

#### Dear Margit:

Thank you so much for sending me the memo from M. P. Brichto to the Advisory Board Members on the R'fa-aye-nu Society.

Please allow me to write to you very frankly on two levels.

One level is our family one. You are one of my closest relatives, my first cousin, and obviously we share many genes. You are a truly caring human being and I just hope that I will live long enough to get to know you better as a person. Please do try to visit us again for leisurely talks.

The other level relates to what I think about the Catholic Church.

Until fairly recently I was tremendously suspicious of everything Catholic. To me, as a boy in Vienna, the word Catholic as well as the word Christian simply meant hypocrisy. I remember how the Cardinal Archbishop in Vienna, Innitzer, threw his arms around Hitler to welcome him.

Since then I have learned, to my surprise, that not all Catholics are automatically hypocrites. Isabel and I spent a few days at Boston College, a Jesuit institution, and some of the people there are like you, really caring human beings.

But when I see collaboration between Jews in Eastern Europe with high-ups in the Catholic clergy, I am naturally suspicious and wonder whether it is all froth or reality.

I simply cannot forget how the Pope acted during the 12 years of Nazi terror. If he had stood up against Nazis, a great many people - and not just Jews - could have been saved.

But this evil within the Catholic Church continues.

During the war there were some very good Catholics, mainly in Poland, who took care of Jewish children, mainly orphans. They were baptized to give them some protection. Now, the World Jewish Congress has asked the Catholic Church to present us with the names of these Jewish children so that we can at least inform them of their Jewish heritage. The Catholic Church has refused to give us these names.

Think of the absurdity: The Catholic Church collaborated with the Nazis by giving them baptismal records of Jews who converted and these were then sent to Auschwitz. But now to present us with baptismal information is denied. Where is the Church's sense of justice?

Recently I read a biography of a German nun, Edith Stein, who converted to Catholicism and could not be protected by the Church. She died in Auschwitz. It is a heart-rending story showing so clearly the moral weakness of the Church.

I am happy to have a close relative, a Catholic, to whom I can write so frankly.

This spring I visited Poland, Ukraine, and Lithuania where the echoes of the past still resound: Krakow is *Cracov*, Lviv is *Lvov*, Kaunas is *Kovna*, Telsiai is *Telz*, Panavezys is *Panavitz*, and Vilnius is *Vilna*. Shadows of the past hover.

For me, the emotional experience was compounded by the privilege of benefiting from the esteem and affection Cardinal Bernardin had earned from his colleagues. It is not an accident that many are *ohavei yisrael* (lovers of the People of Israel).

It is in this spirit, I believe, that Cardinal William Keeler of Baltimore has graciously accepted the honorary chairmanship of R'fa-aye-nu Society.

• Activities in cooperation with the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' Office to Aid the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe:

Monsignor George R. Sarauskas, Executive Director of the Office to Aid the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe, has introduced various aspects of R'fa-aye-nu Society's programs for physical and spiritual healing to ecclesiastical hierarchies and church-related hospital administrators in Central and Eastern Europe.

As a result of these meetings, many of which were initiated by Msgr. Sarauskas, whole-hearted moral support and pragmatic assistance has been committed to R'fa-aye-nu's programs.

• New developments in acquiring and distributing medical equipment

Assisted by the International Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Community Relations Council connections were made with newly emerging

Jewish communal programs. R'fa-aye-nu Society is in the early stages of developing working relationships with these organizations.

Early in July, a generous donation was received from Premier Hospitals valued at \$253,000, through the good offices of Director of the Office of International Affairs, Sharon Weinstein. This gift is the result of good will and moral support engendered for R'fa-aye-nu Society by a member of the Advisory Board from Highland Park, IL, Rabbi Dov Taylor, Congregation Solel.

Continuing its support and assistance to R'fa-aye-nu Society, Counterpart Foundation has agreed to ship this donation of medical equipment. The shipment is destined for distribution in Moldova and Ukraine. (Enclosure 1)

# • Work with U.S. Congress:

We continue devoting time and effort to sustaining the significant Congressional support we have earned.

This year, once again, members of our Advisory Board have been of inestimable value in establishing connections with critically positioned Congressional leaders. Melissa Lanier, Chairman for the Cardinal Bernardin Lamed Vov Kolel, Rabbi Eddie L. Schechter, Hasting-on- Hudson, New York, Rabbi Mark L. Shook, St. Louis, Missouri, and Rabbi Chaim Stern. Chappaqua, New York, are among those who helped us make such contacts.

The current status of our efforts for gaining Congressional support for the Bibliographia project is reflected in the enclosed letter from Reps. Rob Portman (R-Ohio) and Gary L. Ackerman (D-NY) to the Chairman of the Committee on International Relations, (Enclosure 3) Please note their reference to the Senate Foreign Aid Authorization Committee Report which "encourages the

authorization of funding for a \$3 million, two-year pilot project in Central and Eastern Europe to be headed by the R'fa-aye-nu Society."

Also enclosed is a similar letter of support from Senators Mike DeWine (R-Ohio) and Arlen Specter (R-PA) to Senator Jesse Helms, Chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. (Enclosure 4)

The fate of our proposal may be determined before Congress recesses for the summer. We will keep you informed and will turn to you again as the need arises.

### • Some thoughts on R'fa-aye-nu Society's Bibliographia Project:

We continue to be committed to the conservation and preservation of Christian and Jewish secular and sacred documents and early printed books where ever they are found. Our plans to disseminate such treasures do not require removing them from the countries where they are.

