Dear Dr. Bader:

I am writing in response to your letter of October 24, 1994. I am truly sorry that you are disappointed with the proposed schedule for the Keystone Circuit in April 1995. Unfortunately, the Speaker Service has no control over which local sections accept which speakers. The acceptance depends on the needs of the individual sections. The list of "possible" cities that I sent to you during my initial contact with you was just that "possible." I offer the speakers who are willing to visit the circuit to the local sections, however, it is the section's perogative as to which speakers the section chooses to accept. The Pittsburgh and the Maryland (Baltimore) sections chose not to participate in any local section tours this year. When I received your letter, I phoned both sections to let them know that you were interested in visiting their sections, however, each has already set their programs for 1995.

You also mentioned in your letter that you would like to give at least two lectures a day. In most cases, each local section sets up "other" presentations with the speaker directly. That communication is between the speaker and the section, however, I'm sure that the sections can accommodate your request.

Dr. Bader, I very much appreciate all the time and effort that you spend on ACS programs. You are a valued tour speaker, and I would like to continue our relationship. Please let me know what I can do to make your tour acceptable given that the Pittsburgh and Maryland sections are not participating.


I am puzzled that I have not had a reply to my letter of October 24, 1994.

I look forward to visiting some of the sections of the Keystone Circuit next April.


However, please do remember that I would like to visit only five sections, and not six, and that I very much hope to give more than one talk in each city.

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




