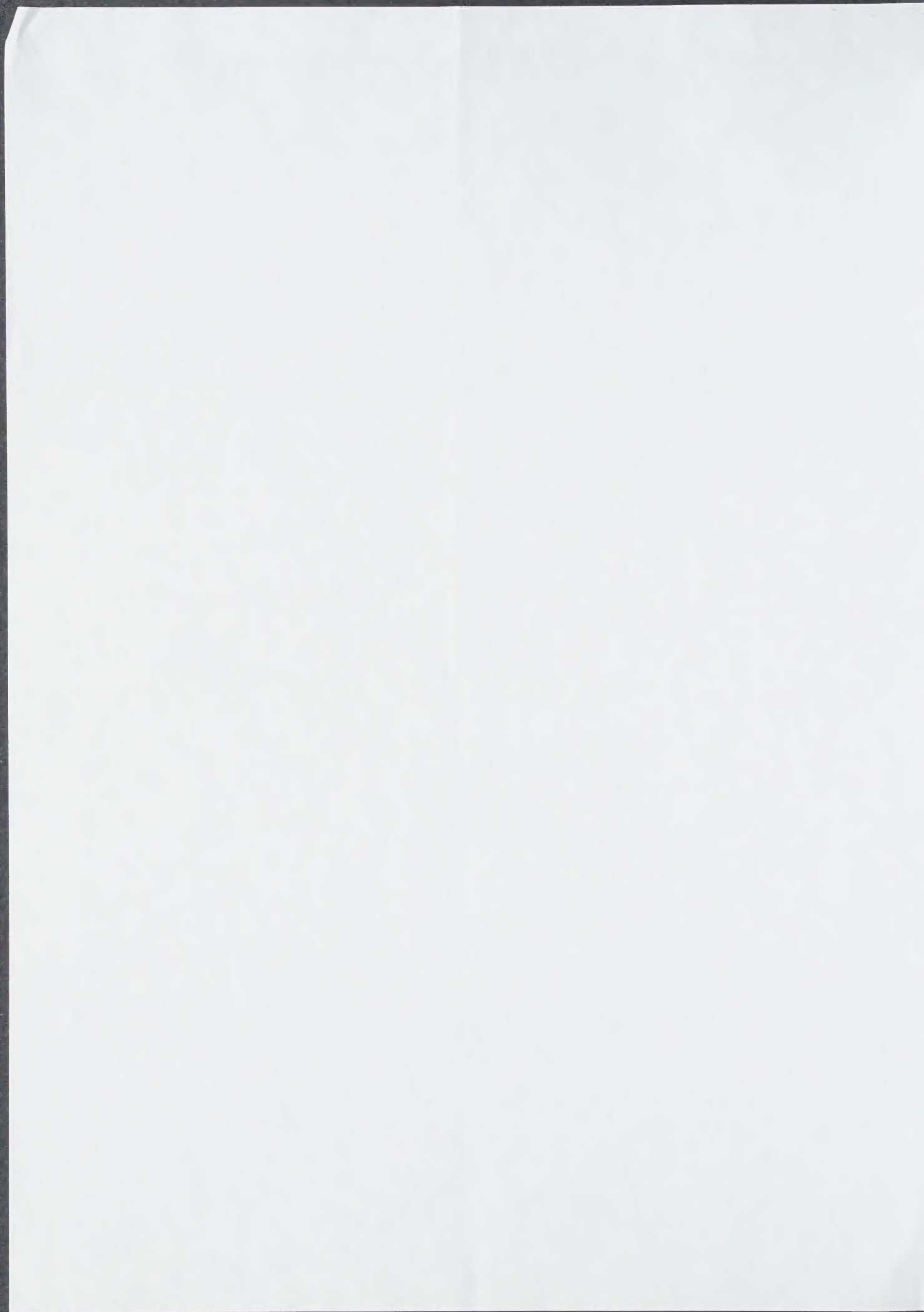

It has been invited to the Toronto, Boston, and London Film Festivals and will have an invitational screening at the US Holocaust Memorial Museum on September 11th.

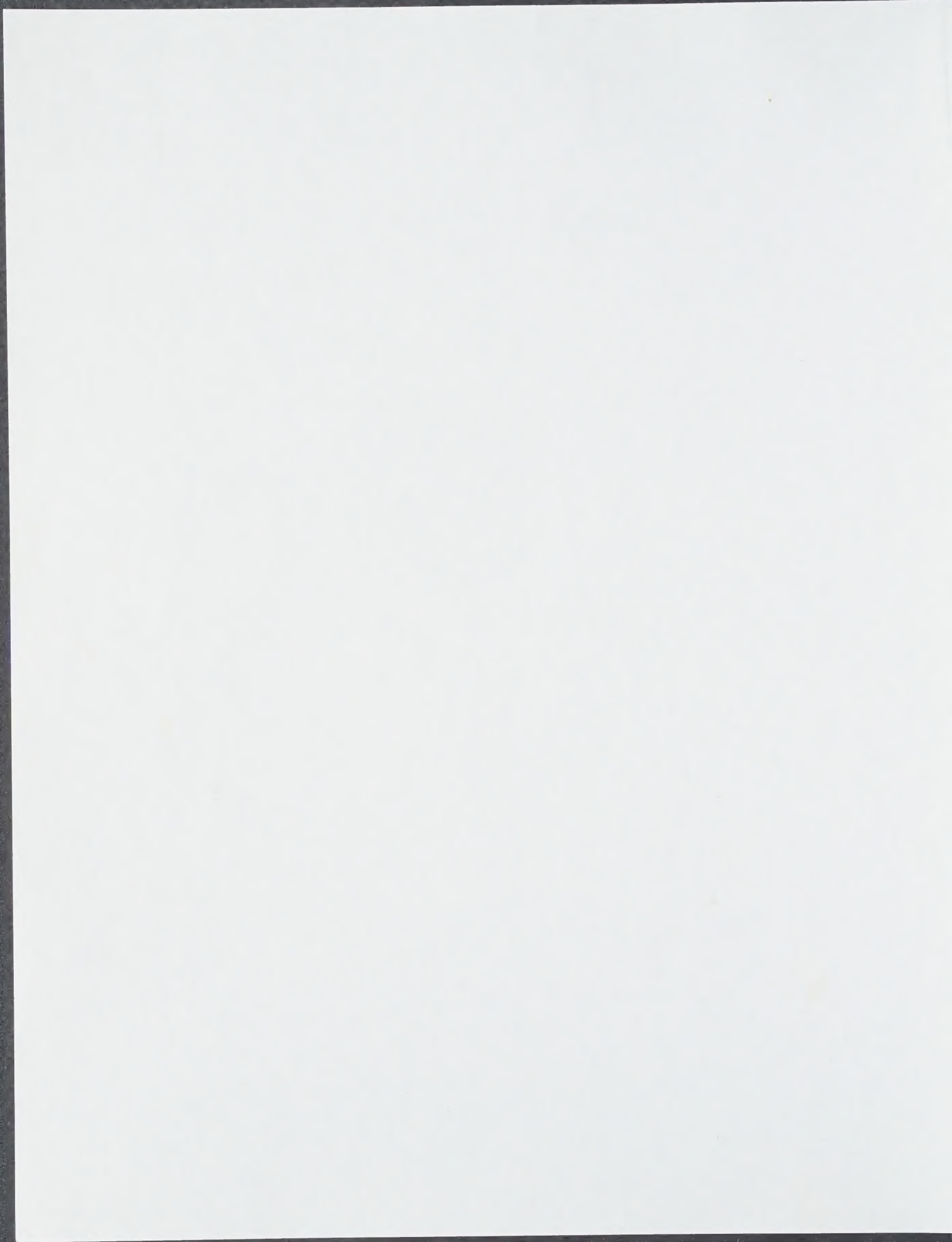

Please call my office then to ascertain whether I can meet you on Monday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

