Dear Professor Sharpless and Lorraine:

I apologize for the delay in sending this material; other urgent business arose on Tuesday.

It is my pleasure to assist you in preparing this award nomination for Dr. Bader. Following please find:

- (1) Alfred's CV and a brief bio (2 pages)
- (2) Alfred's 'menu' of talks, which he gives for the ACS and other groups around the world (1 page)
- (3) A list of Alfred's Science History Publications (1 page), to which we should add
  - (a) *Chemistry and Anti-Semitism in Vienna in the 19th Century*, which Dr. Bader and Dr. Robert Rosner have only recently completed and for which they are now seeking publication, and
  - (b) *Honoring Loschmidt*, which Dr. Bader wrote about the Loschmidt stamp issued in Austria last year and which I believe was published in *The Chemical Intelligencer* late last year.
- (4) A list of his patents (2 pages)
- (5) A list of his publications (2 pages)

I think most of the award information which Lorraine described is included in the "Honors" section of his CV, though in looking at the wall of certificates in his office, I noticed that he doesn't mention the Alfred R. Bader Symposium held at Harvard on May 17, 1993. I enclose a copy of that certificate for your information (1 page).

Regarding community involvement, he doesn't list much on his CV, but Alfred regularly does speaking tours for the ACS to various local sections (Florida this week, for instance, and Kansas last fall) as well as speaking at as many of the requesting universities, organizations and companies (worldwide) as he can fit into his busy schedule. He always requests that the organizer try to set up at least two or three talks (Chemistry Department, Art History Department, local art museum, local Jewish community, etc.) to make each visit as productive as possible.





As you are obviously aware, Alfred also consults for a variety of small chemical companies and tries to act as a clearinghouse for information for chemists around the world - who makes a particular chemical or has licensing rights to a particular process, who might have an opening for a chemist of a particular talent or who might be qualified to fill a particular opening, etc.

On a non-chemical level, he also still buys and sells many paintings every year and is currently working on his next book, an art history reference book of the Old Testament depictions by Dutch artists to be collated in Biblical order and which will list all known depictions of various Biblical stories.

If you think any other information would be helpful, please feel free to contact me today, as Alfred is out of town all this week - or if you need something after this week and want to insure secrecy, you may leave a message for me on my home answering machine (414/769-7119) and I will try to arrange to send you the information without his knowing.

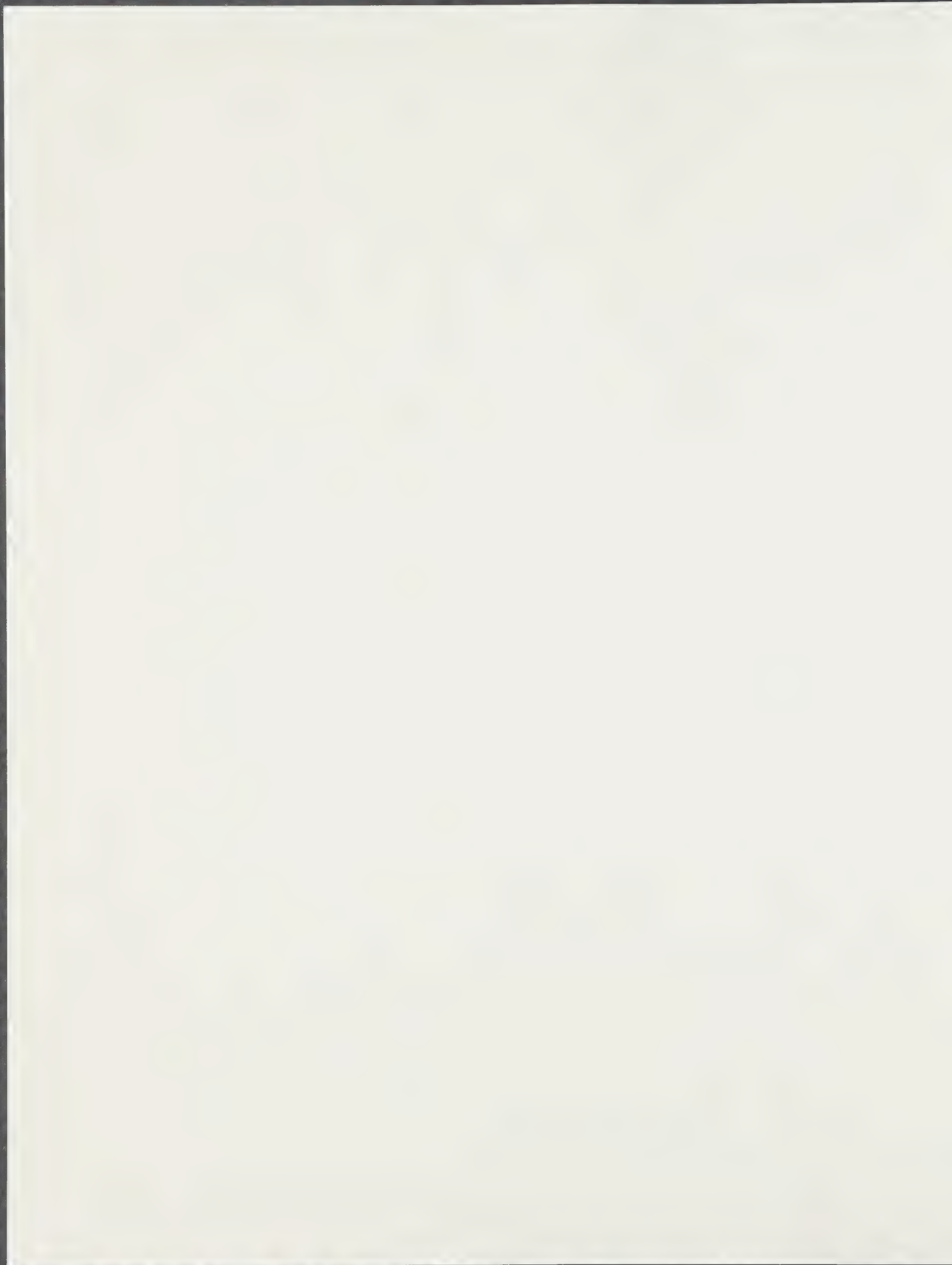
Dear Alfred,

## ***Haider glaubt an die Lüge, die er ist.***

*20 Thesen aus gegebenem Anlass*

- Auch Hitler hat ja an das geglaubt, was er sich vorlog. Haider wie Hitler sind existierende Lügen.
- Haider ist ein erwachsenes Kind. Das war Hitler auch. Aber: wie soll man einem 50jährigen Kind das Spielen verbieten? Das, genau, macht ja seinen Charme, seinen Reiz, seine Faszination aus: dass er mit sich und den Menschen spielt.  
Nein, er habe die Veranstaltung der Lega Nord nicht besucht, liess sein Büro ausrichten; nein, er habe dort nie gesprochen, wurde weiter gelogen; am Ende waren es nur "auguri"-Glückwünsche, die er dort abgeliefert haben will. Wer aber die Bilder dann sah, als sie das Fernsehen zeigte, stiess auf einen glückstrunkenen, siegreich den Massen zujubelnden Mann, dessen einzige Bosheit seine Kindlichkeit ist, mit der er die Macht anstrebt.
- Hitler musste seine Macht noch erkämpfen, das ging nicht ohne Blutbäder ab, Haider vibriert vor Lust, sich die Macht erspielen zu können. Wie ein altes, freches Kind.
- Das ist ansteckend, macht auch anderen Mut, gibt den Menschen Hoffnung, putscht sie auf, setzt sie moralisch unter Droge. Haider wie Hitler – zwei Hoffnungsmacher, die ihre Anhänger dazu bringen, sich in ihnen, den Siegern, zu spiegeln. Hitler mit seinem Kriegsgeschrei, voll blutiger Aggressionen, Haider spöttisch, rotzig, verspielt, ein Vorläufer der "Spass-Generation", der sogar mit seinen Feinden noch spielt. Das macht ja den Umgang mit seinem Rassismus, seiner Fremdenfeindlichkeit, sogar seinem Nazismus so schwer: dass er auch damit nur spielt; ihn zur Hälfte zurückzieht, auf ein Drittel verkürzt, ganz fallen lässt, dort, wo die Politik es erfordert. Siehe sein Interview in den USA und seine gewundene Distanzierung vom Nationalsozialismus später, zu Hause.
- Ich prophezeihe: auch von seiner Fremdenfeindlichkeit wird er sich distanzieren, sobald er Morgenluft wittert: hofft, sich die Macht damit erspielen zu können.
- Ernst ist es Haider nur mit sich selbst, heilig ist ihm nur er sich selber. ER, der sich mit gläubig zu IHM aufblickenden, IHN umrundenden Menschen umgibt - die geniale Plakatserie der letzten Wahl.
- Die Anleihen bei der Religion sind unübersehbar, die Töne des Kulturkampfes unüberhörbar. Auch Hitler hat ihn geführt, sich den Massen meisterhaft als Messias präsentiert, wenn er in seinen Reden an den entscheidenden Stellen die "Vorsehung" beschwor, oder, unter dem Jubel der Menschen, die Österreicher auf dem Heldenplatz von der verhassten Autonomie, dem "lebensunfähigen" Kleinstaat befreite: "...melde ich vor der Geschichte den Eintritt meiner Heimat..." Und alle Dokumente belegen den heiligen Ernst, mit dem der Zyniker Hitler an das glaubte, was er "Berufung" nannte, an seine Lüge.
- Immer wieder, immer wieder geht es auch Haider um die Verweigerung der Autonomie, die Rücknahme der Moderne. Vor etwa zwei Jahren spielte er sich plötzlich zum "Schutzpatron des kleinen Mannes" auf; ein Sager, direkt aus der Sakristei; der rasch wieder von der Bühne verschwand; vielleicht direkt von Krenn eingeflüstert; ein Sager aber auch, der das Böse, das Faszinierende an Haider deutlicher macht als der von der geglückten "Beschäftigungspolitik" des Dritten Reichs: Haider, der sich – freilich nur rhetorisch – mit Bischofsmütze und Krummstab drapiert, weil er weiss, wie anfällig wir Österreicher, noch immer, für geschenkbringende Nikoläuse, gnädige Kaiser, ein geldregndes Lotto, kurzum: den "Segen von oben" sind.

