A long trip to Europe has delayed my thanking you for your long letter of June 15.

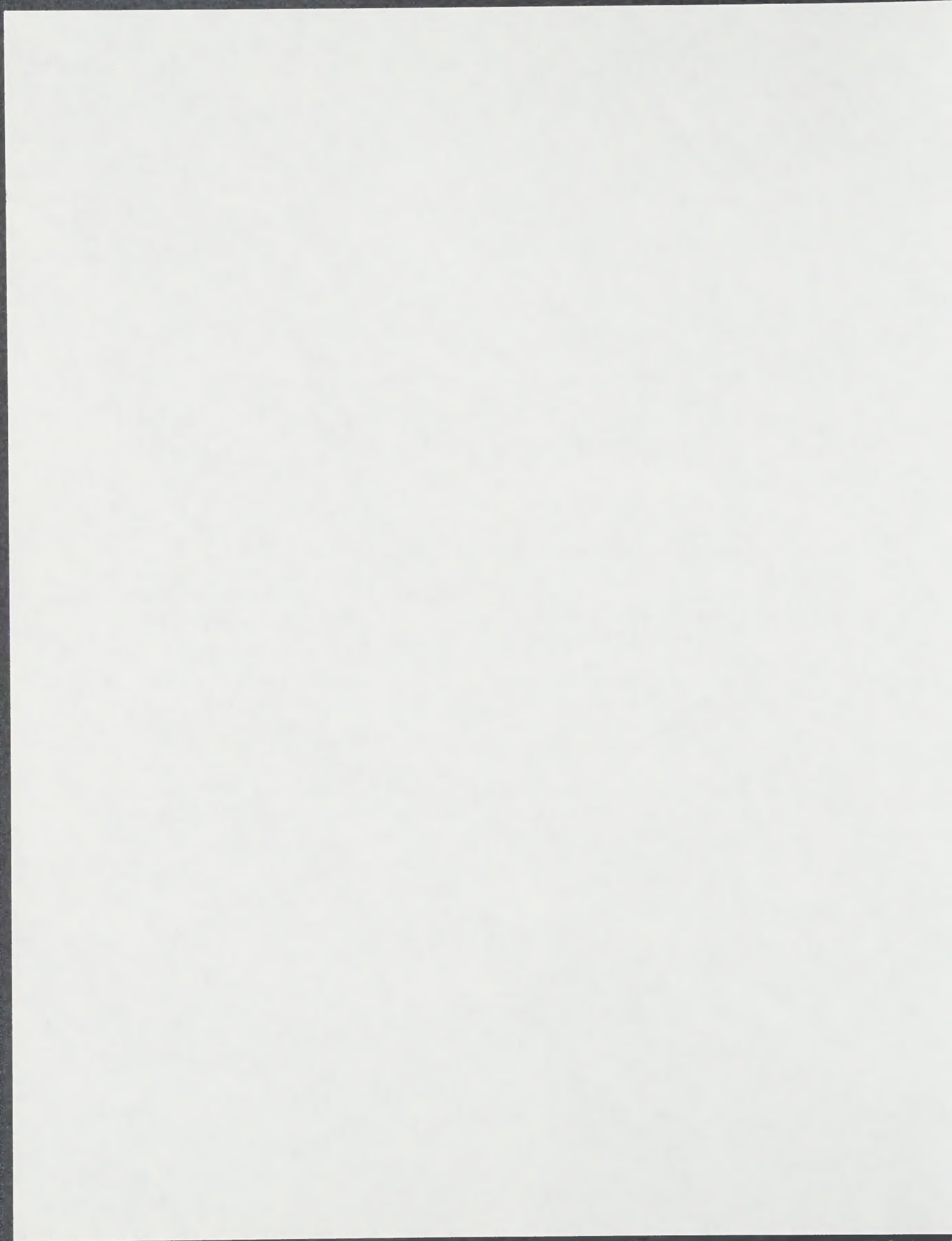



Dear Dr. Bader:

Thank you for your letter of June 7 containing your "menu" of lectures. I have just been talking with Ian Lumsden who, as you may remember is Director of the Beaverbrook Art Gallery in Fredericton. Ian is delighted at the prospect of your visiting Fredericton again. He knows something of your interests and activities, and of course, your talks here last time brought an excellent audience and were a big hit. It is, perhaps premature to talk yet about timing. As I recall, you were not available until the late Fall of 1994, or else next year. The only point to bear in mind when thinking about a schedule is that they like, if possible, to have lectures on Tuesdays around noon. The UNB Chemistry Department would also greatly appreciate another visit, but their "Visiting Speaker Fund" has virtually dried up. Still, they would certainly be prepared to try to make some modest contribution towards the expenses. Unfortunately, the local C.I.C. representative is out of town at present, so I cannot say what their reaction will be. Anyway, the message that I want to convey is that you and Isabel would be most welcome to visit

chemists and art lovers in Fredericton whenever it can be arranged. I shall be in touch with you again as things develop further. It was a pleasure to meet you again in Winnipeg.

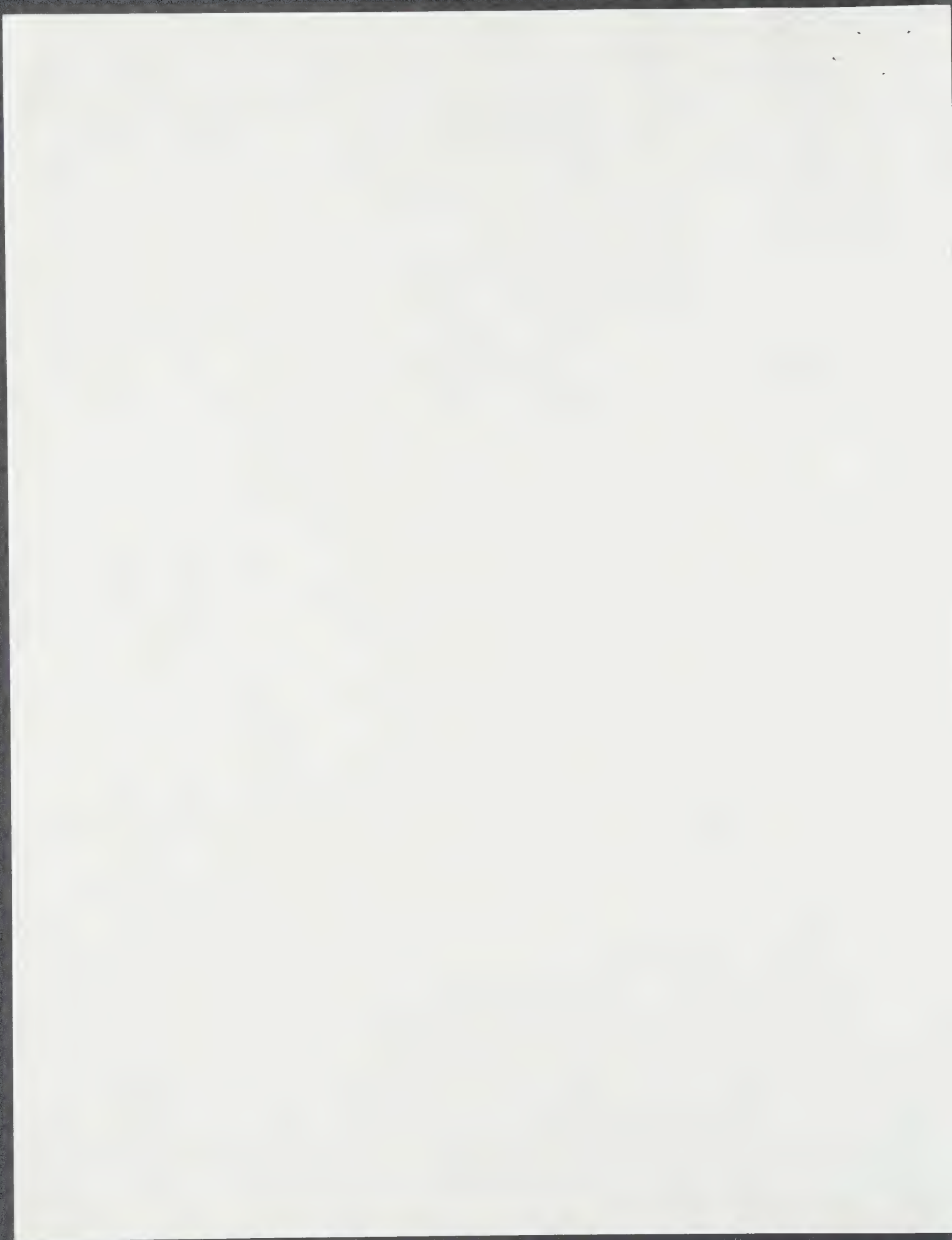

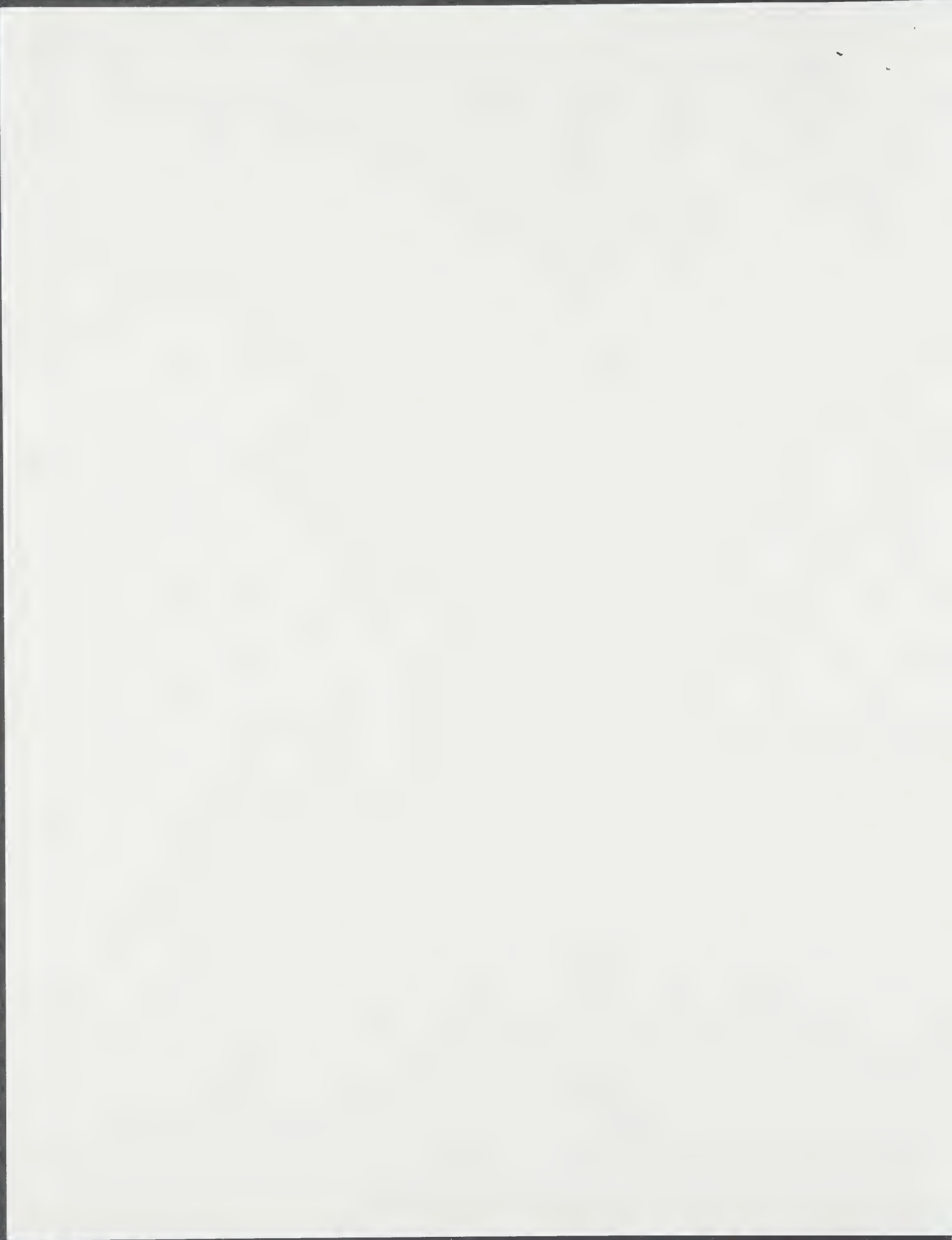

I must tell you that our evening in your department was truly a unique evening.