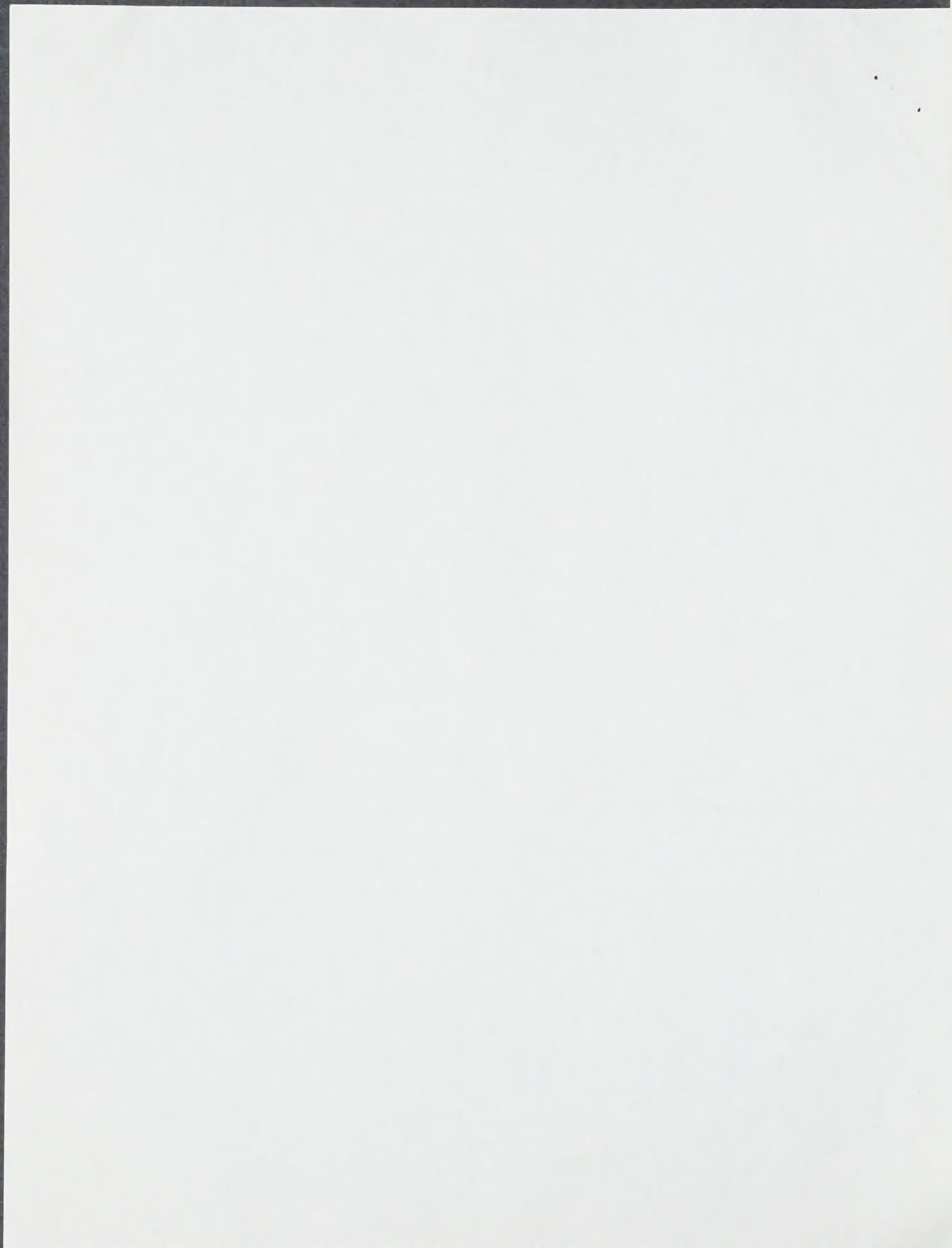

I am sending this by mail because your fax in New York does not work.