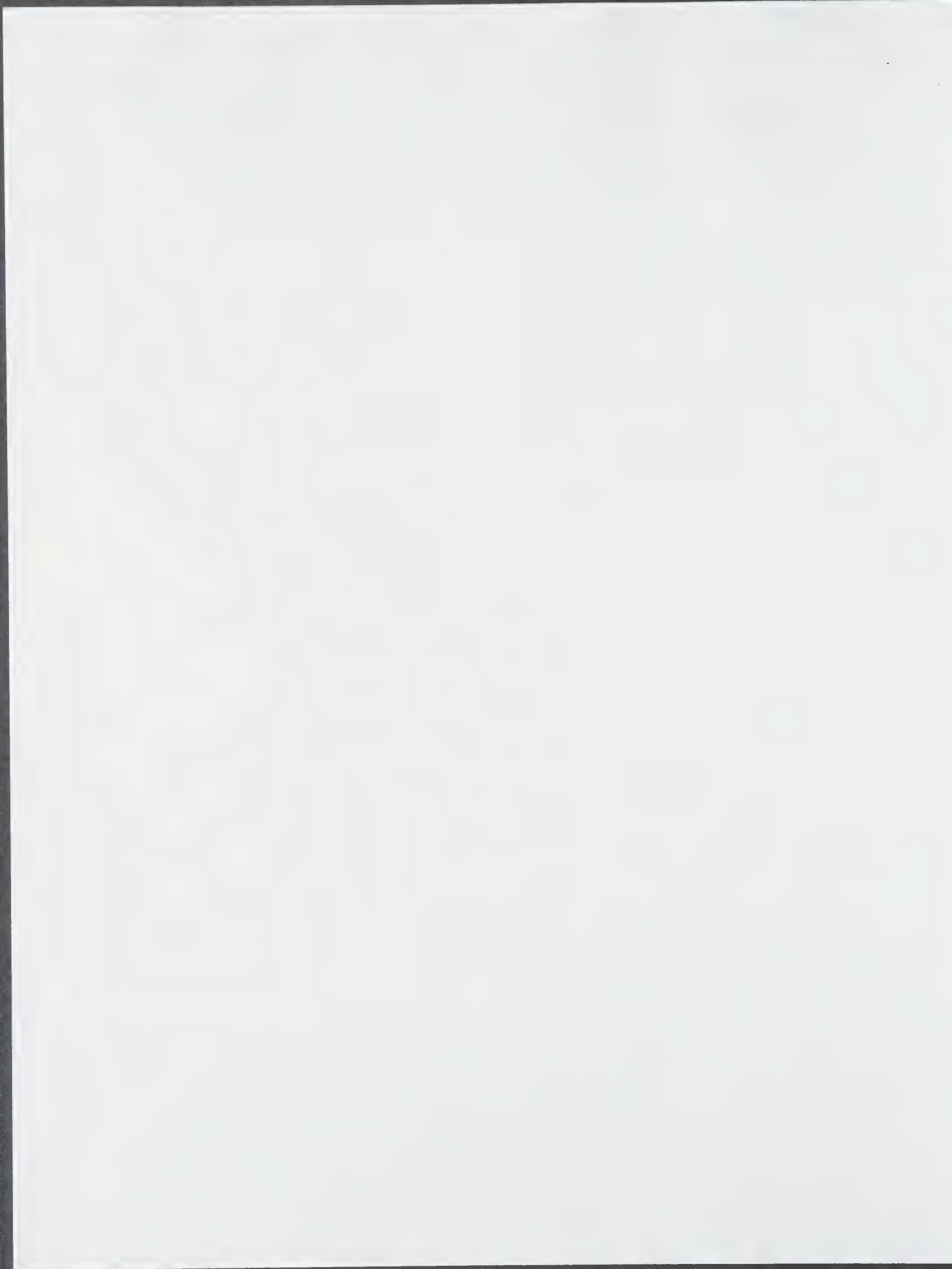


- Haider erzählt uns seit 13 Jahren mit allen Fasern seiner Existenz und in vielen Variationen nur eine einzige Story: wie toll es ist, dass wir uns ducken; damit er, und nur er, der sich etwas trauende Jörg, uns wieder aufrichten kann.
- Man kann über Hitler nicht reden, ohne über das Böse zu reden. Dies gilt auch für Haider.
- Die Verweigerung der Autonomie ist das Böse an Haider wie Hitler.
- Hitler hat den Deutschen die kollektive Autonomie verweigert: die Demokratie: er hat sie, ganz körperlich, bis in den Schutt der Bomben und die Ermordung der Menschen vernichtet.
- Haider verweigert uns die individuelle Autonomie: die der Moderne. Haider ist böse, weil er uns auf bezaubernde Weise zu verstehen gibt, er, und nur er allein, sei imstande, uns die Last der Individualisierung abzunehmen. In religiöser Sprache heisst das „Erlösung.“
- Sein „Kinderscheck“ ist genau das: die Vorgaukelung individueller Autonomie für die Frauen. Das Böse daran sind nicht die mögliche Unbezahlbarkeit, die Milliardenkosten, sondern die allgemeine Bestechlichkeit, die Haider den Frauen mit dem Scheck unterstellt.
- Haider wie Hitler sind Meister der Mittel: der Medien: des schönen Scheins und der tollen Wirkung. Das imponiert.

Ein Van der Bellen, der von der Brücke hüpf? Net amol hinschaun! Klima, der sich vom Gummiband zurückschnellen lässt? Gelt Vickerl, man müsst sich halt trauen! Schüssel, der

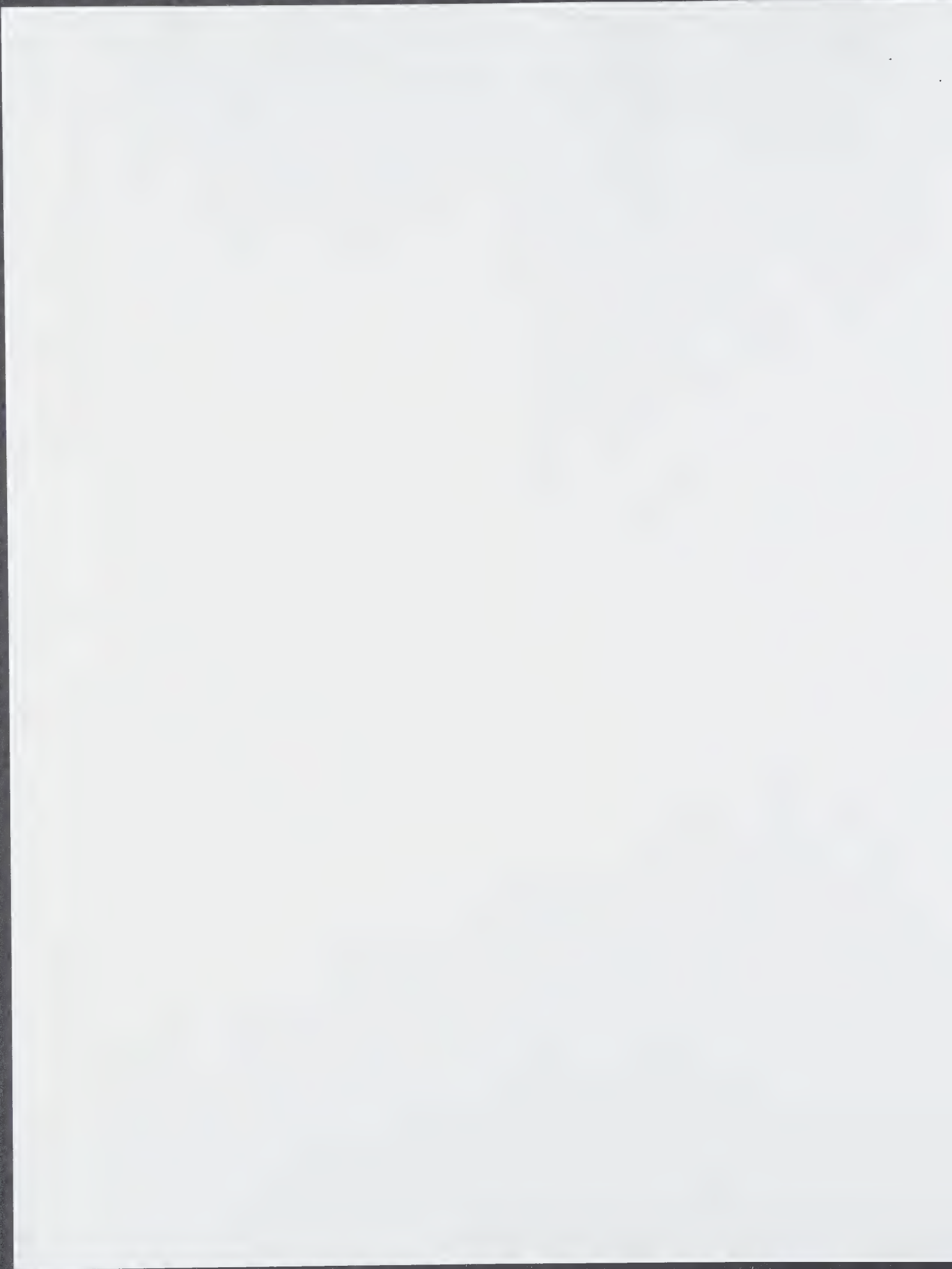
- eine Felswand durchklettert? Armer Wolferl, sei froh, dass d' wenigstens singen kannst!
- Haider liegt in der Wahl seiner Mittel global im Trend, auch der siegreiche Kapitalismus der Globalisierung herrscht ja nur mit Hilfe der Mittel. Sinn stiftet er keinen. Haider ist sinnlos.
- Aber das war der Nazismus ja auch. Und hat geschichtlich gesiegt. Zumindest kurzfristig. Faschismus und Nationalsozialismus haben schon einmal gezeigt, dass die absolute Sinnlosigkeit – ökonomisch: der Krieg, und menschlich: die Hölle – Erfolg haben können. Bis zum Zusammenbruch halt.
- Unsere Sehnsucht nach dem Bösen ist die Sehnsucht nach Heimat, nach Abhängigkeit, nach Nicht-Autonomie, – anstelle der kalten, rationalen Moderne. Haider gaukelt uns vor, es sei möglich, diese Sehnsucht zu stillen. Durch ihn. Das ist seine Lüge. Haider ist kein „Erlöser“, aber er spielt ihn perfekt.
- Seine „Dritte Republik“ – ein Klon aus „Drittem Reich“ und „Musikantenstadel“. Nein danke. Ich, jedenfalls, habe mir vorgenommen, sollte es je dazu kommen, mich den Regieanweisungen eines Jörg ÜberMoik zu widersetzen.
- Spass muss sein. Haider nicht.

