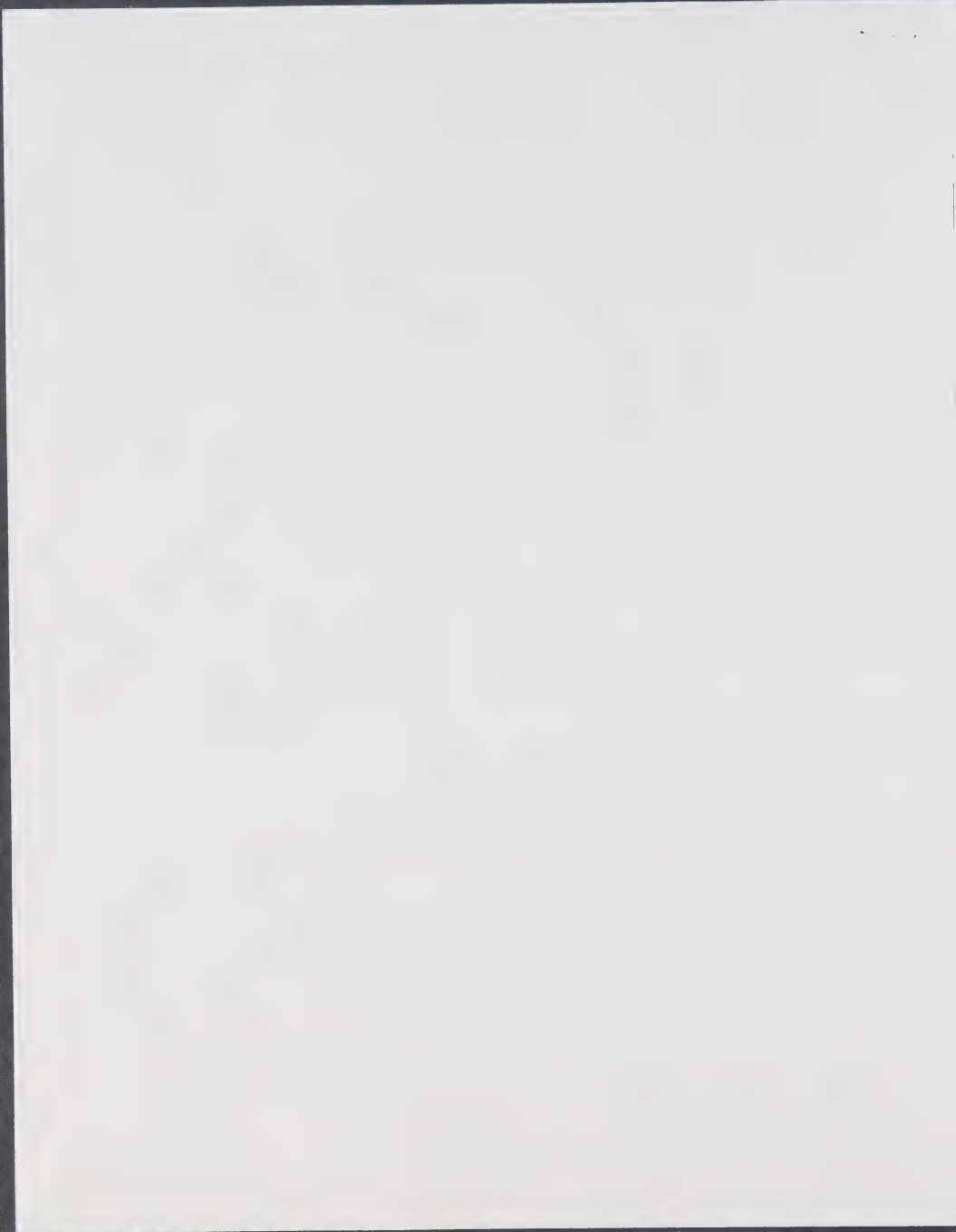
Similarly, I would like to take counsel with you about the possibility of setting up a chair in chemistry at Charles University as suggested by Professor Zahradnik.

I am sorry that a long trip has delayed my thanking you for your letter of September 28 regarding the foundation's willingness to help art historians in the Czech Republic.

