These were:


- 1. Vanitas Still Life

My plans for my trips this summer are not yet quite definite, but I will probably be in London on Thursday or Friday, May 29 and 30, and then much longer at the end of July and August.



Thank you so much for your letter of August 21st which passed my yesterday's letter. I am moved by your trust shown by your sending me the check before receiving the painting.

I do have other good Dutch paintings of New Testament subjects, and when next you are in the United States, you might like to consider these possibly as an acquisition.

Have you considered sending your note to the Burlington Magazine rather than to Oud-Holland?

If you will check Genesis chapters 29 and 30, you will see that Reuben was born in the first year of Jacob's marriage to Leah and Rachel, Judah in about the fourth, and Joseph in the seventh year. Thus Joseph was 7 years younger than Reuben and 3 or 4 years younger than Judah. Of this there can be no dispute whatsoever, but the question may well be irrelevant because Rembrandt may not have looked at the Bible that carefully. If you look, for instance, at the Grisaille in the Rijks Museum in Amsterdam, you would probably conclude that the age difference between Joseph and his brothers is more than at most 7 years, but not nearly as great as that depicted in the Leningrad painting.

It is much more fun to argue with a man like yourself than with someone as completely irrational as Dr. Kahr.

Regarding the table, this is not very clearly defined in the painting and may just have been symbolic for the division between the young man leaving and the 2 old men.