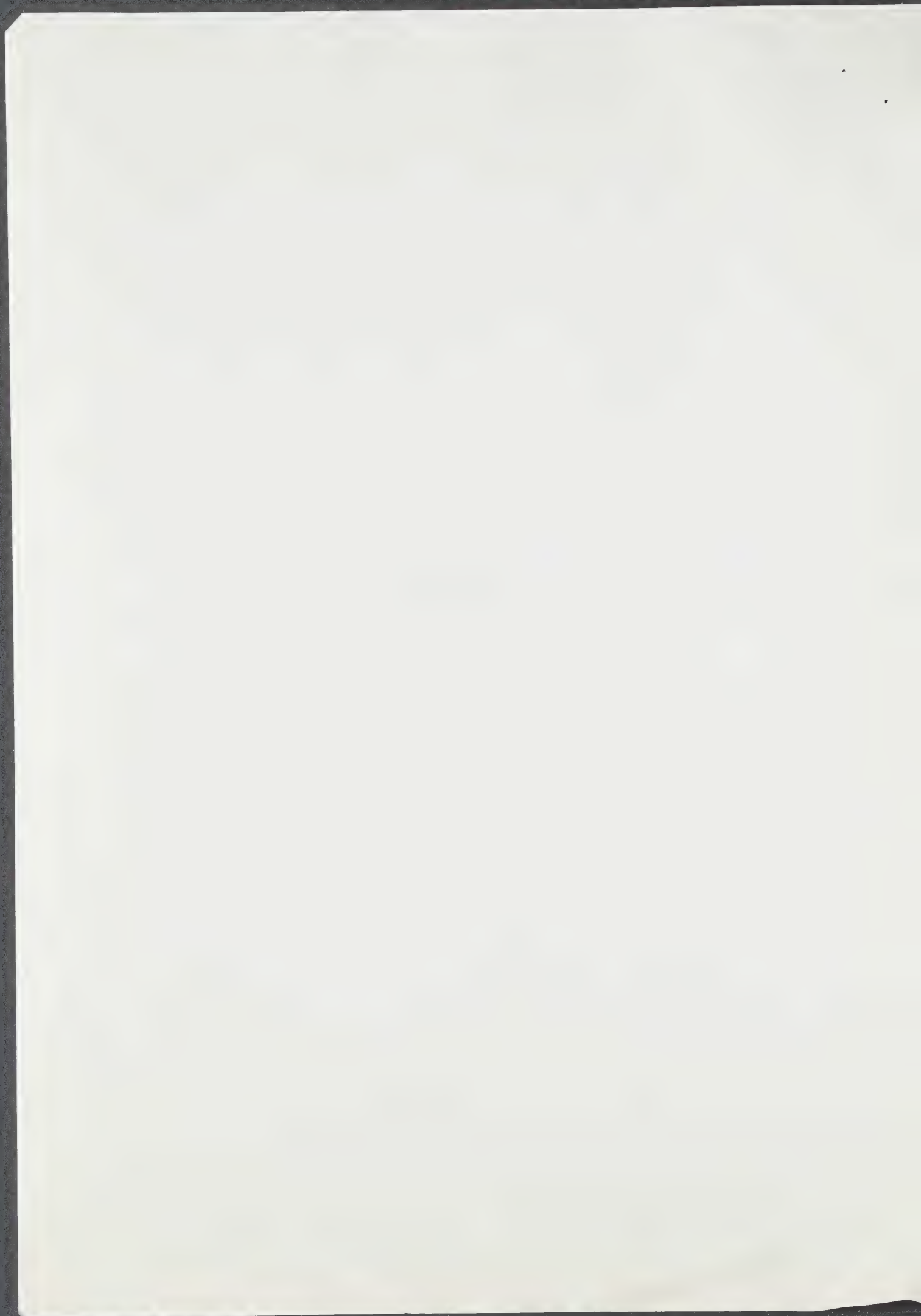

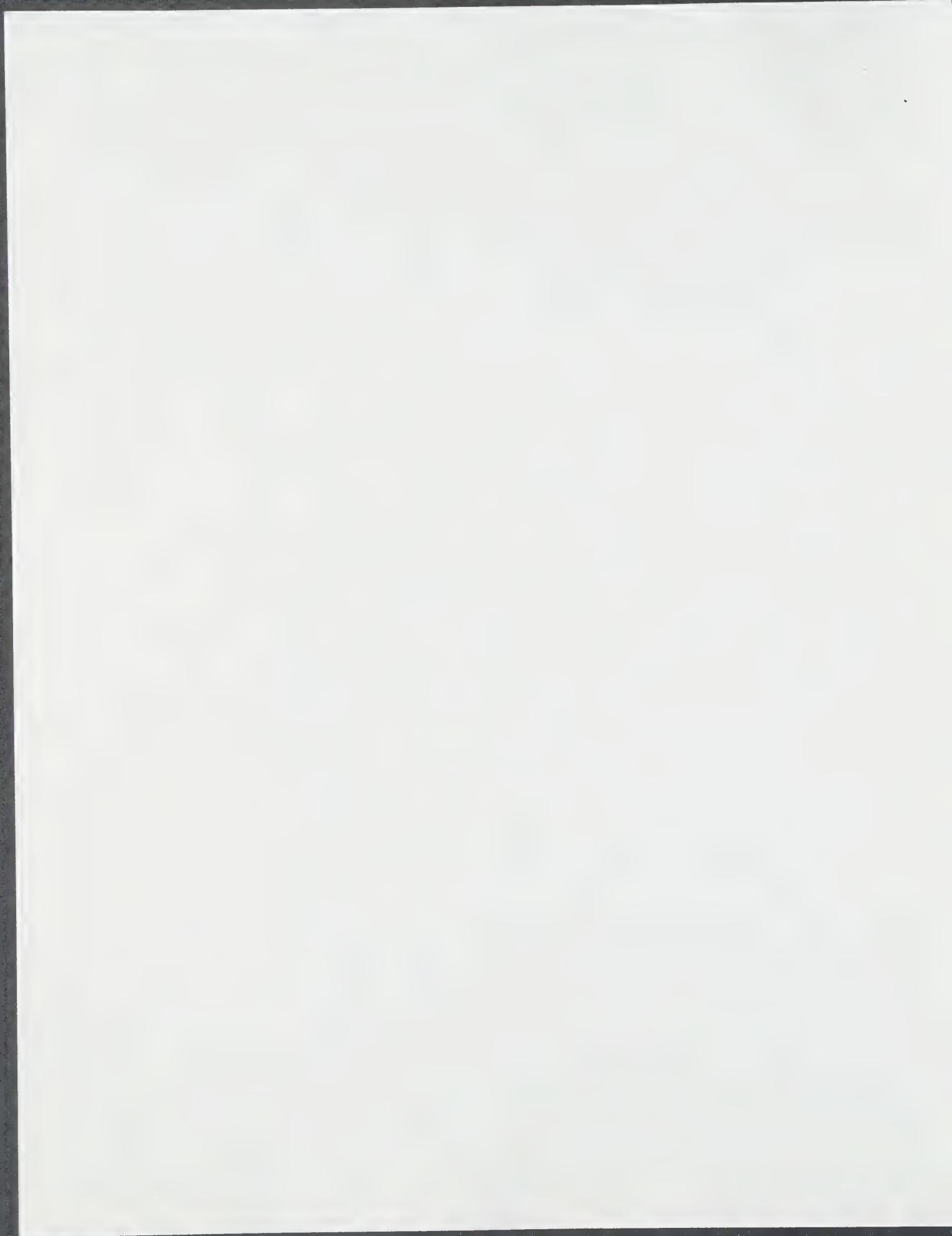
Dear Mrs. Hassan,

May I ask you for your help in the following matter: Some two years ago your organization told me about the great needs of an orphanage in Odessa and last year about similar needs of an orphanage in Dnepopetrovsk. You may know that I sent \$30,000 for each to the Joint last year. Now, however, I have received a rather curious letter from Jacob Bradpiece at Ohr Somayach in New York and I enclose copies of his letter and of my reply.

This week my best friend, Marvin Klitsner, is visiting us, coming from Jerusalem where he and his family have settled. (You can read all about him in the autobiography I left with you.)

I showed that correspondence to Marvin and he told me that he believed that Ohr Somayach is a far right-wing organization, one which I would ordinarily not help. It is clear from Mr. Bradpiece's stationery that Ohr Somayach is a worldwide organization, obviously well organized and of course my first question is whether my gift of \$30,000 is being well used.

Of course if I had the simple choice of having orphans under the care of a right-wing organization or under no care at all, I would choose the former. But the question remains, with such a worldwide organization why do they need me?

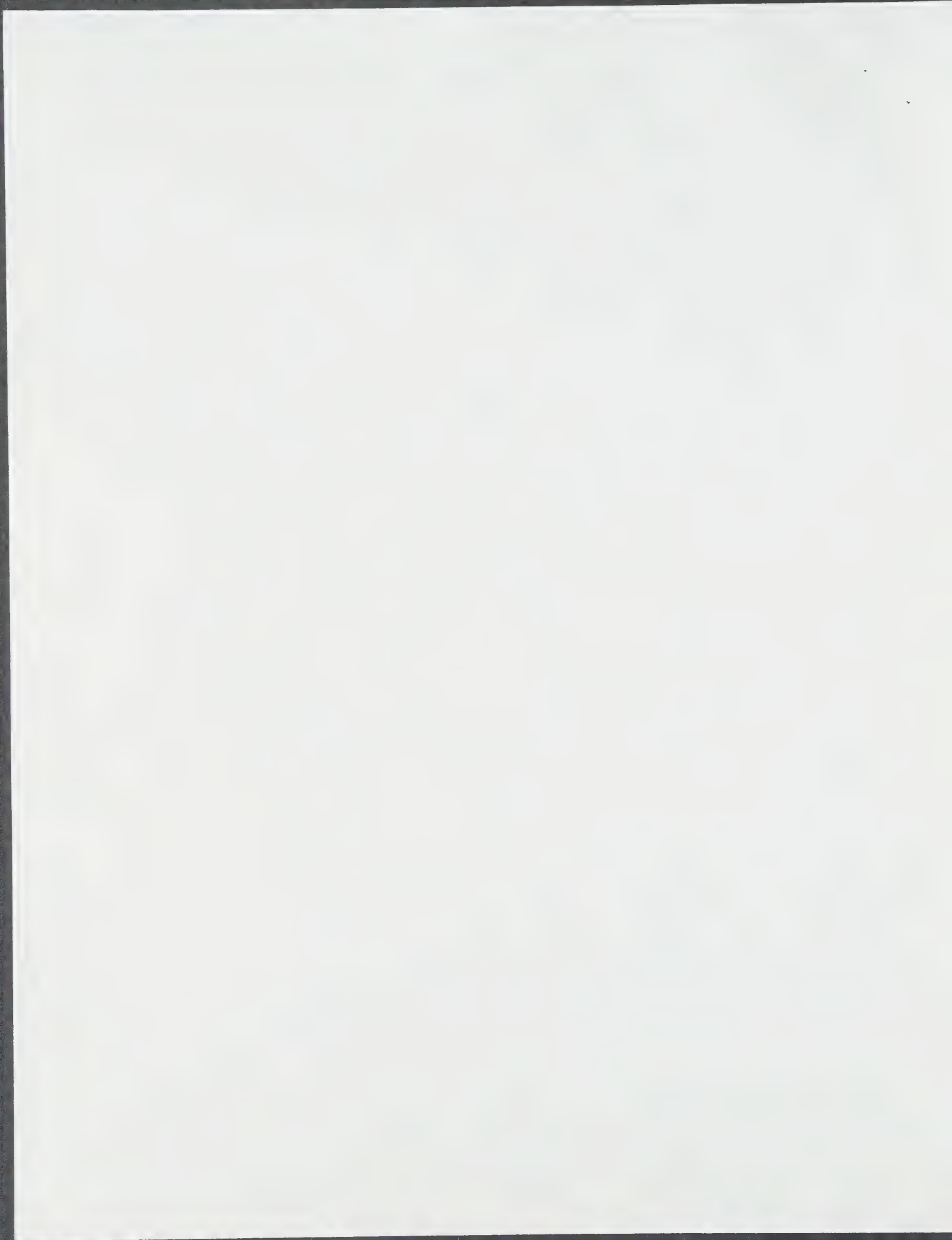
Could you please also tell me whether the orphanage in Dnepopetrovsk is run by the same organization?

I am sorry that a trip has delayed my responding to your letter of February 2<sup>nd</sup>.