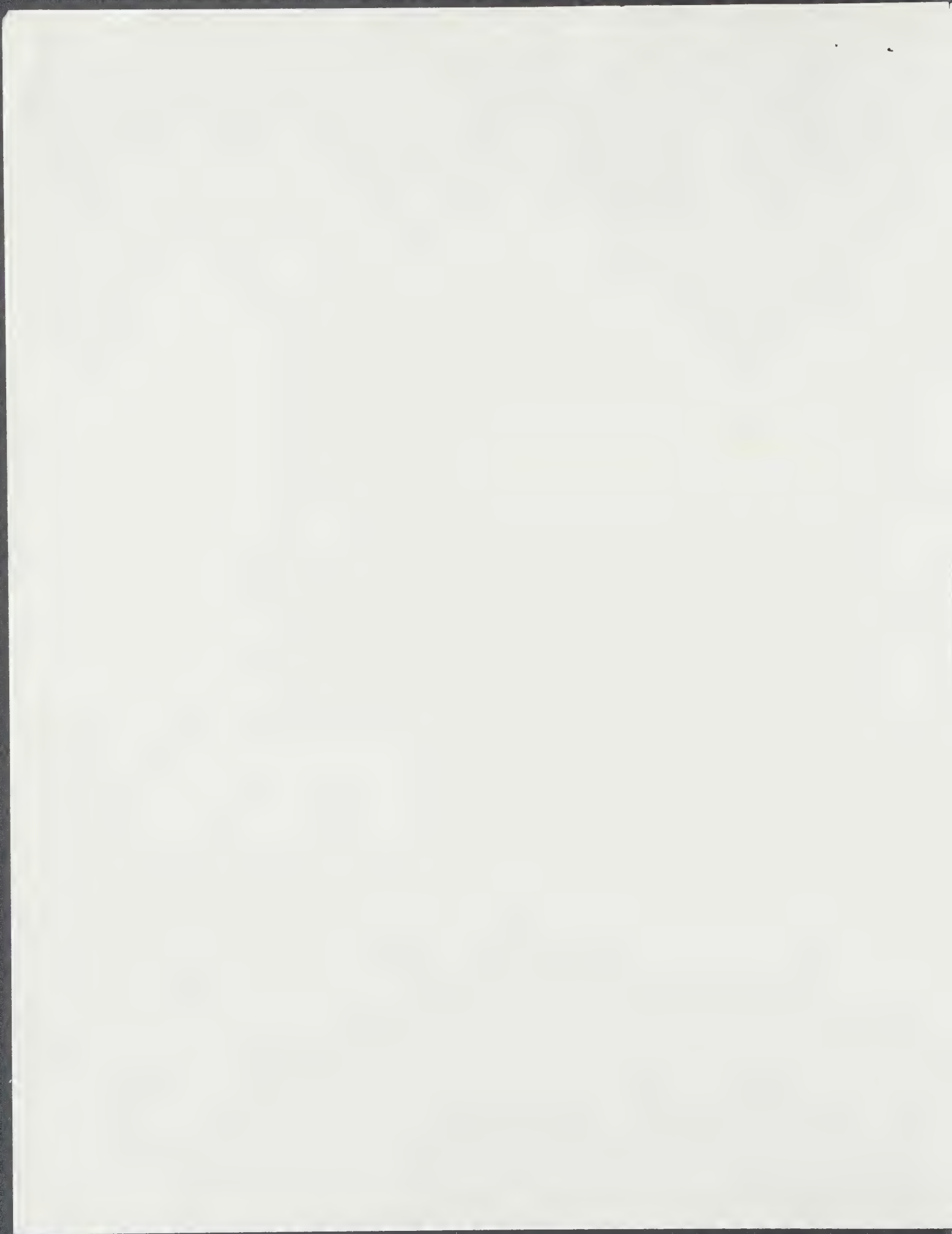

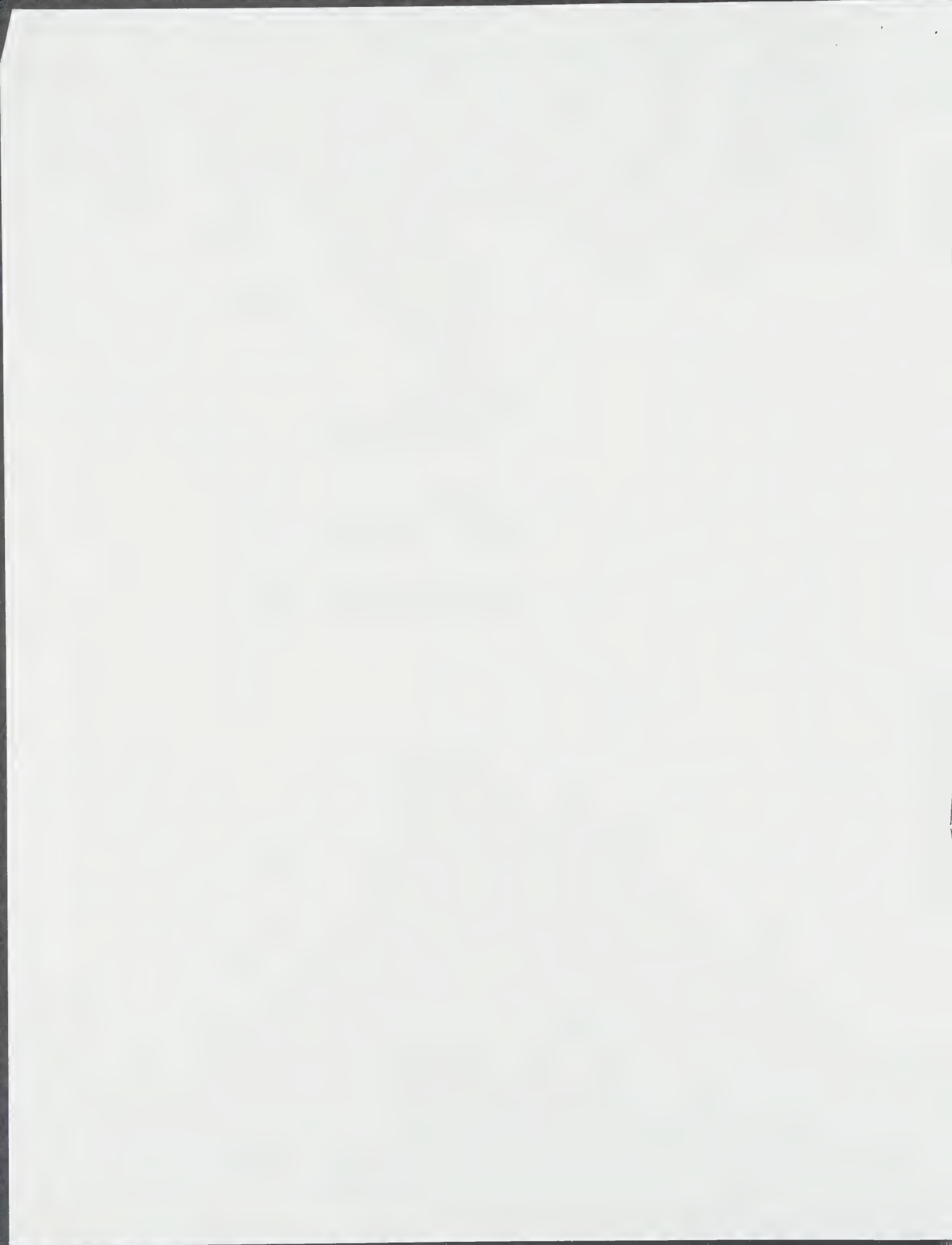

Your kind letter of July 26th reminded me of our wonderful visit with you.