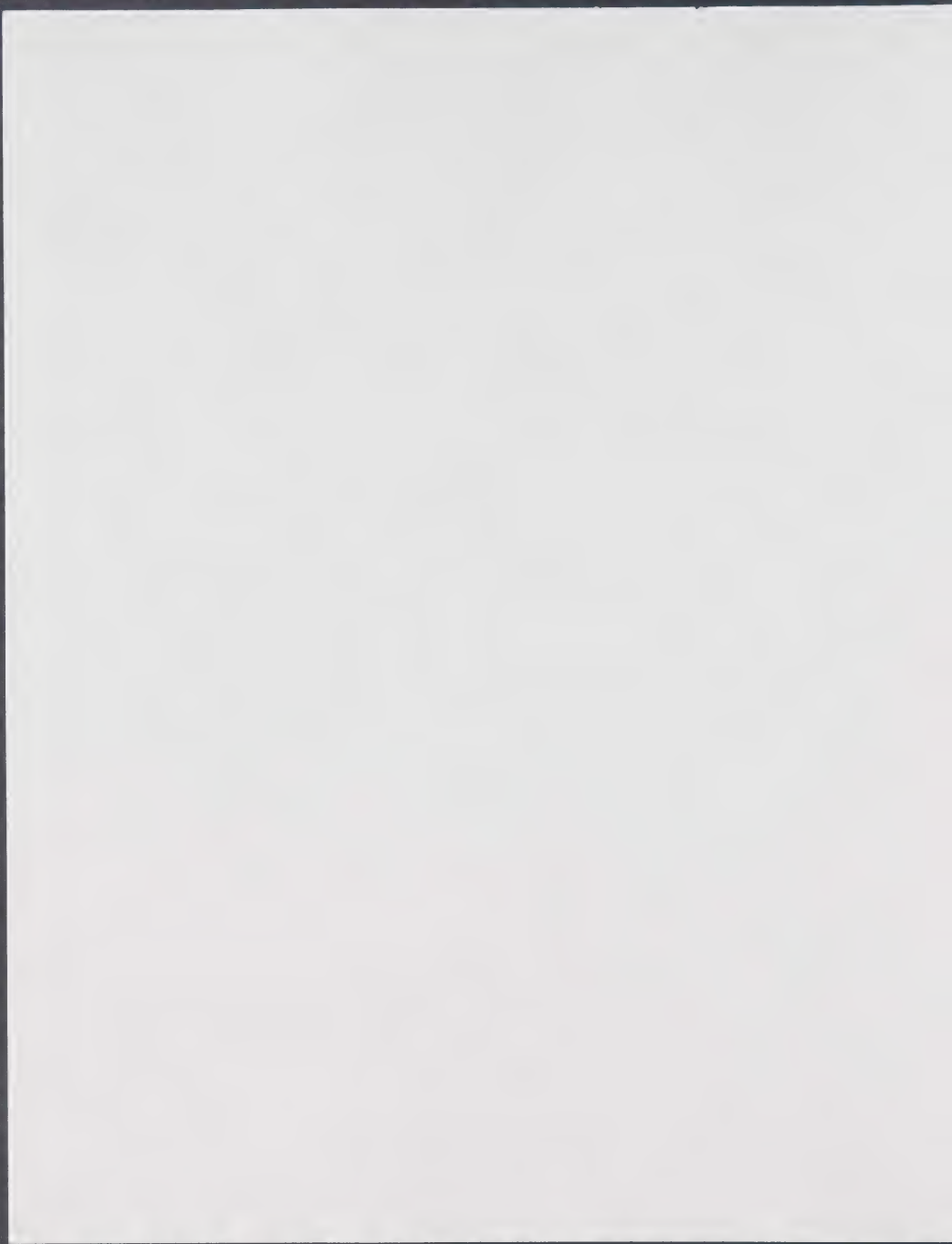

I trust that you received my fax of September 4 regarding my proposed gifts for a Bader Fellowship in Baroque Art History.


When I established the three fellowships for Czech doctoral students in chemistry, I gave capital of \$150,000 each to Columbia University, Imperial College, and the University of Pennsylvania. At that time, the universities could buy long-term bonds yielding 10% so that the students could be assured of \$15,000/year in perpetuity. Today, the interest rates are so low that I could not give the Charter 77 Foundation \$150,000 and expect to pay \$15,000 per year. Hence, we have decided, for the next three years, to give the \$15,000 annually and then rethink what best to do about capital in 2-3 years.

As soon as I hear from you that you can act to help transmit these funds, I will finalize the matter.