*Nachbemerkung: Die Politik hat Haider bis jetzt nicht wirklich ernst genommen, ihm nichts entgegengesetzt; ausgrenzen allein war zu wenig. Aber auch die Intellektuellen sind der Herausforderung, die dieser Mann dem Gedanken stellt, bis jetzt nicht gewachsen gewesen; haben sich eher moralisch entrüstet, als nachgedacht. Die erste gründliche Analyse habe ich im Standard vom 20. 11. 1999 gelesen: Tom Appleton kommt in seinem ruhigen, unaufgeregten Essay inhaltlich zu ähnlichen Erkenntnissen wie ich. Haider sei ein „Hitlerkranker, wie es sie zu tausenden gibt,“ schreibt er dort, den man zwar verstehen könne, der aber „sich selber nicht versteht.“ In meiner Sprache: eine existierende Lüge, wie Hitler. Oder: ein ichloses Ich, das nur eines will: Macht. Reine Macht. Allerdings ist Appletons Text formal keine Kampfansage, wie diese Thesen, die Haider bewusst dort herausfordern, wo er hilflos ist: auf der rationalen Ebene.*

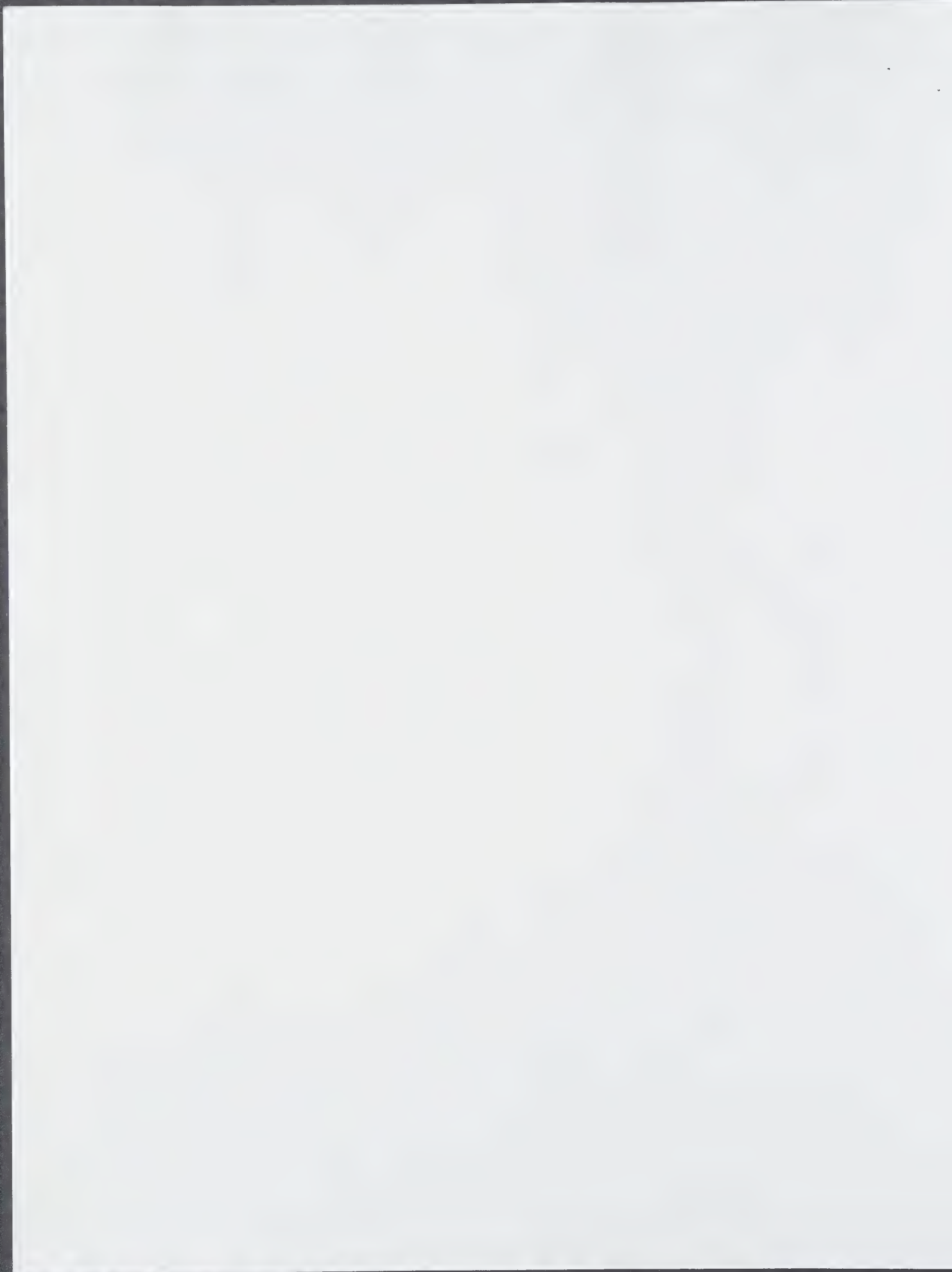




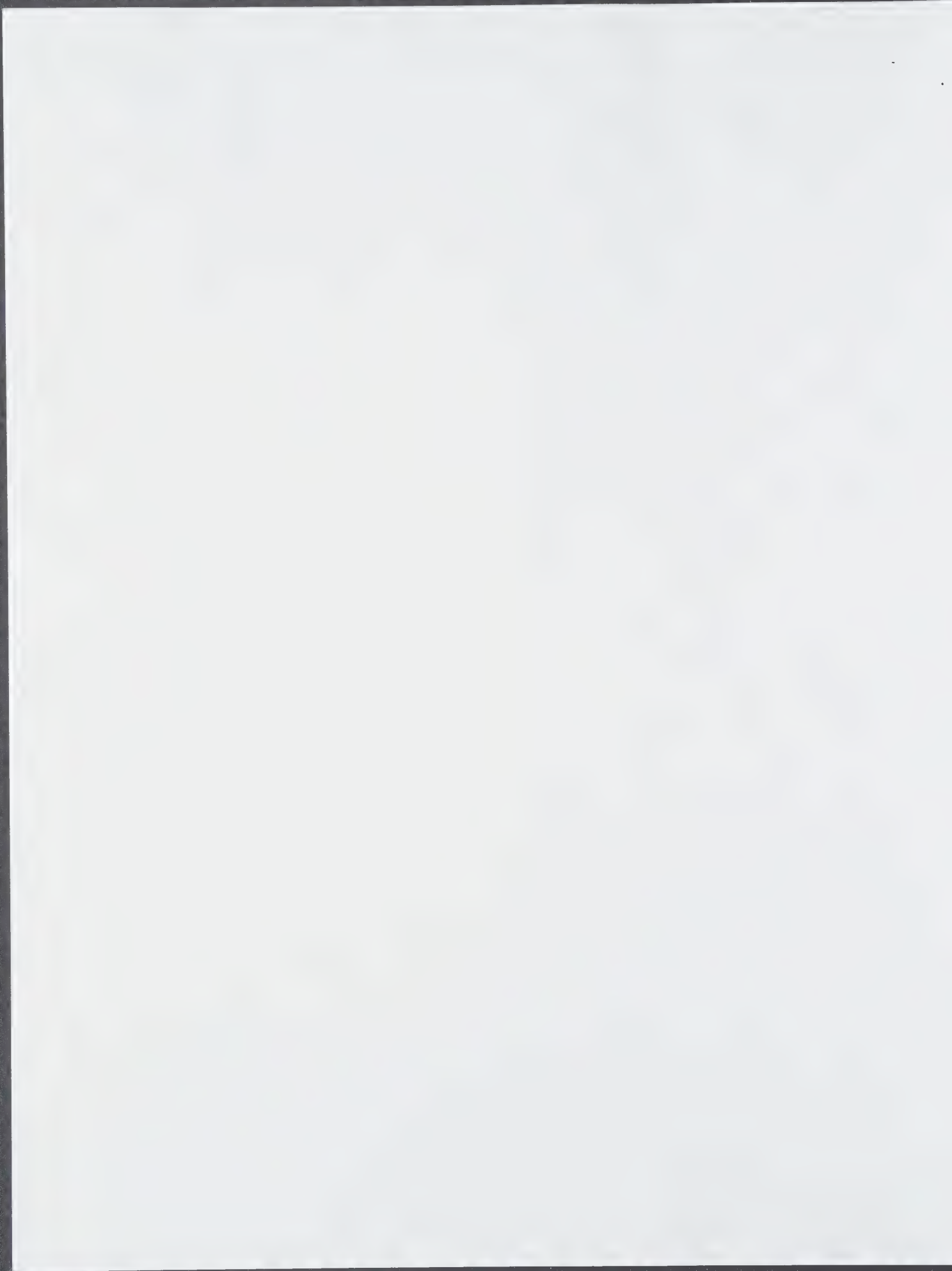

Dear Dr. Bader,

Friday, the thirteenth: There are people who believe that Friday the thirteenth is a day of misfortune. But I am not superstitious, and you are not, either. You did not hesitate to write the letter to the Editor of the *Bulletin for the History of Chemistry* concerning Dr. Saltzman's paper about Siegfried Ruhemann just eight days before your 75th birthday, though you were aware that this was the birthday of a former compatriot of yours (both being native Austrians) who shared with you the fate of becoming an emigrant – one to Germany, the other one to the United States. Concerning the first one, Sir William Ramsay and people like him might not have been entirely wrong in mistrusting naturalized citizens, but in that special case, this became evident only later, and this case does not justify generalizations.