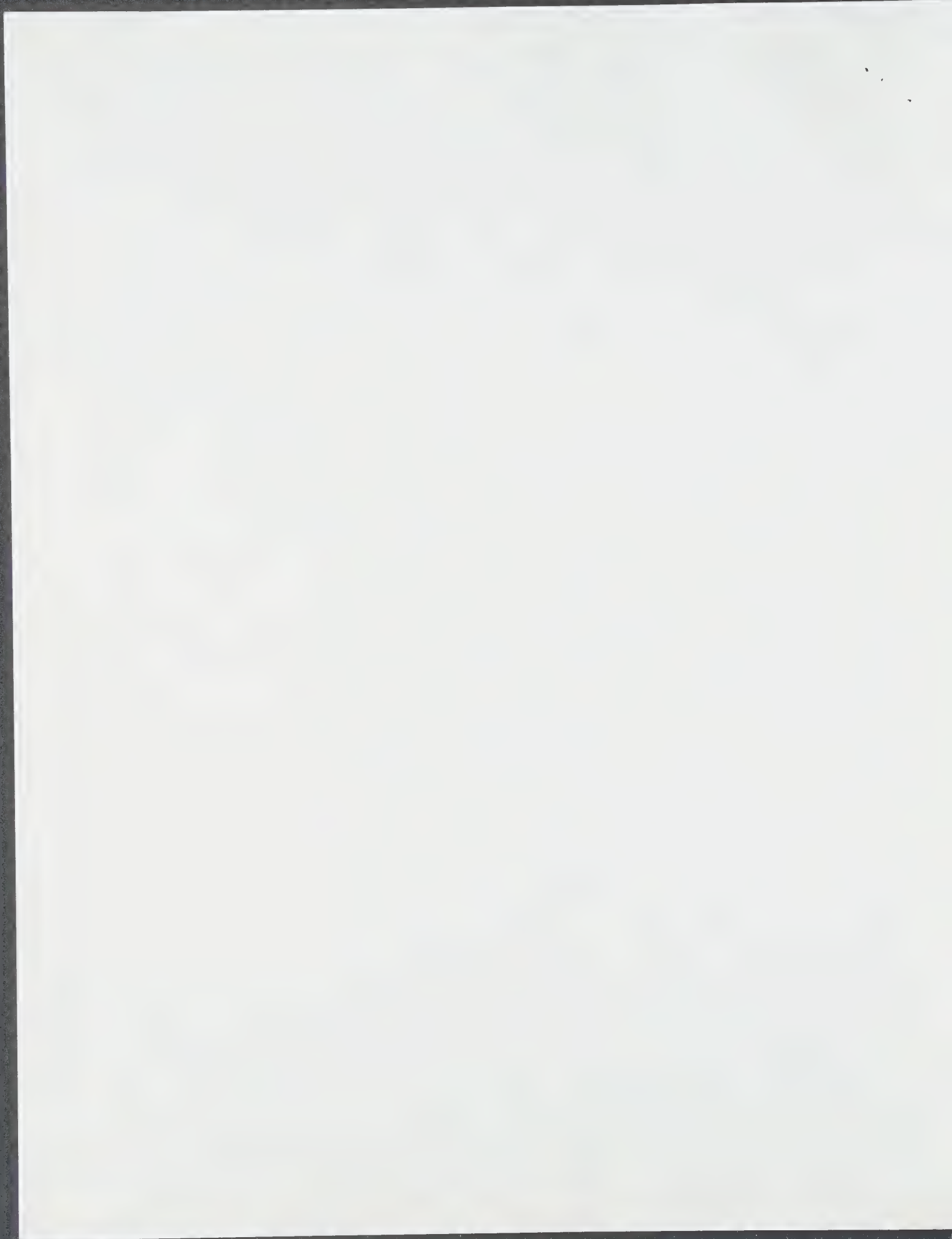

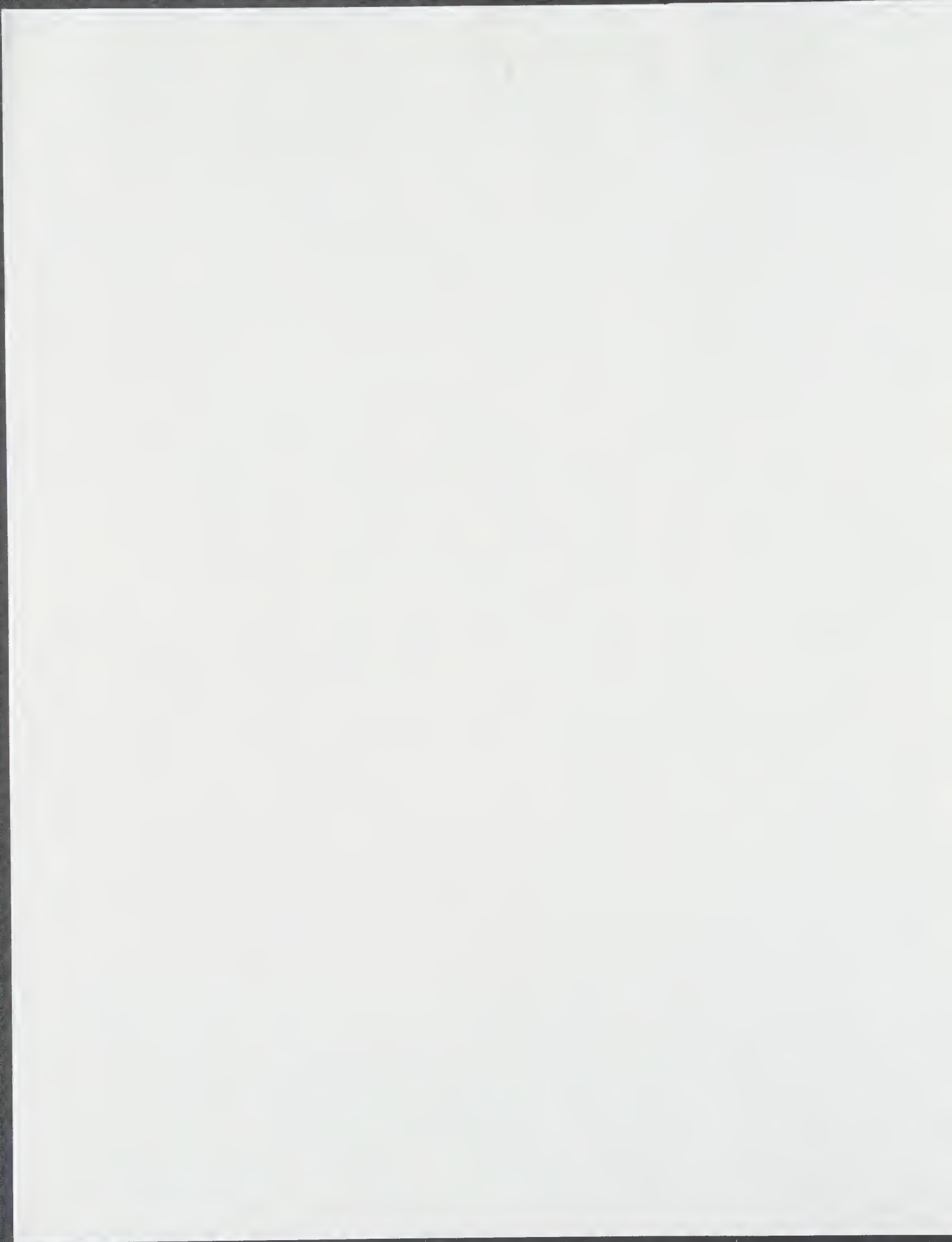

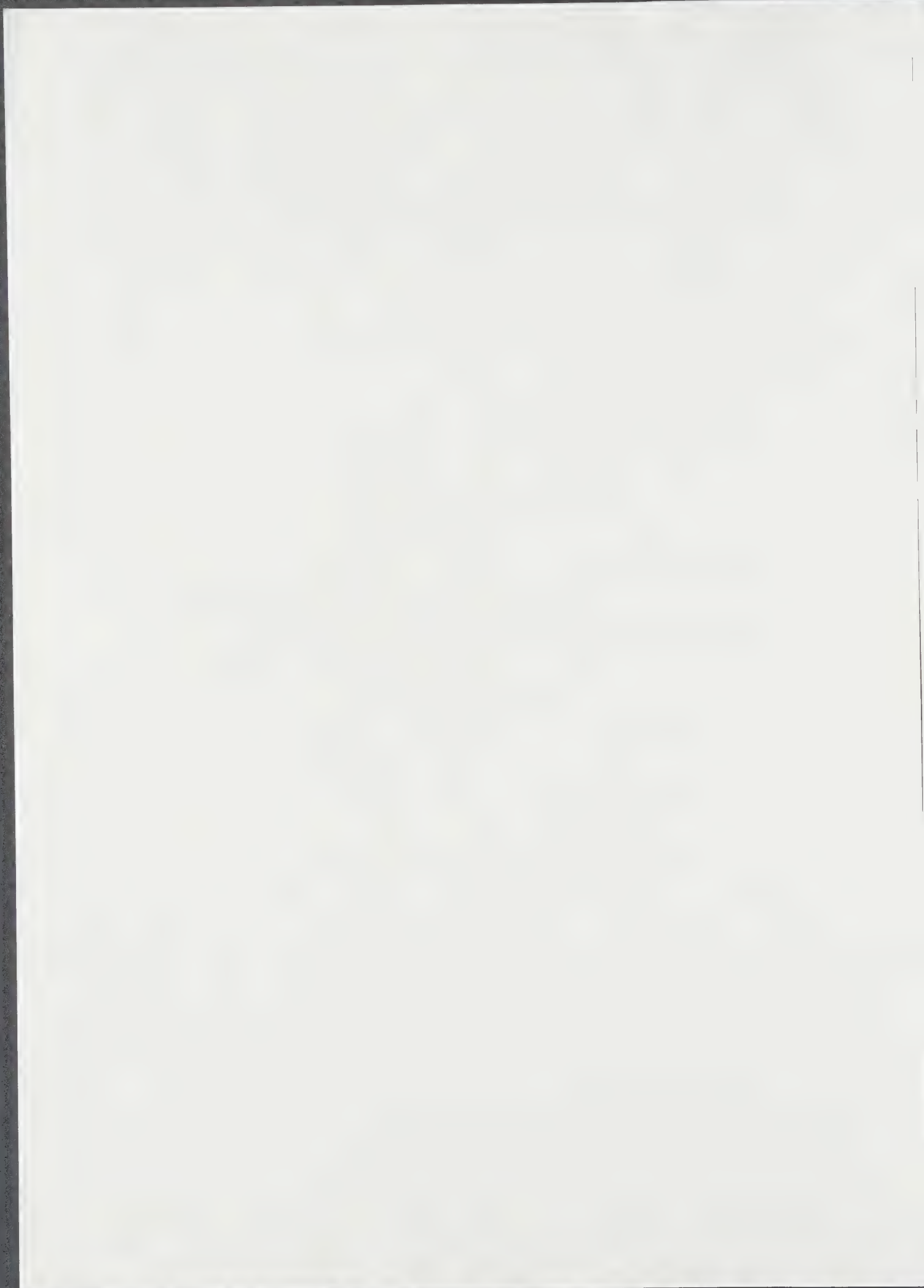

Anspruchsberechtigungen für den NS-Opfer-Fonds. §2. (1) Der Fonds erbringt Leistungen an Personen,

1. die vom Nationalsozialistischen Regime aus politischen Gründen, aus Gründen der Abstammung, Religion, Nationalität, sexuellen Orientierung, auf Grund einer körperlichen oder geistigen Behinderung oder auf Grund des Vorwurfes der sogenannten Asozialität verfolgt oder auf andere Weise Opfer typisch nationalsozialistischen Unrechts geworden sind oder das Land verlassen haben, um einer solchen Verfolgung zu entgehen, und.

2. die a) am 13. März 1938 die österreichische Bundesbürgerschaft und ihren Wohnsitz in Österreich oder

b) bis zum 13. März 1938 durch etwa zehn Jahre hindurch ununterbrochen ihren Wohnsitz in Österreich gehabt haben bzw. in diesem Zeitraum als Kinder von solchen Personen in Österreich geboren wurden oder

c) vor dem 13. März 1938 die österreichische Bundesbürgerschaft oder ihren zumindest etwa zehnjährigen Wohnsitz verloren haben, weil sie wegen des unmittelbar bevorstehenden Einmarsches der Deutschen Wehrmacht das Land verlassen haben, oder

