This picture, which bore attributions to other Rembrandt pupils: Nicolaes Maes and Abraham van Dijck; until recognised as a Fabritius by Werner Sumowski in 1973, derives from Fabritius' drawn self portrait of *circa* 1650 in Darmstadt, Hessisches Landesmuseum (inv. AE 671, pen and brown ink and wash heightened with white, *147 by 109 mm.*), where he also portrays himself standing in a somewhat hieratic pose, facing the viewer, and wearing a long belted smock. His distinctive features may also be easily recognised in painted self-portraits of (*inter alia*) 1650 in Frankfurt, Städelsches Kunstinstitut, 1660 in Vienna, Gemäldegalerie der Akademie der bildenden Künste (inv. 639), and 1666 in Aachen, Suermondt-Museum (see Sumowski, 1983, under *Literature*, pp. 926, 923-4, nos. 598, 586, 589, reproduced pp. 976, 965, 967). The present self-portrait dates from around 1660.

The eagle, attribute of the Evangelist Saint John, is seen as a painted relief in the right background.

Dear Alfred:

I enjoyed our visit in Philadelphia. Thank you for including me in your plans, and thank you for your very generous offer to help with the publication of the Victors book.

Otto called me yesterday, after he received a copy of your letter outlining our options. Of course we agree that to do nothing would be a terrible waste of valuable information. We also feel that to bring a new graduate student in at this point would create unnecessary complications and delays, since Professor Manuth and I already have a strong background and knowledge of Victors, which the student would lack. Otto was very encouraging in his belief that Davaco would be happy to publish the book, as originally intended, with the aid of a \$20,000 subvention from you. So now the only remaining problem is the funding I will need for travel to The Hague (RDK) and London (Witt Library) to update my catalogue raisonne, and to Queen's University to confer with Professor Manuth.

Unfortunately, I do not have the financial means to undertake this project. As you know, I have no full-time position, no institutional affiliation, and consequently, no steady income in Art History. Otto and I discussed the minimum amount of time and resources I would need to complete the necessary travel as indicated above. If I were to go off-season, at the lowest available airfares, and to stay at the most economical tourist-class hotels/bed and breakfasts, and to eat very modestly (all of which I always do on funded research trips), we estimate my expenses at approximately \$10,000. I would not require any additional funding for my time at



home writing, or in New York (Frick Art Reference Library), where I could stay with family.

All expenses considered, it would cost me considerably less than the \$30,000 you estimated for a graduate student to spend a year in The Netherlands. Now my question to you is: would I be eligible for a Bader Fellowship as a visiting scholar at Queen's University, or are the grants specifically designated for graduate students there? Otto and I discussed the possibilities of my application for outside funding, and he wasn't very optimistic about my chances. Because of my age, my lack of an affiliation, and the fact that this represents the revival of a 15-year-old project, he believes it highly unlikely that I would have any success getting a research grant. Were I to apply to outside sources, it would delay the project by at least a year, as most grants are awarded on April 15 for a period beginning the following September. And again, my application would not be guaranteed of funding.


It is very frustrating for me to have the material at hand, the interest of a publisher, and the offer of assistance from you, but still to have serious financial obstacles in the way of completing this important project. Please consider the appropriateness of my application for a Bader Fellowship at Queen's University--it would be the perfect solution to my needs and we could get this publication out at last!

I leave for my study abroad program in Paris and London this Sunday (June 13); I return on June 25. I will contact Professor Manuth when I return, to discuss our options. All my best to you and Isabel.

I would call my > contact at Aldrich....could his name have been O'Brien.... (he was tall, lean > and dark-haired and handled your exhibits at ACS meetings)....and almost > always was able to arrange for the purchase. Sometimes the chemist would pay > me in cash and I would write a personal check for the purchase. Barbara