We would love to visit you in October, but that is not possible because of the very high cost of travelling in Canada. Allow me to explain: Isabel and I look forward to being at my Queen's University 45th reunion on Saturday, October 13th. 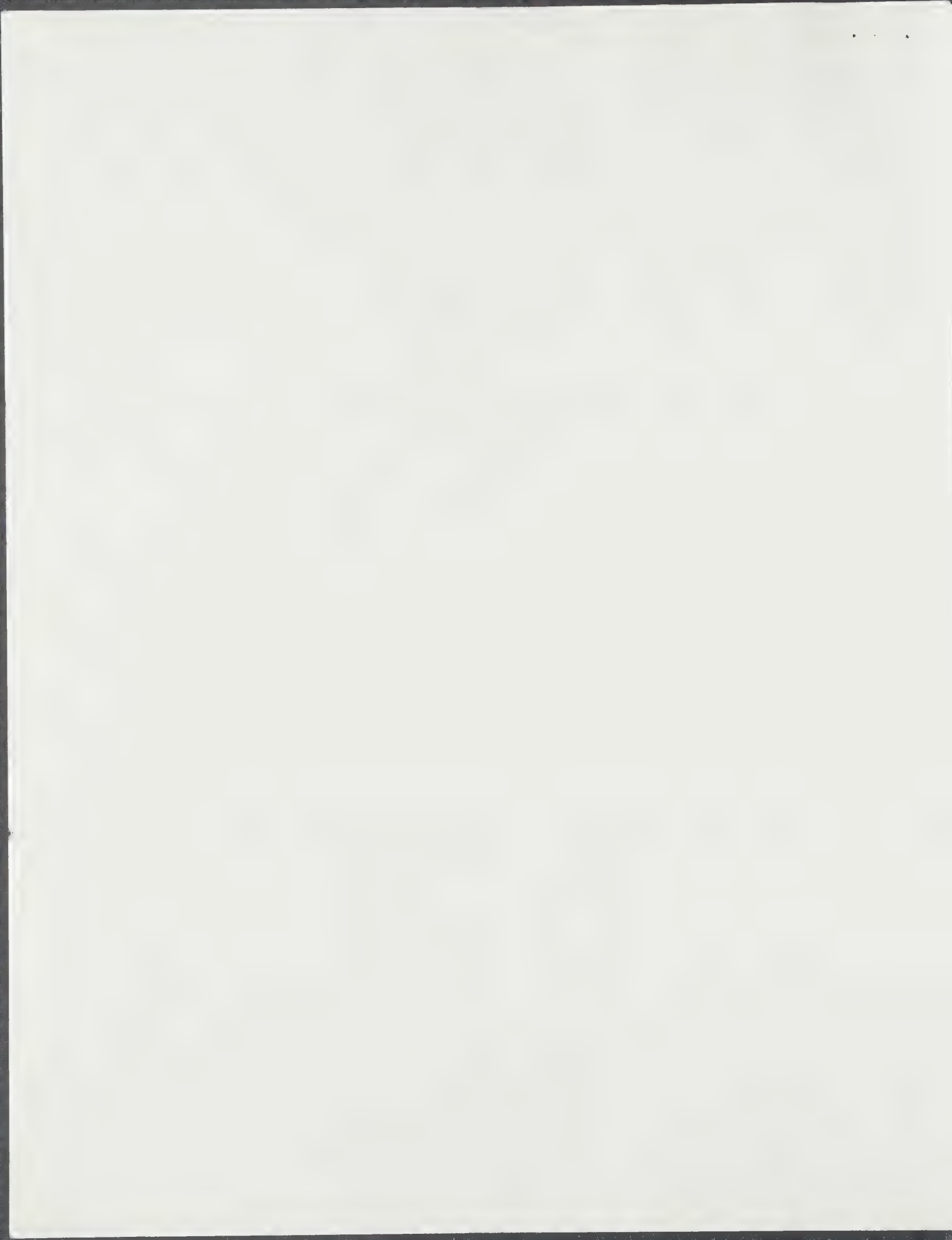