d) vor dem 9. Mai 1945 als Kinder von solchen Personen im Konzentrationslager oder unter vergleichbaren Umständen auch in Österreich geboren worden sind.

(2) Leistungen werden insbesondere an Personen vergeben, die keine oder eine völlig unzureichende Leistung erhielten, die in besonderer Weise der Hilfe bedürfen oder bei denen eine Unterstützung auf Grund ihrer Lebenssituation gerechtfertigt erscheint.

(3) Der Fonds kann auch Projekte unterstützen, die Opfern des Nationalsozialismus zugute kommen, der wissenschaftlichen Erforschung des Nationalsozialismus und des Schicksals seiner Opfer dienen, an das nationalsozialistische Unrecht erinnern oder das Andenken an die Opfer wahren.

(4) Der Fonds erbringt einmalige oder wiederkehrende Geldleistungen.

## NS-Opferfonds kann mit Arbeit sofort beginnen

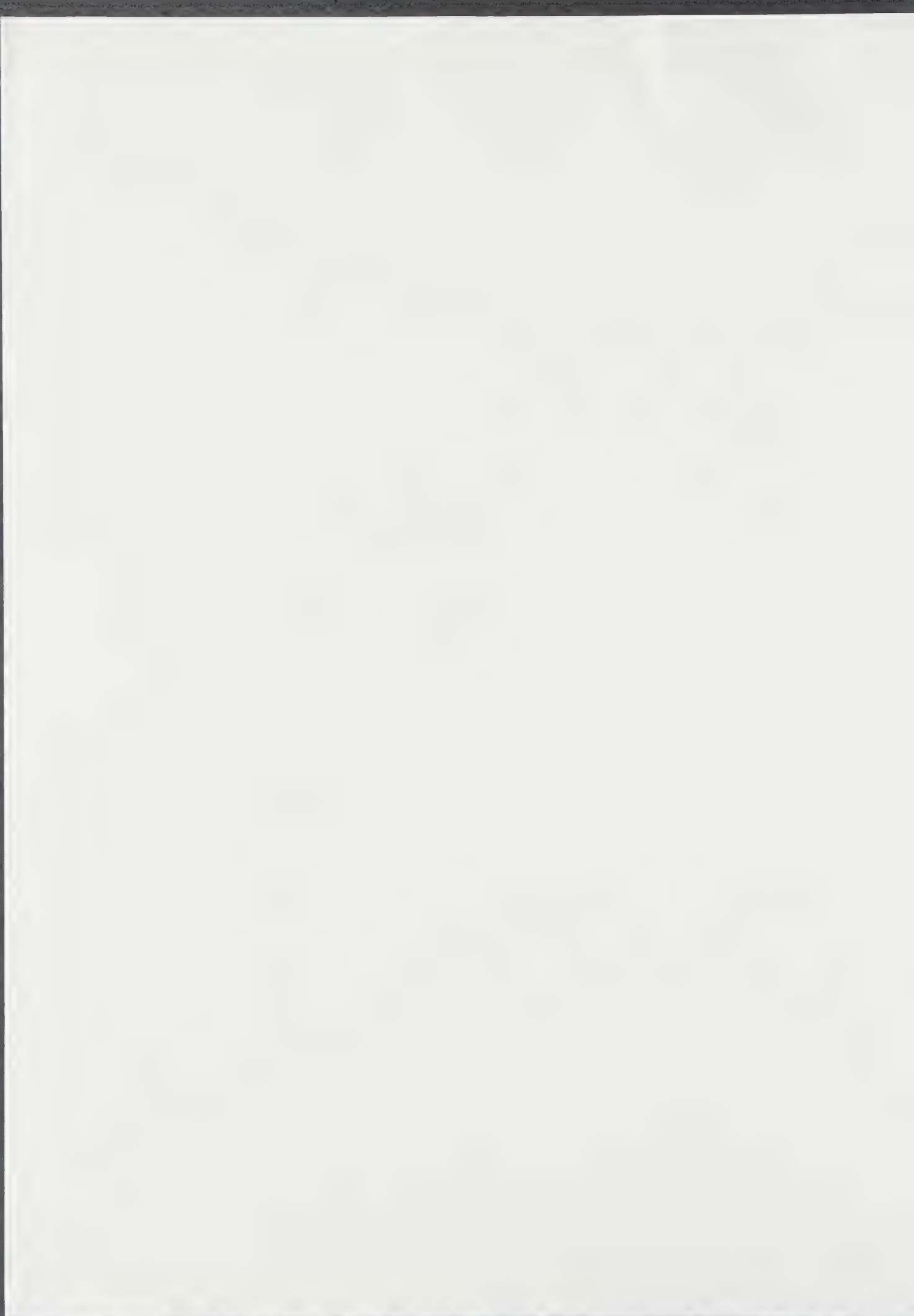
Wien – Das Kuratorium des NS-Opferfonds hat Dienstag nachmittag in einer Sitzung im Parlament die „Richtlinien für die Zuerkennung von Leistungen des Nationalfonds der Republik Österreich für Opfer des Nationalsozialismus“ einstimmig verabschiedet. Damit kann sofort mit der Bearbeitung der Anträge begonnen werden.

