
As you will be able to imagine, I was truly sorry to know from your last letter that we again missed each other during my visit to Vienna.

The family and I are all well, as is our first granddaughter, Helena, born to David and Michelle who now live in Pennsylvania.



I have been invited to speak at the University at 17:30 on Tuesday afternoon, June 11th, and then stay in Vienna for three days, either until the 13th or 14th. But I fear that you will be in Grado, which incidentally I know quite well because I had to stay there for 21 days every August when I was a little boy, and I found it ever so boring.

From Vienna, we will go to Switzerland, where I have to consult for a chemical company and want to be at the Fischer Auction in Lucerne on June 18th. And from there we will travel via Stuttgart and Munich and fly back to England around June 22nd.

Is there any chance that you might interrupt your stay in Italy and join all of us in Vienna between the 11th and 14th of June?

Alternatively, do make definite plans to visit us in Milwaukee. I don't get to New York or Washington often and rather dislike both cites. But there are such good non-stop flights by Midwest Express from New York and also from Washington to Milwaukee that I hope you will visit us.