The allusion teaches us that punctual analogies do not prove anything and that one must look into the individual details rather than generalize – not *the Turks* versus *the Kurds* (in view of the recent war in Turkish Kurdistan), not *the Israelis* versus *the Arabs* (in view of the present troubles in Palestine), not *the Serbs* (who mistreat so cruelly the Bosnians and the Kosovo-Albanians), not *the chemists* (those wicked people who irresponsibly try to spoil the environment), and many more examples in the present and the past including the years 67 to 55 years ago. Siegfried Ruhemann's tragic fate is a consequence of such undue generalizations. Evidently, he was an able scientist and a peaceful person, and yet, he was mistreated, because for some, he was *a Jew*, and for others, because he was *a German* (in spite of his personal attempt to quit this allegiance by becoming a British citizen). The fact that Siegfried Ruhemann was first of all *Siegfried Ruhemann* did not play a significant role on either side. With respect to his silly and arrogant anti-German propaganda, Sir William Ramsay is in no way better than Philipp Lenard (who, incidentally, was a native of Austro-Hungary, too) who certainly deserved his Nobel prize in physics as much as Ramsay deserved his in chemistry, but later wrote his book "*Deutsche Physik*". Compared with Ramsay, he has the privilege that his political convictions remained devoid of any practical consequences, because he did not do any harm to anybody. (You probably know that in 19th century Germany, besides antisemitism, there was another antagonism which, it seems to me, played an even more important role: the antagonism between catholics and protestants which culminated in the *Kulturkampf*. Professors of protestant creed were frequently resented at institutions such the Polytechnical Institute of Aachen or the University of Münster, and Catholic professors often looked at with some suspicion at universities in the Protestant North of Germany. Many careers were influenced by this attitude. My grandfather was a marine zoologist in Berlin. One of his former students collected anecdotes about him. One of them runs as follows: "*Paulus Schiemenz used to say 'I hate the Catholics'. But his 'hatred' was entirely theoretical. In his attitude towards his students, it played absolutely no role whether one was protestant or catholic or whatsoever; he was of utter objectivity.*" Wouldn't it be unfair to blame him for his *hatred of the Catholics*?)

I come back to an earlier letter of yours. "*Schiemenz I and Bader ... are unlikely to hurt each other... Couldn't you plan a holiday in Madison and Milwaukee where we could laugh about all this [i. e. "the Loschmidt controversy"] ?*" (Alfred Bader to G. P. Schiemenz, April 1st, 1998). April 1st is a traditional day of joking, and the consequence of a joke is laughter. Yet, I am confident that A. Bader's quoted remark was meant serious, but that he will take as a joke (a benevolent rather than a malignant one) what I include in this letter. Some people are honoured by a Nobel prize (most recently a US citizen who has been a Jewish

emigrant from Vienna), but there are fields for which no Nobel prize is available. However, there are other ways to honour distinction – by a monument, a special stamp or a street named after the meritorious person.

Some reserve, however, is appropriate. *E. g.*, I do not know, after whom the *Kekuléstrasse* in Bonn has been named: August, the chemist, or his distant relative Reinhard Kekulé who was a distinguished professor of archaeology at the University of Bonn (consider that in public esteem, archaeology ranks much higher than chemistry). Similar doubts concerning the other street names may not be entirely unjustified – unfortunately, the street signs are silent about first names such as Reinhard, Richard, Ferdinand and Alfred.

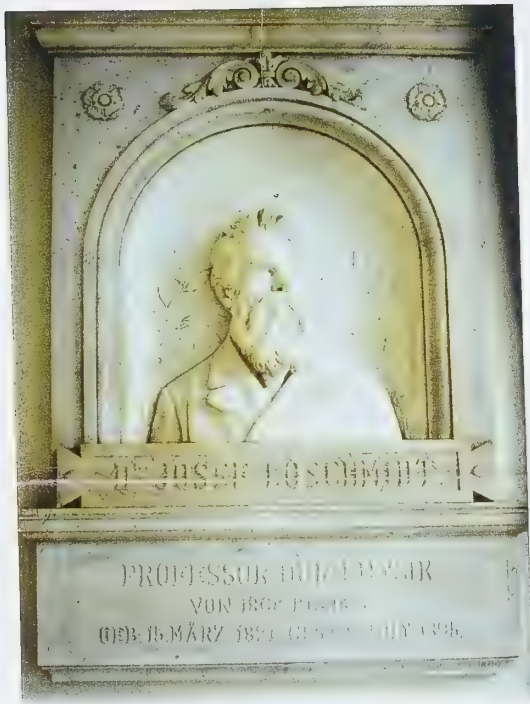
You will notice that quite a few names of *dramatis personae* are missing. This is beyond my responsibility: There are more people who deserve a Nobel prize than who actually win it, and not all street names refer to distinguished persons.

Stockholm (dpa) Parkinson und Schizophrenie haben ihre Ursache in zerstörten und fehlgeleiteten Nervenzellen. Für die Erforschung dieser Zellen und vor allem ihrer Signalübertragung erhalten drei Neurobiologen den Nobelpreis für Medizin 2000: Den Arbeiten von Arvid Carlsson (Schweden), Paul Greengard

(USA) und Eric Kandel (USA) ist es zu verdanken, dass neue Medikamente entwickelt wurden und der Mensch besser versteht, wie sein Gedächtnis funktioniert. Sie untersuchten, wie Botenstoffe die Signale zwischen den Nervenzellen übertragen und wie sich daraufhin Strukturen im Gehirn verändern.

# Nobelpreis für Medizin an drei Hirnforscher

## Pionierarbeiten zur Nervenfunktion

Wie das Karolinska Institut gestern in Stockholm mitteilte, schuf der emeritierte schwedische Professor der Universität Göteborg, Arvid Carlsson (70), die Grundlage für wichtige Medikamente gegen die Parkinson-Krankheit: Er entdeckte die Bedeutung des Signalstoffes Dopamin im Gehirn und seine Rolle für Muskelbewegungen. Mit diesem Wissen wurde L-Dopa entwickelt, das immer noch der wichtigste Arzneistoff gegen Parkinson. Aus ihm entsteht im Gehirn Dopamin. Diese Forschung habe auch zu besseren Behandlungsmöglichkeiten von Schizophrenie, Depressionen und anderen mentalen Krankheiten geführt.

Greengard von der Rockefeller Universität in New York (74) baute darauf auf und untersuchte, was Dopamin und andere Signalstoffe innerhalb der Zellen bewirken. Die Signalsubstanzen docken erst an der Außenhülle von Nervenzellen an und lösen so eine Kaskade von Reaktionen in der Zelle aus. Aktiviert werden die einzelnen Stoffe in der Zelle, indem sie Phosphatgruppen angehängt bekommen. Damit ändert sich die gesamte Funktion der Nervenzelle, ihr Erregungszustand wird verändert.

Eric Kandel (70) von der Columbia Universität New York schließlich erforschte, auf welchen biochemischen Wegen

Signale zwischen den Nerven zu bleibenden Erinnerungen werden. Dazu nutzte er zunächst die Meeresschnecke Aplysia, die nur nur 20000 Nervenzellen besitzt. Seinen Ergebnissen zufolge könnte das Gedächtnis in den Enden der Nervenzellen lokalisiert sein, so die Nobelpreis-Jury. Die Forschung Kandels könne für Menschen mit Gedächtnisverlust von Bedeutung sein.

„Das ist ein wunderbares Trio und hervorragend ausgesucht“, lobte Wolf Singer, Direktor am Max-Planck-Institut für Hirnforschung in Frankfurt/Main zur Auswahl der drei Preisträger. Die höchste Auszeichnung für Mediziner ist in diesem Jahr mit insgesamt neun Millionen Kronen dotiert und liegt mit umgerechnet 2,1 Millionen Mark erstmals über der Zwei-Millionen-Grenze.

## Auf der Spur von Parkinson

Das Parkinson-Syndrom, zu dessen Erforschung Arvid Carlsson entscheidend beigetragen hat, ist eine Erkrankung des Zentral-Nerven-Systems. Im Zentrum steht eine Unterversorgung des Körpers mit dem Botenstoff Dopamin. Dadurch geht die Kontrolle über die absichtlichen Muskelbewegungen verloren. Die Symptome: Bewegungsstörungen, Verkrampfungen, Zittern der Hände und Finger. Betroffen werden meist Menschen jenseits des 60. Lebensjahres – wie etwa Papst Johannes Paul II. und Ex-Boxweltmeister Muhammed Ali. Meist sind die Ursachen nicht zu klären. Parkinson kann auch nach einer Hirnhautentzündung oder Hirntumoren entstehen. Drogen wie chemisch verändertes Heroin und Ecstasy können ebenfalls Parkinson auslösen. (afp)



**Eric Kandel**

Der gebürtige Wiener Jude emigrierte 1939 als Neunjähriger in die USA. Seinen Werdegang bezeichnet er als „typisch amerikanische Erfolgsgeschichte“. Nach einem Studium der Geschichte und Literatur promovierte er 1956 in New York in Medizin und spezialisierte sich auf das Lern- und Erinnerungsvermögen. Der Nobelpreis sei für ihn eine „unglaubliche Ehre“, sagte Kandel, der als gesellig und humorvoll gilt.



**Paul Greengard**

Seit 40 Jahren erkundet der New Yorker die Signalübertragung zwischen Nervenzellen. Er war es, der in den 70er Jahren die Wirkungsweise Dopamins im Gehirn nachwies. Wichtig waren seine Erkenntnisse für das Verständnis der Wirkung von Schizophrenie-Medikamenten. Der begeisterte Bergsteiger hat auch ein Herz für Frauen in der Biomedizin: Sein Preisgeld spendet er für deren Förderung.