Das Komitee, das über die Auszahlungen entscheidet, wird durch die Richtlinien beauftragt, allen „Opfern des nationalsozialistischen Regimes

einen Grundbetrag in der Höhe von 70.000 Schilling zuzuerkennen“. In Härtefällen kann der Betrag bis zu 210.000 Schilling erhöht werden. Ursprünglich sah das Bundesgesetz vor, daß die Entschädigung nur an sozial Bedürftige ausgezahlt wird.

Nach der Entscheidung erklärte der Stellvertretende Vorsitzende des Kuratoriums, Heinrich Neisser: „Ich bin froh, daß die Voraussetzungen geschaffen wurden, mit der Arbeit des Fonds sofort zu beginnen.“ (APA/anka)

The *Österreichische Exilbibliothek im Literaturhaus* was founded in 1993. It systematically documents the life, work and influence of Austrian writers who were driven into exile or who emigrated from 1933 onwards: this includes authors who were born within the historical borders of Austria, who can be counted as belonging to the complex of Austrian culture or those for whom Austria represents or has represented a focal point in their lives. While the core of the collection is formed by works of fiction, drama and poetry, the fields of essay-writing, journalism, the cinema, cultural philosophy and the humanities are also taken into consideration.

The *Österreichische Exilbibliothek im Literaturhaus* is an institute for research and documentation which collects, classifies and makes publicly accessible material relating to the subject of the cultural exodus from Austria, a subject that was for so long suppressed and taboo in Austrian public life. It is intended as a public service institution to those who produce literature and as a partner for other institutions and researchers working in the field of the literature of Austrian exile or members of the general public who are interested in this subject. This includes activities of a scientific, documentary, politico-cultural and social (e. g. contacts with authors) nature.

**PUBLICATIONS:** One of the main tasks of the *Österreichische Exilbibliothek im Literaturhaus* is the acquisition of those publications by Austrian writers who emigrated or were driven into exile which originally appeared outside Germany from 1933 and outside Austria from 1938. In addition, we document reissues and translations, the output of publishing houses in exile in which Austrians were active, together with journals published in exile. To date there are over 4,000 titles (primary and secondary literature). The ultimate goal is to produce a comprehensive bibliography of Austrian literature in exile with location and classification references at least as far as Viennese libraries are concerned.

**PRESS DOCUMENTATION:** Expansion of the extant collection of newspaper cuttings related to the subject through continuous updating with new additions from the daily press and relevant periodicals such as *Aufbau* and *Israel-Nachrichten*.

**MANUSCRIPTS and OTHER COLLECTIONS:** Acquisition and preparation of relevant collections and library estates when the *Österreichische Exilbibliothek im Literaturhaus* is the desired location or according to the available means (at present the collection includes extensive material on approximately 1.100 exiled Austrian authors and artists).

**IMAGE BANK:** Systematic expansion of the collection of photographic portraits by Alisa Douer, which was set up with the exhibition *Time Creates Images* (at present comprises c. 450 items).

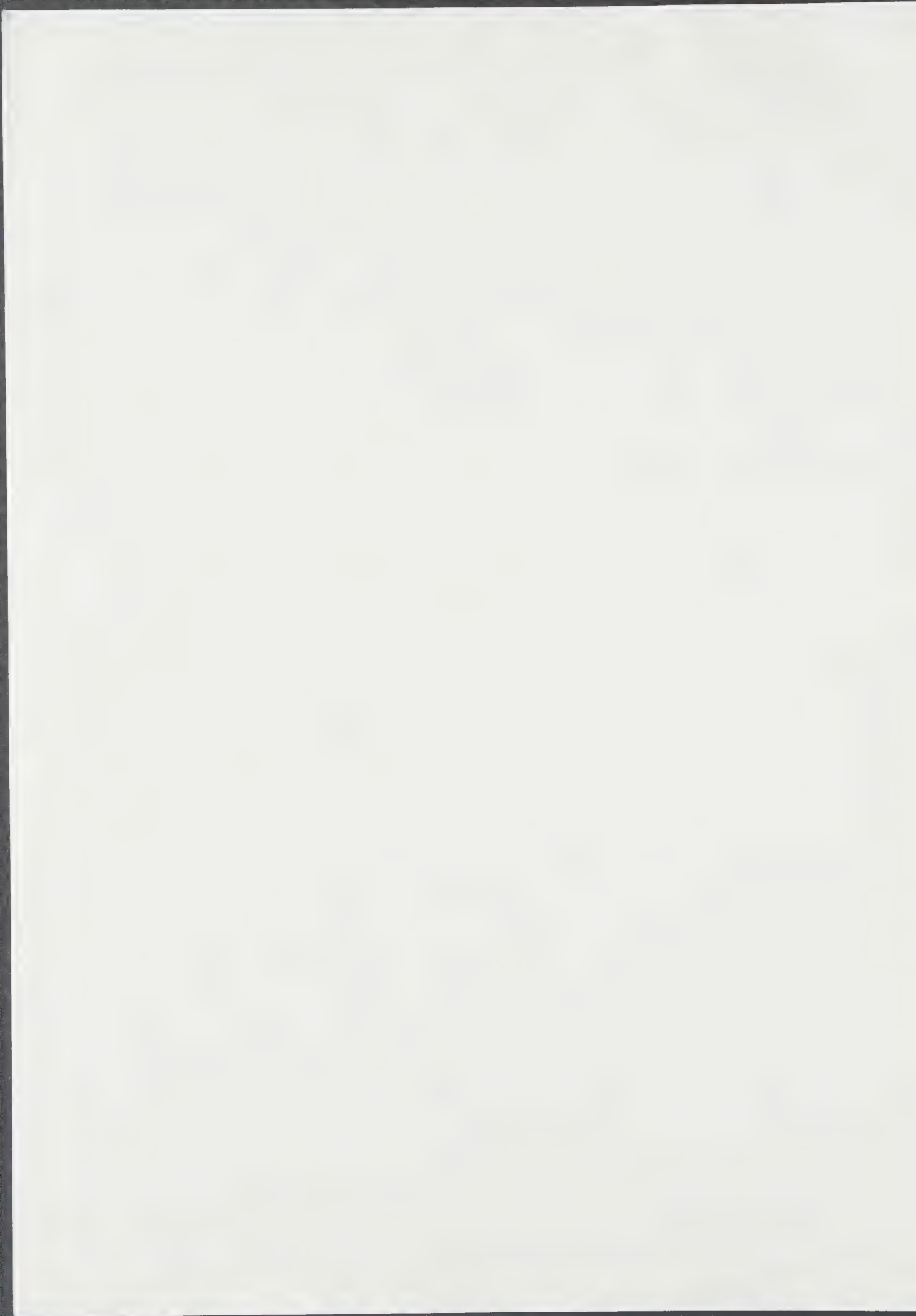
**AUDIOTAPE and VIDEOTAPE COLLECTION:** Systematic development of a collection of audiotape and videotape documents of exiled Austrian authors.

