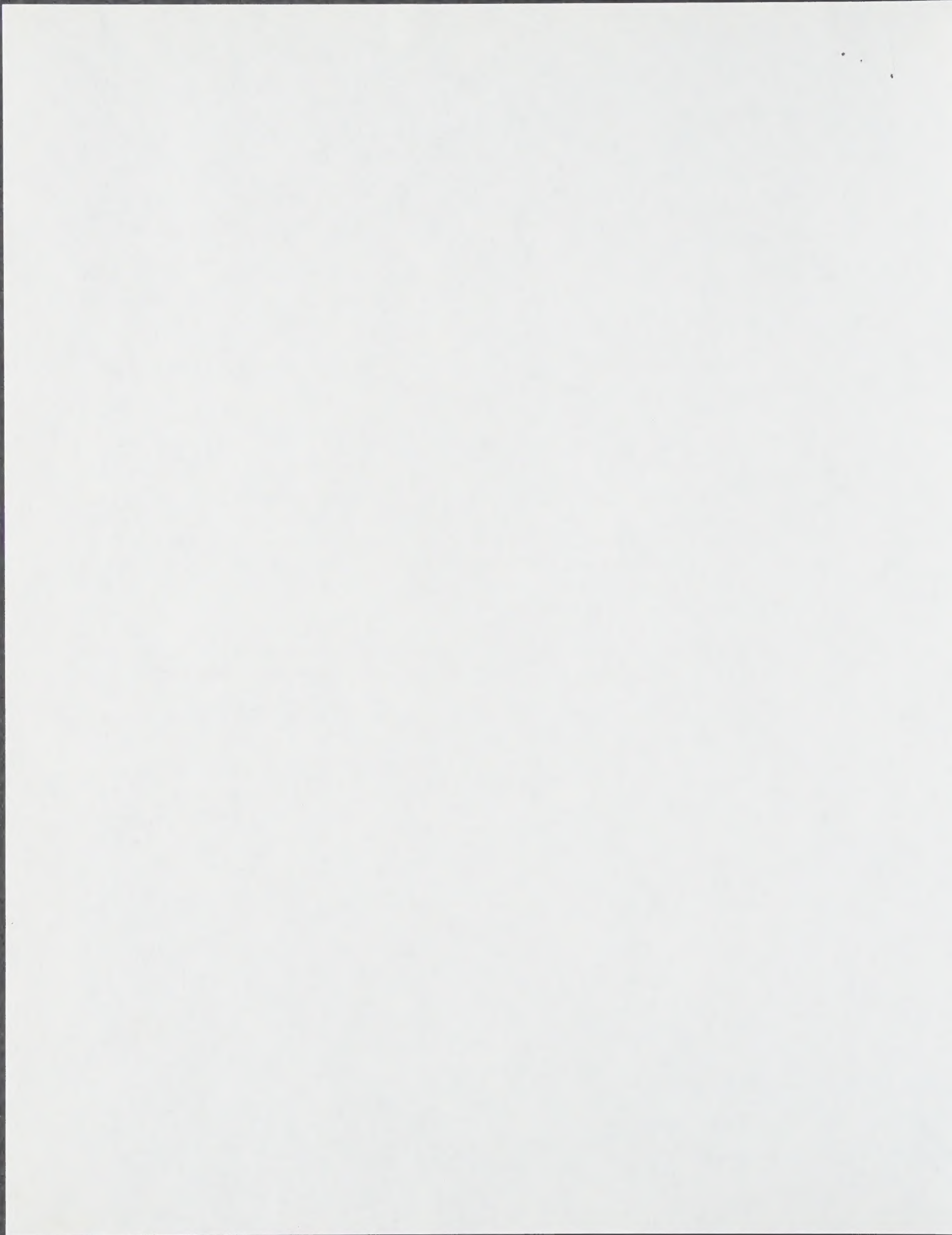

I am writing in response to your letter of October 24, 1994. I am truly sorry that you are disappointed with the proposed schedule for the Keystone Circuit in April 1995. Unfortunately, the Speaker Service has no control over which local sections accept which speakers. The acceptance depends on the needs of the individual sections. The list of "possible" cities that I sent to you during my initial contact with you was just that "possible." I offer the speakers who are willing to visit the circuit to the local sections, however, it is the section's prerogative as to which speakers the section chooses to accept. The Pittsburgh and the Maryland (Baltimore) sections chose not to participate in any local section tours this year. 
Thank you so much for sending me the possibilities for an A.C.S. speaker tour for 1995.