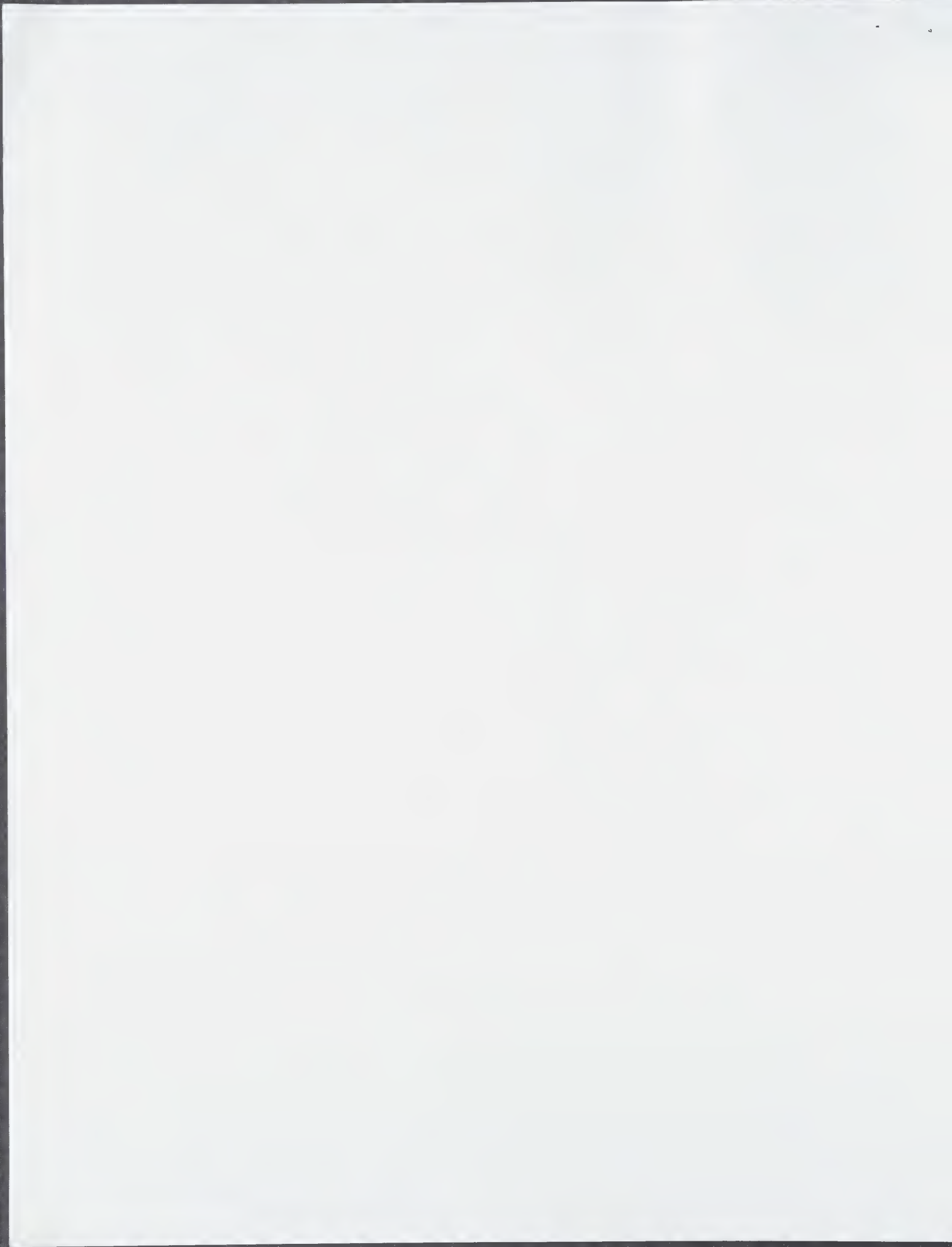

I had not seen the article in The Daily Telegraph written by Joan Clements in Amsterdam. Like most articles about paintings it is full of mistakes.

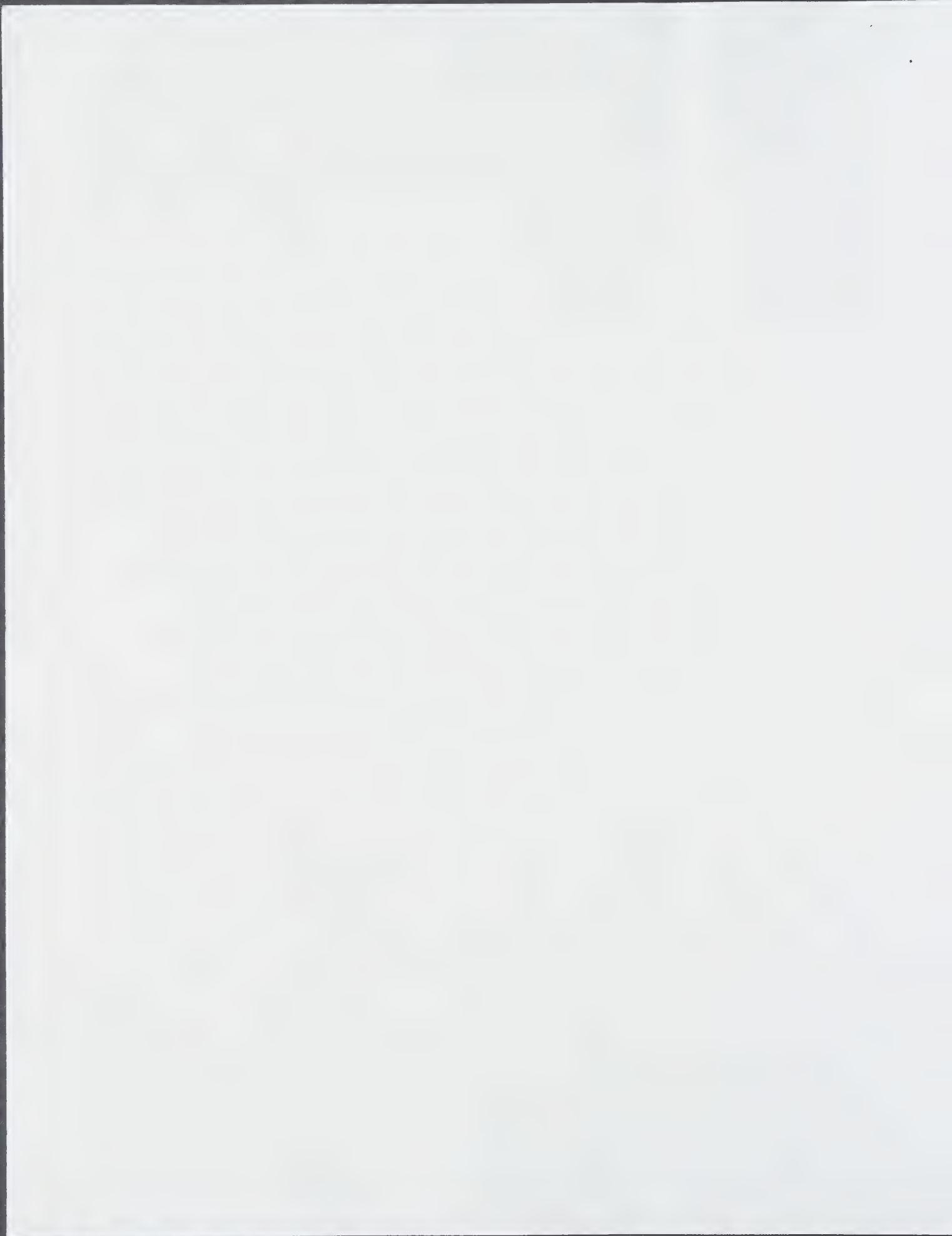

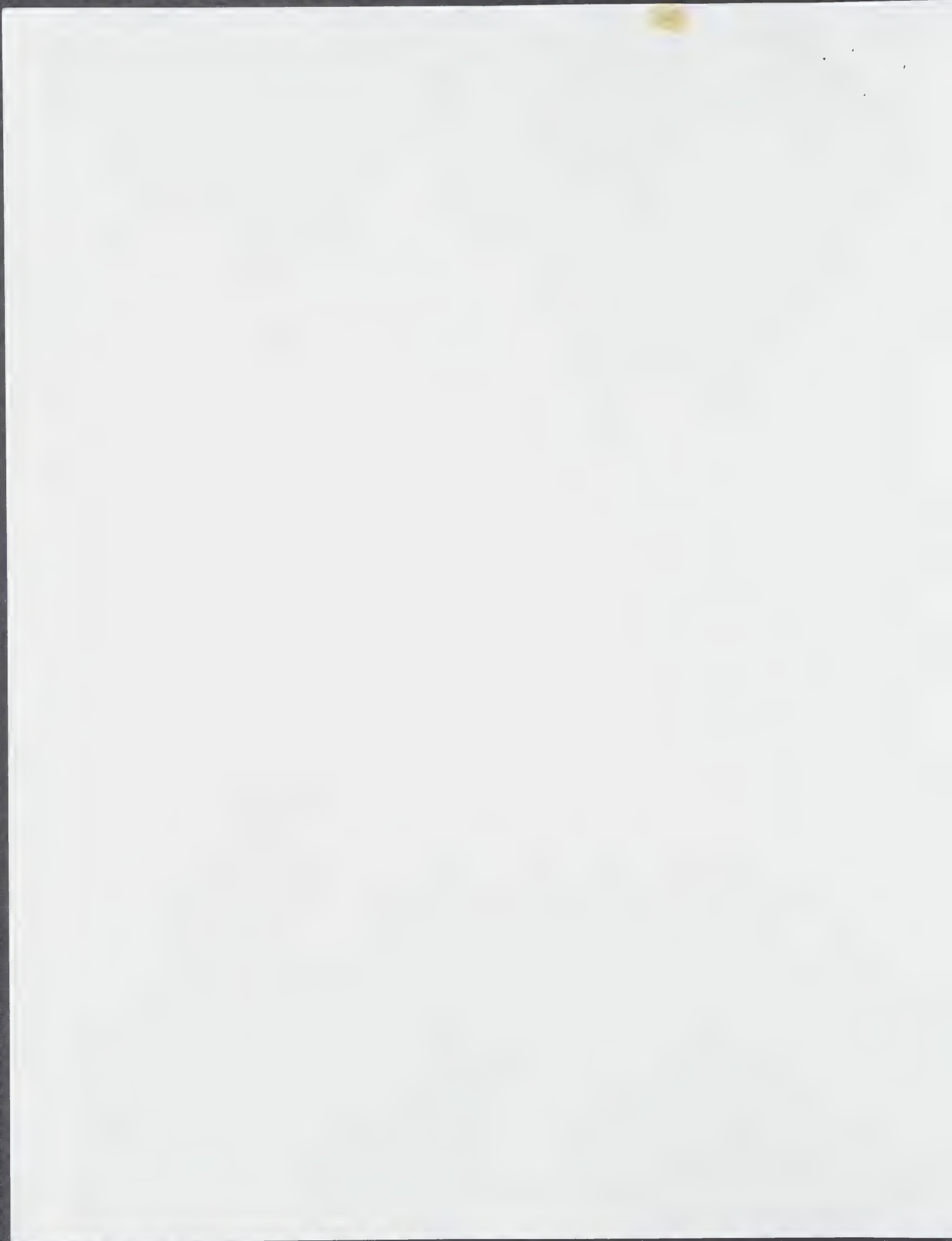
I have now completed the reading of your autobiography. Thank you for including it with the books you sent to Holy Trinity High School. Certainly, your life and its achievements represent an odyssey based upon luck of the draw, hard work, personal intelligence and the grace of God.