**DATABASE:** Development of a user-oriented bio-bibliographical database of Austrian culture in exile (at present comprises c. 5.300 items).

**EXHIBITIONS and EVENTS:** Series of events related to the exhibition *Time Creates Images* (readings, talks, book presentations, round table discussions) and regular exhibitions featuring documents from the *Österreichische Exilbibliothek im Literaturhaus*.

Thank you so much for your interesting letter of December 31st regarding help for Professor Janos Mink and his important work in Hungary.

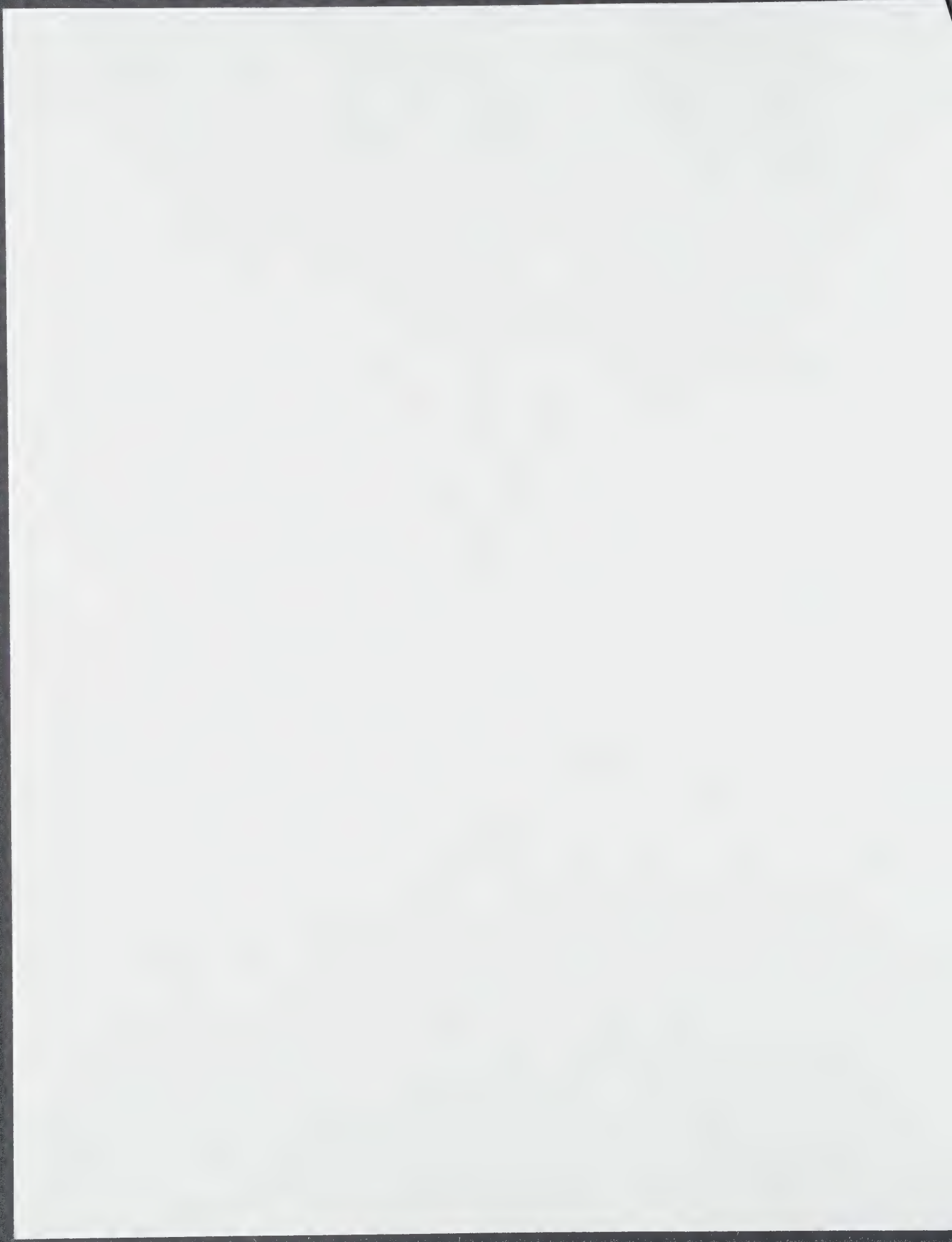

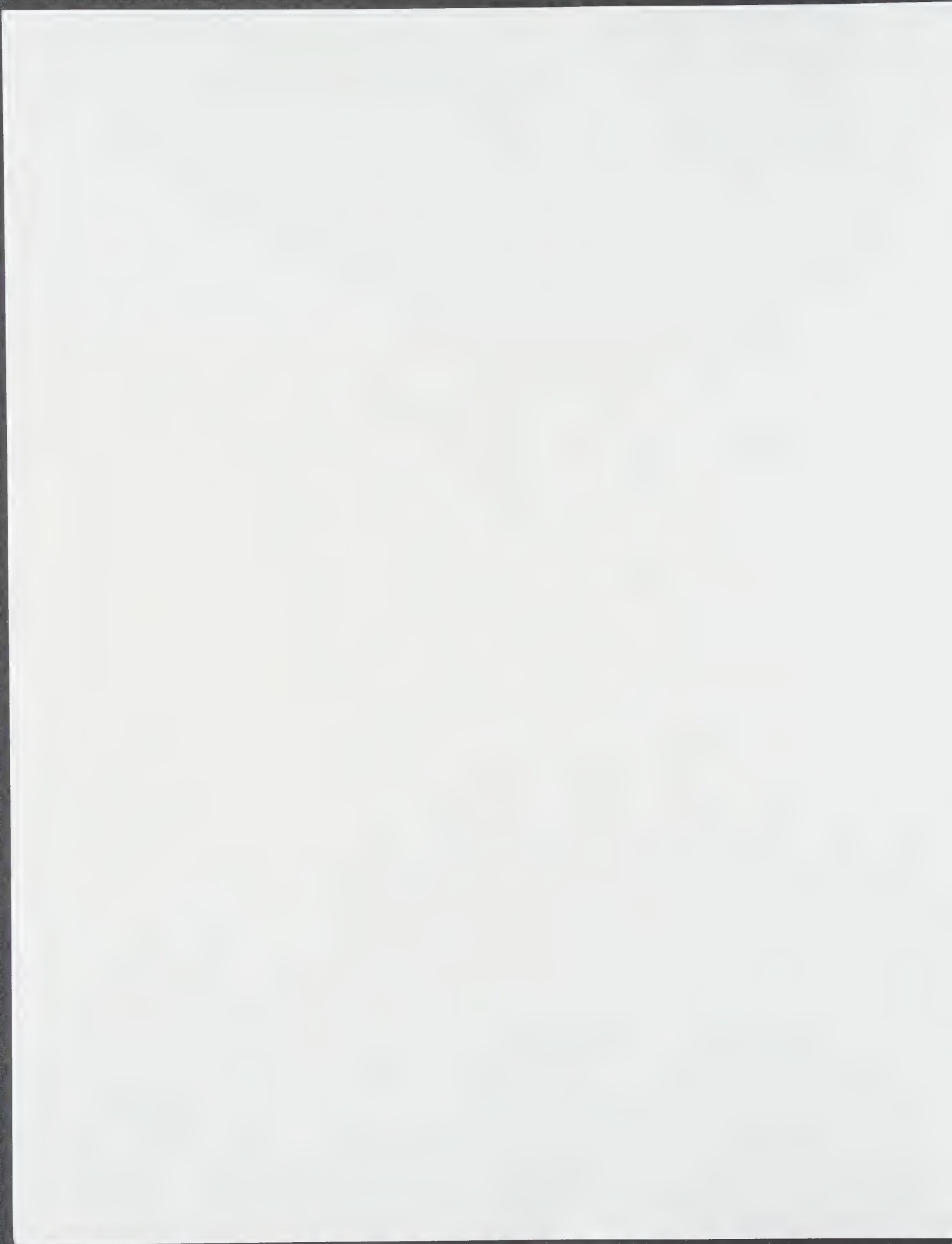

To give you some idea of my style, I enclose one chapter on the beginnings of Aldrich Chemical Company, which has already been published, and a rough draft of the chapter on paintings.

