




Dr. Alfred Robert Bader

Dr. Bader received a BSc in chemical engineering from Queens University, Ontario in 1945. He continued his education at Queens obtaining a BA in history in 1946 and an MSc in chemistry in 1947. He then went to Harvard University obtaining an MA in chemistry in 1949 and a PhD in chemistry in 1950. He has also been awarded DSc's from the University of Wisconsin at Milwaukee in 1980, the University of Wisconsin at Madison in 1984, Purdue University in 1984, and Northwestern University in 1990. He was awarded an LLD from Queens University in 1986 and a DUniv. from the University of Sussex in 1989. After working for the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company for several years (1950-54), he joined the Aldrich Chemical Company where he became president in 1955.

His scientific honors include the 1971 Milwaukee Section (ACS) Award Winner, the Winthrop-Sears Medal, 1980, and the Engineer of the Year, Engineer & Scientists of Milwaukee, 1984. Other honors include being a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts and being Guest Curator, Milwaukee Art Center. He is a benefactor to many art related organizations as well as to colleges and universities. He is a member of the American Chemical Society and The Chemical Society (London).

"The Bible Through Dutch Eyes"

One of the remarkable aspects of life in seventeenth century Holland was the study of the Bible and the identification of Dutchmen with the People of the Book and their destiny. Never before had a Christian people studied the Bible so carefully. In many Dutch families the Bible was read daily, page by page, every morning. Events which are obscure to us became common household knowledge. Just as the Jews appeared in the Bible as the champions of God and freedom, so Dutchmen looked on themselves as the latter-day Israel, and on their fight with Spain as a fight against tyranny, of good against evil. The effects of this identification on Dutch art of the seventeenth century have been manifold and will be the topic of this presentation.

Directions to King's Table Restaurant: From I-24 to Exit 81. Take route 231 north toward Murfreesboro. The restaurant is on the left hand side of the road about 0.5 to 1.0 mile from the interstate. From points northeast of Murfreesboro coming via route 96: After entering the Murfreesboro city limits, you'll travel several miles to a traffic light where route 96 turns right (Tennessee Blvd.). Turn left onto Tennessee Blvd. and follow it a few miles (past the MTSU campus) to the intersection with route 231 (a stop light just after a railroad crossing). Turn left on 231 south and the restaurant is a short distance on the right. From points north coming via route 231: Follow route 231 south to the south side of Murfreesboro (you'll join 41/708 for a while by turning left onto Broad Street and then split from 41/708 by turning right on Church street). The restaurant is about 1.5 to 2.0 miles on the right.

Note:

Dr. Bader will also be speaking at MTSU at 4:00 pm in the Davis Science Bldg. His topic will be related to Joseph Loschmidt a Vienese school master who first calculated the number of molecules of a gas that should be present in 1 cc of a gas under standard conditions, the first Avogadro's number, as it were. Dr. Bader will give his ideas relating to the discovery of the ring structure of benzene, which he feels should properly be credited to Loschmidt.



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

Dear Marilyn and Jack,

You must have realized how very much Isabel and I enjoyed our visit with you and want to thank you most sincerely for your kind hospitality. Now, I also have to thank you for your kind letter of April 13th.

First of all, Isabel and I very much hope that you will be able to visit us in Milwaukee before long. Our calendar for May is relatively free, but from the end of May until early September we will be travelling almost all the time. But then our calendar for September and October is relatively open.

We would love to return to Memphis next winter, and I would be happy to give a lecture on Rembrandt and the Jews. But, I would feel much happier if I were invited to give two or three talks; perhaps one at a Jewish community center and one or two at your art museum. In any case, I enclose a list of ten lectures.

Our trip through Tennessee, from Memphis to Kingsport, was really delightful, and we were received very warmly everywhere. Just as an example, I enclose a letter from Professor Kelsey Cook, chairman of the Knoxville Section, with the titles of the lectures I gave there.

Enclosed please find a photograph of that Neapolitan painting of Moses by Gabriel de Sabbato. De Sabbato painted in Naples around 1700, and his name may well indicate that he was a Marrano. The painting is fully signed and so there can be no doubt that it is by de Sabbato. I am going to take a snap shot this weekend so that you will see what the colors are, blue being the predominant color.

You asked me the price of this painting, and I told you that it is \$12,000, which includes a 10% commission that I would like to pay Rena Dewey as a small thank you for introducing us.

I handle far more Dutch 17th century paintings than Italian, and my hope is that both of you will really like some paintings from the circle of Rembrandt.

Jack, I must tell you that I particularly appreciated your questions about my dismissal from the company which I founded. Until I was ousted, I didn't know how many friends I have among chemists around the world, and the enclosures are but a small sample. This doesn't change the fact that Sigma-Aldrich is an excellent company with close to a monopoly in research chemicals worldwide, and I would love to have a chance to discuss Sigma-Aldrich with you. The latest annual report and proxy statement are enclosed, and you will see that I am still the largest private stockholder.