I cannot help but ask you to consider a request for funding to St. John's Secondary School in Ghana, West Africa. You will remember that when we met on the plane returning from London to the States, I had spent some time in Ghana. I was asked by my provincial superior to travel to Ghana to evaluate the Congregation's educational efforts that have been in place since 1957. Based upon the growth of the indigenous manpower over the last several years, I estimate that there will be nearly 50 Ghanian brothers in 2010. All of these men will be trained as educators. These signs of growth are most encouraging for the people of Ghana.

St. John's was the first school founded by the Brothers of Holy Cross in 1957. Within ten years of its foundation, the school was ranked as the number one secondary school in the country. Boys from throughout Ghana flocked to this school because of its reputation for preparing young men in math and science. The majority of its sixth form students ranked highest in the nation on their pre-university exams -- especially in math and science.

Today, St. John's is destined to return to its former glory because of the growth in manpower and the Congregation's desire for it. In three years, twelve young brothers will enter the ranks of its teaching force. There is no school of ours in the States that currently has such numbers.

My visit to St. John uncovered a tremendous desire to offer the students a quality holistic education, but time and lack of funds have caused a great deal of physical decay, especially in the science labs. I was astounded and humbled by the degree of education going on considering that the labs are nearly functionless. Time and termites have taken their toll upon furniture and the equipment. The equipment that does exist is out-dated and, often, inoperative. The most recent textbooks utilized in all of the sciences are



twenty years old. I long to assist these teachers and students, and I hope that you can prove to be my resource to do this.

I would like to request a gift of \$100,000 to renovate the three science labs at St. John's. In terms of cost in the States, I would not be able to do much for one lab for \$100,000. But in Ghana, such a gift will renew the labs and energize the spirit! The brothers will literally be able to rebuild these science spaces, and have money to fund teachers for at least two years -- teacher salaries are about \$100 a month.

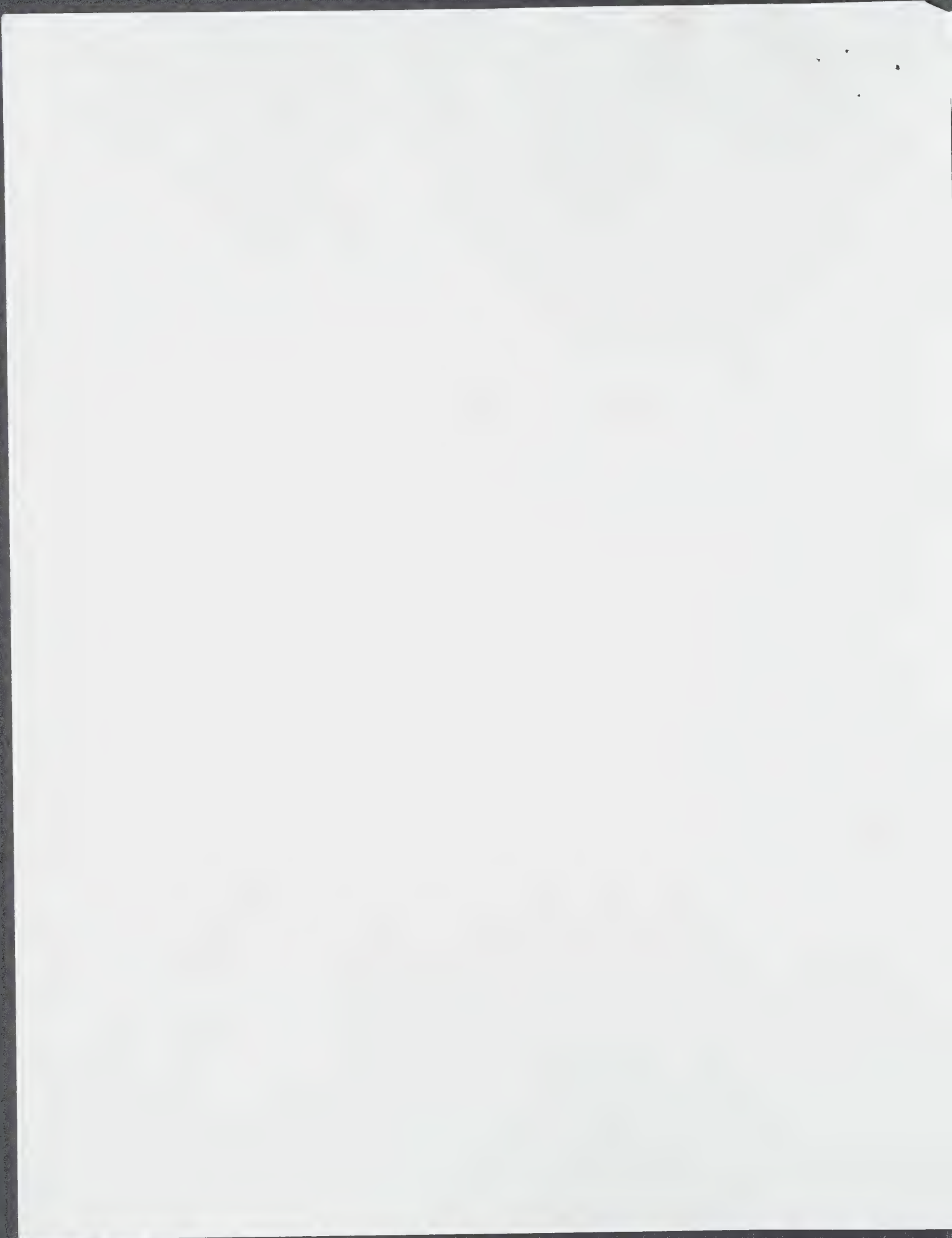
I realize that I am bold to ask you for this money, yet I have been raising money for many years now and have learned but one thing: Better to ask and be denied, than not to ask and never to know.

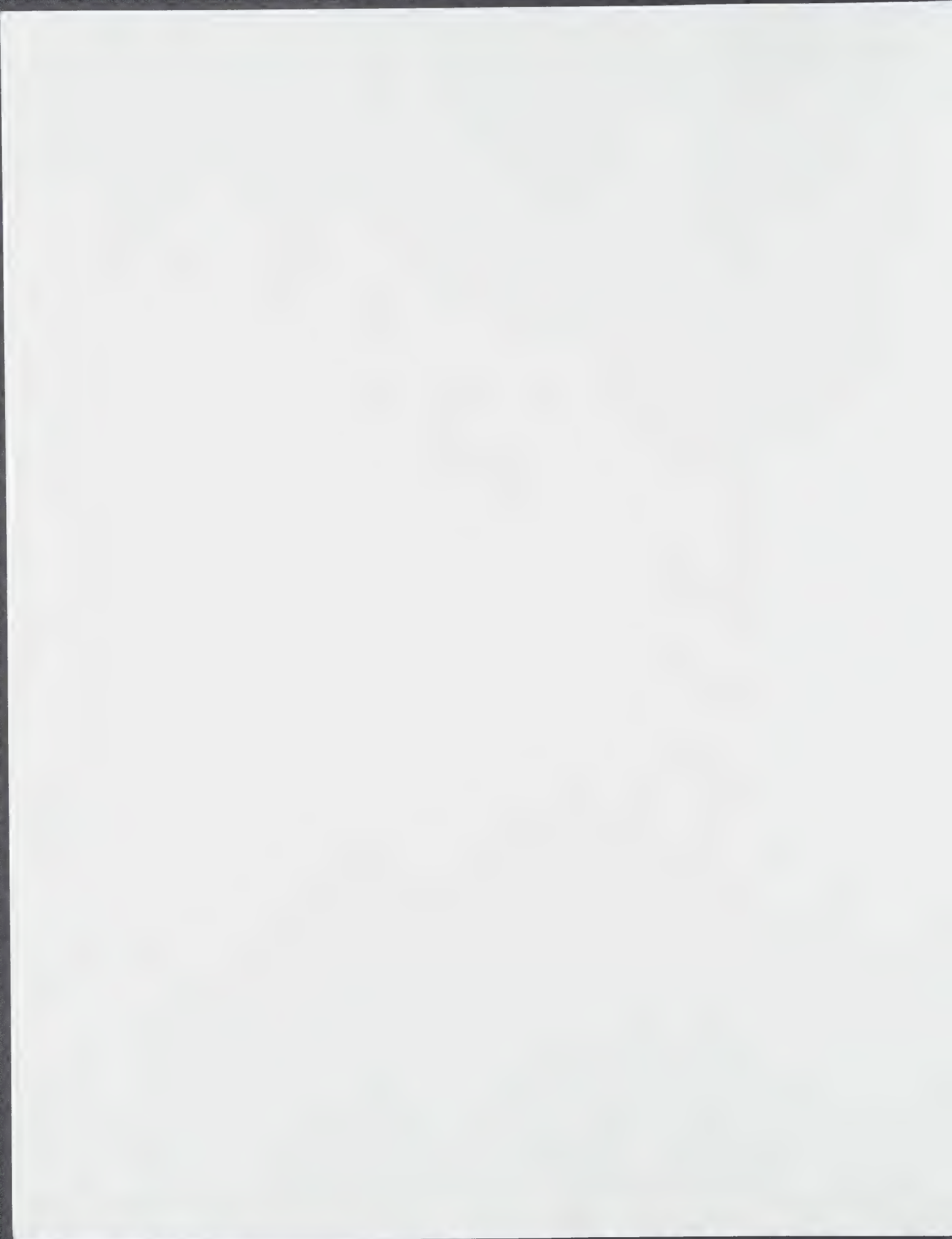
When I suggested that you consider purchasing that painting of the fighting in the Falkland Islands I did not think that this could be for your office, but rather for the offices of the company.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE  
CLEVELAND INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM



The Cleveland International Program was started in 1955 by Dr. Henry Ollendorff. Its initial purpose was to build bridges between the United States and post-war Germany. The first year brought youth leaders from Germany to Cleveland for a work experience (at that time the United States was the leader in social work skills) and to learn about American culture and values.