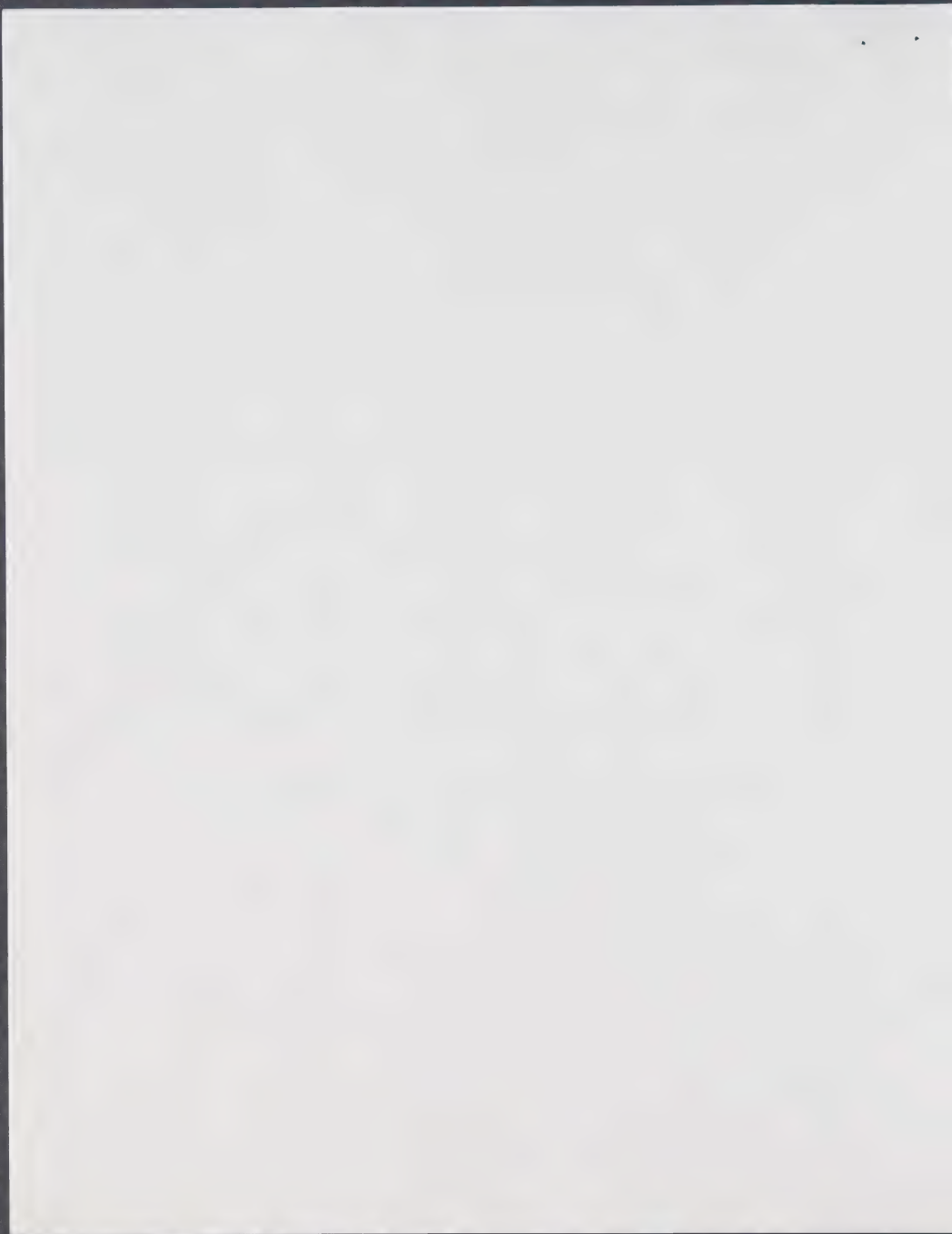

The American businessman and collector Dr. Alfred Bader from Milwaukee decided to create a foundation to support art-historical research of Czech and European Baroque art in the Czech Republic

Financial backing for the foundation will be provided by Dr. Bader via The Charter 77 Foundation in New York for the three following years. Dr. Bader, however, intends to continue the support in the future, similarly to his foundation to support Czechoslovak chemistry students in the USA, and Britain.

The Bader Foundation will provide one researcher a year with the sum ca 13,000 US\$ to cover the costs of his/her stay no longer than six months in any country or place the researcher may choose and where he may arrange for his/her stay. The only condition is to return back to Czechoslovakia after finishing the stay and to present a report on the results of his/her work.

Any Czechoslovak researcher in the field of painting, sculpture, drawings and prints from the 17th and 18th centuries can apply for the grant.
