Let me say that it is a great pleasure for me to converse with a true and highly knowledgeable scholar of art -

The painting is the same direction as the print, suggesting this painting was

produced after the etching. It is my understanding the etching was commissioned by Rembrandt in 1631.

It is my current belief the work is that of a student in the mid 1630's. I also think it possible - (and this is where I may be losing my objectivity !?) that certain parts of the painting look like they may possibly have come from the hand of the master himself - specifically the background cave wall and vegetation.

Who would be the best person to contact for an attribution, or, is it likely such a painting will always be identified as, Rembrandt School?



Dear Alfred,

We spoke on the phone of this earlier to-day, so I just want to to reconfirm that the person with whom Dr. Keyser should make the arrangements for you to give a talk is Christina Corsiglia, Curator of European Art at the Art Gallery of Ontario. Phone number (416) 977-0414.

As I mentioned in my last email, I had invited Christina to be this year's Rita Friendly Kaufman speaker (subject: The Thomson Collection). The lecture was yesterday; we had about 120 in the audience, and she gave a wonderful lecture. I did not know her particularly well, so we had a great opportunity to make a better acquaintance over dinner that evening. She is very personable and energetic (and was quick to point out to me that she is not a "Dr.", as we had indicated in our promotional material for the lecture; just so you know, as she is uncomfortable to think that she is supporting false claims!). She told me that she has already received a call from Dr. Keyser, and is happy to try and arrange something at the AGO. She is also pleased to arrange a meeting between you and Mr. Thomson, with whom she is in constant contact, as you can imagine. I'm happy to be of assistance with this, but if I understood you correctly this morning, you will be contacting her yourself. But do let me know if I can follow up or otherwise be useful.

She mentioned something to me that I'm sure will interest you: Mr. Thomson continues to buy very actively (apparently a week rarely goes by that something new doesn't come in). While his prime focus will always be decorative arts, I gather he's prepared to make strategic forays into Old Master paintings. So your plan sounds like a very promising one!

I'm desperate to get home tonight and grab my Bible; I'm cringing at the thought of all those citation errors.

Hello Alfred.

I will be watching the mail with great anticipation for Isabel's envelope! Thank you both for the opportunity to answer your questions yesterday, and for once again being so open to helping us. I have been pondering the question of future support for research and exhibition of the Costume Collection, and hope to develop several proposals as options for Isabel to consider, and look forward to that meeting.

I'm not sure who Dr. Keyser is, except of course for Barbara; do you perhaps mean George Keyes? If the field is European, I would suggest he contact Dr. Christina Corsiglia, who is the AGOs Curator of European Art. When I was there, there was no separate person or department that booked lectures; rather they were generated by the "hosting" individual (and then got put through many hoops, but that's another story), so she could certainly at the very least guide him. Can you confirm who Dr. Keyser is to me before I call him with her number?

Actually, Dr. Corsiglia will be here in Kingston on Sunday, delivering our annual Rita Friendly Kaufman lecture (this is an endowed lecturship inaugurated at the Art Centre last year). You will be interested to learn that the subject of her lecture is the Thomson Collection, as she is a decorative arts specialist and responsible for the collection at the AGO. I believe this is known as synchronicity!

I have never met Ken Thomson (whose father Roy had the title, which was not hereditary as far as I know); there was no relation between the AGO and him when I arrived at the AGO, or during my years there in the early 1990s, although we did develop a relationship with his son David, who gave us several hundred Old Master frames. I should think that the link to the father eventually developed that way, although I was gone by then. All that to say that I cannot arrange an introduction myself, but I will certainly raise it with Christina when I see her for dinner after the lecture. Do you know the day or days in May that you will be in Toronto?

The "lost" painting I'm going to New York for is a Milton Avery, thus quite outside our interests, and one for which the owner apparently has a plan. But I'll keep you're offer in mind!