Quickly, the program expanded to include other countries and other disciplines within the human services field. Within 10 years, programs began to form in other cities in the U.S., some as independent non-profits and some affiliated with universities. There are now 11 affiliate programs. Eventually, CIP split into two entities, the Cleveland International Program and the Council of International Programs, the first having local program responsibilities and the second having national and international responsibilities. This is the only professional exchange program of its kind in the Greater Cleveland area. We network with other international organizations.

The Cleveland International Program's purposes are to increase professional knowledge, to increase cross-cultural understanding, and to promote world peace. We seek to meet these goals through a program with three important parts. First, the participants are provided with a one-week educational program, which explains U.S. social welfare, government, judicial, educational, and economic systems. Top representatives of their fields volunteer as discussion leaders and lecturers for these sessions.

Secondly, participants stay with four to five host families so they can experience the diversity of American life as it exists. We attempt to give participants a variety in their experience and we encourage all kinds of families to participate: nuclear families and single-parent households, single persons, retired couples, and all races and ethnic groups.

Thirdly, each participant trains in an agency for a period of three, five or eleven months, depending on whether he or she is a part of the short-term or full-year program. The internship may be a learning experience or a teaching experience, depending on the level of the individual's expertise, the agency, and the country from which the participant comes. For example, one participant started an Annual Fund at home in his country, after hands-on training at our United Way. Others have gained experience with prominent architectural firms and governmental agencies.

CIP brings approximately 30 participants per year, and has brought a total of over 1,900 international professional visitors.

CIP has a 23-member Board of Trustees, an extensive network of volunteers and host families, and a five-member staff. The staff is composed of an Executive Director, an Associate Director, a Secretary, and a Business Manager. The annual budget is \$457,253 for the 1994-95 Fiscal Year, which ends September 30, 1995. Funds are contributed to CIP by agencies which provide placements for participants, foundations, corporations and individuals.

CIP's alumni organization, The Council of International Fellowship, has developed programs in 12 nations. These are attended by Americans and others. CIF stages an international conference every two years.

CIP is financed by the organizations where participants train, by citizens, corporations, foundations, governments (here & abroad); and by the generous, joyful contributions of host families and other volunteers.

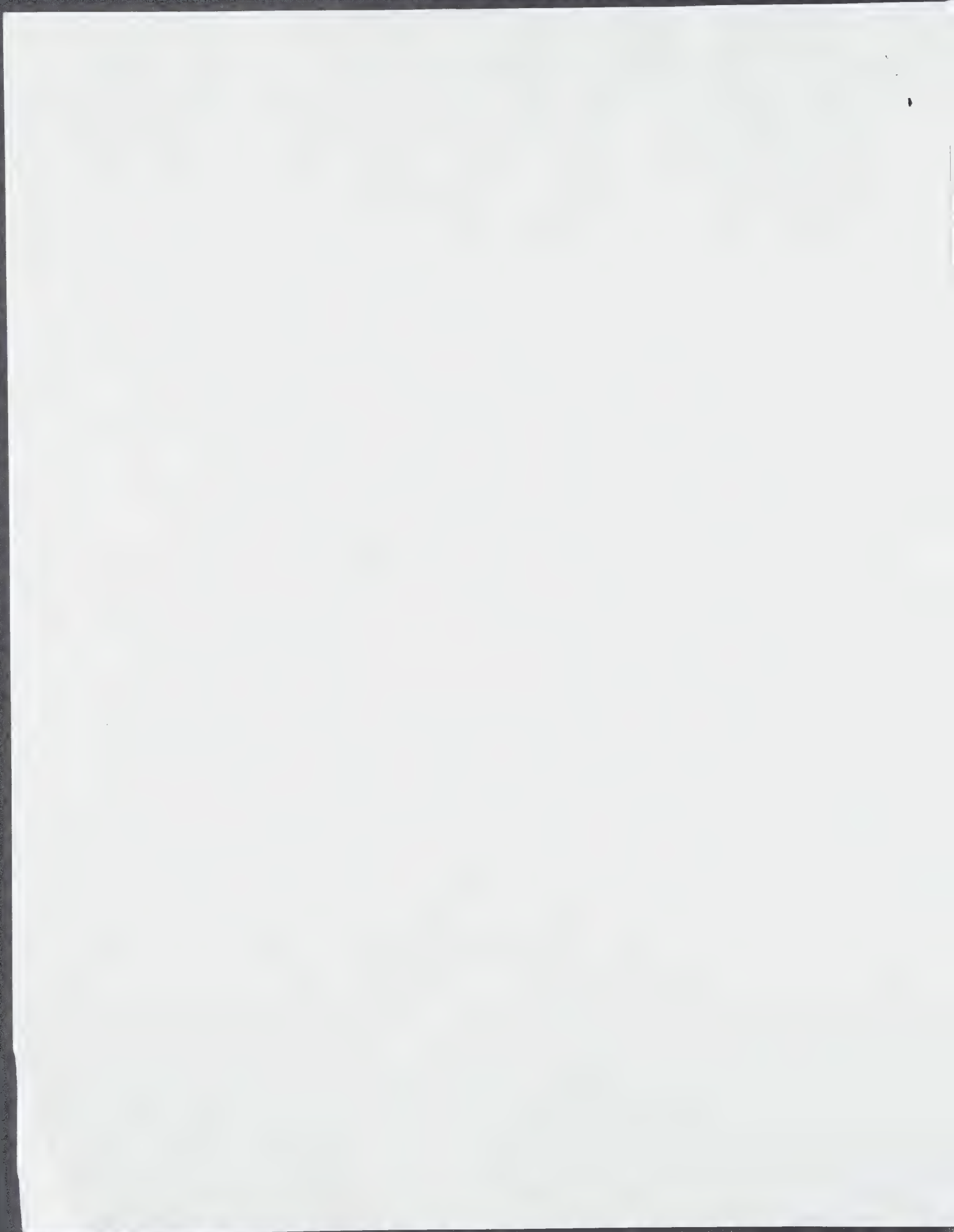
If you've worked with either of these men during your time at Pittsburgh, I'd appreciate hearing from you.

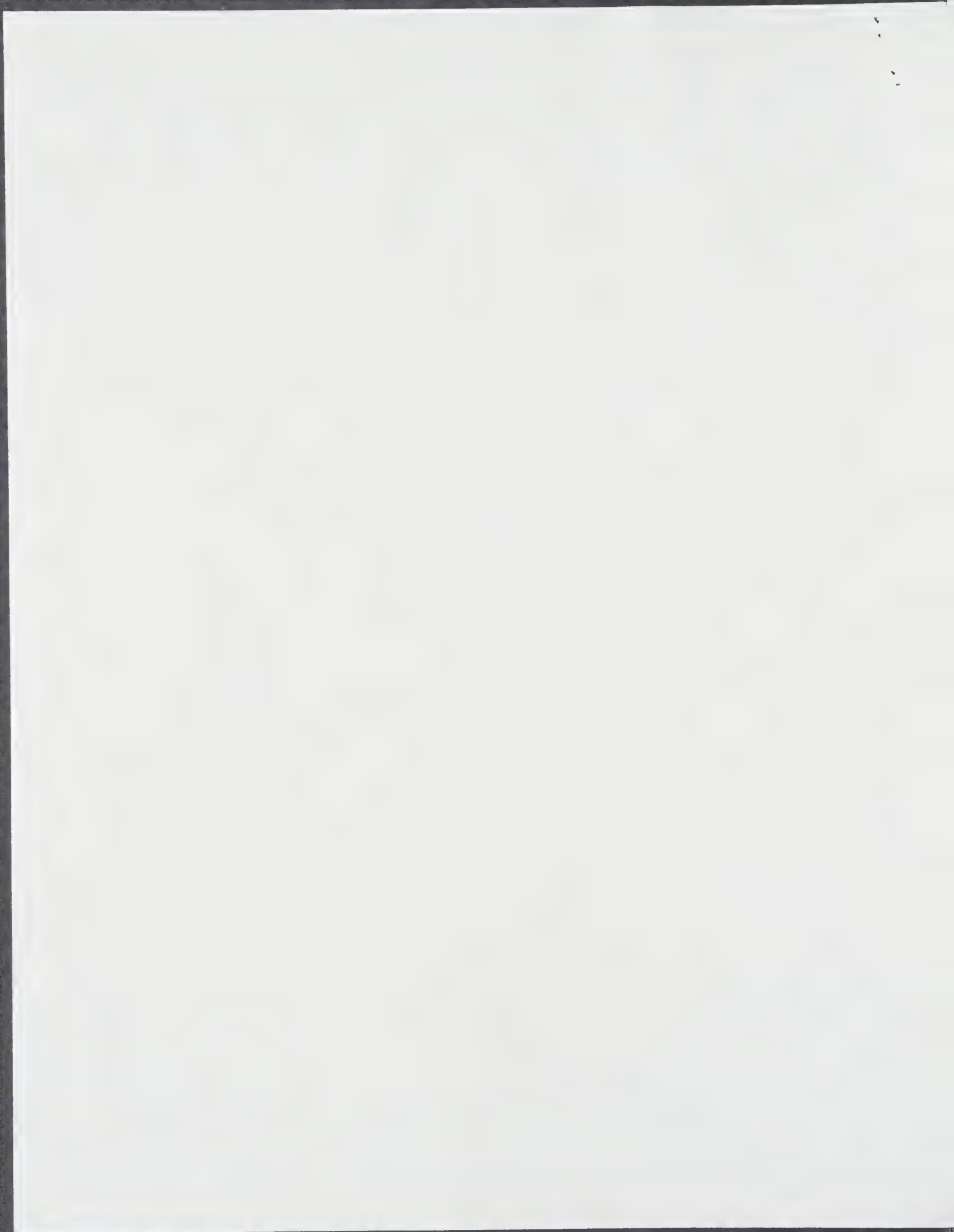


On future occasions we will have to exchange many more stories, anecdotes and life experiences, especially that Alfred and I have started out our adult lives as strangers in a strange land.