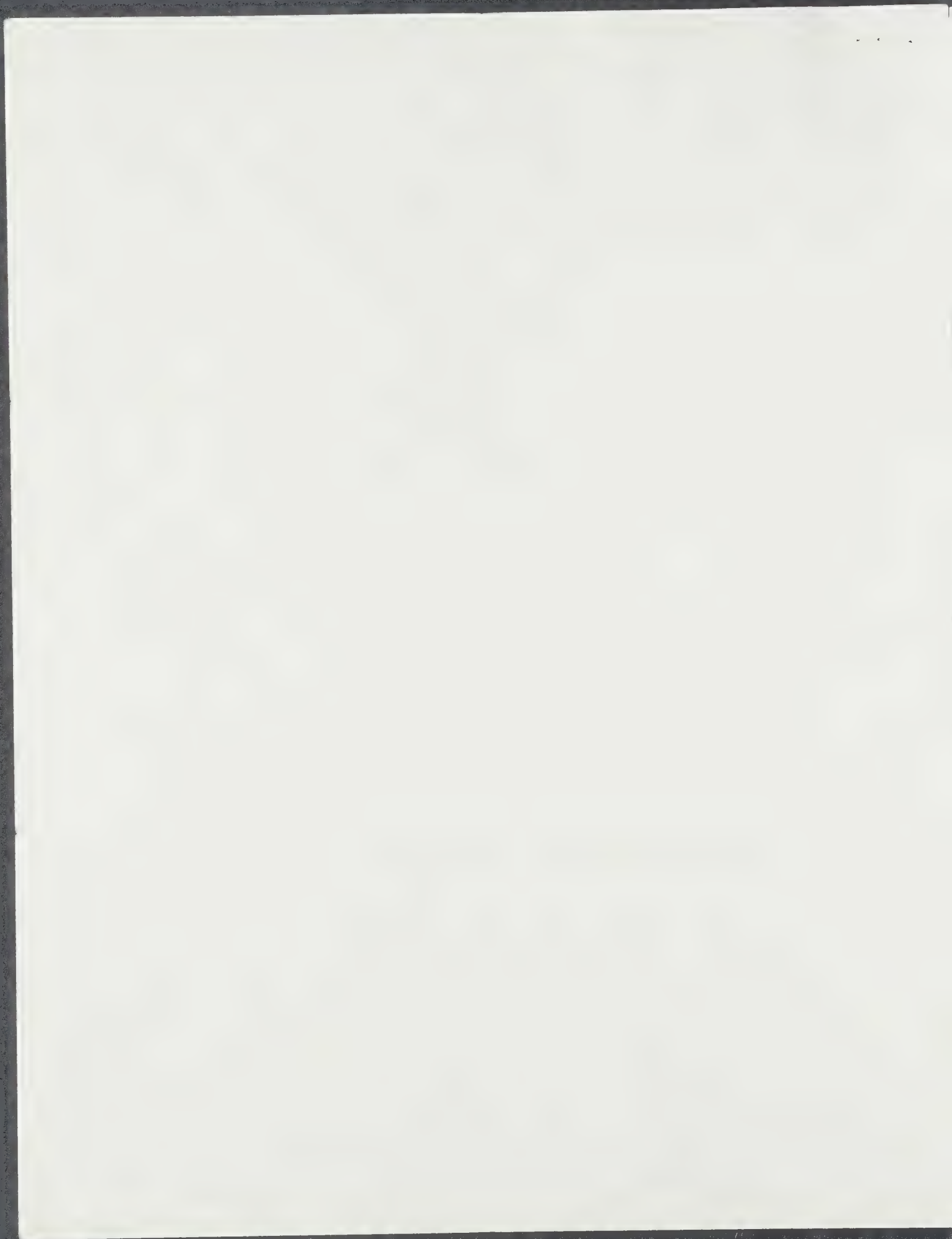

Dr. Alfred Bader, noted Chemist and Art Historian, will present a public slide lecture entitled "Adventures of a Chemist-Collector" on Thursday, November 5 at 8:00 p.m. in Room 241, Beveridge Arts Centre.

