




We will probably still be in Milwaukee late in October, though early in November we must fly to Toronto for the opening of the Isabel Bader Theatre.



I apologize for the many typing errors in this letter, but his morning my very old computer broke finally down, and typing on, again an old, of typewriter just isn't the same.






## 4) Me


Dear Isabel, dear Alfred, I am looking forward to see you in our small country with an incorrigible people and politicians. But I hope you will meet here some better persons.

Thank you for all the time you spent with me at the Queen's Alumni meeting last week.

In your detailed letter of May 15th addressed to me and the President of the Alumni Association, you touched on many points, some simple and some very complex.

The simplest is your Rembrandt etching of 1648. I just hope that you got a really good and early impression; it takes an expert to tell the difference between a good impression and a restrike.

The best essay on that particular etching which I know is in a rather out-of-the-way book by an art historian, Rachel Wischnitzer, who lived to be over 100. As the book, entitled *From Dura to Rembrandt* might not be available to you, I enclose a Xerox copy of that essay.

On page 2, you wrote that although you are not a Queen's alumnus, you "would like the books and artpieces pertaining to the Dutch Golden Age to remain in Canada to augment Dr. Bader's gift." Hence, I am sending a copy of your letter and my reply to Professor David McTavish, the director of the Agnes Etherington Art Centre, who may wish to contact you. However, please be patient, as Professor McTavish is in Venice right now and will not be back until later this summer.

Your next problem is of very great interest to me because some of my good friends at the University of Sussex have worked with Buckminsterfullerene. You gave me a sample plastic bottle labelled "Macro Buckey Balls", and if I understood you correctly, then you believe that this is Buckminsterfullerene with ferrocene inclusions.

Do you have any analytical data showing that this is not just ordinary soot, but really Buckminsterfullerene and what is the chemical evidence that ferrocene is included?

If you have evidence that this really is Buckminsterfullerene with ferrocene inclusions and if that has not already been published, then of course, you have an important discovery. If you have scientific evidence, may I share this with a very good friend, Dr. David Walton, who has worked with Professor Harry Kroto on the discovery and elucidation of Buckminsterfullerene at the University of Sussex?

Your other important discovery deals with Alberta tar sands. I know nothing about tar sands, but early in April, Isabel and I spent two delightful days in Edmonton and were entertained in a most kindly manner by a scientist working on Alberta tar sands. May I share the information which you gave me with her and then simply suggest to her that she contact you if she is interested?