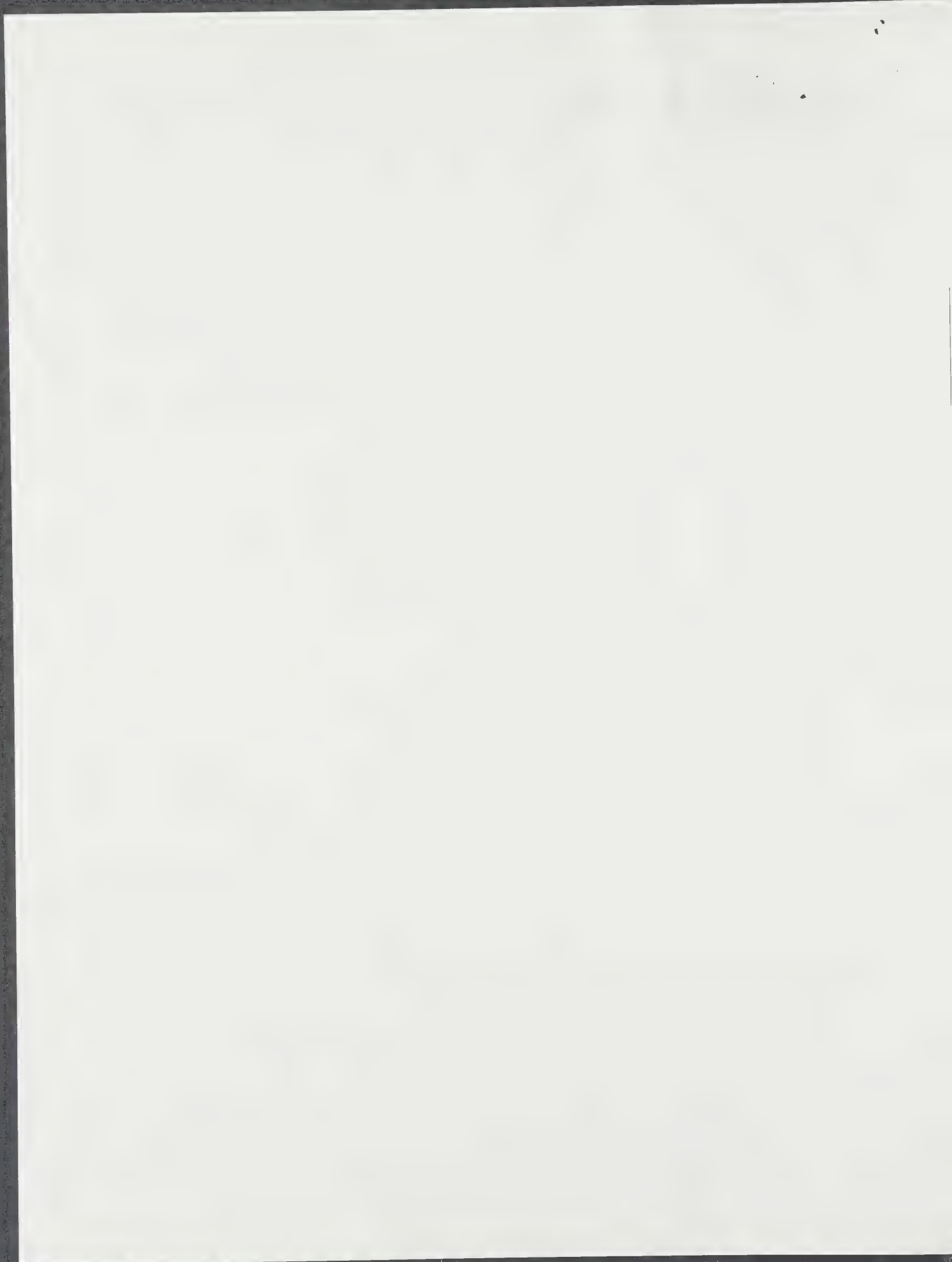

I have tried to telephone you a number of times, and there was always your recording of a very pleasant gentleman speaking with an accent much like mine.

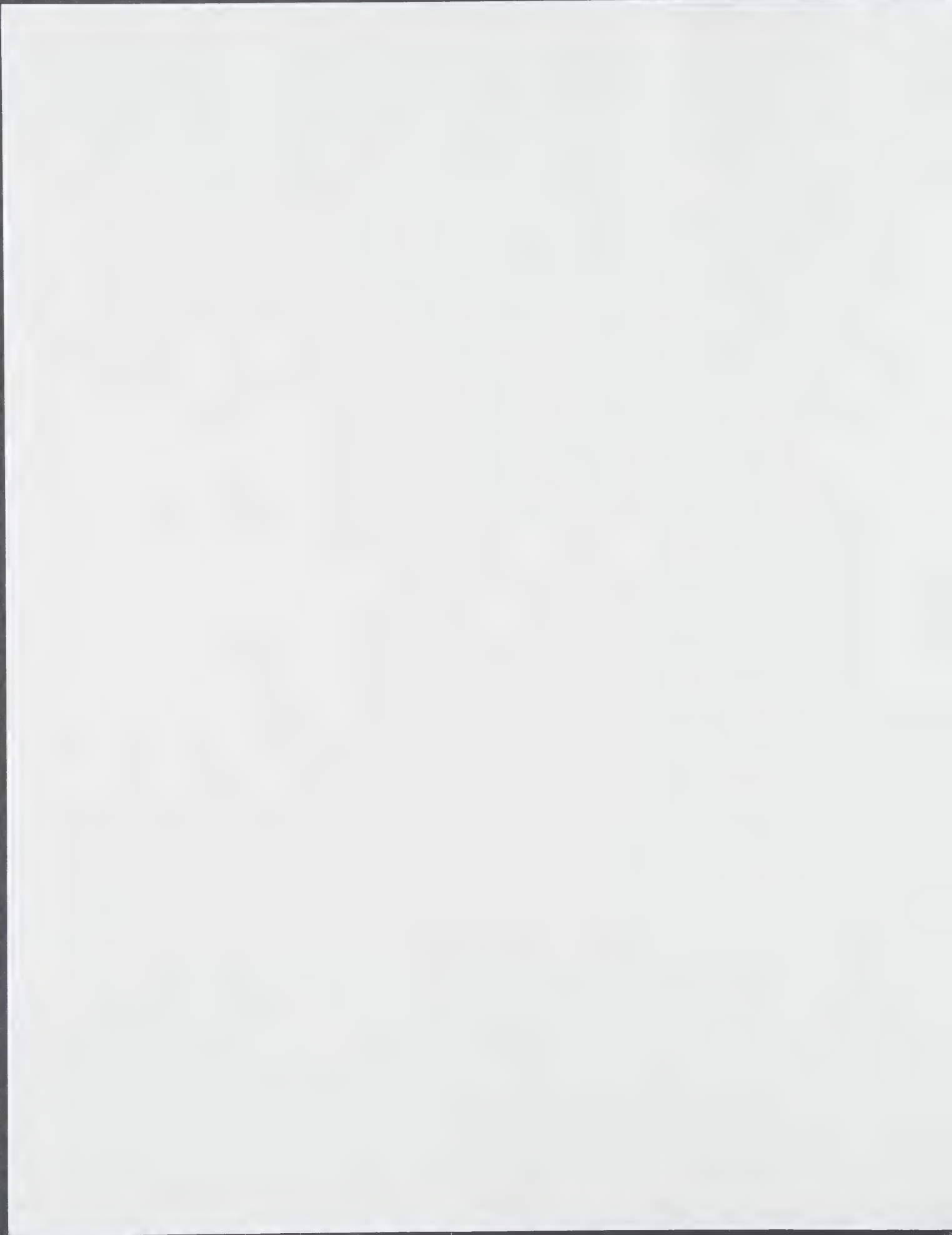

Dear Dr Bader,

My family and I enjoyed meeting you and your wife, Isabel, in the summer. We were most impressed by "your castle" and Queen's University must count itself lucky to have such a generous alumnus. Let us hope that it will be able to keep it on a financially viable basis and that it will flourish (and keep the Bader Center) as it deserves to do.

I shall be sending under separate cover a number of cuttings, which show the attention your generous gifts to the British chemical community is receiving. Another one pertains to Coalite Chemicals.

Also enclosed with these are articles pertaining to the "Festival of Austrian-Jewish Culture" currently held in London. I have taken my children to the opening ceremony and concert and intend to go with my son, Robert, to the seminar on "Fin de siecle Vienna and its Jewish cultural influences". One of the speakers is the famous art historian, Professor Sir Ernst Gombrich, who like yourself and myself hails from Vienna. Did you ever meet him? My son, Robert, and I have been using his book "The story of Art" and I met him for the first time personally last May at a symposium devoted to "Mitteleuropa". I may have told you that Robert won his school's prize for the History of Art last summer. Hence we paid recently a brief visit to Professor Gombrich's house to have his book inscribed for my children.

We also visited recently the National Gallery to see the exhibition on Ruben's landscapes. I was particularly taken by the "Landscape with Moon and Stars."

My research continues to flourish and we are having another communication accepted by the JACS. Alas, our EC grant will terminate soon.

When we met last summer I mentioned that I would like to write to George Soros to see whether his foundation for Eastern Europe might help (the project is with Poland). I would prefer a personal approach rather than to the administrators of his foundation and you mentioned that you might be able to provide his address.

I am tempted by your example and following persistent prompting by my wife and to put "my memories" on paper. You also mentioned that you could let me have the name of a good literary agent. I may do it only for my family, but should it prove of more general interest, such a name would be of value. Also any hints how to approach "Ahnenforschung" would be much appreciated.

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I have one more query. As you know, Austria is now very belatedly beginning to acknowledge the guilt of its behaviour towards its former Jewish fellow citizens. Thus very small compensation payments are in the offing is one sign, the recent sale of unattributed art treasures stolen from Jews with the receipts going to Jewish charities is another. My great-uncle, whose only living relative I am, left a villa in Hitzing. Do you know of any organisation or lawyer, who could help me in this matter? It would be of considerable interest to us now, as we would like to acquire a pied-a-terre in Central London for mid-week. My son, Robert, will be attending a famous school, Westminster School, next academic year in Central London and an excellent school for my daughter, Lily, is also in a similar location. Apart from my winning the Nobel prize or the National lottery, restitution for this villa would seem the only solution to this problem. Any pointers where to start such quest would be much appreciated.

Finally when I recently celebrated my 72nd birthday with a dinner at Veeraswamy, the well-known Indian restaurant in Regents Street, one of the guests, a sprightly 76 year old one, who hailed from Berlin, had also read your book and remembers you from the internment camp. The world is small indeed!