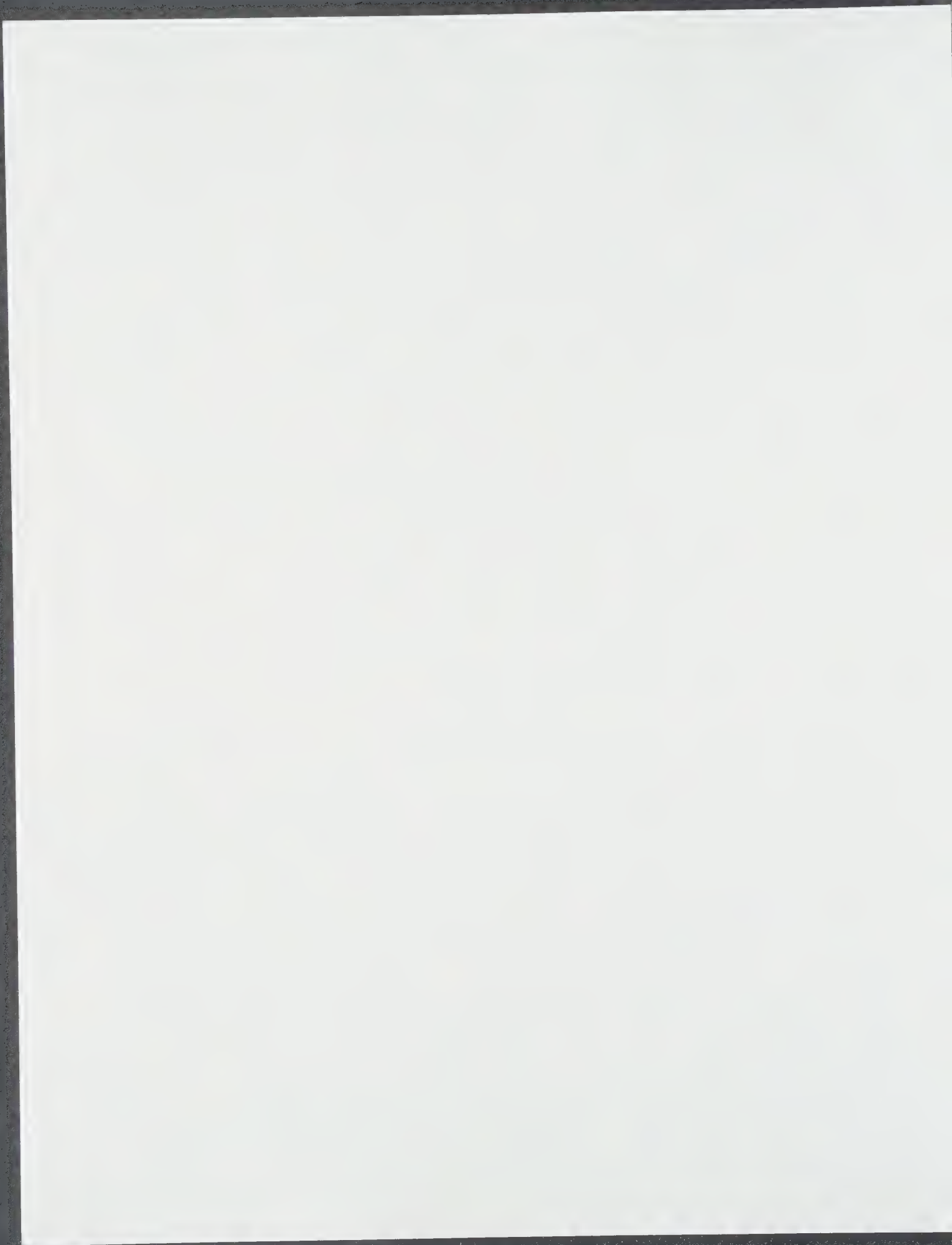
I estimate that there will be about 20 chapters and that the book will have between 150 and 200 pages.

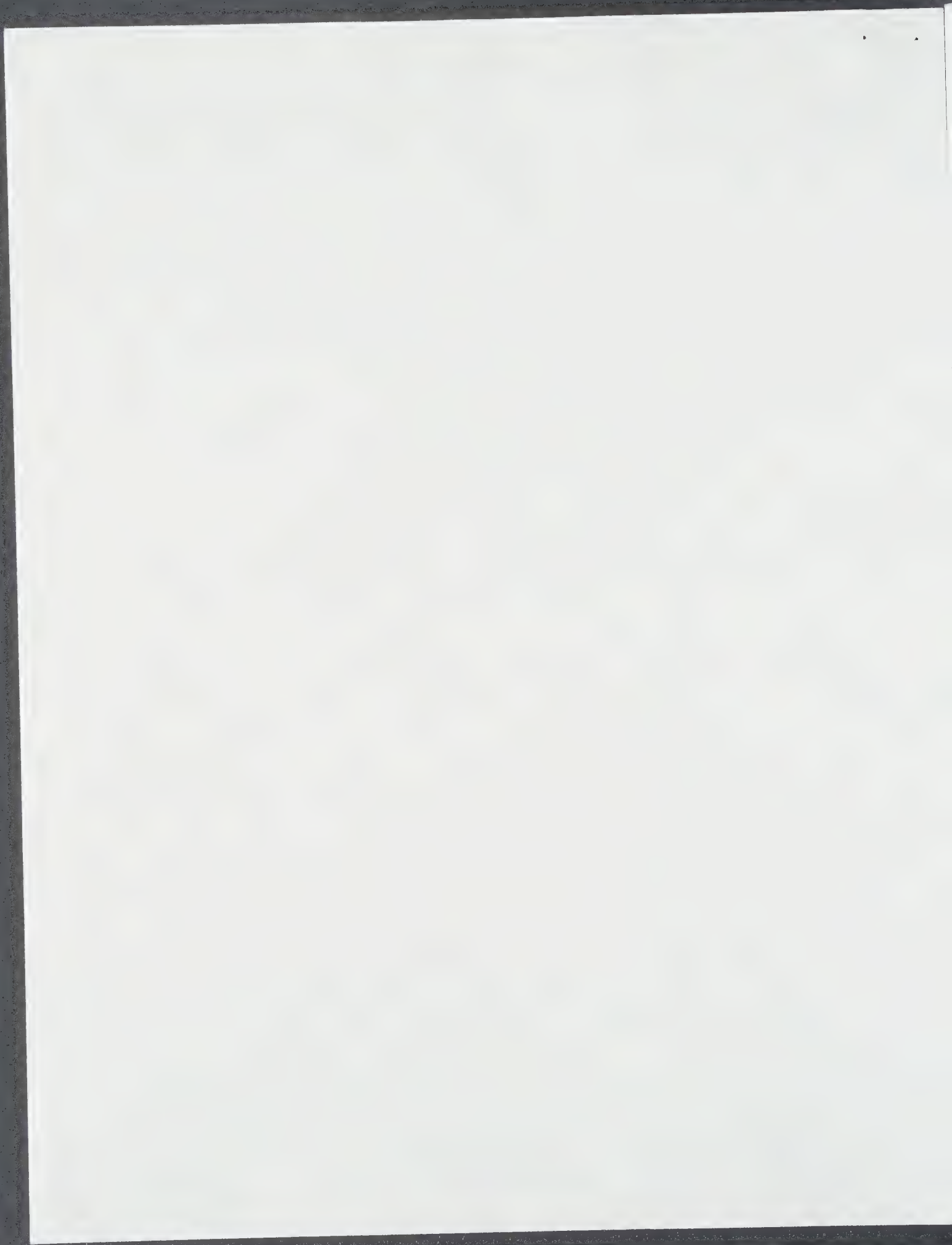
For a moment I thought that as your letter was dated April 1 it was an April Fool's Day joke, but would a responsible company send April Fool's Day letters by certified mail?
