
Dear Alfred:

Dear Doctor Koenig:

What a pleasure to know you back  
in this country, and to be able to share Italian  
puzzles with you.

May I right away?

You know my interest in the story of Tobias,  
and I have acquired no less than 3 pieces I  
wrote to you last:

(a) A Tobias catching an enormous fish,  
a work attributed to Tetti, discarded by the  
L.A. County Museum. Another version in Dresden,  
yet another in Verona. I really like it - despite  
the dangers inherent in all Tetti sculptures.

(b) A Tobias holding the fish, in a beautiful  
landapezzo - manner. Not far from Nugget? "

(c) A Tobias about to heal his father.  
Previously - in a Genoese collection - called  
Polimena. Unlike any Polimena I have ever  
seen. The angel quite Neapolitan - a Frenchman  
in Italy? Certainly 17<sup>th</sup> century.

Moorish! - 2-

Then a large St. Sebastian - ca. 1660?

I don't even know whether Neapolitan or Venetian  
or what. That's the chance you take when working  
with a chemist who has never taken art history.

And a small 'Felsenlandschaft' - it looks  
a bit washed out in the photo, but isn't in reality.  
Earthy browns - in good condition. I presume the  
original to Mr. Bent and Prof. Ponowski in  
the hope of a Dutchman in Italy - but both said  
it was Italian. Twenty years ago I would have  
been disappointed - but not any more.

Last, to me the most beautiful, an  
Adoration of the Shepherds - very long - painted  
in colors - transparency enclosed. Could you  
please return that?

It came with two etchings by Correggio, copies  
enclosed. Why Correggio? I don't know. I have  
never seen a Correggio like this - to me it  
looks more like a cross between Veronese  
and one of the Bassanos - and I liked it so  
well that I bought it, paying to myself  
'You had well known'.