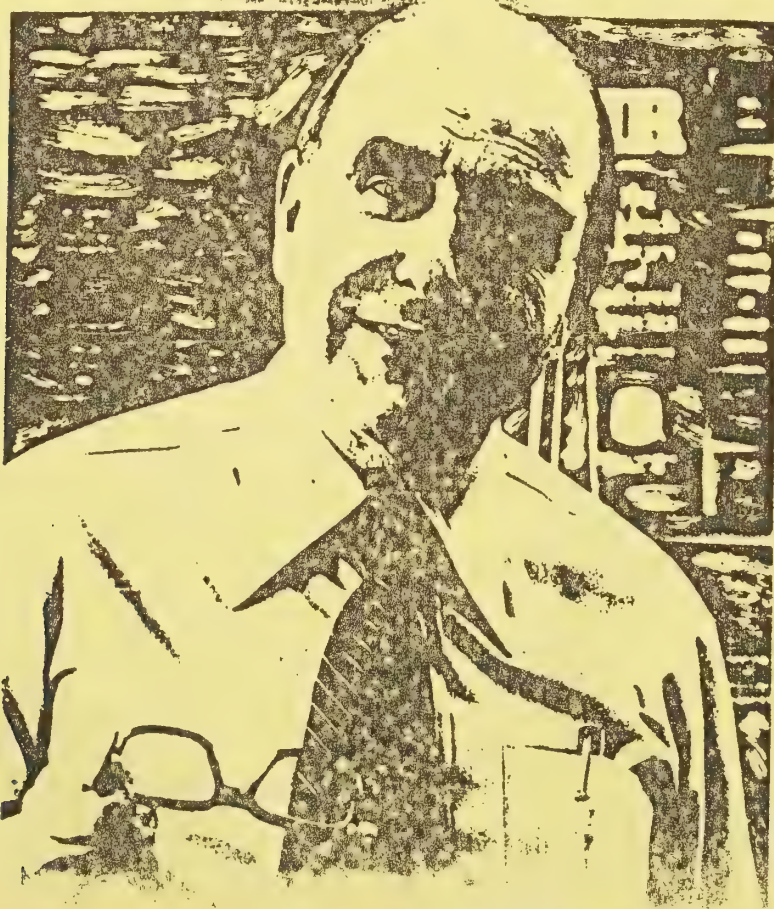
Dr. Bader describes his talk with the following words: "As a collector of old master paintings I look every year at several hundred old paintings - in junk and antique stores and at auctions all over the world - and have to decide, usually within minutes, whether a painting is worth buying. The first criteria is, of course, the general artistic merit of the work - often hard to discern in paintings covered with centuries of dirt. Secondly, is the painting really what I think it is. I am offered a painting said to be by a Dutch 17th century artist - are the pigments those used by 17th century artists? Are the wood or canvas and the ground those used by 17th century Dutch artists?" Many specific examples will be given to illustrate these and other questions and their answers.

A Chemist by profession, Dr. Bader has continued his intense interest in art - particularly Old Masters and the Bible. He has assembled an important private collection of 17th Century Dutch Masters and has assisted with purchases for public collections. In 1976, Dr. Bader was invited to act as guest curator of the Milwaukee Art Centre to organize an exhibition, "The Bible through Dutch Eyes." He produced a scholarly catalogue reflecting his insight and knowledge of painting and the Bible. He is a much sought-after lecturer throughout the USA, Canada and Europe on his favourite subjects; the Bible as represented by the Dutch Masters and the Chemistry involved in restoring works of art. He was selected as a fellow of the Royal Society of Arts in London in recognition of his achievement as an art collector, historian and his research in art restoration. Founder of Aldrich Chemical Company, his contribution to science and industry have been recognized in many ways. He has received Honorary Doctorates of Science degrees from the Universities of Wisconsin - Milwaukee, Wisconsin - Madison and Purdue.

The lecture which is part of the Atlantic Section of the Chemical Institute of Canada, Tour Speaker Programme, is co-sponsored at Acadia by the Art Gallery and Chemistry Department and supported by the Acadia Associated Alumni Visiting Lectureship Fund.

If anyone has old paintings about which they would like advice regarding restoration or identification, Dr. Bader would be happy to look at them before his talk.

You are invited to a reception in the Art Gallery to meet Dr. Bader following his talk.

Dear Dr. Bader:

Today is the day you are expected back from Europe and I hasten to send off the enclosed schedule giving a detailed breakdown of your trip to Eastern Canada.
