You must have realized how very much I enjoyed my talk at Marian College and my visit with you. As I said during the talk, "If my mother was looking down at me from Heaven, she must have been pleased that her infidel son was doing some good after all."

I much look forward to the photographs of the paintings we discussed. The series of paintings depicting the Life of Moses is really thirdrate; the Judith with the head of Holofurnes is a 19th century copy after the original by Allori in Florence. The two Cardinals look good, and we should be able to determine the artist of these, as well as of the large 17th century Biblical subject.

None of these paintings is of the same great museum quality that is the Holy Family by Sassoferrato. If per chance Marian College should ever consider selling that painting, allow me to try to buy it from you for my alma mater, Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. Unfortunately such a large Italian New Testament painting would not fit into my own Dutch collection, but it would be one of the masterpieces in the Queen's museum.

My mother had often told me about her years at the Sacre Coer in Paris, and yet I had always thought of nuns being impersonally cold. You certainly proved how very wrong I was.