Recent highly publicized efforts to reclaim and remove manuscripts, books, and documents from Central and Eastern Europe are antithetical to R'fa-aye-nu Society's philosophical grounding.

R'fa-aye-nu Society's *modus operandi* for conservation, preservation and dissemination has elicited respectful response and commitments for cooperation from ecclesiastical and government keepers of these materials.

In my most recent travels, I identified repositories in ecclesiastical as well as secular libraries. Our access to these collections was considerably enhanced by the cooperation and support of churchmen. Some examples:

- In Panavezys and Telsiai, Lithuania, Msgr. George R. Sarauskas who is fluent in Lithuanian, acted as our translator.
- It was Rev. Gintaras Grusas, Secretary General, Lithuanian Bishops Conference, who, at the request of Archbishop Audrys Backis, President of the Lithuanian Bishops Conference, arranged a meeting for us with Emmanuel Zingeris, M.P., Chairman of the Committee on Human Rights and National Minorities.
- In Lviv, the Most Reverend Lubomyr Husar, Auxiliary to the Major Archbishop of Lviv of the Ukrainians, Vicar General Archeparchy of Lviv, Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, eagerly filled the role of translator during our visit to the State Central Historical Archive of Lviv. He is bilingual, having been raised near Union Square, New York City,

I cite these as clear indications of the respectful and welcoming attitudes we consistently encountered along the way.

Non-confrontational in intent or style, R'fa-aye-nu Society has earned the appreciation and trust of members of diverse academic, governmental and religious establishments.

Thus, as with gifts of medical equipment, where both the giver and recipient experience healing, so, too, keepers and seekers of our cultural heritage are blessed.

In the same spirit, in the United States within the past month, through the efforts of St. Louis Advisory Board member Rabbi Mark L. Shook, we have gained the support and commitment for participation of the prestigious Jesuit St. Louis University. Rabbi Shook is also a member of the faculty at St. Louis University. Their cooperation enhances our efforts and will expand our fund raising base. (Enclosures 5 and 6)

#### · Cardinal Bernardin Lamed Vov Kolel

The Cardinal Bernardin *Lamed Vov Kolel*, originally scheduled for Summer, 1997, has been postponed, not canceled.


Our preliminary plans have been met with interest and enthusiasm by Hebrew Union College administration and faculty and Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk of Cincinnati. With the enthusiastic support of Msgr. Sarauskas, bishops and rectors of Christian seminaries and universities in Central and Eastern Europe have been introduced to the prospect of having their faculties participate in the Cincinnati-based Cardinal Bernardin Lamed Vov Kolel,. Details of the rich academic and religious studies programs being planned for the seminars were met with eager anticipation.

Academic and religious support and administrative planning for the *Lamed Vov Kolel*, have been easy compared to the time and effort required to build a financial base for a sustained program. Without the assistance of professional fund raisers, we received a modest sum which enabled us to proceed with preliminary plans. Should the roles of mendicant friar or *mashulach* ever become coed, I shall be well prepared.

A few of our Advisory Board members have arranged (or offered to arrange) living room meetings in order to enable us to promote interest for sustaining our work. Such fund raising efforts will make it possible to take advantage of the offer for a matching grant from the Stefan Batory Foundation in Poland, funded by George Soros.

Our long term plans call for sustaining our programs with the assistance of private foundations.

As we work towards this goal, we turn to you in order to cover our minimal operating costs. As the enclosed photograph suggests, there are many heart warming tales and incidents encountered along the way which I would like to share with you. (Enclosure 7) You have only to find the living room and arrangements will be made.


I have learned a bit more about your sister's work and very much hope that we can get to know each other personally.

## Bader Awards for the Research of Baroque Painting

In 1992, Dr. Alfred Bader and his wife, Isabel, approached The Foundation for a Civil Society with the desire to assist the Czech Republic, to which Dr. Bader has a deep family connection. A noted collector of Baroque art, Dr. Bader established the **Bader Awards for the Research of Baroque Painting** under The Foundation's auspices in 1993. These awards are presented annually to three outstanding Czech students of Baroque painting under the age of 30. Awards of \$5,000 are provided to each winner to support short-term research projects undertaken outside the Czech Republic. The selection process is overseen by **Dr. Milena Bartlová** and **Dr. Tomáš Viček** of the Czech Institute of Art History, with the assistance of the Association of Art Historians of Bohemia and Moravia.

In 1994, The Foundation presented the Bader Awards for the Research of Baroque Painting to **Petr Balcárek** of Palacký University in Olomouc and **Petr Svojanovský** and **Pavel Blattný**, both of Charles University in Prague.

#### The Alfred Bader Award for Chemistry


In 1994, the Czech Chemical Society and The Foundation for a Civil Society presented the first annual **Alfred Bader Award for Chemistry** to **Dr. Ivo Starý**, a post-doctoral researcher on a short-term stay at the University of Geneva. The Kč 100,000 award supports the work of a Czech chemist under the age of 35 whose research and publications are recognized as outstanding. The winner is selected by a distinguished committee headed by Dr. Oldřich Paleta of the Prague School of Chemical Technology.

The Alfred Bader Award for Chemistry is also sponsored by Dr. Alfred Bader, the founder of Aldrich Chemical, one of the leading research chemical companies in the world. Now engaged full-time in philanthropy, Dr. Bader and his wife, Isabel, are dedicated to promoting chemical research, as well as numerous other humanitarian initiatives. 
